ASAC Belmont called at 2:30 P.M., stated that the Judge in the Chambers Case had ruled that he would not permit Hede classing to testify in this case. He stated her testimony would relate to a collateral issue and would be prejudicial. She acknowledged that she was a former wife of Gerhart Eisler. He also stated he would not permit Rosen, the man who purchased the old Hiss Ford automobile to testify because it could only be anticipated that he would refuse to testify on the grounds that it would incriminate him. This has been Rosen's answer on previous occasions.

Mr. Murphy, Government Attorney, tried to get the Court to permit him to put Massing on the stand and ask her one question in a manner similar to that used by Stryker yesterday when he put the psychiatrist on the stand and gave a 40 minute summation of the case, to which objection was made and sustained. When Murphy asked for this permission, the Judge said he wanted to consult with someone and he apparently consulted with another Judge and came back and said that he would not permit Massing to get on the stand.

Special Agent Whitson also testified today briefly concerning the interview with Hiss in your office in March, 1945. The purpose of Whitson's testimony was to show that questions were not asked of Hiss but that information he volunteered was taken and the questioning was limited to three or four specific questions. This was to overcome the testimony of Hiss that he had gone to the FBI and had answered all of their questions and Hiss by his testimony gave the impression that he had been cleared by the FBI. ance of Whitson was to dispel this contention. At 4:00 the Belmont called again and stated that the Washington Field Office was trying to locate a Walter Webb, manager of Tyler & Rutherford, Incorporated, a realty firm in Washington, to cause the introduction of records reflecting the occupancy of 152 K Street, Northwest, by Woodstock Typewriter Company. It has been ascertained that Hebb was under subpoena by the Defense and it was felt that the Defense was going to hold him under subpoena until the trial was over and send him back without testifying. His records will tend to prove the Government's contention that Hiss was still in possession of the Woodstock Typewriter during the pertinent period.

Mr. Donegan requested that as soon as Hebb could be located he be served with another subpoena calling for his appearance as a witness next Tuesday morning in behalf of the Government. Donegan requested that the subpoenal be served by the agents who locate Hebb either in New York or in Washington. Dauthorized the service of the subpoena by the agents.

By letter dated March 29, 1949, the Baltimore Office advised that Dr. MORRISON is Dr. SAMUEL MORRISON, bnother of Dr. ALBERT MORRISON, a chemist employed by the Allied Kidd Company, Wilmington, Delaware, and who at a Communist Party meeting was nominated for the office of Educational Director for the Communist Party of Delaware on January 27, 1947. ALBERT MORRISON was also Chairman of the Progressive Citizens of America at Wilmington, Delaware and had visited for some time in Russia several years ago.

In view of the above information, the Baltimore Office did not interview Dr. SAMUEL MORRISON regarding WINLY ARNHEIM.

On May 26, 1949, the reporting agent ascertained that ARNHEIM was employed as a stone mason on the construction of the new telephone building at 723 13th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. ARNHEIM was contacted during his lunch hour and indicated he might be cooperative. He requested the writer to contact him on Tuesday, May 31, 1949 at 12.00 noon.

ARNHEIM was contacted at noon on May 31, 1949 and the writer had lunch with him. WILLY ARNHEIM stated that when he thinks of his activities of several years ago, he becomes emotionally upset. When asked why he became upset, he stated he didn't know for sure. He went on to state that after having talked with the writer on Thursday, May 26, 1949, he had found himself twice contemplating suicide on Friday, May 27, 1949. At that time he was working on a scaffold seven floors above the street.

ARNHEIM then asked, "What caused men like FORRESTAL (JAMES FORRESTAL) and DUGGAN (LAWRENCE DUGGAN) to commit suicide? Nobody knows for sure." WILLY then added that his wife had been under the care of a psychiatrist for the past year. It was obvious that ARNHEIM was not in the proper frame of mind for further questioning in regard to his past activities, so the writer changed the topic of conversation to stone masonry. ARNHEIM became quite enthused about this subject and discussed it logically and rationally. When he appeared quite at ease, the writer left him.

Considering ARNHEIM's conversation regarding normal everyday activities, hand his visible physical condition, one is left with the impression that he is bluffing when he states he becomes emotionally upset and contemplates suicide when questioned about his past activities. However, the fact that he had fainted when being interviewed by agents on March 10, 1949, indicates that he may be telling the truth.

In view of the above information regarding ARNHEIM, no further attempt will be made to interview him regarding the JAHAM case.

At 2:00 p.m., June 15, 1949, Supervisor Delavigne of the Tashington Field Office advised that the New York Office had requested the TFO to check with the HCUA to ascertain the identity of the stenographer who took the dictation and transcribed Page 1190 of the Committee's report covering Chambers' testimony.

Apparently Hiss's counsel is using the HCUA report and particularly Page 1190 thereof to discredit Chambers' testimony regarding the residence of Hiss on one of the occasions that Chambers visited him. The HCUA Committee report, which reflects Chambers' testimony in August, 1948, indicated that he visited Hiss at Dent Place, Washington, D. C. Chambers on the witness stand maintains that this was an error, that he never said that Hiss resided at Dent Place, but was positive that he had said he visited Hiss at Volta Place, Washington, D. C.

Accordingly, AUSA Murphy has requested that an attempt be made to interview the stenographer who took this particular testimony to find out if the notes are still available or through interview determine if it was possible that a mistake might have been made in transcription.

HISS TRIAL SUMMARY, AFTERNOON SESSION, JUNE TWENTIETH. TEUNIS FACOLLIER, WASHINGTON CONTRACTOR AND BUILDER, TESTIFIED, HIS FIRM HAS DONE WORK ON VOLTA PLACE, RESIDENCE OF HISS LAST TEN YEARS AND IDENTIFIED IT FROM PHOTOS ALREADY IN EVIDENCE. WITNESS STATED HE HAD BEEN CONTACTED ON THIS MATTER BY AN ATTORNEY DAVIS LAST SATUR-FRANK EXDUVALL THEN TESTIFIED HE HAS BEEN WITH STATE DEPT. Herep SA DONALD D. CONNORS 6/29/49 and previous teletypes with respect to the availability of State Department documents to the Live Committee and to ALGLE HILD while he was a member of this committee.

Enclosed herewith for the New York Office is a memorandum dated January 13, 1936, which is a list of the confidential documents from the files of the Department of State, which documents were furnished to the Mye Committee. It is noted that the State Cepartment denied the Mye Committee the right to publish the documents described in this memorandum. Although the memorandum is dated January 18, 1936, Mr. JOSEPH COYL GREEN who furnished the memorandum has advised that the documents themselves were actually furnished prior to January 13, 1936. The exact date these documents were furnished is unknown and probably cannot be ascertained, although an exhaustive search of State Department files might indicate the actual date on which a number of these documents were furnished. Such a search will not be undertaken unless the New York Office so desires.

Mr. GARRA, who is cooperative in this matter, has advised that this list may be used in court; however, the documents to which this list refers are still considered to be classified, and the documents themselves may not be brought into open court without specific State Department clearance on each document. In other words, while the enclosed memorandum may be introduced if desirable and the brief descriptions of the documents which this memorandum contains may be introduced, the actual documents may not be so introduced without State Legartment clearance. State Penartment clearance, however, probably can be obtained if so desired.

The Lashington Field Office is retaining no copy of this memorandum; consequently, this memorandum should be reported by the New York Office.

Hr. GLEEN retains a copy of this memorandum in order that he may introduce it into evidence himself if so desired. He also retains a copy of the cover memorandum which is merely a letter of transmittal addressed to the MINDH of the Lye Committee.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Dr. KENNETH BUXTON SMITH, Montreal, Canada, lived at 117 Front Street, Chestertown, Md. 1932 to 1942 Neither he nor Mrs. SMITH remember ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS as tenants at that address but recall that Dr. ALICE DOLE subleased her apartment for two or three months each summer. State PAUL SOLANDT and mother resided in other apartment on floor with Dr. DOLE'S about 1936-37. SOLANDT believed instructor at Washington College. Dr. SMITH says Mrs. WICKES married daughter was frequent visitor at house. Says one COLLINS, a Mr. HUMPHREYS and daughters and a retired Army Colonel lived on third floor during 1936-1937. States LEWIN WICKES had little contact with residents in house but manservant LEONARD well acquainted with tenants. Dr. SMITH and wife had not recognized ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS in recent publicity as persons whom they had ever seen. Prof. ARNOLD TOLLES, Cornell University, Ithaca, N.Y. was employed June to Sept. 1934 as investigator in Washington, D.C. by the NYE Committee. TOLLES recalls that ALGER HISS came to work for this Committee as General Counsel in July or August 1934. TOLLES stated that his superior was STEPHEN-RAUSHENBUSH, Chief Investigator for the Committee, and that he received his orders from RAUS-HENBUSH and never at any time received any instructions or orders from HISS. TOLLES asserted that he never furnished HISS any original documents or files from the State Dept. TOLLES stated that his assignment under NYE Committee was to review certain files in State Dept. and make copies. extracts or abstracts from such files being relevant to the Munitions Inquiry being conducted by the Committee. copies or extracts from State Dept. files furnished by TOLLES to RAUSHENBUSH, who in turn furnished them to HISS.

DETAILS:

At Montreal, P. Q., Canada:

Dr. KENNETH SMITH BUXTON, residence 1545 McGregor Street, business address 977 Acqueduct Street in care of H. L. BLACHFORD, LIMITED, advised the writer that he and his wife resided in an apartment in the home of Mrs. L. W. WICKES at 117 Front Street, Chestertown, Maryland, from 1932 until 1942. He said that Mrs. WICKES occupied one of the two first floor apartments and he and his wife occupied the other. He said that he had little association with other tenants in the building with the exception of Dr. ALICE DOLE, who was employed, as he was, as an instructor at Washington College. Dr. BUXTON and Mrs. BUXTON said that they do not recall ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS residing in that house and they do not recall having ever seen either of them. They said that the recent publicity concerning ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS has not recalled to them any former association or recollection of the HISSES.

Dr. BUXTON said that the basement of the house was occupied by LEWIN WICKES, JR. and that LEWIN had little occasion to contact any residents of the house. He said he recalls that LEWIN broke his back and was invalided during the summer of 1936.

Dr. BUXTON said that from 1932 to 1942 he and Mrs. SMITH had one first floor apartment while Mrs. WICES had the other; Dr. ALICE DOLE occupied one of the two second floor apartments from 1935 until Dr. BUXTON left in 1942. The other second floor apartment was occupied by Mr. PAUL SOLANDT and his mother during the period 1936-1937. Mr. SOLANDT was then an instructor at Washington College and Dr. BUXTON believes he may still be so employed. Mrs. SOLANDT is a native of Baltimore and returned there to live before Dr. BUXTON left Chestertown.

Dr. BUXTON stated that Dr. ALICE DOLE subleased her apartment for two or three months each summer while she was teaching summer school at Alfred University, Alfred, New York. He said that during the summer Mrs. SMITH did not remain in Chestertown and that he had not become acquainted with any of the subtenants in Dr. DOLE'S apartment.

Dr. BUXTON said that there were about three small apartments on the third floor and one of these was occupied during 1936-1937 by one COLLINS who is now editor and part owner of one of the Chestertown local newspapers. About that time a man named HUMPHREYS (best recollection) who is now deceased, and who had two daughters attending Washington College resided on the third floor. The only other tenant on the third floor during 1936-1937 was a retired Army Colonel who spent most of his time at local golf courses.

Dr. BUXTON stated that Mrs. WICKES' married daughter lived in Chestertown and was a regular visitor at 117 Front Street. This daughter's husband was then hospitalized in a Veterans' Hospital at Perry Point or near Havre de Grace, not far from Chestertown.

The only person other than the above who would be in a position to know the tenants for many years back, according to Dr. BUXTON, is LEONARD, the Negro manservant of Mrs. WICKES. Dr. BUXTON stated that LEONARD is very intelligent and has an excellent memory and would certainly know if ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS had resided at 117 Front Street.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent DONALD B. RONEY at Ithaca, New York on June 28, 1949.

Professor ARNOLD TOLLES was interviewed in his office in the School of Industrial and Labor Relations, Cornell University. Professor TOLLES stated that from June to September, 1934, he had been employed in Washington, D.C., by the Senate Munitions Committee, popularly known as the "Nye Committee" as an investigator. He stated that during most of that period, he was assigned to the task of reviewing files in the State Department headquarters in Lashington pertaining to certain topics under study by the Committee in the field of munitions sales.

Concerning ALGER HISS, Professor TOLLES stated that according to his best recollection, HISS came to work for the Nye Committee as General Counsel in about July or August, 1934, and that HISS continued in that capacity after TOLLES left in September, 1934. TOLLES also pointed out that in the matter of jurisdiction in the Committee staff, he was not directly under ALGER HISS, nor did he have any more than a minimum of direct contact with HISS.

TOLLES stated that his immediate superior was STEPHEN RAUSHENBUSH, who was Chief Investigator for the Committee. TOLLES stated that he received his orders and instructions from RAUSHENBUSH and in turn made his reports to him. Professor TOLLES emphasized the point that he received no instructions, orders or suggestions from ALGER HISS, and that he did not furnish directly to HISS any material which he had received from the State Department files.

Professor TOILES explained that in the inquiry being made by the Nye Committee, an agreement had been made between the Committee and the State Department, whereby Committee Investigators were to have access to any State Department files deemed by the Investigator to be relevant to the matter under inquiry by the Committee. As the Investigator assigned by the Committee to the State Department, TOILES was given a desk and office in the State Department Building, and under the agreement, he was authorized to call for any State Department files he deemed relevant. The procedure then was that from the pertinent files which he reviewed, TOLLES would prepare extracts, abstracts or paraphrases and in several instances would make a complete typewritten copy of a State Department document, file or serial. Here again, Professor TOLLES emphasized that no original State Department document or no serial from a State Department file ever left the State Department Building.

These copies, extracts or abstracts prepared by TCLLES were typed in duplicate, the ribbon copy then being delivered personally by TOLLES daily to the office of STETHEN RAUSHENBUSH, the Chief Investigator, from where they would eventually go to HISS. At this point, Professor TOLLES also pointed out that

there was close State Department supervision over all outgoing material which he was in the process of reviewing, and emphasized the point that the State Department thus approved the release to the Committee of all material. TOLLES explained that one copy of each such report prepared by him, the original of which was furnished to the office of STEPHEN RAUSHENBUSH, was simultaneously sent for the purpose of clearance and review to Mr. JOSEPH GREENE, an official of the State Department, who was at that time acting as liaison man with the Senate. TOLLES also stated that the main purpose in GREENE's reviewing this material was to see that certain messages and similar data from State Department files had been properly paraphrased by TOLLES for the purpose of protecting the State Department code.

ALGER HISS never came to TOLLES' office in the State Department Building and handled any original State Department files or documents, nor did he, TOLLES, ever deliver any such files or documents to HISS. TOLLES admitted, however, that in the course of his duties, he had prepared exact copies of many original State Department files or documents, that he had delivered such copies to his superior, STEPHEN RAUSHENBUSH, and that it was his understanding that all such copies and reports made by him were then eventually furnished to ALGER HISS in his capacity as a member of the Committee.

Professor TOLLES indicated to the reporting agent that his sympathies in this case are with the Defense, and stated that he wished to make the point that the decision as to which State Department files he would copy or abstract was his alone, and that to his knowledge, ALGER FISS was in no way instrumental in determining which files he, TOLLES, should review or copy.



office for a short trial period but it was his feeling that the individual who had left the typewriter on trial had actually been THOMAS GRADY himself and that GRADY had followed up the trial period and subsequently sold the typewriter to the partnership. MARTIN had no independent recollection of any other person having been involved in the sale of the typewriter and he was positive that the typewriter was not traded in on a new one at any time during the life of the partnership.

JOHN CAROW, former manager of the Philadelphia agency for the Woodstock Typewriter Company, was recontacted with reference to the practice of using "junior salesmen" who would place typewriters for trial periods. CAROW advised this practice had been used to some extent and was subsequently able to advise that one such "junior salesman" employed by him between 1927 and 1929 was M. E. COHEN, who is now a second-hand typewriter dealer at New Brunswick, New Jersey. He was able to recall that COHEN covered a territory which included the Bullitt Building, which was the building occupied by the FANSLER-MARTIN partnership.

By teletype dated June 16, the Newark Office advised that M. E. COHEN had no independent recollection of the sale of a typewriter to FANSIER-MARTIN, but that he claimed he maintained a record of contacts made during 1927 and believed they were still located at the residence of his sister, Mrs. SAMUEL BECKMAN, 2430 North Myrtlewood Street, Philadelphia. COHEN advised the Newark Office he would make a search of any such records in Mrs. BECKMAN's possession.

On June 21, 1949, M. E. COHEN advised the reporting Agent that after an examination of all records remaining in his sister's possession, he was unable to locate any record concerning the sale of a typewriter to FANSLER-MARTIN. He pointed out that while he himself had the habit of saving many records, that his sister on the other hand, frequently threw out things which she felt were of no further value and that his sister had told him she had thrown out a great many records which he had left in her possession.

By teletype June 21st, the Baltimore Office set forth that investigation conducted at Chestertown, Maryland concerning the residence of AIGER HISS there during the summer of 1937, had developed certain information from Mrs. L. W. WICKES concerning the sub-lease of an apartment at her home by the HISS!. According to Mrs. WICKES, her son LEWIS, JR. had been ill of a broken back the year of the HISS visit. It was requested that the

Philadelphia Office contact WICKES in care of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, Philadelphia, to ascertain the dates of the back injury and any knowledge he might have of the presence of the HISS family at his mother's residence. It was established by the Philadelphia Office that LEWIN WICKES was at that time attending hearings for the Pennsylvania Railroad at the Interstate Commerce Commission in Washington, D. C. WICKES was subsequently located by the Washington Field Office and the results of his interview set forth in teletype of June 22nd.

By teletype dated June 24th, the New York Office requested WICKES again be contacted concerning the identity of the doctor who treated his broken back and the hospital wherein he had been confined.

LEWIN WICKES, JR. was interviewed at Philadelphia by Special Agent JOSEPH E. FLAHERTY, at which time he advised that he had first been treated for his back injury by a Dr. MURPHY, a physician for St. John's College, Annapolis. He further advised he had been confined at the only civilian hospital in Annapolis for a period of less than one week, at which time he had been removed to the University of Maryland Hospital at Baltimore, where he was under the care of a Dr. SHIPLEY. WICKES stated he could not recall the first names of either of the doctors.

Reference report indicated that additional effort would be made to determine the whereabouts of SOPHIA MINKIN through an informant.

Philadelphia Confidential Informant T-l advised Special Agent HCWARD W. AMOS that he had been unable to obtain any information relative to the whereabouts of SOPHIA MINKIN.
