

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c) (2006 & Supp. IV (2010))]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.

- (iii) **Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets.** The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks – often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheets. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative “FBI file.” An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. - (iv) **The National Name Check Program (NNCP).** The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. - (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

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In followup to my conversation with [redacted] on Wednesday, October 9: On Tuesday, October 8, about 3:00 PM, an anonymous lady called and was put through to me. She mentioned that she had some information that would be "of real interest to Senator Denton on a matter that she knows is getting a lot of attention right now." Other than that, I had no idea about what she was talking, but she sounded like she really might know something, so instead of disregarding her like we do a lot of times, I agreed to meet her that evening at 6:30 at the Sheraton Parkwater Park South. I only knew at that time that her name was [redacted]

At the Sheraton we talked. She spoke in very vague and general terms about knowing some information that we needed to know. Finally after a while, she began to get more specific. She told us she had been at one week of training at [redacted] temporary school in early September. She dropped out mid-way due to exhaustion and not having the physical capability at that time to finish it. She talked about "this the man who was interviewed on TV about [redacted] school: "I'm going to get him. He needs to keep his nose out of this." She responded, "That would be okay to do something like that." He said, "Well, he's got kids." She said, "You wouldn't hurt children because of something he may be doing." He said, "Well, I know they are grown."

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She also told us that this same man is stock-piling weapons, ammo, the large, military-type containers of ammunition, and is in the process of obtaining a passport or visa to South Africa. She now recalls no comment that he wanted to "take care of Bishop Tutu." She didn't go a lot further into detail about that but made us believe she knew more.

Actually, she inferred that she acquired his kindness through her feminine prowess. She is impressed with [redacted] and thinks he is a brilliant man, but at the same time, thinks he may have dishonorable intentions with his temporary school. She said that while she remained in early September that there were numerous other foreign nations in her class, even a couple of East Germans. I told her, "As I understand it, people like that must be approved through the State Department." She said, "Well, don't you think they can get in even if they want to, without that?"

Her friend going to South Africa apparently is not the only mission of what she has knowledge. She referred to others in Central America and other countries.

She asked me what it would be worth to us to have an undercover person in [redacted] school. I told her, "That is nothing. There are hundreds of people who have gone to that school and you are not the only one willing to talk." (I was trying to get her to give me more details instead of just generalization.) What finally came out of the whole conversation is that for a price she wants to work with us as a "paid informant" as [redacted] and these various other unnamed persons. I asked her if she was financially strapped and is that why she needed money. She said, "No, that is not the reason." I asked her why she got involved in this school to begin with. She told me [redacted] and had always wanted a "change of pace." I think it's just the fantasy of being a spy that she is fascinated by. She has been familiar with the mercenary school for the last three or four years and not just during this recent surge of media attention. She told me she lived until [redacted] which is [redacted]

This lady's name is [redacted] She is about [redacted] pounds. [redacted] I told [redacted] I believe she was capable of making it through the school by looking at her, but as she admitted, she dropped out after the first week.

I told her that I didn't know her from Adam's housecat so I could not believe her credibility and how did I know that she wasn't just some nut. I asked her if she could give me three names of people who know her and could give me a reference on her if I were to call them and ask for a reference for something like a job at a hospital. She gave me three for which I have names and addresses: one is a mother's friend; second one is a next-door neighbor of the mother; and third one is [redacted] friend of hers.

The home (duplex) she is staying [redacted] which is [redacted] I don't have her exact street address but it is located [redacted] Her phone number is [redacted] and mailing address is [redacted] [redacted] (she told me his name and I can't remember it right now - I will find out). She has [redacted] who apparently lives with her. Her mother (not sure about father) lives in [redacted] phone [redacted] She also said she is [redacted] She has lots of kinfolks in that area.

I don't really know how to read this lady. She seems very sensible and "together," if you can classify someone who has been through that mercenary school as "together." Still, she wants to be very coy and vague about what she says and seems to really be fascinated with the idea of being an undercover and paid informant. When she finished talking that night after 1 1/2 hours, I asked her to call me back Wednesday afternoon at 4:00

after I had talked with my office. She had requested to be able to talk with Senator DeLoach about all of this. I told her to begin with that was impossible - that he would never be directly involved with something like this. If we went further with this, it would be through staff. I explained to her that our subcommittee on Security and Terrorism is not a truly investigative organization. That more than likely we would be referring her to the State Department, CIA, FBI, etc. I discussed with her how she felt about her safety and her well-being if she were to turn into a paid informant. She didn't seem to be afraid of any consequences.

I finally talked with [redacted] Wednesday afternoon at 4:00. [redacted] never called back. She may not, but even as [redacted] recommended, it is probably best that someone be in touch with her to find out more about what she knows about these threats to other people and the Senator.

I will be willing to do whatever you ask me to guide whoever back to her. She probably trusts me. I don't think she even knows my last name unless she asked the receptionist when she called.

[REDACTED] ALSO ADVISED THAT THE SENATOR IS CURRENTLY OUT OF TOWN AND TRAVELING THROUGHOUT THE STATE OF ALABAMA AND WILL BE TRAVELING THERE FOR APPROXIMATELY ONE WEEK. THE SENATOR IS TO APPEAR IN LANETT, ALABAMA, ON FEBRUARY 14, 1986, FOR A TOWN MEETING. THE TOWN MEETING IS TO TAKE PLACE AT APPROXIMATELY 3:00 P.M. [REDACTED] ALSO ADVISED THAT THE SUBJECT IS KNOWN TO THE SENATOR AND MEMBERS OF HIS STAFF DUE TO THE FACT THAT THEY HAVE HAD PRIOR CORRESPONDENCE WITH HIM CONCERNING HIS MILITARY RECORD. AT THE TIME OF THE ORIGINAL INTERVIEW WITH [REDACTED] HE INDICATED THAT HE DID NOT WANT THE CAPITOL HILL POLICE INVOLVED IN THE SUBSEQUENT INVESTIGATION.

30 days to correct my military records. If they are not corrected within that time, then I'll do what I have to do. I hate that you have let this matter come to this." This letter is dated 2/4/86 and signed by the subject.

[redacted] stated that this alone does not convey a real threat, however, [redacted]

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[redacted] stated that the subject resides in Lanett, Alabama, and that the Senator's Office has been working with the subject in attempting to clarify the subject's discharge status with the U. S. AIR FORCE. According to [redacted] the subject was court martialed and discharged from the AIR FORCE on 5/13/58 and since has been drawing a disability from the VETERANS ADMINISTRATION. The subject feels that he should have been honored with a retirement certificate, rather than being discharged.

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Senator DENTON's Office has corresponded with the DEPARTMENT OF AIR FORCE and they have been advised that they are unable to issue the subject a retirement certificate, as he requests. This, according to [redacted] has precipitated the remarks set forth in the letter dated 2/4/86.

[redacted] stated that he is somewhat concerned, as the Senator has scheduled a visit to the town of Lanett, Alabama, for 2/14/86, and that postcards have been sent to all known residents of that community notifying them of DENTON's visit.

On this same date, First Assistant United States Attorney [redacted] Northern District of Alabama, Birmingham, Alabama, was contacted and apprised of the statements made by the subject in enclosed letters, at which time he stated that he would defer prosecutive opinion to the Middle District of Alabama, as venue regarding an extortion violation would lie in that district.

Upon receipt of any additional information from Senator DENTON's Office, Birmingham will forward same to FBIHQ and interested offices.

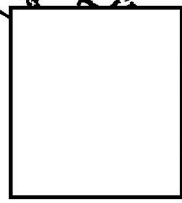

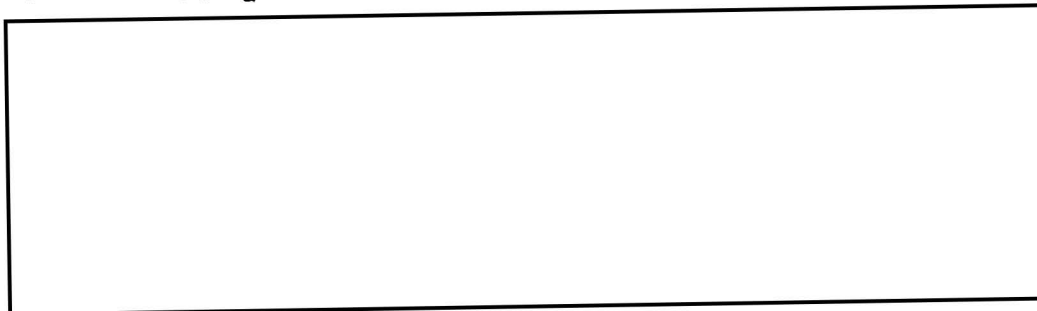

AUDLEY (NO MIDDLE NAME) CHAPPELL, 223 South 15th Street, Lanett, Alabama, Telephone No. 205/644-4879, was advised of the identity of [redacted] as a Special Agent for the Federal Bureau of Investigation. CHAPPELL was advised the nature of the interview concerned a threatening letter dated February 4, 1986, which he mailed to Senator JEREMIAH DENTON, Huntsville, Alabama. CHAPPELL advised as follows:

CHAPPELL served in the United States Army as a Private First Class from 1937 until 1940. He became a Staff Sergeant in the United States Air Force and served from 1942 until 1958. During the years from 1942 to 1945, CHAPPELL served as a Combat Airman in a B-24 Bomber Aircraft in North Africa. ~~As a result of the aerial combat, CHAPPELL developed a nervous condition and was admitted to the hospital. He remained in the hospital for a short time and returned to combat duty. CHAPPELL remained in the United States Air Force and was on active duty at Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama, during 1953.~~

CHAPPELL was court-martialed by the United States Air Force during 1953, for being intoxicated on duty. He was found guilty and was reduced in rank to Airman Second Class. In addition, CHAPPELL was fined a total of \$300 in connection with the court-martial. In 1958, CHAPPELL received an honorable discharge from the United States Air Force for medical reasons. He made available a medical board report dated April 9, 1958, Parks Air Force Base, California, which contained the following diagnosis of his medical disability:

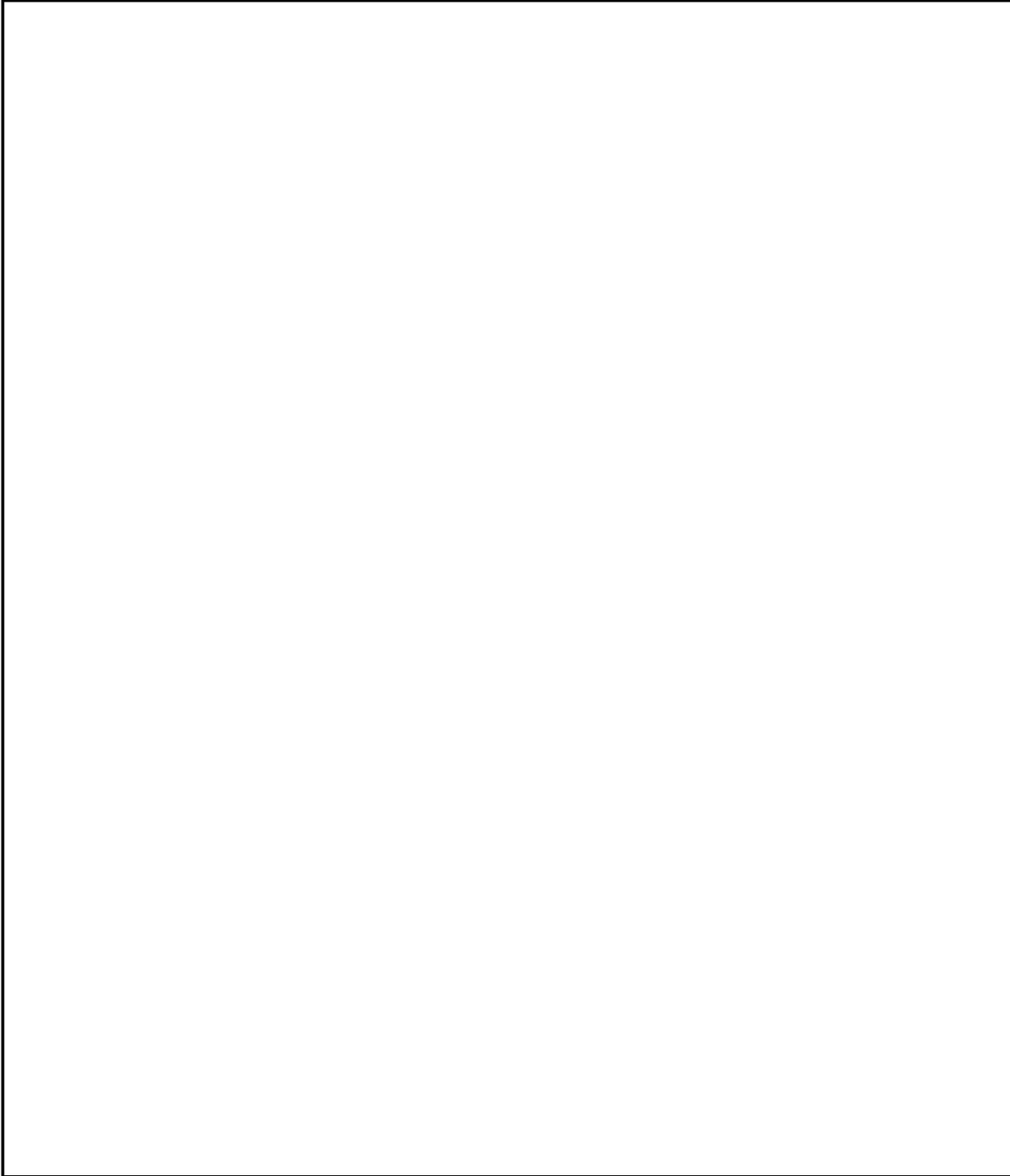

The United States Air Force Board rendered CHAPPELL unfit for duty and recommended that he be discharged from the United States Air Force on a 10 percent disability on May 13, 1958.

CHAPPELL was discharged from the United States Air Force instead of being retired. The method in which he was discharged does not allow CHAPPELL certain privileges which he would have enjoyed if he had been retired from the United States Air Force. CHAPPELL has been writing letters to various Senators and the United States Air Force since 1958 in an attempt to get the matter resolved. CHAPPELL has been unable to get any results from his letters to date.

Approximately two or three years ago, CHAPPELL began writing letters to Senator JEREMIAH DENTON requesting his assistance in having his military records corrected. CHAPPELL was shown a copy of a letter dated February 4, 1986, which was addressed to [redacted] Staff Assistant, Office of Senator JEREMIAH DENTON, Huntsville, Alabama. CHAPPELL identified the letter as his most recent correspondence with Senator JEREMIAH DENTON's Office. CHAPPELL was referred to a section which stated: "I can assure you that if he is not stopped before the next election, we will stop him then. [redacted] everybody works better with a deadline to meet. I am going to give you and your Senator Denton 30 days to correct my military records. If they are not corrected within that time, then I'll do what I have to do. I hate that you have let this matter come to this." CHAPPELL explained that he meant in his letter that he would not vote for Senator DENTON again when he made reference to stopping him before the next election. CHAPPELL referred to his sentence containing the statement, "I'll do what I have to do" as meaning that he would acquire an attorney and take legal action against the United States Government if the matter was not corrected within a 30-day period. CHAPPELL emphasized that he did not have any intention of harming Senator JEREMIAH DENTON or anyone else connected to the matter involving his military records. He noted that he did not realize that his letter contained a threatening tone. CHAPPELL stated he is well aware of the penalties involving extortion in matters relating to threatening letters. CHAPPELL again stated that he has no intention to harm Senator DENTON and does not plan to contact Senator DENTON on February 14, 1986, at the town meeting in Lanett, Alabama. CHAPPELL advised that he plans to secure an attorney and handle any further request with the United States Air Force through legal channels.

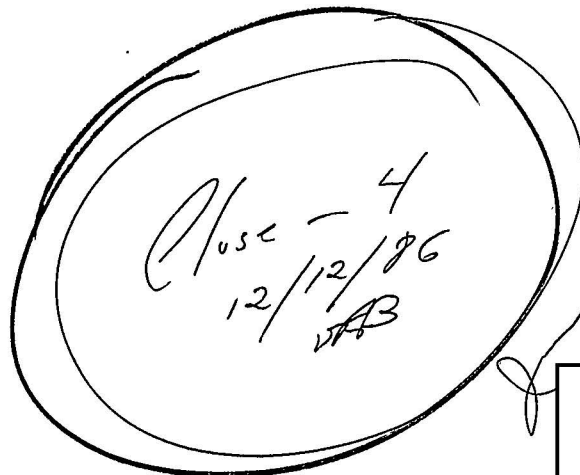
Senator DENTON was defeated in his bid for reelection as a Senator, and his campaign headquarters which was involved in the shooting incident at Huntsville, Alabama, has since been closed.

In view of the above, no further investigation is being conducted by the Birmingham Division UACB.

On 10/11/85, [redacted] was located and interviewed by Bureau Agents at [redacted] Alabama. During this interview, [redacted] (w/m, age 44), disclaimed any intention of causing violence to Senator Denton or anyone else. He specifically disclaimed violence or force as a means of solving disputes or disagreements and claimed to be a very pro-law enforcement individual. He recalled that he had made some derogatory comments regarding Senator Denton not knowing what he was talking about and that Denton should keep his nose out of matters he does not know anything about, but that he did not intend any harm to Senator Denton. [redacted] stated that he was an honorably discharged U. S. Navy veteran and denied any prior arrest record.

Bureau indices contain no record identifiable with [redacted] U. S. Secret Service and U. S. Capitol Police have been furnished with pertinent details regarding subject's statements.

PURPOSE: To provide information to the Criminal Investigative Division (CID) regarding a shooting into the campaign headquarters of Senator JEREMIAH DENTON of Alabama.

DETAILS: On 9/19/86, [redacted] Counsel to the Senate Subcommittee on Security and Terrorism, telephoned SSA LARRY E. RISSLER of the Congressional Affairs Office advising that he had just learned that an unknown individual had fired a shot into the campaign headquarters of Senator JEREMIAH DENTON in Huntsville, Alabama. The bullet apparently went through the window of the building and was possibly lodged in the wall. [redacted] advised that the telephone number for the headquarters building in Huntsville is (205) 551-0441.

[redacted] stated that he thought this might be a possible violation of the Congressional Assassination Statute and asked the Bureau to look into it.

On 9/19/86 the above information was furnished to SSA [redacted] of CID.

RECOMMENDATION: That CID advise CAO, attention SSA LARRY E. RISSLER, regarding the status of this case so that the Senator's office may be kept advised.



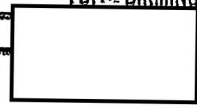

S. Senate Committee on the Judiciary, that he was in receipt of a memorandum from [REDACTED] who is on Senator Denton's staff in Birmingham, Alabama. This memorandum related that [REDACTED] met with a [REDACTED] [REDACTED] on October 8, 1985, at which time [REDACTED] related to him that an individual who was staying with her made threats against Senator Denton while watching Senator Denton being interviewed on television about the mercenary school run by [REDACTED] near Birmingham.

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This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

On October 10, 1985, [redacted] maiden name [redacted] was contacted outside of JACK'S HAMBURGER RESTAURANT, Warrior Road, Hueytown, Alabama. She was advised the nature of the interview and the official identities of the interviewing Agents.

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[redacted] advised that during September of 1985, she attended the MERCENARY SCHOOL run by [redacted] Hueytown, Alabama, for a one week period dropping out of the school prior to completion. During this school she met [redacted] who was also attending this school. She described [redacted] as a white male, age 44 years old, six feet tall, 200 pounds, red hair, who at the time of his training in the MERCENARY SCHOOL, was employed with [redacted] in Hueytown, Alabama. He is presently unemployed and has indicated to her that he left his wife and children somewhere in Colorado, and over a period of time, has claimed to be from either Colorado, Virginia, West Virginia, or Maine. Following completion of his training at the MERCENARY SCHOOL, because of his unemployment he was permitted to move into her residence [redacted]. She additionally resides at [redacted].

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[redacted] and indicated that she is not romantically involved with [redacted]. During the last couple of days, [redacted] was employed with [redacted] having obtained this job through [redacted] however, because of complaints about working conditions his employment at [redacted] was terminated and he is currently unemployed. She stated that [redacted] is not paying any rent, and indicated that she is having some difficulty in getting him to move from the residence. [redacted] advised that approximately one week ago, date not recalled, she and [redacted] were watching television at the address in Wilsonville, which was airing a program on which Senator DENTON was talking about [redacted] his MERCENARY SCHOOL and terrorism matters. She indicated that she was in and out of the room where the television was airing this program, and did not pay specific attention to Senator DENTON's comments, although [redacted] stayed with the program. During her travels in and out of the room, [redacted] as she recalls, stated "he is causing problems" and that she, [redacted] should "remember his face." [redacted] stated that she questioned [redacted] about

what he meant, and that he replied "he would get at him and fix things." She stated that she again questioned _____ about what he meant, with his response being "there are ways to handle this problem." _____ stated that she felt _____ was talking about hurting Senator DENTON, and that she told _____ that Senator DENTON had children. She stated that _____ replied that he would get to DENTON through his children and that doing something to the children would cause him, DENTON, problems. _____ advised that she told _____ that if he had a problem with a particular individual, he should approach that individual and leave the family out of it. She stated that _____ responded that was not the way to do it, that the best way was through the children.

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_____ stated that _____ did not specifically threaten the Senator, nor did he actually state he was going after either the Senator or his family. She stated that he, _____ questioned her about which state, Senator DENTON was from and from his line of questioning, this indicated to her that he, _____ did not have even any basic information concerning the Senator. She stated that she did not know if _____ was serious and indicated that since this initial discussion took place, no further discussions have come up concerning Senator DENTON or his family. She stated that _____ has remained at her residence in _____ and to her knowledge has made no travel plans, except for claiming to have a ticket for travel to South Africa, sometime during December of 1985. She stated that she has not personally seen this ticket.

_____ advised that she was concerned about having this information and not reporting it, fearing that something should happen to the Senator or his children, as she would be involved, although she did not know whether _____ was capable of hurting DENTON or his family, nor whether he had a propensity for violence. She was additionally concerned with the information being known only by her, since the conversation only involved _____ and herself.

[REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] claims that he is traveling to South Africa to prove his credibility as a Mercenary and "take care of Bishop TUTU" although she could furnish no other specific information. [redacted] being interviewed at the residence of [redacted] [redacted] Alabama, was advised of the official identities of the interviewing Agents and the nature of the interview.

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[redacted] advised that he had attended [redacted] [redacted] MERCENARY SCHOOL during September of 1985, stating that he attended the school as he was desirous of the training for possible future security work. He stated that he has no intention to use any training received at the school in a terrorism field or mercenary type work nor does he have any intentions of traveling outside of the United States as a mercenary. He indicated that he is currently not working and because of his financial condition, had asked [redacted] who he had met during training at the mercenary school, to utilize her residence in [redacted] as his residence. [redacted] indicated that he had, for several days worked at [redacted] [redacted] however had lost his job as he complained of the working conditions, and that he is currently unemployed.

[redacted] stated that he recalled Senator DENTON being on television regarding [redacted] and his school, and that he had watched this program with [redacted]. He stated that the program was aired approximately one week ago, date not recalled, and that he recalls making some remarks about Senator DENTON, not knowing what he was talking about and that he, DENTON, should keep his nose out of such matters. [redacted] stated that he did not recall specific statements, as he presently recalled that they were made in the heat of the moment, that he was mad and that he has since regretted making any statements concerning Senator DENTON. He indicated that he has no intention of hurting Senator DENTON, his family or anyone for that matter. He indicated that he does not believe that hurting anyone because of their beliefs is the proper method of solving disputes. He stated that he believes everyone has the right to voice their opinion openly, but only verbally and not through threats or assaults. He stated that he personally feels that anyone in an elected position should be protected.
