Indonesian military (TNI) General Kiki Syanakri on September 27 said "farewell" to Interim Force for East Timor (INTERFET) Commander Cosgrove behind closed doors and then departed Dili; Cosgrove emphasized this was not an official "handover," according to Embassy Jakarta and press reports. Over the weekend, INTERFET swiftly expelled militias from the town of Likisia.

The exodus of refugees into western Timor continues; there are also growing concerns about those trapped in militia-controlled and crime-plagued camps, according to Embassy Jakarta and press reports. Relief activities remain largely limited to a narrow INTERFET-controlled strip. Though few Timorese are starving, many towns and villages continue to burn. Departing TNI soldiers on September 25 massacred 14 church members on the road between Baukau and Los Palos. (

Comment: With growing operational confidence, and remaining TNI troops sticking closer to their barracks, INTERFET will be extending methodically the parameters of relief activity. Beyond this thin zone, and especially in western Timor, militias will terrorize and loot at will.
