2. Rev.Stefan Lucaci had earlier been elected Head Priest to succeed Rev. Martinian Ivanovici, who had been earlier associated with the Rumanian Legation but had later refused to return to Rumania and announced his support of King Mihai in the summer of 1948.

3. Following the election of the Council, Rev Ivanovici, Andrei Bejan, Dr. Petre liescu, and Major Ioan Lupoaia, a supporter of General Nicolae Radesou,

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complained to the French authorities that the church had fallen into the hands of the Iron Guard and was used to hide Horia Sima when he was in Paris. On 19 November 1948 Rev. Stefan Lucaci and Rev. Vasile Boldeanu were interviewed by the police authorities and shortly thereafter were informed that the council election was illegal. They were told that Rev Ivanovici had organized a Rumanian Religion Association which was recognized as legal. Boldeanu was accused by the French authorities of attempting to reorganize the Iron Guard under the protection of the church. All Iron Guard members then resigned from the church council.

4. Following the success of Rev. Ivanovici's manoeuver, the National Peasants in Paris announced their opposition to Communist control of the church. General Radescu' has likewise issued instructions to his adherents to oppose Rev Ivanovici.
