## FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

### Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the [www.fbi.gov/foia](http://www.fbi.gov/foia) website.
- (ii) **Intelligence Records.** To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

### Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) **Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) **Requests for Records about any Individual—Witness Security Program Records.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could identify any participant in the Witness Security Program pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(3) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(3), 18 U.S.C. 3521, and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.
- (iii) **Requests for Records for Incarcerated Individuals.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any incarcerated individual pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

### Part 3: General Information:

- (i) **Record Searches.** The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching systems or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. A standard search normally consists of a search for main files in the Central Records System (CRS), an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled by the FBI per its law enforcement, intelligence, and administrative functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization, comprising records of FBI Headquarters, FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide; Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records are included in the CRS. Unless specifically requested, a standard search does not include references, administrative records of previous FOIPA requests, or civil litigation files. - (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) **Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets.** The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks – often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative “FBI file.” An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. For a fee, individuals can request a copy of their Identity History Summary Check. - (iv) **National Name Check Program (NNCP).** The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Please be advised that this is a service provided to other federal agencies. Private Citizens cannot request a name check.

## EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

### SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information ( A ) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, ( B ) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, ( C ) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, ( D ) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, ( E ) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or ( F ) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

### SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552a

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

The masthead in the February 8, 1965, issue of "Spark" reflects it is published by the Progressive Labor Movement of the Bay Area, P. O. Box 73, Station A, Berkeley....page 4 of this issue of "Spark" carries an article describing MORT SCHEER as the "West Coast organizer" of the Progressive Labor Movement (PLM).

A source advised on January 7, 1965, that MORTIMER SCHEER, following a press conference in San Francisco, California, on January 7, 1965, related that he was the West Coast Organizer for the PLM and National Vice Chairman. PLM was started about three years ago as a national organization located mainly in the New York and Buffalo areas, and he has been here since last July striving to organize PLM. He stated PLM has several publications, including "Progressive Labor", a monthly, and the "Marxist-Leninist Quarterly."

The April 19, 1965, issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle, a daily San Francisco newspaper, carried an article which related that the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) was officially formed April 18, 1965, after a four-day convention in New York. PLP was formerly known as the Progressive Labor Movement and MORT SCHEER was elected as one of the vice-presidents of PLP.

A second source advised during May, 1966, that the Bay Area Progressive Labor Party (BAPLP) has no headquarters. The Mission Club BAPLP has rented space at 2929 - 16th Street, San Francisco, California. MORTIMER SCHEER, West Coast Organizer for BAPLP, operates out of his residence.

NATION OF ISLAM, Formerly Referred  
to as the Muslim Cult of Islam,  
Aka. Muhammad's Temples of Islam

In January, 1957, a source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On May 7, 1965, a second source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960 MUHAMMAD and other NOI officials, when referring to MUHAMMAD's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised MUHAMMAD had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

On May 3, 1965, a third source advised MUHAMMAD had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to MUHAMMAD, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY (PLP)  
PROGRESSIVE LABOR MOVEMENT (PLM)

A source advised on April 20, 1965, that the PLP, formerly known as the PLM, held its first national convention April 15-18, 1965, at New York City, to organize the PLM into a PLP. The PLP will have as its ultimate objective the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

"The New York Times," City Edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP. The PLP was described as an outgrowth of the PLM. Its officers were identified as MILTON ROSEN, New York, President, and WILLIAM EPTON of New York and MORT SCHEER of San Francisco, Vice Presidents. A 20-member National Committee was elected to direct the party until the next convention.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962 by Mr. ROSEN and Mr. SCHEER after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

The PLP publishes the "Marxist-Leninist Quarterly," a theoretical magazine; "Progressive Labor," a monthly magazine; "Challenge," a New York City newspaper; and "Spark," a West Coast newspaper.

The June 1, 1965, issue of "Challenge," page 6, states that "This paper is dedicated to fight for a new way of life - where the working men and women own and control their homes, factories, the police, courts, and the entire government on every level."

The source advised that the PLP utilizes the address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn 1, New York, but also utilizes an office in Room 622, 132 Nassau Street, New York City, where PLP publications are prepared.

At approximately 8:58 P.M. on 9/3/66, SA James Dunphy of the San Francisco Office advised as follows:

He stated San Francisco was interviewing the suspect [redacted] and [redacted] was denying any knowledge of a conspiracy to kill the President. SA Dunphy stated that [redacted] has a lengthy criminal record and is responding to the questioning by denying knowledge of any conspiracy such as indicated by the informant in this case. It appears to the interviewing Agents, according to SA Dunphy, that [redacted] is possibly lying in some respects. SA Dunphy stated that Secret Service in San Francisco feels it's Washington headquarters would desire a confrontation between the informant in this matter and [redacted] San Francisco feels that the informant would be most reluctant to do so and nothing would be gained as [redacted] would continue to deny being involved in any conspiracy. The San Francisco Office desired to know the Bureau's view as to exposing the informant in light of the distinct possibility that the conspirators are prone to violence and danger to the informant could result from a confrontation.

Night Supervisor Roy L. Erickson, San Francisco Office, was advised that this allegation of a plot against the President was a serious one which would have to be resolved by continued investigation, and that it did not appear they have resolved whether there is a violation or not at this point. San Francisco was instructed to use all necessary manpower to resolve this matter as quickly as possible and to keep the Bureau fully advised of all developments. As to whether there should be a confrontation between the informant and [redacted] San Francisco must decide this aspect of the case. With respect to Secret Service interviewing the informant, or [redacted] or having a confrontation, San Francisco was advised that we cannot interfere with the Secret Service investigation if they feel this is necessary. It is noted identity of the informant is known to Secret Service. However, the possibility of danger to the informant is to be pointed out to Secret Service.

This is to inform of a possible conspiracy to kill the President during his Labor Day weekend speaking engagements, 1966.

On September 1, 1966, [redacted]

[redacted] alleged

that [redacted] (LNU), who [redacted] knew as an associate of Progressive Labor Party (PLP) leaders in the San Francisco area, had information that an attempt would be made to kill the President during his speaking tour for the coming Labor Day weekend. According to [redacted] PLP would pay for a ticket for the assailant to travel to Battlecreek, Michigan, to commit the assault.

Secret Service was immediately advised of the possible threat against the President. San Francisco immediately initiated investigation to identify the subject and resolve whether or not a violation of the Presidential Assassination Statute existed.

San Francisco positively identified [redacted] as [redacted] who has an extensive arrest record. [redacted] was located in his apartment at San Francisco on September 2, 1966, at which time he was too drunk to be able to speak. The following day [redacted] was interviewed and denied any knowledge which might be related to the allegation. Complainant [redacted] and suspect [redacted] were reinterviewed many times but maintained their original stories.

On 9/5/66, [redacted] and [redacted] confronted each other at the San Francisco Office. Both continued to maintain the facts as they originally supplied them to interviewing Agents.

## The Revolver, 1865-1888

By A. W. F. Taylerson. Crown Publ. Co., New York. 292 pages. \$7.50.

This book, by a competent author, is based mainly on patent records and covers British, European, and American percussion and cartridge revolvers as well as their inventors, agents, or factors who applied to the British Patent Office during the period 1865-1888.

There are chapters covering percussion, pinfire, rimfire, and center-fire revolvers, service adoption, and light ordnance machine guns. One appendix lists revolver patents surviving into the 1920's.

This is a book for the technician or the collector who wish to study and understand mechanical variations in a field where there are numerous low-priced but little definitive knowledge.

It is a well illustrated book, the author having borrowed heavily on the study collection in H. M. Tower's collection. The plates are general and the text refers to specific patent numbers and other identifying features.

A LHM dated 9/2/66, which furnished details of the original complaint was furnished to Secret Service, San Francisco.

Secret Service, San Francisco, through their agents LARRY NEWMAN and BARRY GREEN were kept fully advised of all developments since they were notified originally on 9/1/66.

They were afforded the opportunity to interview the original complainant, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. Both Secret Service agents agreed that both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] told convincing stories and they are unable to explain in their own minds the discrepancies in the two stories. Secret Service has conducted no independent investigations, and since President JOHNSON has completed his Battle Creek trip, they merely want to be advised of any developments in the case.

Synopsis:

[redacted] furnished information that [redacted] (LNU) on 9/1/66, while looking at the August, 1966, issue of "The American Rifleman" magazine, exclaimed "that's the type of rifle that is going to be used against President JOHNSON." Pictured was a Savage 30-30 bolt action rifle, model 340 with scope. Upon urging, [redacted] told of a meeting held previously where he was urged to go to Battle Creek, Michigan, on a ticket that would be provided; further that a film had been made showing a Negro aiming a rifle at JOHNSON. The film would raise money if the individual was caught. The plan was to have NOI blamed for shooting and white people would be aroused to racial violence. [redacted] stated he refused to participate in affair. [redacted] (LNU) identified as [redacted]

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[redacted] on 9/2/66. [redacted] reinterviewed on 9/2/66 and furnished same information as originally reported. [redacted] interviewed on 9/3/66 and denied any knowledge of plot to harm President and that he made statement that President might be harmed or knew of anyone who had such intentions. Admitted that he had associated with MTU and friendly with leaders who were known to be PLP members. Stated that most recent contact was in first part of August, 1966. Description of [redacted] set forth. [redacted] reinterviewed twice on 9/4/66 and made a point-by-point denial of original allegation. On 9/5/66, [redacted] were

[redacted] on September 1, 1966, telephonically furnished the following information:

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[redacted] whose last name is unknown, visited [redacted] at [redacted] residence between 10 a.m. and 11 a.m. on September 1, 1966. [redacted] stated that he has known [redacted] for approximately one year and was responsible for recruiting him into the Mission Tenants Union (MTU). Further he stated [redacted] became very friendly with the leaders of the MTU, who are also the leaders of the Progressive Labor Party (PLP).

During the visit [redacted] noticed a copy of the August 1966 issue of "The American Rifleman" magazine, official journal of the National Rifle Association of America. Upon viewing Page 57, he explained "that's the type of rifle that is going to be used against President JOHNSON."

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The picture was of a Savage 30/30 rifle with bolt action, Model 340. The picture also showed a scope on the rifle which was identified as a 3 by 8 with model number 3833.

[redacted] pressed [redacted] for details and [redacted] reluctantly related that a meeting was held a day or so previous where only five individuals were present. At this meeting [redacted] was urged to go to Battle Creek, Michigan. Further, that if he was willing to go, a ticket would be provided for him. [redacted] related that a film had been produced showing President JOHNSON, and pictured a Negro pointing a rifle at President JOHNSON. Source got the impression that the film was made during one of President JOHNSON's previous trips and that the Negro with the rifle was dubbed in. [redacted] explained that after the shooting of the President, they planned to distribute the film and that if the person shooting the President was caught, the money could be used to "get him off."

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[redacted] stated that he was not going to Battle Creek, Michigan, and was not going to get mixed up in this affair.

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[redacted] indicated further to [redacted] that according to

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those present, the Nation of Islam (NOI) would get blamed for the shooting and that the white population of Michigan would be aroused to violence. Further, that the NOI was strong in the vicinity of Detroit and might be able to take over the city in the confusion.

Characterizations of the PLP, MTU, and NOI are contained in the appendix.

On September 1, 1966, [redacted] volunteered that he was familiar with the apartment building in which [redacted] (Last Name Unknown) lives. [redacted] advised that he did go to the vicinity of [redacted] but recognized [redacted] apartment as being located on [redacted]. Inquiry at [redacted] by [redacted] disclosed that [redacted] and [redacted] had recently moved from that building. Further, that [redacted] called for mail but left no forwarding address. [redacted] claimed to have interviewed at least three tenants in this building who furnished substantially the same information.

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[redacted] was interviewed by the FBI on September 1, 1966. She advised that she was not acquainted with the neighbors in the building and did not desire to associate with them. She disclaimed any knowledge of a [redacted] or [redacted] living in the apartment building.

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Obad Realty Company, 583 Eddy Street, furnished records on September 2, 1966, that reveal that [redacted] had on August 19, 1966, been served with a 7-day notice to vacate the premise. Further, that the [redacted] did vacate subsequent to August 19, 1966, on an unknown date. [redacted] advised that he suspected the [redacted] or the friends or roomers were using narcotics and further that they were constantly behind in rental payments. For this reason, he had sent them a notice to vacate.

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[redacted] on September 2, 1966, volunteered to locate [redacted] made a canvass of bars in the vicinity of [redacted] between Seventh and Third. [redacted] at the [redacted] obtained an address for [redacted] of [redacted] proceeded to [redacted] and visited [redacted] and [redacted] advised that the [redacted] was identical with the [redacted] who on September 1, 1966, had furnished the original information. [redacted] visit ended at approximately 10 p.m. and he reported that [redacted] was in bed and had his Russian type green hat covering his face and that he had been drinking and was fairly well "loaded."

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[redacted] was reinterviewed on September 2, 1966, and furnished the same information as furnished on September 1, 1966. He stated he could furnish no further details as the facts originally reported was all that he knew.

On September 3, 1966, [redacted] was contacted at his apartment at [redacted] San Francisco. He denied having any information that might affect the safety of the President of the United States. He denied making any statements that he intended to harm the President in any way. He further denied that he knew of anyone else who had these intentions.

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He was invited to the office of the FBI and voluntarily accompanied Agents. He furnished the following information:

He again denied any knowledge of a conspiracy or threat against President JOHNSON. He stated that he would furnish authorities with any such information if he could. [redacted] stated that he had attended about four meetings of the Mission Tenants Union (MTU) beginning around June 1966. Further, that he became friendly with the leaders of the MTU, especially [redacted] [redacted] advised that [redacted] had admitted to him that he, [redacted] was a communist. He stated that he knew that [redacted] was a [redacted] of both the MTU and the PLP. He stated that meetings of the MTU were held on 16th Street near Capp and the PLP used the same office and published "Spark", a newspaper. Photographs of the leaders of the PLP and the MTU were exhibited to [redacted] who said he knew [redacted]

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[redacted] advised that he lost interest in the MTU and had not seen any of the above individuals since the first part of August. He claims to have lost interest because they were exploiting Negroes and that he had found out previously to terminating his association with MTU that it was a communist organization.

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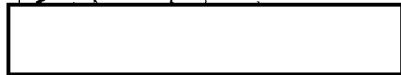

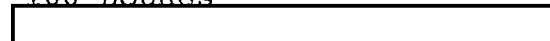

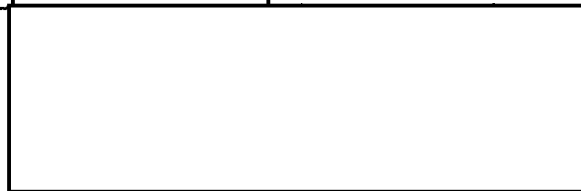

On September 3, 1966, [redacted] was invited to the office of the FBI and again repeated in detail original allegation concerning [redacted] and President JOHNSON substantially as given on previous occasions. At this time, [redacted] stated that he did not wish to confront [redacted] mainly out of fear of substantial bodily harm.

On September 4, 1966, [redacted] was interviewed at the office of the FBI at San Francisco. [redacted] was questioned as to whether or not he had ever made a threat against the life of the President or had threatened to shoot the President. This he denied. [redacted] denied ever having made a statement that he was going to Battle Creek, Michigan, and further that no one had offered to buy him a ticket to Battle Creek. [redacted] stated that he was not familiar with a Savage rifle and that one had not come to his attention recently. [redacted] stated that he knew of no film, picture or movie or reproduction showing a Negro pointing a gun at President JOHNSON. [redacted] stated he had learned either by radio, newspaper or TV that the President was only going to Ohio where they were having racial trouble and that the National Guard had been called to clean up the violence. He stated that he had heard this or read about it on Friday. [redacted] further stated that he would inform government authorities right away if he had heard of a threat to take the life of President JOHNSON. [redacted] stated that an offer of money would in no way refresh his recollection as he did not have the information but that he could sure use the money.

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He stated further that [redacted] had proposed no such plan to him and that the same went for [redacted] and any other members of PLP or MTU.

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[redacted] repeated substantially the same information about attending the last MTU meeting in the early part of July 1966. [redacted] further stated that he did not know of any reason why anyone would accuse him of having made a threat against the life of the President. He advised that the only neighbors with whom he is friendly are [redacted] who live at [redacted] where he had moved to approximately 3 weeks ago. The last time he saw [redacted] was at the [redacted] residence about the first part of August. With regard to his feelings about President JOHNSON, he stated that JOHNSON was better than he thought he would be, being a typical Texan. President JOHNSON was not as prejudiced as [redacted] had thought he would be. He stated that JOHNSON had been fair in carrying out the program of his office.

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[redacted] claims that the last time he saw [redacted] whose first and middle names he could not remember, was 3 or 4 weeks previously, except for a short visit on Friday night, September 2, 1966, when [redacted] unexpectedly visited his apartment. The previous visit was at [redacted] residence on [redacted] in early August 1966. At this time, he was accompanied by [redacted] [redacted] The rest of his story did not vary substantially from that given on the previous evening.

\_\_\_\_\_ advised he understood the seriousness of the allegation he had made concerning a possible attempt on the life of President JOHNSON. He reiterated his previous statement that \_\_\_\_\_ whom he has identified as \_\_\_\_\_ was at his place between 10 a.m. and 11 a.m., Thursday, September 1, 1966, and while there pointed out a photograph of a rifle with scope in the August 1966 issue of "The American Rifleman" and stated, as near as \_\_\_\_\_ can recall, "that's the kind of gun they are going to use to get President JOHNSON." He now does not recall asking \_\_\_\_\_ "Who?" but remembers somehow getting the impression it was the PLP (Progressive Labor Party), thinking, "Who else could it be?" \_\_\_\_\_ indicated to him he had been to a meeting 2 or 3 days before when he was asked to go to Battle Creek the following weekend and do the job, but said he wanted no part of it.

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\_\_\_\_\_ reference to the ticket to Battle Creek, he recalls as "they already have the ticket," but he cannot say that \_\_\_\_\_ said that the PLP had bought it. He has no doubt, however, that the PLP was meant and may have reported this. He does not now remember asking \_\_\_\_\_ how many were present at the meeting.

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\_\_\_\_\_ cannot recall that the Nation of Islam (NOI) was discussed as the one on whom any assassination attempt would be blamed, but he has a theory that if a Negro were to be used, the NOI would be blamed and there would be widespread racial trouble in Michigan, especially in Detroit, where he understands the Muslims are strong.

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\_\_\_\_\_ does not know whether the film \_\_\_\_\_ referred to with a Negro dubbed in pointing a rifle was a photograph or a movie film.

\_\_\_\_\_ expressed ostensibly sincere concern about communism and the President's safety. He claimed to love President JOHNSON and has fear for what might happen if he is killed. He denied with considerable feeling having convinced himself psychologically the story is true, even if it is not.

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He denied putting out the story as a means of collecting money he feels is due from the Government.

[redacted] was contacted at his residence of [redacted] San Francisco, at 8 p.m. on Sunday, September 4, 1966. [redacted] was advised that if he could substantiate any of the details of the allegation of his being approached to participate in an assassination conspiracy, he would be paid a bonus as this would place him in a close position to Progressive Labor Party members to furnish valuable information. [redacted] stated that even though he was unemployed and needed the money badly, he could not accept any money on false pretenses as he knew nothing of the facts as alleged. He stated that he realized that he was in no danger of prosecution on any charge as the story implicating him had related that he refused to participate. [redacted] stated that he was willing to attend meetings and furnish information about the Mission Tenants Union and Progressive Labor Party members involved and that he would have no reason to deny the allegation if it were true. [redacted] stated that he was at a loss to understand [redacted] story.

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[redacted] Negro, [redacted] entered the room and was interviewed in the presence of [redacted]. She stated that she attended meetings of the Mission Tenants Union with [redacted] and knew the Progressive Labor Party members involved. She stated that they started attending meetings of the Mission Tenants Union through the influence of [redacted] and after a couple of months' participation, discontinued attending meetings in early July 1966.

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She stated that the reason they discontinued attending meetings of the Mission Tenants Union was that she felt that as Negroes they were being cultivated and exploited by the organization and because she was advised by [redacted] that he had checked with authorities and had found that the organization was subversive.

[redacted] and [redacted] were interviewed together in the San Francisco Office on September 5, 1966, relative to the alleged visit of [redacted] to the apartment of [redacted] on Thursday, September 1, 1966, at approximately 10:00 a.m. at which time [redacted] allegedly told [redacted] about a plan to assassinate President JOHNSON at Battle Creek, Michigan.

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[redacted] insisted that [redacted] came to his apartment around 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, September 1, 1966; and, during this time, [redacted] was looking at an American Rifleman Magazine and [redacted] also looked at the magazine. [redacted] allegedly saw a picture of a rifle on page 57 and, according to [redacted] made some comment about that being the type of rifle that was to be used to kill President JOHNSON.

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[redacted] steadfastly denied that he was in [redacted] apartment on that date and stated that he was home getting drunk and he visited his neighbor, [redacted] as she had just returned from New Orleans on Wednesday morning. He stated that he went to see her around 9:00 or 10:00 to get a suitcase that he had lent her which had become lost. He stated that he went back home and got drunk.

[redacted] however, contrary to this, insisted that [redacted] came to his apartment and stayed about one hour around 10:00 a.m.

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[redacted] countered by stating he did not go to [redacted] apartment but went around the corner between 9:00 and 10:00 a.m. to the room of [redacted] and was drinking with [redacted] a [redacted] and the woman who manages the building in which [redacted] resides, namely the [redacted]. He insisted that the last time he was in [redacted] place was with [redacted] about three or four weeks ago.

[redacted] stated that he laid down the American Rifleman Magazine he was looking at when [redacted] came in and picked it up and looked at it.

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[redacted] denies this and states that he never saw the August issue of "The American Rifleman" magazine.

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[redacted] stated that [redacted] on turning to a page in the magazine stated, "that is the weapon they are going to use to get JOHNSON."

[redacted] was asked if it was not possible that he was under the influence of liquor at the time, since he admitted he was getting drunk on Thursday and would not remember that he was in [redacted] apartment. He stated that he was not under the influence to the extent that he would not remember being in [redacted] apartment.

According to [redacted] stated that there was a meeting where they planned to kill JOHNSON and that a ticket was bought for [redacted] or someone else to go to Battle Creek, Michigan, to assassinate the President. According to [redacted] [redacted] stated that they wanted a Negro to do the job to stir up racial violence.

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[redacted] steadfastly denies this and, at this point, stated he was willing to take a lie detector test to show that he is telling the truth.

[redacted] also volunteered to take a lie detector test.

[redacted] stated that [redacted] mentioned that a mess would be stirred up as a result of a film that they had; and, from showing the film, funds would be raised for the defense of the person who would kill the President. [redacted] stated that the organization had a ticket and someone had to go, according to what [redacted] told him.

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[redacted] again denied that he had any such conversation and does not recall any part of the conversation as above.

[redacted] stated that, when [redacted] told him the above, he became quite nervous and wanted to get rid of [redacted] so that he could call the Federal Bureau of Investigation; and, to induce [redacted] to leave, [redacted] stated he gave him a fifth of Seagrams Seven Crown whiskey. [redacted] also used the excuse that he had to go

to see his doctor and told [redacted] that he would have to leave. [redacted] admitted that there was no other person that could put [redacted] in his apartment.

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[redacted] asked [redacted] to describe what he was wearing at the time of the alleged visit to [redacted] apartment. [redacted] said he was wearing the same pants that he had on during the interview, same green shirt, green cossack hat which he always wears, but a different jacket than he had on during the interview. [redacted] asked if it were gray, and [redacted] said, "Yes, sort of." [redacted] stated that, when he goes to [redacted] he visits everyone in the building at [redacted]

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[redacted] insisted that he was drinking on Thursday, September 1, and about noon he went to the Big Bonus Market on Howard Street and got some boxes to be used by [redacted] in his move. He stated that when he got the boxes he bought some hot dogs for [redacted] children and some hamburger meat to make spaghetti sauce. He said that he took the boxes to [redacted] and then about noon took the hot dogs to [redacted]. He also stated that he owed the butcher 50¢ for the meat since he was short 50¢. [redacted] denied that he had talked to [redacted] about [redacted] but did admit that he had seen [redacted] sometime after August 1, 1966.

[redacted] stated that after [redacted] left he shaved and cleaned up about 12 o'clock on September 1, but he was so shook up over what [redacted] had told him that he could not eat. He said that he tried to call SA DUNPHY but could not get him and left no message at the FBI office. He stated that he called again about 3 p.m. and left a message that he would call DUNPHY again around 4:30 p.m. He said he did reach DUNPHY about 4:50 p.m.

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[redacted] again said that no one else could put [redacted] in his apartment on September 1 at 10 a.m. [redacted] stated that he recruited [redacted] into the Mission Tenants Union but they did not talk about the Progressive Labor Party. [redacted] agreed that [redacted] more or less recruited him into the MTU.

[redacted] stated that he last attended meetings of the MTU in July. He said he went to these meetings by bus because

[redacted] car transmission had broken down. Prior to this [redacted] had driven [redacted] to MTU meetings.

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[redacted] stated that [redacted] lost his transmission a long time ago and he got rid of the car sometime in July.

[redacted] was asked when did [redacted] and [redacted] hear that the MTU and PLP were subversive. [redacted] said it must have been sometime in June, or it was either in May or June. He admitted that he did not stop going to meetings of MTU when he heard it was subversive, and continued attending meetings until sometime in July. [redacted] said that he met people in the MTU and he had gone to the beach with [redacted] on a Sunday in June and they talked about coming back to the beach the Fourth of July for a weenie roast and picnic and that [redacted] was there.

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[redacted] stated that the last time he saw [redacted] was at [redacted] apartment a few days before she left to go to New Orleans, it was 2 or 3 days before she left. [redacted] left for New Orleans on August 11, 1966.) [redacted] stated that [redacted] stayed in New Orleans for 2 weeks leaving between the 10th and 14th of August. He also stated that he saw [redacted] in July and this had to do with some pictures that [redacted] had for [redacted] and this meeting was after the Fourth of July. [redacted] came to [redacted] apartment.

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[redacted] was asked if he ever saw [redacted] at MTU meetings and he replied in the affirmative. [redacted] stated that on the September 1 alleged meeting [redacted] told him further that [redacted] had come to see him [redacted] and they talked about [redacted] car breaking down and his disposal of it. [redacted] denies that they ever had a conversation about [redacted] car as [redacted] already knew about the car. However, [redacted] concedes that it might be possible that they talked about [redacted] car.

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[redacted] was asked whether or not he did or did not discuss the conspiracy to assassinate the President with [redacted] was there any truth that there was a plot, and [redacted] said no.

[redacted] stated that when [redacted] told him of the plot and they had the discussion about the gun to be used, he did not ask [redacted] who was involved, but he stated that [redacted] told him there was a meeting where five people were present, and he said that he was not going to discuss it and to keep "your mouth shut." [redacted] stated that [redacted] said he would not have

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anything to do with shooting President JOHNSON. [redacted] further added that he did not ask [redacted] who was trying to get him to go to Battle Creek to do the job.

MISSION TENANTS UNION

The November 8, 1965, issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle," a daily San Francisco newspaper, carried an article captioned, "Tenants 'Revolt' in the Mission," which related in part:

The Mission Tenants Union (MTU) was formed last May after a fire on Shotwell Street drove six families from their homes. The MTU is a direct-action organization which will fight unduly high rents, low wages, and "company unions," according to MTU spokesman, JOHN ROSS.

A source, during the period November 24, 1965, to June 5, 1966, reported that JOHN ROSS, active leader of the Mission Club, Bay Area Progressive Labor Party (BAPLP), is the organizer of the MTU. The MTU advocates better housing and living conditions for the tenants of the Mission District in San Francisco, California. The MTU has held meetings at the Mission Club, BAPLP Office, San Francisco, and uses this as a mailing address. The MTU is a community project of this Mission Club, BAPLP, and is a recruiting area for potential BAPLP members.

NATION OF ISLAM, Formerly referred to  
as the Muslim Cult of Islam, also known as  
Muhammad's Temples of Islam

---

In January, 1957, a source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On April 29, 1966, a second source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960 MUHAMMAD and other NOI officials, when referring to MUHAMMAD's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised MUHAMMAD had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

On May 2, 1966, a third source advised MUHAMMAD had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to MUHAMMAD, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.

  - (c)  Prior acts (including arrests or convictions) or conduct or statements indicating a propensity for violence and antipathy toward good order and government.

Mr. CUTKOMP said the fact that they had no tickets in the Accounting Division for the above people would indicate that they had purchased the tickets at another air line and that the portion of their flight from Chicago on North Central Air Lines was a continuation of some other flight. He had no way of determining what air line would have been involved in the original ticket sale. He rechecked the manifest for Flight #801 on 9/3/66, and said he felt quite certain that the two [REDACTED] listed on that manifest were traveling together inasmuch as the names were listed in consecutive order. However, he said he could not be positive that they were together.

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Miss BONNIE KEHOE, Stewardess Base Supervisor, North Central Air Lines, O'Hare Field, Chicago, Illinois, stated that she would have no record of the stewardess assigned to Flights 805 and 809 and that this information would have to be obtained from Detroit, which was the starting point for these flights. Her records indicated that Stewardess KAREN SULZER was assigned to Flight 801 on 9/3/66, and that Miss SULZER is based in Chicago. Miss KEHOE attempted to contact Miss SULZER but determined she is presently out-of-town and will return to work the morning of Wednesday, 9/21/66. Miss SULZER will be contacted at that time to determine if she can identify the photograph of [REDACTED] as possibly being identical to either of the [REDACTED] listed on the manifest for Flight 801 on 9/3/66.

Efforts to disprove it have, of course, been directed toward placing the person allegedly knowledgeable about the conspiracy, [redacted] either in the source's apartment between 10:00 and 11:00 a.m. on 9/1/66, as alleged by [redacted] or placing him elsewhere as [redacted] claims.

Nobody but [redacted] places [redacted] in [redacted] apartment, over four long blocks from his home, on 9/1/66. Only one person places him in the [redacted] neighborhood and he at 11:00 a.m., although he did not see [redacted] face and, because of other factors, may well have seen him at 11:30 a.m. rather than at 11:00 and may not have seen him at all.

[redacted] next-door neighbor said he was there about 10:00 a.m., 9/1/66. Friends at the [redacted] a short block away, place him there between 10:40 and 11:00 a.m.

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[redacted] on 9/3/66, and in several subsequent interviews has consistently denied knowledge of any conspiracy and of having visited the source on 9/1/66 as source maintains.

Considering the type of people we are dealing with it has been impossible to determine facts which establish beyond doubt what [redacted] and [redacted] were doing between 10:00 and 11:00 a.m. on 9/1/66. [redacted] and [redacted] and most of the persons with whom they are acquainted live very disorderly lives, live in the poorest of accommodations, and associate with persons of questionable character, but are not inherently unpatriotic or untrustworthy. [redacted] himself is unemployed, an alcoholic, a user of marijuana, and lives like [redacted]. Granting all of this it cannot be said that [redacted] is not telling the truth when he disclaims knowledge of and involvement in the alleged conspiracy.

On 9/11/66, [redacted] advised that he is at a loss to explain how his name got mixed up in this matter. He said he is available for continued interviews to get it cleared up and repeated his earlier suggestion that he be given a lie detector test. He also made the suggestion that he be given a sodium pentothal or "truth serum" test. He would like to see the matter cleared up as the investigation has upset his wife, his neighborhood and his friends, who do not understand the nature of the inquiry and blame him for being interviewed or implicated. He does not know what more he can do and is considering contacting an attorney to sue [redacted] for "libel" and damage to his reputation.

When [redacted] was asked what motive he would impute to [redacted] for making the allegations against him, [redacted] said he did not know, unless [redacted] is mad at him or thinks he, [redacted] is still on parole and this would lend credence to his story. [redacted] said he believes [redacted] has an unstable personality and can get violent at times. He cited two incidents where [redacted] exhibited signs of emotionality and instability. On one occasion [redacted] became infuriated when a doctor would not certify that [redacted] was a government service-connected disability. [redacted] threatened to come back and shoot the doctor and his nurse, and ranted in the presence of the doctor and [redacted] about being persecuted because of his color. The police were called but no arrest was made. (See San Francisco letter 8/5/66, entitled, [redacted])

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[redacted] cited another instance where he accompanied [redacted] along with [redacted] to an evening meeting of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors which was then considering problems relating to redevelopment in the Mission District of San Francisco. [redacted] started speaking from the floor without being recognized by the chairman. He was called out of order but continued shouting and demanding his right to speak, thus throwing the meeting into an uproar.

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As to the source, [redacted] there has been no reason heretofore to believe that he would furnish false information. In fact, what he has furnished heretofore is thought to be true or cannot be proved to be untrue. [redacted]

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Certainly, because of the impasse reached in the current matter, information he might offer in the future will be scrutinized most carefully and the intent is to discontinue all contacts with him. His stability at this point is unpredictable. Interviews thus far and the doubt indicated by the investigation have left him in a disturbed state of mind, nervous, and during the confrontation with [redacted] on 9/5/66, admittedly ill.

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[redacted] having appeared at the San Francisco Office of the FBI, advised he understands fully the consequences of furnishing false information to the FBI and the importance of resolving a matter concerning the safety of President Johnson. He was asked if the information he furnished on September 1, 1966, to SA JAMES DUNPHY regarding the visit of [redacted] later identified as [redacted] was true. [redacted] said it was.

Regarding the bottle of Seagram's Seven Crown whisky which he claims to have given to [redacted] the morning of September 1, 1966, he said he had had it quite a while, does not know where he bought it, but does buy his liquor at Third and Folsom Streets, San Francisco.

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[redacted] stated his doorbell rang at 10:00 a.m. [redacted] was admitted at which time he was wearing his green Russian style hat, a jacket, a striped shirt, and black pants. [redacted] said he had awakened about 9:00 a.m. in his apartment at [redacted] San Francisco, and had two shots of white Port, and was thumbing through the National Rifle Association magazine when the bell rang. [redacted] after admitting [redacted] went to the kitchen to pour [redacted] a drink. When he returned, [redacted] was looking through the National Rifle Association magazine and, pointing to a rifle advertised about the middle of the magazine, said approximately, "Oh! This is the same kind of gun they are going to use to get JOHNSON." [redacted] said he asked [redacted] "Do you mean President JOHNSON?" and when [redacted] did not answer said, "Come on, we are friends. You can tell me." [redacted] responded by saying approximately, "We had a meeting the other night. They want me to go to Battle Creek, Michigan, but I don't want no part of it. They already have a ticket."

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[redacted] believes he asked [redacted] how many were at the meeting, but is not sure, although he somehow had the idea that five were there. [redacted] presumed from the conversation that the reference to the ticket meant an airline ticket. [redacted] also referred to a film (or picture) of a Negro holding a gun. What the gun was pointing at [redacted] said he is not sure. [redacted] said

they already know what kind of car President Johnson will be using and [ ] gathered from the conversation that [ ] meant the Negro was dubbed in and understood that the film or picture could be sold to raise money for a lawyer if the person was caught in the act.

[ ] could not furnish any other details and professed some haziness on the exact dialogue. [ ] admitted that the plan is not logical and he said he does not understand why it would be contrived.

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[ ] said he believes no mention was made by [ ] of the Progressive Labor Party, the Mission Tenants Union, the Nation of Islam, or the Muslims.

[ ] left [ ] apartment about 11:00 a.m. (about ten minutes before or ten minutes after).

[ ] said that after he gave [ ] the bottle of Seagram's Seven Crown to get rid of him, he washed up, shaved, and went out at 12:30 p.m. to a public telephone booth at Harrison and Third Streets, to call SA DUNPHY. This was his first call and he does not remember if he stopped anywhere en route. He did not leave his number or a message and went back home. At about 3:30 p.m. he made another call from the same telephone booth, still could not reach SA DUNPHY or two other Agents whose names he knew, and left a message that he would call SA DUNPHY at 4:30 p.m. He again went back home. He does not recall stopping anywhere en route. [ ] said he called a third time between 4:30 and 5:00 p.m. and did at that time furnish the information indicated to SA DUNPHY.

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[ ] firmly maintains that the information as furnished on September 1, 1966, and on this date is true and cannot understand how [ ] could have been any place other than [ ] apartment between approximately 10:00 and 11:00 a.m., September 1, 1966. He was not at all vehement in his feeling about [ ] not admitting that he was in [ ] apartment, but merely shook his head and maintained that his story is true. He showed no ill feeling toward [ ]

[redacted] was asked if he knew if [redacted] was still on parole and he denied any knowledge that [redacted] even had a criminal record.

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He stated that several months ago he was suspicious of [redacted] and one night when he was invited by [redacted] to a party at his home, he gave one of his guns to [redacted] and instructed her how to use it for self protection even though the gun would not fire. He said that he took his other gun with him to [redacted] home and there were no other people there, no liquor other than some cheap wine, and no preparations for a party. [redacted] was gone for quite a while and while away met with [redacted] as part of the plot. When asked how he knew they met, he said that he could not explain, but that he just knew. When asked what the plot was about, he stated that it was to get him away from his house and bring harm to [redacted]. He explained that nothing happened to [redacted] that night and said that was because [redacted] must have learned that he had left a gun with her.

[redacted] also related an incident which happened on the day prior to the interview. He stated that a beautiful 25-year old caucasian girl, previously unknown to him, rang his bell and stated she was warning him that he would get hurt if he did not stop furnishing information regarding [redacted]. She also told him that she knew he was furnishing information to the FBI. [redacted] stated that if she wanted him to cooperate with her, that she should engage in a "little sex" with him. [redacted] said that the girl accepted the invitation and that they went into his apartment and "we had sex" for about 20-25 minutes. [redacted] said she called herself [redacted].

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He described the girl as follows: White, about 25, 5'4", 135 pounds, black hair, well dressed, well built, no glasses, and no distinguishing marks. He was unable to furnish further details which would aid in her identification.

A time check of the alarm clock observed by [redacted] was made by SA EDWARD J. O'FLYNN from September 10 - 13, 1966. It was noted that over this three-day period the clock ran 30 minutes fast, or an increase of 10 minutes per day. Adjusting the 35-minute fast time reading of the clock on the day of interview of [redacted] September 10, 1966, back 90 minutes to September 1, 1966, would indicate that the clock on that date was reading 55 minutes behind time. When [redacted] noted the time at 11 a.m. on September 1, 1966, the true time was probably 11:55 a.m. on September 1, 1966. This would coincide with the television program schedule for the Dating Game, which he stated was on the television.

[redacted] was re-interviewed September 10, 1966, ten days after the pertinent date of September 1, 1966, when he claimed to have seen [redacted]. He was contacted at the same time of day and under the same conditions as when he claimed to have seen [redacted]. [redacted] was asleep on the sofa, but he did not awaken by the ringing of the doorbell. The alarm clock he claimed to have observed on the pertinent date was not in the living room where he was sleeping, but he was wearing a wrist watch which kept accurate time. [redacted] also made the suggestion that he be given a sodium pentothal or "truth serum" test. [redacted] stated that he would like to see the matter cleared up as the investigation upsets his wife, and his neighbors and friends do not understand the nature of the inquiry and blame him for being interviewed or implicated. [redacted] stated that he did not know what more he could do and was considering contacting an attorney to file suit against [redacted] for "libel" and maliciously damaging his reputation.

When [redacted] was asked what motive he would impute to [redacted] for making such allegations against him, [redacted] said that he did not know and could only speculate that [redacted] may have been mad at Progressive Labor Party, (PLP), members for dropping him and wanted to cause them trouble. He stated that [redacted] probably thought he, [redacted] was still on parole and used his name to give credence to the story. [redacted] stated that [redacted] has an unstable personality and can get violent at times. [redacted] cited two incidents where [redacted] exhibited signs of emotional instability. He stated that on one occasion he was at [redacted] apartment when [redacted] came by to give [redacted] a ride to 450 Sutter Street for a doctor appointment. He stated that he went along and that [redacted] became infuriated when the doctor would not certify that [redacted] was a government service connected disability. [redacted] threatened to come back and shoot the doctor and his nurse and ranted about being persecuted because of his color. [redacted] stated that the doctor became frightened and called the police who talked to [redacted] and that no arrests were made.

meeting of the Board of Supervisors. The Board was considering problems relating to the Mission Corridor, Bay Area Rapid Transit, (BART), and housing for tenants displaced by redevelopment.

[redacted] started speaking from the floor without being recognized by the chairman. He was called out of order by the chairman, but continued shouting and demanding his right to speak and threw the meeting into an uproar.

[redacted] stated that he was amazed that [redacted] has expressed fear for his life because [redacted] has no guns and knows nothing about them, while [redacted] is the one who is interested in guns and has a collection of them.

The following investigation was conducted by SA HARRY W. LEGGETT:

A review of manifests of United Airlines, American Airlines and Trans-World Airways on flights from San Francisco to Detroit and Chicago for August 29 through September 3, 1966, disclosed no individual on the flights who can be identified with [redacted] [redacted]. Also, no other names were observed identifiable with known members of the PLP.

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KARL MERCER, Assistant Ticket Counter Manager, North Central Airlines (NCA), Detroit Metropolitan Airport, advised that manifests from August 29 to September 3, 1966, for flights from Detroit to Battle Creek and Kalamazoo, Michigan, contain only surnames. Only two names possibly pertinent appeared, but upon investigation they appeared not pertinent.

It is noted that NCA is the only airline servicing Battle Creek, Michigan, with three flights daily from Chicago to Battle Creek and six flights daily from Chicago to Kalamazoo. Many passengers to Battle Creek take a flight to Kalamazoo with a twenty to forty minute limousine ride to Battle Creek.

NCA Head Stewardess, Metropolitan Airport, Detroit, Michigan, furnished the names of NCA stewardesses who were on pertinent flights out of Detroit. Photographs of possible principal suspects listed above were exhibited. All stewardesses advised that no one identifiable was observed on the flights as follows:

[Redacted] was interviewed at his residence, [Redacted]. The interviewing Agents identified themselves and SA ERICKSON advised [Redacted] that he did not have to talk to the Agents, that he had the right to have an attorney present at any interview, and that if there ever became a problem involving court proceedings, the court could provide him with an attorney if he could not afford one himself.

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[Redacted] was told that the interviewing Agents wanted to talk to him about the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and his connection with it, if he was a member or had any knowledge of its activities. He stated he would be willing to discuss this with the Agents. He stated that he has never officially been a member of the PLP, but he has attended many of its activities and has read much of its literature. He has done work at their request in Richmond and North Richmond after the so-called riots at Peres School over a year ago. He did try to hold meetings and talk to the people, but the PLP handled the activity as a "race issue" when he felt it was not such a problem, but was actually a "class struggle." He suggested that they would do better by taking some of their own "white" people into places like San Pablo to bring up the class struggle problem. He did not feel that the Negro was doing any good for himself having a group like PLP, which is mainly composed of white people, try to get them agitated and active in a struggle that involved violence. He does not feel the Negro should become involved in activities that include violence.

He stated that he still associates with people who are in PLP and identified [Redacted] as two people he knew to be members, stating that he was with [Redacted] just last night. She had commented to him that "the FBIs" had talked to her.

The original information was that [redacted] while looking at the August, 1966, issue of "The American Rifleman," official journal of The National Rifle Association of America, stated upon viewing a picture of a Savage Rifle, Model 340, on page 57, "That's the type of rifle that is going to be used against President Johnson."

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The magazine in question was forwarded to the Identification Division, Latent Fingerprint Section, for examination, Latent Case Number 71116.

The results are as follows:

Nine latent fingerprints and five latent palm prints were developed on pages of issue of "The American Rifleman." Latent fingerprints are not identical with the fingerprints of [redacted] FBI Number [redacted]. Five of the latent fingerprints are not identical with the fingerprints of [redacted] FBI Number [redacted]. Palm prints for [redacted] are not available.

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Two latent fingerprints developed on page 56, one latent fingerprint developed on page 105, and one latent fingerprint developed on page 112 are identical with finger impressions of [redacted]

On September 1, 1966, information was received from [redacted] that [redacted] had knowledge of a plot, possibly by the Progressive Labor Party (PLP), to kill the President of the United States in Battle Creek, Michigan over the Labor Day weekend. The instrument to be used was a Savage rifle.

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In an effort to prove or disprove the allegation, various sources were contacted with the following results:

A first source, on September 10, 1966, advised that he met with [redacted] and [redacted] on September 9, 1966, in San Francisco. The source advised that all of the above were members of the Mission Club, PLP; but that the occasion was not a regular meeting of the club. All of the above members discussed being contacted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and were puzzled as to the reason. [redacted] remarked that he

cannot understand why the FBI is connecting [redacted] with them. Both [redacted] remarked that [redacted] is with the Mission Tenants Union (MTU).

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A characterization of the PLP and the MTU is contained in the appendix attached hereto.

The first source further advised, after looking at a photograph of [redacted] that [redacted] is a person whom he observed at MTU meetings in San Francisco. The source stated that he usually wears a fur hat. The source continued that he is not, to source's knowledge, a member of the PLP but may have attended some PLP public meetings. This source failed to identify a photograph of [redacted]

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A second source on September 19, 1966, advised that photographs of both [redacted] did not strike a familiar chord.

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A third source, who is presently attending classes sponsored by PLP and attends PLP public forums, but is not considered a member, after observing photographs of [redacted] and [redacted] advised on September 8, 1966, that neither individual is familiar.

A fourth source who has attended PLP functions during the past year in the San Francisco area, advised on September 9, 1966, that neither [redacted] is familiar.

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A fifth source who was contacted on September 12, 1966, advised that neither [redacted] was known, after viewing photographs of the individuals. The same source continued that there was no information indicating them to be connected with the PLP.

A sixth source, on September 12, 1966, advised, after viewing photographs of both [redacted] that source did not know these individuals and had never seen them at PLP meetings.

A seventh source who has attended PLP functions for about three months but is not a member, on September 12, 1966, advised, after viewing a photograph of [ ] and [ ] that they were not known to him. This seventh source advised that he had seen [ ] a PLP leader, on September 10, 1966, and no discussion was held on being interviewed by the FBI. Further, that a PLP picnic was held on September 11, 1966, in San Francisco, where 50 to 60 persons attended. The source stated that during this picnic no mention was made of an investigation, but that the leaders seemed somewhat nervous and less talkative than usual.

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Sources eight and nine, who are in close contact with the Los Angeles Club of the PLP, advised on September 12, 1966, that they were unable to ascertain any information which tends to concern the allegation of [ ]

Sources ten and eleven in the Sacramento, California, area, who are involved in PLP activities, on September 9, 1966, advised that they do not know either [ ] These sources both advised that to their knowledge, none of the Sacramento PLP members were in San Francisco for a week or so prior to September 1, 1966.

Sources twelve to, and including, seventeen, were contacted in the Detroit, Michigan, area on September 2, 1966; and could furnish no information concerning the allegation.

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On September 9, 1966, source eighteen was contacted. This source is familiar with Nation of Islam (NOI) activities in the San Francisco area. Source eighteen was shown a photograph of [ ] and advised that he met this individual at the office of Local 110 of the Dishwashers Union in San Francisco, which is located in the Mission District. Source eighteen advised that he did not know [ ] by name, but had engaged in conversation with him when they were both at the union office. Source recalled

that he last saw him in April, 1966; and about that time, [redacted] offered him a marijuana cigarette, and that [redacted] was smoking one at the time. Source continued that was in April, 1966, and [redacted] had asked him, while they were both at the union office looking for jobs, if he wanted to go get a "heat on." Source eighteen added that he understood by this that [redacted] was suggesting that they use some narcotics. The invitation was declined.

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A characterization of the NOI is contained in the appendix pages hereto.

Source nineteen, on September 21, 1966, advised that he had no knowledge of [redacted] and could not identify [redacted] photograph. This source is familiar with criminal activities in the South-of-Market-Street area where [redacted] resides.

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Source twenty, who is familiar with some phases of criminal activity in the San Francisco area, advised after viewing a photograph of [redacted] that the photograph was not familiar, nor was the name.

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY

A source advised on April 20, 1965, that the Progressive Labor Party (PLP), formerly known as the Progressive Labor Movement (PLM), held its first national convention April 15-18, 1965, at New York City, to organize the PLM into a PLP. The PLP will have as its ultimate objective the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

The "New York Times" City Edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP. The PLP was described as an outgrowth of the PLM. Its officers were identified as MILTON ROSEN, New York, President, and WILLIAM EPTON of New York, and MORT SCHEER of San Francisco, Vice Presidents. A 20-member National Committee was elected to direct the party until the next convention.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962 by Mr. ROSEN and Mr. SCHEER after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line".

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor", a bi-monthly magazine, "Challenge," a bi-weekly New York City newspaper, and "Spark," a West Coast newspaper.

The June 1, 1965, issue of "Challenge," page 6, states that "this paper is dedicated to fight for a new way of life where the working men and women own and control their homes, factories, the police, courts, and the entire government on every level."

The source advised that the PLP utilizes the address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn 1, New York, but also utilizes an office in Room 622, 132 Nassau Street, New York City, where PLP publications are prepared.

In relet it is pointed out that there is no evidence that a conspiracy exists to kill the President and there is some question as to the current reliability of the source.

In view of the fact that on 9/5/66, during a confrontation between the source, [redacted] and [redacted] the person who reportedly gave the information to the source, professed a willingness to take lie detector tests, and [redacted] on his own on 9/11/66, practically pleaded for a chance to take such a test and thus clear himself, the Bureau is requested to consider the use of this device to reconcile the differences between the two stories.

The original allegation was made by [redacted] on 9/1/66, when he claims a person known to him then as [redacted] later identified as [redacted] was in his apartment at [redacted] San Francisco, between 10:00 and 11:00 a.m., and while there thumbed through the August, 1966, issue of "The American Rifleman," pointing out an ad for a rifle, explaining at the time, "That's the type of rifle that is going to be used against President Johnson." According to [redacted] then related details of a meeting held a day or so previously where he was urged to go to Battle Creek, Michigan, presumably in connection with an attempt against the

President's life. If he was willing to go he would be provided with a ticket. There was also some discussion about a photograph or a film which showed President Johnson as well as a Negro pointing a rifle at him. Source received the impression that the film had been made during one of President Johnson's previous trips and that the Negro with the rifle was dubbed in.

[ ] told the source that he was not going to Battle Creek and was not going to get mixed up in the matter.

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[ ] has been interviewed several times and has denied being in [ ] apartment on 9/1/66 and saying that he knows nothing whatsoever about "conspiracy." He shows no evidence of lying and continually expresses a desire to cooperate fully in his anxiety to clear the matter up.

The magazine which [ ] reportedly looked at in the source's apartment has been processed for [ ] fingerprints, but none was found.

[ ] has been unable to recall any additional details of the interview and has seemed unsure on several points, but continues to maintain that his story is true and that [ ] was in his apartment.

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There is no support through investigation for [ ] story that [ ] was in [ ] apartment, although one person has reported seeing [ ] in the neighborhood at 11:00 a.m., although he did not see [ ] face. [ ] has a next door neighbor who has stated that [ ] was at the neighbor's home at 10:00 a.m. on 9/1/66. Persons who know [ ] have also placed him in the [ ] a short block from [ ] apartment, between 10:40 and 11:00 a.m.

Neither outside investigation nor the several interviews with [ ] and [ ] has established any facts which go to prove or disprove the allegation.

[redacted] is uneducated, not particularly intelligent, and exhibits signs of instability. [redacted]

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[redacted] is much more intelligent, better read, and more convincing in his denial. He is an ex-convict who has served time on narcotics charges and has a number of other arrests for vagrancy, burglary, and robbery.

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Since outside investigation cannot prove the allegation to be true or untrue and since we have two stories, one of which cannot be true, it is recommended that the Bureau approve a polygraph examination of both the source, [redacted] and [redacted]. Signed [redacted] waivers will be obtained prior to the examination if authorized.

On 9/1/66, one [redacted] reported to our San Francisco Office that an individual known to him as [redacted] later identified as [redacted] an ex-convict and veteran criminal, while in [redacted] apartment, pointed out an advertisement for a rifle in a magazine and exclaimed that was the type of rifle that is going to be used against President Johnson. According to [redacted] then related details of a meeting held a day or so previously by members of the Progressive Labor Party in San Francisco, wherein [redacted] was urged to go to Battle Creek, Michigan, presumably in connection with an attempt against the President's life. [redacted] told [redacted] that he was not going to Battle Creek, and was not going to get mixed up in the matter, however.

When [redacted] reported this information to our San Francisco Division, immediate and intensive investigation was instituted. All logical members of the Progressive Labor Party have been contacted and no information has been obtained to substantiate the original allegation made by [redacted]. Extensive neighborhood investigation and other logical investigative avenues have been explored without developing any independent indication that such a conspiracy to kill the President existed.

SAC, San Francisco recommends the use of the polygraph technique to pin down specifically who was telling the truth in this matter.

ACTION:

Although San Francisco recommends the use of the polygraph, contending this technique could possibly resolve which individual is telling the truth about this alleged threat to the President, authority is not being given since we have not utilized this technique in some time. Attached for approval is an airtel to San Francisco denying the use of a polygraph.

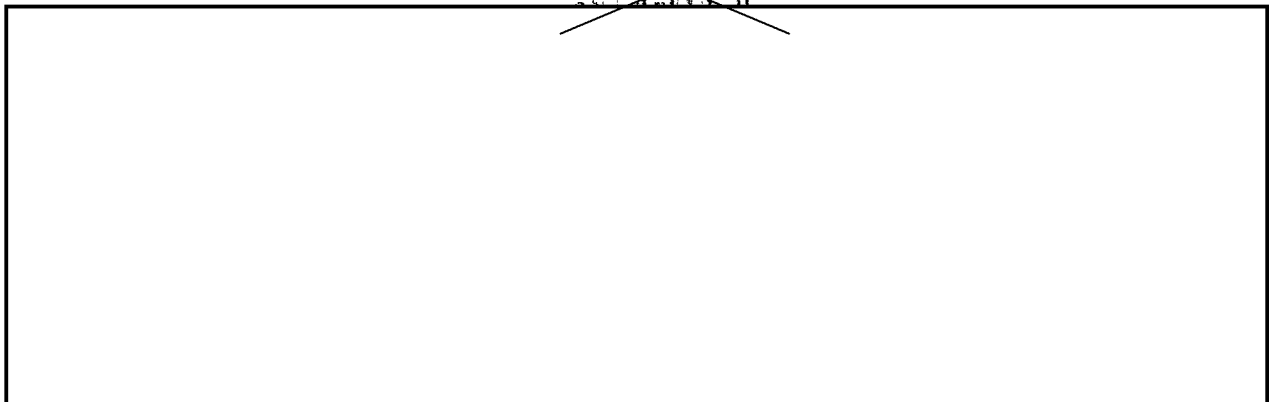

Files of the Office of Security and Visa Office, Department of State, Washington, D.C., were reviewed for any reference to the aforementioned names with negative results.

Continuous liaison has been maintained with the United States Secret Service (USSS) in view of concurrent jurisdiction, but the USSS has to date developed no positive information concerning the existence of an alleged plot.

The Bureau of Special Services (BSS), New York City Police Department (NYCPD), was immediately notified concerning the alleged plot and the Commanding Officer of BSS advised that his undercover officers would be alerted and assigned to determine any available information. Continuous liaison has been maintained with the BSS, however, no positive information has been developed to date.

Results of the above investigation have been entirely negative and nothing has been developed to indicate that the alleged plot does in fact exist.

Target number two Washington for Johnson and Humphrey." The caller then said "Roger" and hung up.

The above was immediately furnished by telephone at 4:58 p.m. to Secret Service Agent Chalfant, Washington, and Washington Field Office Supervisor Todd was instructed to inform the Metropolitan Police. New York Office Special Agent (SA) O'Neil was instructed to inform Secret Service, local authorities, and the Albany Office for similar dissemination there. Subsequently, SAC Conroy, Albany, telephoned and said he had received the same information from Customs and indicated that the New York State Police also had the story. The attached teletype from Buffalo reports that the Erie County Sheriff's Office had passed on the story and that all local authorities had been notified. An all-points bulletin, also attached, instructed that all border crossings and points of entry be informed.

He said that they tried and succeeded Friday night in crossing the border at Jackman, Maine.

A call had been received at the Montreal, Quebec, Consulate 6-6-68, containing similar information. It was also an anonymous call.

The Boston Office was instructed at 5:45 p. m., 6-8-68, to conduct necessary inquiries at Jackman, Maine, to determine if there is any substance to the information furnished by the anonymous caller.

It is noted that if these individuals had crossed the border, an overt act might be evidenced and a possible violation of the Assaulting the President indicated.

This is to advise of the details surrounding the receipt of two anonymous telephone calls made to United States Consulates in Canada in which the anonymous caller in both instances alleged that eight individuals were planning to assassinate the President, Vice President and Governor Rockefeller.

## DETAILS

On 6/6/68, an anonymous call was received by a member of the United States Consulate, Montreal, Quebec, in which the caller stated he knows of eight Quebec revolutionists who are going to the United States to seek revenge for the murder of Senator Kennedy. The caller stated the victims would be the President, Vice President and Governor Rockefeller.

On 6/8/68, an employee of the United States Consulate in Quebec City, Canada, was advised by an unknown caller that his older brother and seven other Quebec terrorists were headed for Washington, D. C., to assassinate the President. He indicated that the eight individuals are traveling in a truck which has a false bottom loaded with arms stolen from military bases. The caller said these individuals had succeeded Friday night in crossing the border at Jackman, Maine.

United States Secret Service is aware of the above two calls and reportedly is checking with Canadian authorities to determine if there is any substance to this information.

Our Boston Office has made appropriate inquiries at Jackman, Maine, to determine if it is possible that the eight described individuals may have crossed the border there, it being noted that if they had it would constitute a possible overt act and a possible violation of the Assaulting the President Statute. Investigation at Jackman, Maine, indicates

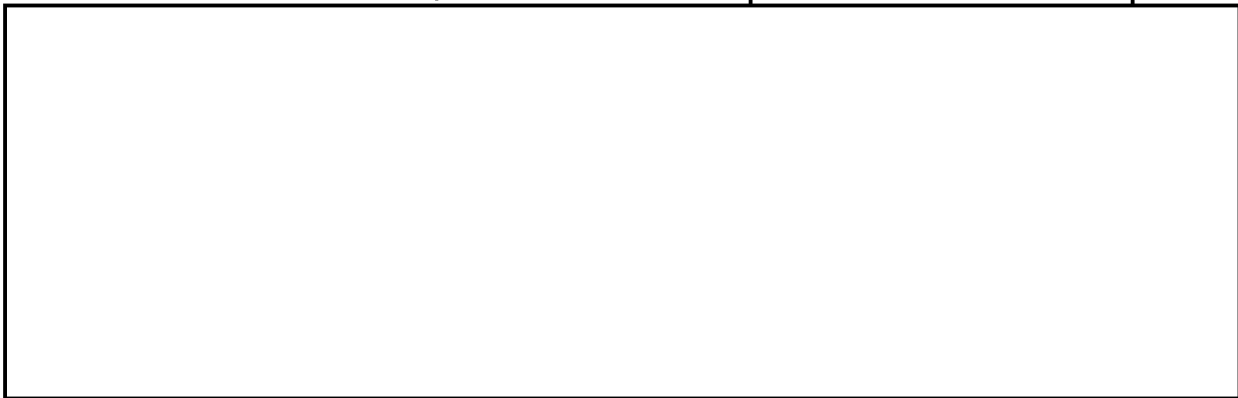

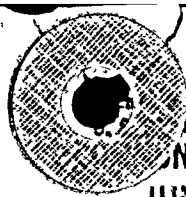

Montreal and U.S. police have classed as a "probable" hoax reports that eight Montrealers were on their way to slay President Johnson and three other leaders, but they were "checking it out" just the same.

The phone call to the U.S. Consulate said eight Quebec revolutionaries were going to avenge the death of Senator Kennedy by "killing off" Hubert Humphrey, Richard Nixon, Nelson Rockefeller and President Johnson.

The report which started with an anonymous telephone call at 4:30 p.m. yesterday to the U.S. Consulate here, was flashed to all border crossing points, to Washington and to the FBI.

In Montreal today Chief of Detectives Paul E. Olivier said the rumor that an alleged gang of Quebec terrorists invading the U.S. on a killing rampage was "stupid."

"Of course, we must check the flimsy report out as far as we can, but the whole thing sounds fantastically idiotic," he said.

As soon as the RCMP and city police were informed of the phone call, checks were made by customs men at all border crossings to be on the lookout for a car carrying eight French Canadians.

United States police and border authorities last night were alerted to watch for "Quebec revolutionaries" on their way "to avenge the death of Senator Robert Kennedy" through assassination of certain American political leaders.

Although the report was considered far-fetched, authorities were obliged to take it seriously as a precautionary measure.

Border points were placed under surveillance by New York State Police and customs and immigration officials while the FBI, RCMP and Washington police were put on guard.

**U.S. Consulate  
Warned**

The original report was the result of an anonymous telephone call yesterday afternoon to the U.S. Consulate in Montreal.

The unidentified male voice, speaking in unaccented English, told a consular officer that a group of eight "Quebec revolutionaries" were on the way to avenge the assassinated Senator.

The consulate notified Customs officials. Within minutes N.Y. State police issued a "routine police information bulletin" listing details of the call.

The bulletin quoted information saying the Quebecers left Montreal last night "traveling through New York state to assassinate President Johnson, Vice-president Humphrey and Governor Rockefeller for the purpose of avenging the slaying of Senator Kennedy."

A police officer in Malone, N.Y., said "naturally we consider it far-fetched but we have to check it out."

Sources in Montreal's radical circles dismissed the report as "absolutely absurd."

"If anybody considered doing that, they couldn't be very politicalized," said a young man with extremist connections.

Intelligence officers in the Washington City Police force said they were alerted by the FBI about possible Quebec-based assassination attempts around 9.30 last night. They will be taking "the usual extra precautions."

ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) -- The police of New York state confirmed yesterday that they had received reports indicating that eight "Quebec revolutionaries" left Montreal to avenge the death of Senator Robert F. Kennedy.

The report in question says that the eight individuals were to cross the State of New York yesterday evening to assassinate first President Johnson, then Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller of New York State, and then Vice President Hubert Humphrey.

These claimed plans for vengeance supposedly were revealed yesterday afternoon in an anonymous phone call to the American Consulate in Montreal.

The message supposedly was also confirmed by the plice in Batavia, New York.

The state police headquarters affirmed having received notification from the FBI and believe that special measures have been taken throughout the state. They did not elaborate.

At Albany, the FBI neither confirmed nor denied the news.

Elsewhere, at Massena, near the Canadian border, an American customs agent let it be understood that the inspectors had been alerted to look out for "a car carrying eight French-Canadians." The New York State police at Malone also affirmed that they had received a report on the subject of the eight presumed revolutionaries from the border post at Ogdensburg and that "the necessary measures were taken."

At Champlain, the closest border station to Montreal for entering New York State, a spokesman explained "that a special alert had been made all along the frontier" but that nothing had happened which could confirm the report. "We don't know if it's a joke," he said, "But with everything that's happened recently, we can't take chances."

One is reminded that the American Consulate in Quebec was recently damaged by an explosion, after a bomb of domestic manufacture had been placed in front of the principle entrance.

The Quebec Police, supported by the RCMP and by the Suret  provinciale, are continuing their investigation of this attack which caused no injuries.

Special Agent Jessie Hall of the Senior Resident Agency, Alexandria, Virginia, was advised of the above and instructed to immediately interview Brown concerning the above and to make every effort to place Brown in custody. Hall at 7:05 telephonically stated that on arriving at Brown's address, Brown consented to be interviewed only by one Agent at which time Hall entered Brown's apartment and related to him that the FBI desired to interview him regarding alleged threatening calls and Brown went into a lengthy obscenities, claiming the FBI had killed his wife "as sure as though you had held a gun to her head" He stated he had gone this route before and that he had received a call from a woman ~~who~~<sup>he</sup> had known six or seven years to discuss a private matter and claimed that it was all a hoax made up to harass him.

Hall related that Brown claimed that he was ill with the flu and from his actions appeared to be mentally unstable. Hall stated he discussed the obscene complaints and threatening calls with AUSA John D. Schmittlen who advised that he referred not to give a prosecutive opinion until an affidavit was obtained from the complainant.

Special Agent George Cronin, Hyattsville Resident Agency, was instructed to immediately interview  and obtain a signed statement and contact the Alexandria Resident Agency regarding the results of same. In addition to the above, Special Agent Jessie Hall in Bureau car 44 is maintaining a surveillance on Brown's residence pending receipt of the information obtained from  *B RIP:ms ms*

Investigation was immediately instituted. Subject was located and interviewed by Bureau Agents at his residence in Arlington, Virginia. Interviewing Agents described him as an obviously mentally deranged individual. Subject denied making any threats.

The U. S. Attorney, Alexandria, has indicated that upon the receipt of a signed statement from [redacted] concerning the details of subject's conversation with her, he will authorize prosecution of subject under the Federal Extortion Statute. Subject is being closely surveilled by Agents until an arrest warrant is obtained. U. S. Secret Service immediately notified.

We are affording this investigation thorough and immediate attention and upon the obtaining of a warrant subject will be promptly arrested.

DETAILS: [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] telephonically advised the Bureau at 1:20 a. m. , 12/17/68, that subject Brown of Arlington, Virginia, has been harassing her for several years with obscene telephone calls and that she has had her telephone number changed several times for this reason.

She advised that she had just received another call from Brown in which Brown threatened the life of Mr. Hoover, the President and the President-elect. The subject indicated to her he had access to two firearms and other weapons and indicated he had friends that would assist him.

Agents of our Richmond Office immediately instituted investigation and located subject Brown at his residence in Arlington, Virginia. He was thoroughly interviewed; however Agents described him as an obviously mentally deranged individual. He denied making any threats to victims and claimed the charge made by [REDACTED] is a hoax made up to harass him. The U. S. Attorney in Alexandria, Virginia, has indicated that upon the receipt of a signed statement containing the details of the conversation between subject and [REDACTED] he will authorize prosecution of subject under the Federal Extortion Statute. Baltimore Agents are in the process now of obtaining this statement.

Until Agents in Arlington, Virginia, receive this statement and a warrant is obtained for subject, subject is being kept under surveillance in his residence.

Our files reveal that Brown was previously the subject of investigations by the Bureau. He was found guilty in 1963 of Impersonation and Federal Housing Administration violations and in 1960 was the subject of an Extortion investigation in which he attempted to extort money from an individual. Prosecution was declined in this matter.

Inasmuch as subject made threats against the President and President-elect, U. S. Secret Service has been advised of the developments in this case.



On the early morning of December 17, 1968, [redacted]

[redacted] advised that during a telephone conversation with Herbert Whitney Brown, Apartment 1, 1515 North 16th Road, Arlington, Virginia, telephone 528-3041, he claimed he had a weapon and was "going to get" President Johnson before he left office. He alleged he also knew that FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover lived somewhere on Massachusetts Avenue in Washington, D. C. and it had been his "fault" that Brown served time in Lewisburg (possibly United States Penitentiary at Lewisburg, Pennsylvania). She said he did not make a verbal threat against Director Hoover, but gave the impression by the tone of his voice that he was "going to take care of" both.

Efforts were made to interview Herbert Whitney Brown, Apartment 1, 1515 North 16th Road, Arlington, Virginia, at 6:05 A.M. on December 17, 1968. He denied engaging in any conversation containing any threats, referring to this as an "absurd allegation." He claimed he had had a telephone call from a "lady friend," whom he declined to name, concerning private business. He declined to be further interviewed and used vulgar, abusive and obscene language.

Sergeant L. M. Holsclaw, Police Department, Arlington County, Virginia, was advised of the above information at 6:25 A.M. on December 17, 1968.

This matter was discussed with Assistant United States Attorney John D. Schmidtlein, Eastern District of Virginia, Alexandria, Virginia, at 6:30 A.M., when Mr. Schmidtlein withheld prosecutive opinion to review a signed statement or affidavit from [redacted]

Subsequently, it was ascertained from Assistant United States Attorney Stefan Long, Eastern District of Virginia, Alexandria, that Special Agent Harold E. Creamer, Secret Service, Washington, D. C., had presented facts concerning a telephone call Brown made to that office on the morning of December 17, 1968.

At 10:00 A.M. on December 17, 1968, Mr. Kenneth Giannoules, Secret Service, Washington, D. C., confirmed that agency's interest in Brown and advised a presentment was being made to the Assistant United States Attorney at Alexandria.

At 10:55 A.M. on December 17, 1968, Mr. Schmittlein advised there appeared to be insufficient evidence to charge Brown with violation of the Extortion Statute and he was authorizing Mr. Creamer, Secret Service, to secure complaint and warrant, charging Brown with violation of Title 18, Sections 871 and 875C, United States Code, based on his call to that agency.

At 11:03 A.M. on December 17, 1968, while awaiting arrival of Secret Service personnel at 1516 North 16th Road, Arlington, Brown was seen to leave his apartment and enter a Red Top Cab, at which time he was taken into custody by Special Agents of the FBI. He was transported to the Office of the United States Marshal at Alexandria and turned over to the custody of Deputy United States Marshal James M. McCarthy, in the presence of Special Agent Creamer of Secret Service. He made no statements during this time.

Brown appeared before United States Commissioner Alex Akerman, Alexandria, on December 17, 1968, when he was remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal in lieu of \$10,000.00 surety bond. His hearing was scheduled for December 23, 1968 at 2:00 P.M.

## Synopsis:

On December 2, 1968, [redacted]

[redacted] reported that she had received a harrassing type telephone call from HERBERT WHITNEY BROWN. [redacted] advised that BROWN stated that he had telephonically contacted [redacted] and had posed as Captain WILSON of the FBI and had subsequently asked [redacted] questions about [redacted] personal habits. On December 17, 1968, [redacted] advised that during a telephone conversation with BROWN he claimed that he had a weapon and was going to get President JOHNSON before he left office. BROWN interviewed December 17, 1968, denied all allegations and declined to be further interviewed. Signed statement obtained from [redacted] re this call. AUSA JOHN D. SCHMIDTLEIN, Eastern District of Virginia, Alexandria, Virginia declined prosecution under extortion statute and authorized prosecution under Title 18, Section 871 and 875C, US Code. Complainant filed by SA HAROLD E. CREAMER, United States Secret Service, Washington, D.C. On December 17, 1968 while awaiting arrival of United States Secret Service Agent, BROWN taken into custody by Bureau Agents as he attempted to leave his apartment. BROWN remanded custody United States Marshal, Alexandria, Virginia. He appeared before US Commissioner AKERMAN, Alexandria, on December 17, 1968 and remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal in lieu of \$10,000 security bond. On December 30, 1968, AUSA JOHN D. SCHMIDTLEIN, Eastern District Virginia, Alexandria, Virginia, advised subject's preliminary hearing continued to January 30, 1969 at 11:00 A.M. Subject released to custody of his attorney on personal recognizance bond.

[redacted]  
called the Bureau. She reported that subject has been making annoying telephone calls to her and some of her friends for several weeks. She said she has reported this to the telephone company, to no avail.

She explained that she became acquainted with subject about five years ago, through her employment. She has not seen him in several years. She said he is a "nut" who has some affection for her, although they were never close and she is married to [redacted]. She advised that BROWN resides at 1516 North 16th Street, Arlington, Virginia.

[redacted] said that about three weeks ago, BROWN called her neighbor, [redacted] who lives in the apartment directly under her, and is an employee of the Navy Department, Payroll Division. He identified himself to [redacted] as "Captain WILSON of the FBI" and proceeded to ask her questions about [redacted] which [redacted] answered because of his representation.

[redacted] also stated that BROWN, in some of his phone conversations with her, has stated that he was going to kill President-Elect NIXON, President JOHNSON, and Vice President HUMPHREY. She also said BROWN has served time in the Federal Prison at Lewisburg for obtaining loans from a Bethesda, Maryland, bank using a false identity.

Bureau File indicates that a person possibly identical with subject was the subject of an impersonation case in early 1960's involving the obtaining of bank loans in Bethesda by the impersonation of a DHEW doctor. He was sentenced to 11 months on three counts in Baltimore. He was also the subject of an extortion case in 1960 and an ITSMV case in 1963, Washington Field origin in both, where prosecution was declined.

On the early morning of December 17, 1968, [redacted]

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[redacted] advised that during a telephone conversation with HERBERT WHITNEY BROWN, Apartment 1, 1515 North 16th Road, Arlington, Virginia, telephone 528-3041, he claimed he had a weapon and was "going to get" President Johnson before he left office. He alleged he also knew that FBI Director J. EDGAR HOOVER lived somewhere on Massachusetts Avenue in Washington, D.C. and it had been his "fault" that BROWN served time in Lewisburg (possibly United States Penitentiary at Lewisburg, Pennsylvania). She said he did not make a verbal threat against Director HOOVER, but gave the impression by the tone of his voice that he was "going to take care of" both.

Efforts were made to interview HERBERT WHITNEY BROWN, Apartment 1, 1515 North 16th Road, Arlington, Virginia, at 6:05 A.M. on December 17, 1968. He denied engaging in any conversation containing any threats, referring to this as an "absurd allegation." He claimed he had had a telephone call from a "lady friend," whom he declined to name, concerning private business. He declined to be further interviewed and used vulgar, abusive and obscene language.

Sergeant L. M. HOLSCLAW, Police Department, Arlington County, Virginia, was advised of the above information at 6:25 A.M. on December 17, 1968.

This matter was discussed with Assistant United States Attorney JOHN D. SCHMIDTLEIN, Eastern District of Virginia, Alexandria, Virginia, at 6:30 A.M., when Mr. SCHMIDTLEIN withheld prosecutive opinion to review a signed statement or affidavit from [redacted]

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Subsequently, it was ascertained from Assistant United States Attorney STEFAN LONG, Eastern District of Virginia, Alexandria, that Special Agent HAROLD E. CREAMER, Secret Service, Washington, D.C. had presented facts concerning a telephone call BROWN made to that office on the morning of December 17, 1968.

At 10:00 A.M. on December 17, 1968, Mr. KENNETH GIANNOULES, Secret Service, Washington, D.C., confirmed that agency's interest in BROWN and advised a presentment was being made to the Assistant United States Attorney at Alexandria.

At 10:55 A.M. on December 17, 1968, Mr. SCHMIDTLEIN advised there appeared to be insufficient evidence to charge BROWN with violation of the Extortion Statute and he was authorizing Mr. CREAMER, Secret Service, to secure complaint and warrant, charging BROWN with violation of Title 18, Sections 871 and 875C, United States Code, based on his call to that agency.

At 11:05 A.M., on December 17, 1968, while awaiting arrival of Secret Service personnel at 1516 North 16th Road, Arlington, BROWN was seen to leave his apartment and enter a Red Top Cab, at which time he was taken into custody by Special Agents of the FBI. He was transported to the Office of the United States Marshal at Alexandria and turned over to the custody of Deputy United States Marshal JAMES M. McCARTHY, in the presence of Special Agent CREAMER of Secret Service. He made no statements during this time.

BROWN appeared before United States Commissioner ALEX AKERMAN, Alexandria, on December 17, 1968; when he was remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal in lieu of \$10,000.00 surety bond. His hearing was scheduled for December 23, 1968 at 2:00 P.M.

"I first met HERBERT WHITNEY BROWN in approximately 1960 while [redacted]

[redacted] At that time, Mr. BROWN was employed by some real estate firm in Washington, D.C. Since that time, I have seen Mr. BROWN on two (2) occasions, 1962 and then again in 1963. During the period 1960 to 1968, I have received a rash of telephone calls from BROWN.

"At approximately 1:15 A.M., on December 17, 1968, BROWN called me and made the following statement. He talked about a new job with American NCO, 1616 16th Road, Arlington, Virginia. He further stated that he was getting a 1968 Cadillac and that he had a weapon, he mentioned the numbers 40:44 or 44:40. He further stated that he had the means and was going to get JOHNSON before he left office. He further stated that he knew that Mr. HOOVER of the FBI lived somewhere on Massachusetts Avenue near Washington, D.C., and that it was his fault that he (BROWN) had served time in Lewisburg Federal Prison. BROWN used the terms 'mother (obscene)' and 'cock (obscene)' in referring to
