I WOULD ARGUE THAT THIS HAS BEEN INEFFECTIVE IN THE SENSE THAT THEY CONTINUE THEIR TERRORIST ACTIVITIES ALL OVER THE WORLD AND SEEM TO EXPORT IT. 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SUCCESSFUL BECAUSE AT THE END OF THE DAY, AS LONG AS THE IRANIANS REFUSE TO REMOVE THE OBSCURE FATWA AND STILL THREATEN TO MURDER A BRITISH CITIZEN, THEN THERE CAN BE NO NORMAL RELATIONS WITH IRAN AND BRITAIN HAS BEEN IN THE FOREFRONT OF MAKING THAT CLEAR WITHIN THE EUROPEAN UNION AS WELL AS ELSEWHERE.
