1. Subject is peddling information among Rumanian emigre groups and Western intelligence services.

2. Subject was born on 29 October 1910 in Buzau, Rumania. He attended the Rumanian Aeronautical Technical School of Medias from 1925 to 1931. Between 1931 and 1934 he attended the School for Aviation Officers, Mamaia School of Firing and Bombardment, and Buzau Aviation School of War. He took the Bucharest Polytechnic School's course in electromechanics (1936-1941) and received his diploma as engineer.

He has given up his alias of Peter BOGDAN and presently lives in Salzburg under his own name. He has rented a post office box, No. 141 Hauptpostamt, Salzburg, where he receives his correspondence. His home address is Petre CONSTANTINESCU, bei SCHOEN, Auenbergstrasse 25/II, Salzburg, Tel. 69.7.83. *cross CONSTANTINESCU is about 5'6" tall, dark hair, regular features and usually wears a trench coat.* He has a weakness for women and during 1951 *S.P. per file*

3. In 1941 Subject was sentenced to a long prison term for Iron Guard activities. When an amnesty was decreed, he managed to persuade a high-ranking member of the Communist-controlled Rumanian Security Police to withhold derogatory information from his files (regarding Iron Guard activities) and as a result he was released from prison in 1946. As soon as he got out of prison Subject reestablished contacts with the National Peasant Party and National Liberal Party. His renewed contacts with former military comrades brought him into contact with different resistance groups in Rumania. He worked actively with these groups until 1948, at which time he left Rumania clandestinely and reached Salzburg.

He had had previous contact with the <sup>CIC</sup> ~~U.S.~~ in Salzburg and was employed as an agent upon his arrival there, subordinating himself to the German elements. From Salzburg he established a courier route to Rumania, from which certain uncontrolled elements, including a Communist agent, came out of Rumania. As a result of this, his standing with the I.S. in Salzburg was weakened. Therefore, in order to strengthen his position with the I.S., from which came the necessary funds, he went to Paris to recruit couriers to establish his contact with Rumania via another safe route. Because of his connections with the French I.S. in Innsbruck, he received from the French authorities official identification papers and a travel visa to France, without difficulty. In Paris he recruited a close associate, one Ion Tantareanu, former member of the Rumanian Security Police, who worked for CIC in Trieste but was declared "persona non grata" for engaging in intelligence activities contrary to U.S. interests. About this same time CONSTANTINESCU also sought to regain the confidence of the Horia SIMA group and put at its disposal \$23,000, <sup>allegedly</sup> ~~supposedly~~ paid to him <sup>by certain individuals</sup> for bringing people out of Rumania. He further promised the SIMA group that he would obtain from General RADESCU the funds for establishing clandestine operations into Rumania. This operation would be placed at the disposal of the SIMA group. However, RADESCU did not cooperate with him and told CONSTANTINESCU, instead, to exploit his present favorable position with the I.S. in Salzburg. In 1951 CONSTANTINESCU was in contact with General <sup>low</sup> ~~CH~~ <sup>H</sup> ~~GEORGE~~, who was attempting to establish a courier route from Munich to Rumania through Yugoslavia. It was agreed that safe passage would be ~~granted~~ granted the courier by the UDB in exchange for intelligence information <sup>(allegedly</sup> supplied by CONSTANTINESCU). In 1952 it was reported that Subject was working <sup>as sub-agent for the Rumania Madeleine Manca</sup> ~~for RFE~~ and attempting to establish a hostel to lodge and feed Rumanian refugees whom he would debrief. <sup>(for whom?)</sup>

SUBJECT is suspected of betraying a number of Rumanian friends to the Security Police, and has been denounced by various Rumanian emigres who suspect that he may have sold out to the Communists in order to obtain his release from prison in 1946. Subject has won the reputation of being an indiscriminate opportunist who will align himself with any and all groups. Latest cable from the field advises that Joachim VACARESCU is acting as a cutout for CONSTANTINESCU for debriefing Rumanians, in Braz area.
