SYNOPSIS OF FACTS Subject reportedly fled to Germany in 1941 and was interned at Buchenwald; arrived in Rome, Italy, 1949 where he resided 13 Via Corvisieri, and was employed by the Pontifical Assistance Committee and was active in the Rumanian movement for European unity. Subject among Iron Guard members who beat STEFAN CONSTANTIN VICTOR POPESCU at Rostock, Germany, following trial in which POPESCU accused of being anti-Horia Sima. Reportedly current Detroit outlet for Iron Guard funds channelled from Sima in Spain through Canada.

DETAILS:				
<u>BACKGROUND</u>				
T-1, another government agency which conducts security type investigations, advised on April 1, 1954 that Subject, TIBERIU HUMITA, a stateless Rumanian, holder of IRO passport 0022982, arrived in Rome, Italy, on January 14, 1949 taking lodging at 13 Via Corvisieri; that, while in Rome, Subject was employed by the Pontifical Assistance Committee at 149 Via del Babuino. That, in 1941, after the coup d'etat of Antonescu, in Rumania, Subject had fled to Germany where he had been later interned at Buchenwald Concentration Camp. That, while in Rumania, Subject had been a University Engineering student.

T-2, another government agency which conducts security type investigations, advised that Subject was a participant in the Youth and Student movement of the Rumanian movement for European unity. Latter organization, according to this informant, originated at Rome, Italy, on November 4, 1949, for the purpose of representing Rumanian exiles in Italy.

RUMANIAN IRON GUARD

T-1 advised on April 1, 1954, that Subject, an anti-Communist, had been a Legionnaire in the Rumanian Iron Guard.

T-3, of unknown reliability, familiar with Subject while in Germany, advised on February 8, 1954, that Subject, TEODOR HUMITA, was one of the members of the Iron Guard at Rostack, Germany, who had physically beaten one STEFAN CONSTANTIN VICTOR POPESCU, a member of the "Mexican" faction within the Iron Guard, following a tortue period and "kangaroo court" in which POPESCU had been accused of being anti-Horia Sima.

T-4, of unknown reliability, a self-admitted former charter member of the Rumanian Iron Guard at Bucharest, Rumania, and at Germany, advised on March 27, 1954 that Subject is a follower and contact of Horia Sima in Spain and a friend of (Father) GEORGE PREDA of Hamilton, Ontario, Canada, who, according to informant, is also a follower of Horia Sima; and, further, that HUMITA is considered by informant to be the Detroit outlet for Iron Guard funds channelled by Sima from Spain through Canada.
