A search of the FBI Headquarters electronic surveillance indices has been conducted, and no responsive record which indicates that Edwin Goldwasser has ever been the target of electronic surveillance was located.

This material is being provided to you at no charge.

To minimize costs to both you and the FBI, duplicate copies of the same document were not processed.

Records which may have been responsive to your request were destroyed on February 14, 2006 and November 11, 1977. Since this material could not be reviewed, it is not known if it was responsive to your request. Record retention and disposal is carried out under supervision of the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA), Title 44, United States Code, Section 3301 as implemented by Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1228; Title 44, United States Code, Section 3310 as implemented by Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1229.10.

For your information, a search of the indices to our Central Records System reflected there were additional records potentially responsive to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request. We have attempted to obtain this material so it could be reviewed to determine whether it was responsive to your request. We were advised that the potentially responsive records were not in their expected location and could not be located after a reasonable search. Following a reasonable waiting period, another attempt was made to obtain this material. This search for the missing records also met with unsuccessful results.

FBI FOIPA Addendum

- (ii) **National Security/Intelligence Records.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of national security and foreign intelligence records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1) and (b)(3) and PA exemption (j)(2) as applicable to requests for records about individuals [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2); 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i)(1)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3); 50 USC § 3024(i)(1). - (ii) **FBI Records**
Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) **Requests for Criminal History Records or “Rap Sheets.”** The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks –often referred to as a criminal history record or “rap sheets.” These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative “FBI file.” An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. - (iv) **The National Name Check Program (NNCP).** The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Please be advised that this is a service provided to other federal agencies. Private citizens cannot request a name check.

- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

In the material regarding Robert Alden Cornog, a memorandum dated 3-30-45 from James A. Kilgore, Special Agent, CIC, to the Officer in Charge, entitled Martin Kamen, states that Dr. Cornog was in contact with Edwin L. Goldwasser, 1200 24th Avenue, San Francisco, [redacted] was Secretary of the Science for Victory Committee. It further states "Although no evidence of Goldwasser's Communist sympathies has been discovered, it is known that he associates with Frank and Sandra Collins, both of whom are known to be members of the Communist Party. In a letter to Dr. Cornog dated 2 February 1944, Goldwasser indicated that he had some information as to the location and purpose of Project Y." (100-344485-2)

According to Mr. TILLINGHAST, the applicant during the period that he knew him, enjoyed an excellent reputation and he considered him a loyal and reliable citizen. Mr. TILLINGHAST further explained that the applicant's father, I. EDWIN GOLDWASSER, was prominent in public and civic affairs as a member of the Board of Regents, New York School Department. He stated that the applicant's father was also an executive of the Commercial Factor Corporation, 2 Park Avenue, New York City. Mr. TILLINGHAST said that the applicant came from an unquestionable background, and he volunteered the information that he was positive that the applicant and his family had no subversive tendencies.

Mr. TILLINGHAST added that he had not seen the applicant in approximately ten years. He stated that he would highly recommend him for a position of trust.

Mr. THEODORE DOOLEY, Board of Education, National Defense Training Program, Textile High School, 381 West 18th Street, advised that the records of the National Defense Training Program reflect that EDWIN LEO GOLDWASSER was born on March 9, 1919 at New York City, and attended Textile High School, taking a Machine Shop course under this Program from November 20, 1940 to December 23, 1940. He stated that the record reflects that the applicant attended Harvard College and obtained a degree in Physics from that school. His local address was listed as 135 Central Park West.

Mr. DOOLEY stated there was nothing unfavorable in the record pertaining to GOLDWASSER, and he further advised that the identity of the applicant's instructors at this school was not available.

Miss ANNE BEROWSKY, Clerk, Professional School, Registrar's Office, Columbia University, New York City, advised Special Agent Vernon G. Smith that her records reflect that the applicant attended the Engineering Department at Columbia University as a non-matriculated student in Electrical Engineering in February, 1941, until June, 1941. This record reflects the applicant's date of birth as March 9, 1919; his local address as 51 Manhattan Avenue, New York City; his previous education as a BA degree, Harvard College, 1940.

Mr. A. T. SCHWAB, Assistant to the Dean, Engineering Department, Columbia University, advised Special Agent Vernon G. Smith that he was not acquainted with the applicant and there was no additional information in his files pertaining to GOLDWASSER. Mr. SCHWAB advised that a review of the applicant's transcript reflected that there were no persons present at Columbia University who taught GOLDWASSER. He added that GOLDWASSER was a non-matriculated student, and little would have been known about him by his instructors inasmuch as he was not a candidate for a degree.

WALTER A. CERRY, Professor, Electrical Engineering Department, Columbia University, advised Special Agent Vernon G. Smith that he did not recall the applicant.

Employment

Mr. NORMAN MYERS, President, Clinton Cotton Inc., 271 Church Street, advised that he had employed the applicant as a sales clerk in a temporary capacity during the Summer of 1939. Mr. MYERS advised that at that time he was President of the Langerre Sales Company at 350 Broadway, and that this company was dissolved in 1940. He further explained that the applicant had secured a temporary position with this company from approximately June, 1939 until September, 1939, at which time he returned to Harvard College.

Mr. MYERS said that he was well acquainted with the applicant's father, I. EDWIN GOLDWASSER, who was presently a Vice-President of the Commercial Factor Corporation. He stated that in his opinion, the applicant is definitely a loyal American of excellent character and reputation. He said that the applicant had a wholesome American background and that his father was highly regarded in New York City as a civic-minded, substantial citizen. Mr. MYERS stated that he considers all members of the GOLDWASSER family loyal and respectable people, and he considered the applicant qualified for a position of trust and responsibility.

Mr. ROBERT L. HEILBRONER, 231 East 20 Street, New York City, a free-lance writer, advised that he had been the applicant's roommate at Harvard College from 1936 to 1940.

He added that all members of the applicant's family, from his contact with them as a neighbor, appear to be loyal, respectable people.

Mr. VAN BERGH stated that he knew nothing derogatory pertaining to any member of the GOLDWASSER family.

Mr. DAVID BLAUVELT, superintendent, advised that the GOLDWASSER family have resided at this address for approximately twenty years. He stated that he was acquainted with the applicant during the period he attended school, and advised that he regarded the applicant as a well-mannered, studious young man of excellent character and reputation.

In Mr. BLAUVELT's opinion, the applicant and all members of his family are loyal Americans.

FRANK MILCH and LOUIS JENTZEN, doormen, 135 Central Park West, advised that the GOLDWASSER family are desirable tenants of excellent character and reputation. They stated that the applicant, during his period of residence here, which was established as 1930 to 1936 and from 1940 to 1941, was a quiet, conservative individual of excellent character and reputation. They added that all members of the GOLDWASSER family are reliable and respectable in every way, and they know nothing unfavorable pertaining to them.

This report indicates that information concerning subject CORNOG was furnished at El Paso Field Division from the files of the DSM Project at Los Alamos, New Mexico, where CORNOG was employed as a key scientist. These files indicate that on February 4, 1944 a letter was addressed to Dr. R. CORNOG bearing the return address of EDWIN L. GOLDWASSER, 1200-24th Avenue, San Francisco 22, California. The following information was obtained from this correspondence by the military censorship:

"I have heard just enough whisperings and rumors about Project Y in New Mexico that my curiosity is aroused and interest fully aroused. I wasn't even a hair surprised to find that both you and PAUL (OLUM) were down there but I have no idea at all about just what the work consists of. I realize that it is impossible for you to enlighten me until a lot more definite decisions are reached. Accordingly, I shall trust you and PAUL that you would not ask me in it were not pretty interesting and useful work"

Miss MABLE YOUNG, Administrative Assistant, Department of Physics, University of California, advised that the applicant has been a graduate student of Physics since the Fall of 1945 and that during that time he has been highly regarded, both as a student and as an assistant teacher in Physics. She stated that the applicant was a man of good character, whose loyalty to this country is unquestioned, and whose associates are respectable people.

HARVEY E. WHITE, Professor of Physics, University of California, advised that he has been acquainted with the applicant for the past five years, and that he considers him to be a very likeable young man of excellent character and whose loyalty to this country is undoubted. WHITE stated that he has only known the applicant in classes and in physics research, therefore, his associates are unknown to him. WHITE stated that he would recommend applicant.

WILLIAM B. FRETTER, Assistant Professor of Physics, University of California, advised that he has known the applicant for the past several years, both as a student and as a teaching assistant in the Physics Department. He stated that he believes the applicant to be a person of good character, who is loyal to this country and whose associates are respectable people. He stated that he would recommend the applicant.

LEONARD LOEB, Professor of Physics, University of California, advised that he has known the applicant since about 1944, when the applicant was transferred to his command in work for the United States Navy. LOEB stated that he was the Senior Scientist in charge of Degaussing Services for the U. S. Navy, and the applicant had been transferred to his command in 1944 to take charge of the "watch list".

LOEB stated that the applicant had done his undergraduate work at Columbia, where he had made only fair grades, and that during the war he had volunteered for technical duty in the Ordnance Department. LOEB further stated that when he was sent overseas the applicant became head physicist in the Degaussing Services. LOEB indicated that he became well acquainted with the applicant and that he had considered him one of his most trusted employees. After the war, according to LOEB, the applicant had entered the University of California as a graduate student and had become a very fine physicist. He stated that the applicant was a loyal American citizen, whose character was of the highest and whose associates were respectable people. He further stated that he has never heard anything unfavorable concerning the applicant and that he would highly recommend him.

EMPLOYMENT

The following investigation was conducted by SA FLOYD B.

BARRUS:

AT VALLEJO, CALIFORNIA

Records of the U. S. Navy Shipyard, Mare Island, reflect applicant to have been employed as a physicist in the Office of the Assistant Industrial Manager, Ferry Building, San Francisco, California, from October 25, 1943 to October 26, 1945, when he voluntarily terminated and indicated his intention of continuing his education. His birth data as appearing in these records were found to be identical to those set out on the PSQ.

The records reflected applicant to have resided at 3201 Washington Street, San Francisco, during this employment, and they contained no information of a derogatory nature.

Mr. ELMER H. GOULD, JR., Civilian Assistant Shop Superintendent, Mare Island, who during World War II was a Naval officer attached to the Office of Assistant Industrial Manager, Ferry Building, San Francisco, advised that he vaguely recalled applicant being employed as a civilian in this operation. He stated that he was not well enough acquainted to comment as to his character, loyalty or association.

The following investigation was conducted by SA STANLEY F.

FENSTER:

AT SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

Mr. ROBERT M. FINCHER, Office of Naval Research, Hunters Point, formerly U. S. Navy Commander, advised that he was Executive Officer of the Assistant Industrial Manager, U. S. Navy, Ferry Building, during World War II. Mr. FINCHER stated he had been acquainted with the applicant for approximately one year and recalled that the applicant was a mild, retiring individual, who was exceedingly capable and who did an outstanding job. Due to his limited association with applicant, he was unable to furnish any information regarding associations, character or loyalty, but stated that applicant would necessarily have been cleared by some intelligence agency due to his handling of confidential data.

Mr. HOWARD W. DAVIS, Hunters Point, advised that he formerly was employed by the U. S. Navy in the Electronics Department, Ferry Building, San Francisco, during the war, but was not acquainted with the applicant.

Mr. GEORGE G. TITZELL, JR., 3150 Pacific Avenue, advised that he formerly resided at 2210 Vallejo Street and was a retired mining engineer. He recalled that the applicant and his wife resided in the apartment of Mr. and Mrs. JESSIE H. STEINHART, 2212 Vallejo Street, for approximately two or three months sometime in 1943. It was his recollection that the STEINHARTs were personally acquainted with applicant and allowed him to use their apartment when the applicant was unable to secure housing on arrival from the East. Mr. TITZELL, JR. stated he believed applicant to be an electrical engineer sent to San Francisco to work on degaussing ships. He declined to make any statement regarding applicant's character, reputation or loyalty, due to the short period of his acquaintanceship.

Mrs. JESSIE STEINHART, 2212 Vallejo Street, President of the American Cancer Society, San Francisco, advised that her husband is a good friend of applicant's father, who resides in New York City, and that they met applicant and his wife for the first time on arrival in San Francisco in 1943. As they were unable to locate housing and as Mr. and Mrs. STEINHART were living out of the city, they allowed the applicant the use of their apartment at the above address for a period of approximately four or five months in 1943.

Mrs. STEINHART stated she has not seen the applicant since 1943 and due to her short acquaintanceship was unable to furnish any information regarding applicant's character and loyalty to the United States.

Mrs. ROBERT H. BRADEN, 1950 Clay Street, advised that she has known applicant's parents for over thirty years, that applicant's father was formerly Assistant Superintendent of Schools in New York City and was active in social work for many years. After leaving the teaching profession, applicant's father entered private business and was very successful.

Mrs. BRADEN advised that she is not intimately acquainted with the applicant and his wife, whom she met in 1944, at which time applicant's parents were visiting San Francisco. She stated that applicant is considered exceedingly brilliant, is a good family man, and that she has no doubt regarding his character; however, she declined to furnish any information regarding loyalty due to their limited association.

The following individuals were contacted in the neighborhood of 1200 - 24th Avenue, a former residence of applicant, none of whom were acquainted with the applicant:

Mrs. RAY KAUFMAN, 1220 - 24th Avenue, advised that she had been casually acquainted with the applicant and his wife, but was unable to furnish any information other than the fact that applicant was a student at the University of California.

AT BERKELEY, CALIFORNIA

Mrs. GERTRUDE V. CHISHOLM, 1221 Walnut Street, advised she has been acquainted with the applicant and his family for approximately three years; that they own their own home and appear to be fine people. Applicant, according to Mrs. CHISHOLM, is studying at the University of California for his Ph.D. and has been visited by his and his wife's parents, both of New York, on several occasions. She was unable to furnish any information, declining to make any statement regarding applicant's loyalty to the United States due to limited association. Mrs. CHISHOLM stated, however, that she has never heard any comment that would lead her to believe that applicant was not a loyal American.

Mrs. LEONORE SCHOTT, 1215 Walnut Street, advised that she is a nurse and has known the applicant for approximately three years. After meeting the applicant and his wife, Mrs. SCHOTT learned that her family and the applicant's family had been acquainted with each other for over thirty years in New York City. Mrs. SCHOTT advised that applicant's father devotes considerable time to the Joint Distribution Committee in New York, a Jewish welfare organization, of which her brother, PAUL BAERWALD, was Chairman. Mrs. SCHOTT stated her brother, PAUL BAERWALD, and applicant's father were both bankers and that Mrs. GOLDWASSER had formerly been active in a children's nursery school in Berkeley. She stated she was unable to furnish any information regarding applicant's membership in any organization, stating that she considers applicant's character, association and loyalty to the United States above reproach and would not hesitate recommending him for any position.

Mr. A. E. PETERSON, 1214 Walnut Street, stated he was not acquainted with the applicant or his family.

Mrs. M. P. ZEHREN, 1233 Walnut Street, advised she has known applicant and family casually for approximately three years, and that they came from New York and applicant attended the University of California and is believed to be a teacher. She stated they are family people, appearing to be very devoted to their three children, but due to her limited contact with the applicant she is unable to furnish any information regarding loyalty.

Mrs. HOWARD CADY, 520 Cragmont, Berkeley, advised that she has known the applicant and his wife, whom she referred to as "NED", for four years, having met Mrs. GOLDWASSER at the Children's Community Center, Inc. school on Walnut Street, Berkeley, California, where both Mrs. CADY and Mrs. GOLDWASSER voluntarily assisted at the school. To Mrs. CADY's knowledge, neither Mr. nor Mrs. GOLDWASSER belonged to any clubs or organizations and recommended them very highly. She stated that the parents of applicant and the parents of applicant's wife, who reside in New York City, are prosperous and well known and that the applicant and his wife have three children. She considers applicant to be a loyal American citizen and a man of good character.

Mr. HOWARD CADY described applicant as an extremely honest, sincere, and trustworthy individual and a loyal American citizen. He also said applicant is known by the name "NED."

Dr. JOHN W. OTVOS, 89 Kingston Road, advised that he is a chemist, employed by the Shell Development Company, Emeryville, California, and has known the applicant since 1936, at which time both attended Harvard University. Mr. OTVOS stated he had not seen applicant between the years 1939 and 1946, at which time they accidentally met on the University of California campus. Since that time Mr. OTVOS has seen applicant socially approximately every two months and learned that applicant during the past war had been employed as a civilian employee of the U. S. Navy, degaussing ships.

Mr. OTVOS advised that both he and the applicant are members of the "Federation of American Scientists," which organization, he stated, was set up to advise the people of the country regarding atomic energy, which development the scientists had achieved.

Mr. OTVOS stated he would trust applicant explicitly with any Government or secret information, pointing out that applicant during the period of World War II had access to such information. He stated that in no way did he question the applicant's honesty, character, or loyalty to the United States.

ORGANIZATIONS AND ASSOCIATES

The San Francisco Bay Area Science for Victory Committee, which is more commonly referred to as the Science for Victory Committee, had its origin some time during the summer of 1943.

In a press release prior to the Committee's first open forum, the Committee stated: "The aim of the Committee is to clarify and create an interest in the broad issues around the scientific role in the present conflict and the effects of the impact of war mobilization upon the scientific professions. The Science for Victory Committee is composed of scientists from the San Francisco Bay Area who are endeavoring to take practical steps toward the most effective use of the Bay Area scientific facilities and manpower in the war effort."

This letter reflected that the Committee would hold a meeting on January 11, 1944, at 2683 LeConte Avenue, Berkeley, California, to make definite plans for a forthcoming forum on the Kilgore Bill S-702. The letter reflects that [REDACTED] signed the letter as "Secretary." San Francisco T-3 declined to furnish a signed statement or appear before any hearing which might be afforded the applicant.

The records of the University of California, Berkeley, reflect that RALPH HARELSON GUNDLACH was a substitute professor in the Department of Psychology, his term to expire June 30, 1943. He formerly was employed at the University of Washington and the University of Illinois.

San Francisco T-4, of known reliability, advised that RALPH GUNDLACH was a member of the Communist Political Association, Seattle, Washington, in August 1945.

San Francisco T-5, of known reliability, advised that RALPH GUNDLACH was active in the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee in Seattle, Washington in August 1945.

San Francisco T-6, of known reliability, advised that RALPH GUNDLACH was to attend the Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee Conference in Mexico as a delegate of the San Francisco Bay Area.

Professor LUIS MONGUIO on December 16, 1942, in an interview regarding another matter, advised that he had served many years in the Spanish Diplomatic Corps and during the recent Civil War in Spain had served on the side of the Loyalists as a Lieutenant, and later in Spanish Army Intelligence. He came to San Francisco in 1939 and was associated with the University of California as a Professor, later transferring to Mills College, Oakland, California.

San Francisco T-17, of known reliability, furnished information reflecting that DR. LUIS MONGUIO addressed a Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee meeting at the Berkeley Women's City Club on February 21, 1943.

The Berkeley Police Department advised on March 27, 1943, that an informant, known to them as reliable, but whose identity they declined to reveal, and who was well acquainted with LUIS MONGUIO, stated that he was satisfied that MONGUIO was not only a Communist Party sympathizer, but was a member of the Communist Party.

The Attorney General of the United States has declared the Communist Political Association, the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, and the Young Communist League to come within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

San Francisco T-7 of known reliability, advised that he had formerly been a member of the Communist Party in Berkeley, California, in 1942 and 1943 and identified the above individuals with the exception of Dr. CHARLES L. COLLINS, JOHN SCHUYTEN and ROSE SEGURE, as being members of the same Communist Party Club in Berkeley, California.

San Francisco T-8 of known reliability, advised that CHARLES L. COLLINS was a member of the Communist Political Association of Alameda County in 1944.

San Francisco T-21, of known reliability, advised that ROSE SEGURE was present at a meeting of the Albany Club of the Communist Party held on September 25, 1947.

The San Francisco Examiner newspaper of November 5, 1947, reflects that ROSE SEGURE was labeled as "one of the most dangerous agents in this country," which statement was made by California State Senator JACK B. TENNEY during the State Un-American Activities Committee Hearing held in Oakland, California, during November 1947. While on the stand ROSE SEGURE admitted that she was the organizer of the CIO Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians from early 1943 until late 1944. She stated that "one of my duties, among others, was to give a certain amount of service to a small local of technicians and scientific workers at the University of California Radiation Laboratory."

San Francisco T-1 reported in November, 1943, that

The Joint Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities in California, Senator JACK B. TENNEY, Chairman, in its Third Report, 1947, cited the Daily People's World as a Communist paper.

San Francisco T-18, of known reliability, advised that BERNADETTE DOYLE in 1943 was a full-time Party functionary, a member of the California State Committee of the Communist Party, and Organizational Secretary of the Communist Party of Alameda County.

The Attorney General has declared the Communist Party within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

San Francisco T-18, on August 2, 1944, advised that BERNADETTE DOYLE, Communist Party Functionary in Oakland, California, was pleased with the fact that the services of JOHN SCHUYTEN and DAVID ADELSON had been secured as teachers for the California Labor School.

The Attorney General has declared the California Labor School as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

San Francisco T-22, of known reliability, advised in February, 1948, that EDWIN L. GOLDWASSER, 1200 - 24th Avenue, San Francisco, California, had appeared on a membership list of the Federation of American Scientists.

Applicant's PSQ form reflects that he was a member of the Federation of American Scientists from January 1946 to December 1946.

San Francisco T-19, of known reliability, advised that BURGESS COGILL, 29 Idora Avenue, San Francisco, received correspondence on April 26, 1945, from an individual residing at 1200 - 24th Avenue, San Francisco, California. Informant was unable to furnish any additional information regarding this matter and declined to furnish a signed statement or appear before any hearing board.

San Francisco T-20, of known reliability, advised that BURGESS COGILL was present at a closed meeting on October 14, 1944, conducted by ROBERT MINOR, National Vice President of the Communist Party, which meeting was held in San Francisco. T-20 declined to furnish a signed statement or appear before any hearing board.

The applicant on his PSQ form stated that he resided at 1200 - 24th Avenue, San Francisco, from February, 1944, to June, 1946.

San Francisco T-9, of known reliability, on February 26, 1948, furnished a list of the names of petition circulators for the Independent Progressive Party of Alameda County. Included in this list was EDWIN GOLDWASSER, 1219 Walnut Street, Berkeley, Prec. 151.

San Francisco T-23, who is familiar with subversive organizations and individuals in the Berkeley, California area, and who is of known reliability, advised that EDWIN GOLDWASSER, 1219 Walnut Street, Berkeley, California, as of February 26, 1948, was a petition circulator for the Independent Progressive Party, Alameda County, and as of November 26, 1947 was a member of the Progressive Citizens of America, Berkeley Chapter.

The Independent Progressive Party was cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report 1948, page 41 and 62, as "among typical mass organizations that are victims of Communist domination". It was described by this committee as one of the basic Communist fronts in a coalition under the banner of the Third Party movement to elect HENRY WALLACE President of the United States.

San Francisco T-14, T-15 and T-16, of known reliability, and all of whom are members of the Communist Party, reported that the Communist Party in San Francisco gave priority to the project of securing sufficient signatures to place the Independent Progressive Party on the ballot in California, and that the members of the various Communist Party clubs participated in the circulation of petitions under the supervision of Communist Party functionaries.

Applicant in his PSQ stated that he had been a member of the Progressive Citizens of America, San Francisco, California, from January 1946 to September 1948, and had not been an officer of the organization.

San Francisco T-10, of known reliability, furnished a mimeographed letter issued by the "Progressive Citizens of America - Berkeley Chapter, 2161 Shattuck Avenue, Room 114, dated November 26, 1947". The letter announced the annual meeting for the election of chapter officers and the Board of Directors, which election was to be held December 2, 1947 at the Burbank Evening School Auditorium. The letter reflects that fifteen members were to be elected to the Board of Directors, "EDWIN GOLDWASSER", Indian Rock, being among ten individuals listed and recommended by the nominating committee for the Board of Directors of the Progressive Citizens of America.

San Francisco T-11 and T-12, of known reliability, who have been associated with the Communist Party, advised in December 1946 the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions, and the National Citizens Political Action Committee, together with several other individual groups, merged to form the Progressive Citizens of America in December 1946. These informants state the Communist Party supports the Progressive Citizens of America and has urged its members on various occasions to support this organization.

San Francisco T-2 and T-13, of known reliability, who are members of the Communist Party, have advised that the Progressive Citizens of America in San Francisco is dominated, influenced and controlled by the members of the Communist Party.

San Francisco T-2 and T-3, of known reliability, who are familiar with Communist Party activities in the Oakland-Berkeley area, advised that they are not acquainted with either applicant or

SA MELVIN McRAE JETT has advised that during the two year period from September 1944 to June 1946 that he resided as a next door neighbor of applicant at 1212 24th Avenue, San Francisco, California, he found applicant to be a man of good moral character. He was honest, reliable and dependable.

However, shortly after he moved to 1212 24th Avenue,

brought up the subject of racial segregation in the South. During this discussion SA JETT explained the conditions of racial segregation in the South, but did not attempt to defend them. expressed a very bitter feeling toward racial segregation and from the discussion it was apparent that her only knowledge of conditions in the South was gained from propoganda commonly expressed by Communists or Communist sympathizers. As a result of this discussion, SA JETT searched the San Francisco indices and found a number of references under the name of NED He then directed a memo to the SAC of San Francisco advising him that applicant was a neighbor of his and if active investigation was desired, he might be of assistance due to the location of his home. SA JETT was advised by SA KING, Supervisor of the "C" Squad, that the file citations had been checked and that there was no indication that applicant were members of the Communist Party, but that the citation referred to meetings that were attended by applicant which meetings were also attended by known Communists. It should also be recalled, that at that time every effort was being made by the Bureau, not to divulge that Communist Party investigations were being conducted by the FBI. For these reasons, no efforts were made by SA JETT to discuss controversial issues with applicant and they, knowing that SA JETT was employed by the FBI, also refrained from expressing their views on such matters. It was also noted that applicant were very careful never to mention names of any of their associates.

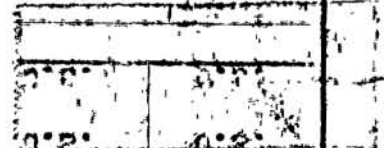

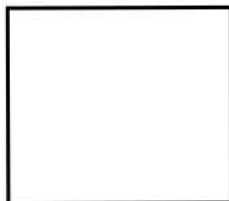

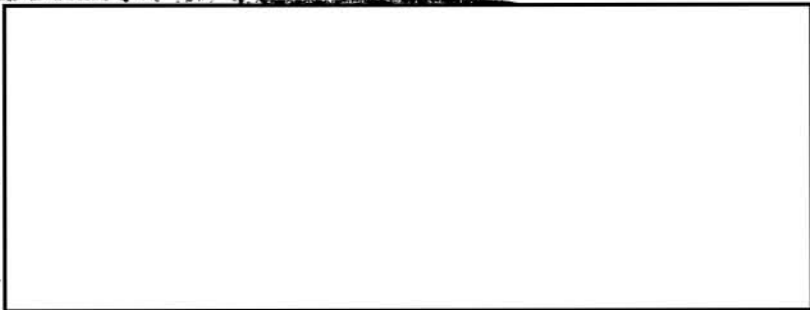

Our files disclose that Mr. Goldwasser, who is also known as Edwin Leo Goldwasser, was the subject of applicant-type investigations conducted by the FBI in 1950 and 1963. These investigations disclosed that during the 1940's Mr. Goldwasser was a member of the Science for Victory Committee (SVC), an organization then described as dominated by communists and communist sympathizers. Mr. Goldwasser was subsequently interviewed by FBI Agents at which time he admitted membership in the SVC but denied that this organization was communist dominated or influenced.

In addition, during these investigations of Mr. Goldwasser, it was reported that he was a petition circulator for the Independent Progressive Party, Alameda County, California, in 1947, and that he had once attended, during December, 1943, a benefit party for the Joint—Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee (JAFRC). The Progressive Party, including its California branches, has been cited "...as one of the largest and most successful fronts ever created by the communists," according to the House Committee on Un-American Activities. The JAFRC is an organization that has been cited by the Department of Justice pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

This organization has been cited as a communist front by the California Joint Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities.

Since the investigations of Mr. Goldwasser, no pertinent derogatory information has come to our attention concerning his activities.

Civil fingerprints were located in the files of the FBI Identification Division which may be identical with those of Mr. Goldwasser. These fingerprints were searched through the criminal files of the Identification Division and no arrest record was located.

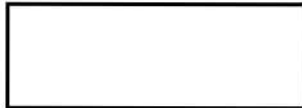
