This letter serves as the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), New Mexico State Office's response to your request for agency records made under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (FOIA). Your records request was received in this office on February 4, 2019.

You requested,

- 1) All documents regarding the research into Mr. Frank Kimbler, his collection of material in or around Roswell, New Mexico, and the contact of Mr. Kimbler to attend the meeting
- 2) All documents regarding the meeting(s) itself, notes, reports, etc. generated after the meeting, and
- 3) All emails, letters, memos, etc. that pertain to the research into Mr. Kimbler and his research."

In accordance with FOIA requirements, the BLM has conducted a thorough search of the Roswell Field Office. Agency records responsive to your request were identified and the BLM is releasing 46 pages with no redactions. In addition, the BLM is partially withholding 3 pages containing either personal phone numbers under Exemption 6 of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. 552(b)(6)).

For those records withheld under Exemption 6 of the FOIA, Exemption 6 allows an agency to withhold "personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." The phrase "similar files" covers any agency records containing information about a particular individual that can be identified as applying to that individual. To determine whether releasing records containing information about a particular individual would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy,

we are required to balance the privacy interest that would be affected by disclosure against any public interest in the information.

Under the FOIA, the only relevant public interest to consider under the exemption is the extent to which the information sought would shed light on an agency's performance of its statutory duties or otherwise let citizens "know what their government is up to." The burden is on the requester to establish that disclosure would serve the public interest. When the privacy interest at stake and the public interest in disclosure have been determined, the two competing interests must be weighed against one another to determine which the greater result of disclosure is: the harm to personal privacy or the benefit to the public. The purposes for which the request for information is made do not impact this balancing test, as a release of information requested under the FOIA constitutes a release to the general public.

We reasonably foresee that disclosure of the records partially withheld would harm an interest protected by one or more of the nine exemptions to the FOIA's general rule of disclosure.

The persons responsible for this partial denial under Exemption 6 of the FOIA are Sarah A. Westenberg, NM/OK/TX/KS FOIA Officer, and Timothy R. Spisak, State Director, New Mexico State Office, Bureau of Land Management, Santa Fe, New Mexico, in consultation with Benjamin Vaccaro, Attorney Advisor, Department of the Interior, Office of the Solicitor, Southwest Region, Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Your request for fee waiver is granted.

You may appeal this response to the Department's FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer. If you choose to appeal, the FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer must receive your FOIA appeal no later than 90 workdays from the date of this letter. Appeals arriving or delivered after 5 p.m. Eastern Time, Monday through Friday, will be deemed received on the next workday.

Your appeal must be made in writing. You may submit your appeal and accompanying materials to the FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer by mail, courier service, fax, or email. All communications concerning your appeal should be clearly marked with the words "FREEDOM OF INFORMATION APPEAL." You must include an explanation of why you believe the BLM's response is in error. You must include with your appeal copies of all correspondence between you and the BLM concerning your FOIA request, including your original FOIA request and BLM's response. Failure to include with your appeal all correspondence between you and the BLM will result in the Department's rejection of your appeal, unless the FOIA /Privacy Act Appeals Officer determines (in the FOIA/Privacy Act Appeals Officer's sole discretion) that good cause exists to accept the defective appeal.

Collecting on **Public Lands**

activities that include collecting resources such as firewood, gemstones, pine nuts and fossils for personal enjoyment and use. This is a summary of what may be collected from public lands. The BLM encourages people to explore the nearly 48 million acres of public land in Nevada.

The public lands offer a broad range of outdoor

Please use care in collecting. Avoid activities which damage public resources such as vegetation, scenery and archaeological sites, or which create hazardous conditions such as pits or trenches. Power equipment and explosives may not be used except for woodcutting and certain dredging operations. Reasonable amounts of the following may be collected for non-

commercial purposes: • Flowers, berries, nuts, seeds, cones, and other plant parts.


Campfire wood.

Rocks, mineral specimens, common invertebrate fossils and

semiprecious gemstones. **Exceptions**

Exceptions include specifically protected plants, campfire wood in posted areas, wilderness areas, wilderness study areas, areas of critical environmental concern including Stewart Valley, near Gabbs, Nev., Red Rock Canyon and Sloan Canyon National Conservation Areas, historic and prehistoric sites and districts, and national natural landmarks. Maps and information on specific restrictions are available at Bureau of Land Management (BLM) offices in Las Vegas, Tonopah, Carson City, Reno, Winnemucca, Battle Mountain, Elko, Ely and Caliente. Minerals

Gold and silver may be prospected for with hand tools including pans and metal detectors. Minerals such as gold, silver and opals found on mining claims belong to the claim holder. Mining claim records may be viewed at BLM and county recorder offices. Sluicing, dredging and commercial mining require permits. Recreational panning which does not involve mechanical equipment is permitted in wilderness and wilderness study areas if it does not create surface disturbance or impair the environment. Saleable minerals, such as sand,



common mineral materials must be purchased by prior arrangement with the BLM. Gemstones and common rock specimens may be collected for private use on unclaimed sites.

museums or other public institutions after study. Common invertebrate fossils such as plants, mollusks, and trilobites may be collected for personal use in reasonable quantities, but may not be bartered or sold.


Petrified wood may be collected up to 25 pounds plus one piece per person per day, with a maximum of 250 pounds per person per year. Permits are required for pieces over 250

humans. Protected materials include arrowheads and other stone tools, grinding stones, beads, baskets, pottery, old bottles, horse shoes, metal tools, graves and trash scatters.

Cultural materials on public lands may not be removed, damaged, disturbed, excavated or transferred without BLM permit. Cultural resources include prehistoric and historic artifacts and sites, broken objects and debris more than 100 years old that were used or produced by

Historic sites such as cabins, sawmills, graves, trail traces, mining areas, townsites, LOVE 'EM ranches and railroads are not open to AND LEAVE 'EM collecting. Metal detector use is allowed on public Artifacts belong lands. Modern money may be collected, on public lands. but coins and artifacts more than 100



years old may not be collected.

Small amounts of plants, plant parts, seeds, flowers and berries may be collected for personal use in most areas. Cacti, yuccas, succulents and evergreen shrubs and trees are protected by the state. Species listed as threatened or endangered are protected by the federal government and may not be collected without permit. Collection of species listed as sensitive or candidates for threatened or endangered status should be avoided.

The public lands offer a broad range of outdoor

Please use care in collecting. Avoid activities which damage public resources such as vegetation, scenery and archaeological sites, or which create hazardous conditions such as pits or trenches. Power equipment and explosives may not be used except for woodcutting and certain dredging operations. Reasonable amounts of the following may be collected for non-

commercial purposes: • Flowers, berries, nuts, seeds, cones, and other plant parts.



Rocks, mineral specimens, common invertebrate fossils and

semiprecious gemstones. **Exceptions**

Exceptions include specifically protected plants, campfire wood in posted areas, wilderness areas, wilderness study areas, areas of critical environmental concern including Stewart Valley, near Gabbs, Nev., Red Rock Canyon and Sloan Canyon National Conservation Areas, historic and prehistoric sites and districts, and national natural landmarks. Maps and information on specific restrictions are available at Bureau of Land Management (BLM) offices in Las Vegas, Tonopah, Carson City, Reno, Winnemucca, Battle Mountain, Elko, Ely and Caliente. Minerals

Gold and silver may be prospected for with hand tools including pans and metal detectors. Minerals such as gold, silver and opals found on mining claims belong to the claim holder. Mining claim records may be viewed at BLM and county recorder offices. Sluicing, dredging and commercial mining require permits. Recreational panning which does not involve mechanical equipment is permitted in wilderness and wilderness study areas if it does not create surface disturbance or impair the environment. Saleable minerals, such as sand,



common mineral materials must be purchased by prior arrangement with the BLM. Gemstones and common rock specimens may be collected for private use on unclaimed sites.



Collection of species listed as sensitive or candidates for threatened or endangered status should be avoided.

In Attendance; Jim Stovall, - Pecos District Manager, Helen Miller, Acting AFM- Resources Roswell Field Office, Courtney Carlson – Roswell Field Office Archaeologist. These notes are being taken by Helen Miller.

Mr. Kimbler stated that he had been collecting some surface material on the X-Bar Ranch, potentially on public land surface, at what he thinks is the alleged UFO site. He works at NMMI as an instructor in Earth Science and has many stories of tours and training with the NMMI cadets.

Mr. Kimbler was concerned about the attendance at this meeting with the BLM Law Enforcement Ranger – Quinton Franzoy.

Mr. Kimbler suggests that BLM get rid of a document produced by BLM – Nevada as it is wrong. ("Collecting on Public Land") Courtney says that NM Arch program says it is incorrect. Jim wants to talk with BLM – Nevada about the article. (Mr. Kimbler did not provide the document.)

Mr. Kimbler said that he is a law-abiding citizen and wants to protect the site. He is concerned about the location, and our map is too small. He will work hard to protect the site and will provide data, aerial photos, especially those taken between 1946 to the 1950's. He said he was given permission to be on private surface in the ranch by Eddy Davis, ranch foreman.

Mr. Kimbler asked what could be done to increase protection beyond "No surface occupancy", as he thinks that this site is now considered an official historical site.

Mr. Kimbler would like to provide his information to us. Courtney would like to see it registered, which is published. That could be a "double edged sword", providing information from the site as well as documenting the location of what could be an archaeological site. Mr. Kimbler agreed.

Mr. Kimbler tries to look at both extremes – the far-fetched and the programmatic. Some friends want him to take him to the site, but he has declined because that would make the site location known. He is willing to stop any work out there and try to become qualified as a crew chief. Courtney recommended that Mr. Kimbler contact Laura Hronec, BLM NM archaeologist at the State Office, to start the process. Courtney said he would have to have a certain type of college degree and get an "ARPA" permit, be a company or be employed by a qualifying company. Courtney gave Mr. Kimbler Laura Hronecs contact information, written on the back of my business card.

Mr. Kimbler says that the last dig was a couple of 100 yards off of the true location. He will provide the 1946 imagery to us and provide the Doleman report, 2006. (Courtney has it already). Doleman used a screen that was too large, most of the material went through the screens. The material was sent to the Maxwell Museum in Albuquerque, as most universities "won't touch anything labeled UFO site." His own metal detector can find a bb sized item 6 inches below the surface. Mr. Kimbler says any material should be within 1 to 2 inches of the surface. Testing of each item is quite costly, up to several thousand dollars per piece.

Courtney asked to see the items, not photographs. Mr. Kimbler is agreeable to that and said he would make an appointment to bring them in.

I asked Mr. Kimbler if he would like to meet our Ranger, Quinton Franzoy, to which he agreed. Mr. Franzoy came into the meeting and he and Mr. Kimbler exchanged phone numbers, just in case there was an emergency and Mr. Kimbler needed Mr. Franzoys help.

The meeting adjourned and Mr. Kimbler left the building, accompanied by a few members of the public, who had been waiting in the reception area.
