MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Meeting with Dr.

| 13 April 1966

1. I met with Dr. _____ on this date at _____ to discuss the general scope and objectives of the forthcoming contract to be negotiated with _____ for the testing of drugs in animals prior to testing in man. Dr. _____ clearly understands that the test screening will include both behavioral and toxicology studies of each drug to be tested under the provisions of this contract.
2. Dr. _____ further appears to have very clearly understood all the security requirements associated with research of this kind and appears to be able to fully prevent the research work from being associated with Agency interest.
3. Concerning drugs to be tested, Dr. _____ suggested that he might be able to provide us with some interesting leads. Also he stated that in cases where drug companies are reluctant to release drugs to the Agency for testing under this project, he might be able to help us obtain such drugs. I informed Dr. _____ that I would prefer to prevent his Corporation from becoming known as being associated with this work except perhaps in certain special individual cases where it appears to be worth the risk. I stated that I would have to make this decision myself but, of course, would first discuss each case with him.
4. Concerning drugs of potential interest to us, Dr. _____ stated that he is currently testing a drug of the tranquilizer class which appears to produce a rage reaction instead of tranquilization. He stated that each animal (dog) has the rage reaction to this drug, not just a few of them. We might be interested in looking more carefully at this drug's potential usefulness.
