MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, SR/6

SUBJECT : Debriefing of Robert Edward WEBSTER (201 - 265472)

1. Subject, who renounced his US citizenship in 1959 when he defected to the USSR and who returned to the US as an alien under the Soviet quota in May 1962, was debriefed by the undersigned together with OO/Contact Division and Air Force representatives in Pittsburgh, Penna., during 2 - 3 July 1962. (See Attachment A for biographic data on Subject) The undersigned used the pseudonym, Rudy Valentino, while the following used their true names: Messrs. Keller Stewart, Robert Starling and Jack Tague, of the OO office, Pittsburgh; Major E. J. Zvetina and Mr. F. G. Jaycocks, of the Air Force Foreign Technology Division, Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio. The undersigned's aim was to determine if Subject was knowledgeable regarding detailed operational intelligence and Soviet Realities, while OO processed its normal requirements, including those of TSD, and the Air Force interrogated Subject along technical lines.

2. Because time was short, it was decided that the undersigned would conduct a chronological questioning and the OO and Air Force officials would enter the debriefing as appropriate. Therefore, the undersigned had about eight hours of debriefing opportunity and on this basis recommended that Subject be brought to Washington, D. C. for detailed debriefing.

3. Arrangements for Subject's quarters to be used also for debriefing were made through the Office of Security and Subject stayed at the Marriott Motel, Key Bridge, during 15-28 July 1962. See Enclosure A for a listing of staff personnel who participated in the debriefing of Subject; this listing includes the Aliases staff personnel used and dates on which they had contact with Subject. Enclosure "B" contains the undersigned notations made during various phases of debriefing and are attached for whatever value they may have in the future. Enclosure "C" is a Secrecy Agreement, dated 16 July 1962, signed by Subject and witnessed by the undersigned and Miss Eleanor Reed in pseudo. Enclosure "D", dated 27 July 1962, is a combination Secrecy Agreement and statement of truthfulness signed by Subject and witnessed by the undersigned and Miss Eleanor Reed (in pseudo). Enclosure "E" is a short biography on Subject prepared by Miss Eleanor Reed which can be used in the event of necessity.

16. Because there was short and less different office participated in the debriefing, it was decided that it would conduct a chronological questioning on Subject's experience and the CO and AF official would enter the ~~cross~~ questioning whenever appropriate.

AF obtained data from Subject on his employment and observations on the Plastics Institute and factory in Leningrad; copies of their reporting will be forwarded via the Pittsburgh CO/C office. DDCI was primarily interested in all personalities with whom Subject had contact in the Soviet Union; this data plus Subject's documents, letters, etc., some of which Subject permitted the Agency to keep, will be forwarded to SR Division from Pittsburgh.

17. Subject appeared very cooperative and, in fact, said that he would do anything to help the US Government ~~to~~ which would help him in his own mind to erase some of the stigma associated with his defection to the USSR. Although Subject ~~recently~~ returns to the US on 20 May 1962, having defected in October 1959, Subject apparently began to forget <sup>details</sup> very quickly; however, his recall ability to recall improved after considerable questioning and conditioning. It was felt that Subject can provide a great deal of OI and realities data and arrangements were made to have him

Office participants in the debriefing are SK/6 (including the SRC ~~and~~<sup>SK/11,</sup> ~~and~~<sup>Office of Security,</sup> ~~and~~<sup>Security</sup> operators), SK/CA, SK/C1, TSD/BAB, TSD/PAB, TSD/ ; CA/PROP, ORR/Channel Branch and, if necessary, (Security operators). OSI/GSO/EBS, IX/SII/ES.

3. At the following are some significant facts derived from the debriefing of Subject: and comments of ~~declassification~~ value.

a. Subject states that he decided to defect because of family problems, <sup>personal and financial</sup> which he could not cope and he took the easy way out. (Apparently his problem was associated with his wife ~~inasmuch~~ as he mentioned she was not paying giving enough attention to their children.) Subject began planning of defection during the second in a series of three trips he made to the USSR as a representative of the Kroc Development Corp., Cleveland, Ohio. He set up a plaster exhibit. He confided in no one about his plans to defect. The following between his second and third trips to the USSR, he collected personal items which he <sup>wanted</sup> ~~wanted~~ during his residence in USSR and ultimately gain full cooperation to Soviet authorities in the defection formalities.

b. A Soviet woman whom Subject met in a Moscow hotel where she was employed ultimately was taken with Subject to Leningrad where they lived.

~~She is common law marriage and at this she gave birth to their child.~~ Analysis of data obtained on her and subject's relationship with her indicates that she may have played a more significant role vis-a-vis subject than other ~~Subject believes the debriefing thus far has~~ ~~been present.~~ Although subject states he has not yet fixed his plans, he ~~is~~ ~~now~~ ~~considering~~ may bring her and the child to the USA - he said he signed as a Soviet agent promising support to this child after he is gainfully employed in the US. Subject states that he has not corresponded with her and does not plan to correspond with her except to send funds at a later date. (He added he has not yet corresponded with anyone in the USSR primarily due to his mother's nervous breakdown about for which she ~~recently~~ was released from a hospital.)

Soviet Citizenship

- 1. Subject applied for Soviet citizenship 11 July 1959.
- 2. Officially he stated that he had received Soviet citizenship - 17 September 1959.
- 3. On October 1, 1959, Director of Central Intelligence telephoned American Embassy, Moscow to state that Subject had assumed Soviet citizenship.
- 4. On October 1, 1959, Secretary of American Embassy, Richard E. Snyder met Subject at Central Office of the War and Registration (O.W.R.) of the Militia at Belgrade, Yugoslavia. From there Subject affited that he had applied for Soviet citizenship 11 July and had been granted Soviet citizenship on or about 17 September 1959. Said he had also applied for a Soviet internal passport which he had been granted about 31 December 1959.
- 5. In late August, 1959, after wife of Subject had called Subject in Moscow and asked him to return to the U.S. and if she should enroll the children in East Cleveland, was sent to Moscow, 1959, and to return soon, the wife said she would return to the U.S. in November. Subject called answer "I will return to Moscow, November, 1959."

Life in the U.S.

1. Worked for 1 year as a teacher (1950-1951) at the American School of Ankara, Turkey, and was paid \$1,000.
2. Lived in Ankara, Turkey, a year (1950-1951) (as a teacher)
3. Taken to Japan to work in Fisheries Institute (Institute for Fish and Scientific Research) at Far Eastern Fisheries Institute, Yeso.
4. Played in Japanese baseball team with his Uncle, Uncle Tom, Mr. PLAPKOWSKI, when he had not family or friends in Japan. Uncle Tom died, and he moved from Japan. He worked in Japanese Institute with a Japanese professor. There six months and then went to Korea. After a month with that professor, returned to Tokyo. Played at Japanese baseball team.
