

1. At approx. 11:00 Am Miss Alice HODGES, Public Health Nurse, advised this office that Gene Murie NORN had sighted a U.F.O. earlier in the morning. At the time I was busy and NORN was not interviewed until later. He described to me what he had seen and told me of other people who had seen it also. When questioning the persons concerned I followed the format laid out in Operational Manual CO-Air and took detailed notes rather than statements. This way I was able to obtain more detail on the sightings as the locals were inclined to talk in monophrases, leave out details, and supply sketchy descriptions. The first person interviewed was NORN.

Gene Murie NORN (B:13 FEB 33) T.I.

- (a) Midnight to 12:30 AM 16 JUL 68.
- (b) Cloudy southwest of settlement and cloudy north of the settlement. Area between clear.
- (c) -
- (d) On roadway opposite Angus BEAULIEU'S walking towards my home in a westerly direction.
- (e) Alone.
- (f) Like a fireball. Like when you shoot a flare - a fire ball goes ahead and sort of sparks following quite aways behind. Sparks were like an arc welder, green and red in colour. Smoke behind like a jet only twisted a different shape. About the size of a jelly bean in the sky. Only took a few seconds to pass, less than a minute. Came from southwest travelling straight northeast. Looks like its breathing, sort of flaring, and this is when the sparks would fly out and smoke would come out. No noise at anytime. No wings. Travelling very fast, faster than a jet does in the sky. Looked like it was coming down but it didn't and went into the clouds and disappeared. Never saw anything like it before. Not a falling star. Smoke looks the same as smoke from fireworks, kind of curly. No idea how high.
- (g) Took about a minute to cross the open space, maybe about fifty seconds.
- (h) I consider NORN to be a steady, truthful individual and quite reliable. He has been employed by Forestry on fire fighting and was given a course in aircraft spotting. He produced RCAF Manual on Aircraft Recognition for the Ground Observer (AF Manual 355-10 CAP 462) and advised that the photo of the B-61 or Matador pilotless aircraft, page 80, resembled what he had seen. He told me the only difference was that the bright light or fire was directly at the rear of the object, there were numerous sparks, no wings, and no noise. Also no tail fin.

Margaret Rose MANDEVILLE (B:27 OCT 47)

- (a) 12:30 to 1:00 AM 16 JUL 68.
- (b) Clear. Clouds in the northeast.
- (c) -
- (d) Intersection of the road by McPHERSON'S and road to Chris' Cafe.
- (e) Alone.
- (f) Long and pointed towards the front end. Sparks around the side of it, just ordinary, no colours. No sound. Bright light, lot brighter than the stars. Not too high. Could see it really plain. Before it went into the clouds I heard what sounded like two shots. After it went into the clouds I heard a sort of explosion, something like a backfire from a car, just above me when I first saw it. Stayed a steady colour. Smoke behind, just a streak like a jet. Big, about 4 - 5 feet long (this is not an estimate on the size of the object but how big it looked in the sky). Really fast, lot faster than jets. No wings. Flying straight across. The bottom area was lighting it up but the rest was a light silvery colour. It was an orangy light, brighter than the stars but not the same colour.
- (g) one half to a minute observation.
- (h) Miss MANDEVILLE is also considered a truthful person and is normally reliable. She was frightened by the object and thought it was some kind of bomb. She told me that it was the bright light from the object when it was overhead that made her look up as she had not noticed it until that time. She could offer no estimate on the height.

Ernest Michael FABIEN (B:16 MAY 48)

Lawrence Allan LAROCQUE (B:12 JUN 51)

- (a) About 1:00 AM - after 12 for sure.
- (b) A few clouds, higher than the U.F.O.
- (c) -
- (d) Down by August BEAULIEU'S house on the old roadway that runs in front of the Bay house to the dock. We were walking.
- (e) Thomas Mathew UNKA.
- (f) Big bright light with all kinds of sparks around it and behind it. Sparks were purple, red, white and green. Big long light behind it. Sort of round shape. Quite big, bigger than a jet. Never made a sound. Very bright, brighter than the stars. Didn't seem to be very high. Really fast, faster than a jet. No wings. Looked like a star when we first saw it then it got really big and bright. It was straight out over the dock when we first seen it. We could see lights or what might be windows when it was going over. Really low and quite distinct. When it was past away it looked purplish. Travelling in a straight line. Heard what sounded like two shots when it was farther away.

There was smoke behind in a streak, bright and wide. It came in from a westerly direction to a north easterly direction. It was low enough that if it was a jet it could be heard quite loud.

(g) Couple of minutes duration, no more than that.

(h) There is nothing to indicate that FABIEN and LAROCQUE are fabricating their story. I would not rate them as being as reliable as MANDEVILLE and NORN.

Mathew Tommy UNKA (B:24 AUG 50) T.I.

(a) 12:30 AM 16 JUL 68.

(b) Clear

(c) -

(d) Ernest Michael FABIEN and Lawrence Allan LAROCQUE'S location applies.

(e) With the above two.

(f) It looked like a star when I first seen it, then all of a sudden it got bigger and there were lights around it. Blue, white, and red lights. There was vapour about a mile behind. I could see it was long and oval shaped. No wings. Way brighter than the stars, like sparks flying off it. About $\frac{1}{2}$ to a mile high. Travelling in a straight line. The sparks trailed about a $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile behind, then the smoke. The fire was coming from the rear. The whole thing was not glowing, just at the back. The front end was dark oval shaped. The light was like from an acetylene torch in colour only all over the place. It had a tail like a falling star only was slower than that. It was real bright and I could see the glow before it came out of the clouds. No noise.

(g) About 50 seconds to a minute.

(h) FABIEN and LAROCQUE were interviewed earlier than UNKA but accompanied him to the office. As we were going into the office an aircraft flew over and all three stated that the UFO was lower than the aircraft and appeared larger. I consider UNKA to be a reliable sort of person.

2. I checked with the Dept. of Transport Aeradio and they advised that the aircraft that had just passed over was Pacific Western Airlines, flight 182, flying at 7000 feet. I believe this aircraft is known as a Convair. This was approx. 9:10 PM of 16 JUL 68 and the aircraft was quite easily observed from the ground as such although little detail could be seen.

3. The foregoing people were not under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or suffering from lack of sleep when the observations were made.

4. No photographs were taken.
5. I asked the people involved why they had not reported the sighting and all advised that by the time they had made it to the office the object would have been gone.
6. The D.O.T. Aeradio here advise that the ceiling was 1200 ft. scattered with cumulus and 12,000 ft. alto stratus on the night in question.
7. Attached are drawings obtained from the observers. These are quite plain and I doubt if they will supply much information. Attached also is a map of the settlement indicating the location of the people concerned when the sighting was made.
8. A message as required by Opr. Manuel CO-Air was telephoned to the O.C. Fort Smith S/Div. on 17 JUL 68.

1. On the above date at approximately 11:30 PM a call was received at this Detachment. Lauchlin MACKINNON, of DEEPDALE, Inv. Co., N.S. stated that he, and members of his family, had been watching a bright light in the sky over his farm for the past twenty minutes. He stated that the object was still in sight and he wished a member to look into the matter.
2. I made an immediate patrol to the scene where I noticed three or four people standing in front of the MACKINNON farm. They seemed to be watching something to the North. As I approached on foot, I could see a bright object in the sky. It appeared to be several miles away and at a high altitude. The object seemed to be giving off colours of red, green and white. I viewed this object for approximately ten minutes, and no change in position was noted.
3. From investigation conducted, it was learned that the MACKINNON family had been out driving, and upon nearing their home, noticed a luminous object directly over their farm at an altitude of approximately 10,000 ft. It was first noticed by Margaret MACKINNON and brought to the attention of her father. As they entered the driveway the object left in a Northerly direction at a high rate of speed. It then stopped and remained stationary for approximately one hour. It was learned that the roof of the nearby barn had been lit up by the lights of the object. It was further learned that in fact two objects were sighted. A second object was noted at the same altitude, but to the East of the farm. The lights from this object lit up a corner of one of the fields on the MACKINNON farm. This object also left upon their arrival, but did not appear again. It was similar in appearance and made no noise when moving. The exact shape of the object could not be determined due to the intensity of the light. MACKINNON stated that it appeared to be round in shape giving off brilliant layers of the above mentioned colours. It should be noted at this time that this was the only report received on this sighting. Other farms in the area were visited in reference to the sighting. All enquiries met with negative results.

5. It is the opinion of this writer that the source of this sighting seems quite reliable. None of the MACKINNON family were drinking at the time and they appeared sincere in relating their observations.



2. The following details of the sighting were obtained from Goulet.
 - a) The U.F.O. was sighted on 27 JUL 68 between 10:00 P.M. and 10:30 P.M. D.S.T.
 - b) The sky condition was very clear, stars could be seen very clearly.
 - c) The observer was beside his house, at 72 - 10th ave. East, Amos, Que. when he sighted the U.F.O.
 - d) The U.F.O. was sighted due south in a due north direction, in a continuous movement, very fast and in a straight line.
 - e) The luminosity of the U.F.O. was compared to the morning star (Venus), of the same brightness, white light with the intensity of a flash and of a round shape.
 - f) The colour was white, with no persistent train or tail after passage of the U.F.O.
 - g) The size was round, approximately the size of a grapefruit.
 - h) The sighting lasted from 3 to 5 minutes.
 - i) There was no sound made by the U.F.O.
 - j) The U.F.O. travelled from due south to due north.
 - k) No other unusual observations were made by the observer.

3. The observer holds the position of Protonotary, Amos County Court, Amos, Que., and would appear to be a reliable person. This person in making comparison in luminosity with stars, appeared to have a good knowledge of astronomy.

UFO puts on brief show for third straight night

No explanation has been given for the unidentified flying object that appeared Monday for the third straight night near Mount Hays.

DOT worker Hans Wessel, who works night shift at the airport, said today he was on his way to work, about midnight and was out in the harbor

when the object, which he said was extremely bright, came over the mountain, remained for 20 to 30 seconds, then slowly dropped and disappeared.

Wessel, who is also a photographer, said he couldn't attempt to photograph the object because he needed a powerful telephoto lens and lighting conditions were poor. He did, however, observe it through binoculars.

"It was so bright that being used to the dark it was very hard on my eyes," he said.

Wessel also added a new twist to the weather balloon theory.

"We take wind readings every hour, and Saturday night at the time of the sighting, the wind was northwesterly at eight miles an hour. Sunday they were northwesterly at five, so reports of seeing the object moving south would have to prove that it couldn't be a weather balloon, unless they are making them to travel against the wind those days."

Patti Greene said she was with seven or eight girls who sighted the object Saturday. She said it made no noise and was a bright orange with a red spot in the middle.

"It's amazing how many people believe that there could be such a thing as a UFO now that some people in Rupert have seen one," Wessel said.

Unidentified flying object spotted near Mount Hays

What was the object floating about the sky near Mount Hays shortly after midnight Saturday and again Sunday night?

We'll probably never know, but it gave dozens of Rupertites a thrill when they reported seeing a bright light approaching from the southeast, hover over parts of the city for about 30 minutes, then shoot straight up in the air and disappear.

Something appeared again Sunday, but this time it was believed to be a weather balloon with a flare hanging below.

Well known athlete John Olsen saw it Saturday.

"We were on the Fulton street hill when the object was first sighted. It was approaching from the southeast very slowly," Olsen said.

"As the light moved closer we moved across the street to watch. It was near Mount Hays, but not as high as the mountain.

"It looked as bright as about seven or eight street lights. The first thing I thought of was a front landing light on a plane, but it was going too slow and not making any noise.

"At one point I saw a dome over top of the light, but this could have been a reflection on the clouds. It looked similar to the canopy on a parachute.

"I thought it was going to land behind Algoma Park, but it never did. When it got past the line of the dance hall it went straight up out of sight."

Mr. and Mrs. Art Hella, Mr. and Mrs. George Howe, Arnold Moen and several others were with Olsen and his wife, and all verified the sighting, and were equally mystified.

Howe told Olsen that he and his father, while on the fishing grounds, had had a similar experience several years ago, but kept it to themselves for fear of being laughed at.

After witnessing the object Saturday, Howe admitted the previous sighting.

Miss Sax Dudoward also told of seeing the object.

"I was near the hospital in a car and saw the light. I told my friend to look, but he couldn't see it so we got out and he saw it. We watched it for a little while and it started heading north, then went out of sight.

"It seemed to be a bright orange color and was just sort of floating in the air. I have seen them twice before, once last year and once this spring in the prairies. Last summer my sister saw a UFO (Unidentified Flying Object) in Port Simpson and it had 13 little UFOs come out of it and play around the larger object."

The Sunday night sighting was discounted by several off-duty policemen and other observers as a balloon with flare.

"You could see sparks coming off the flare as it was so low," said an anonymous sighter.

Was it teenagers playing pranks with helium filled balloons

and flares, or are the eyes of another world peering into our city?

Ask John Olsen or others that saw the object Saturday night. They are believers. Are you?







William PROCHNER - Report of Unidentified Flying Object
Qu'Appelle, Dist., Sask. 4 AUG 68.

9 AUG 68

1. PROCHNER contacted this office in person and advised that he wished to report a sighting of a "flying saucer". According to PROCHNER, he had observed a U.F.O. at approx. 4:00 am on the 4 AUG 68, however, due to the nature of this complaint, he failed to report it immediately. Prior to reporting this incident he had noticed some unusual marks in his pasture near the barn. He had not noticed these marks before and he felt that they were connected with the sighting of the U.F.O. Col. R.D. Anderson and I, along with Cst. Casady of the Regina Identification Section, patrolled to the scene to examine the marks.

2. On examining these marks, they were found to be circular in shape. The diameter of these circles varied from 4 1/2 feet to 5 feet. These circles were noted to be clear of grass except for the center 2 feet. Six of these marks were found, three of them well pronounced. Four of the marks appeared to be in a square pattern, however, on measuring them, it was found that no real pattern existed. PROCHNER stated that the U.F.O. had been observed above that point. Because of several rain storms, the marks were found to be obliterated to a point. PROCHNER was questioned regarding these marks but he was unable to supply an authentic explanation.

3. The U.F.O. was sighted by Kenneth PROCHNER, William PROCHNER, and Julius PROCHNER, all of Qu'Appelle, Sask. Further to telex #R1448, statements have been obtained from the aforementioned persons and are being embodied here.

4. STATEMENT OF Kenneth PROCHNER (Re: U.F.O.)
of Qu'Appelle Dist., Sask. 3:30 pm 10 AUG 68.

BEGINS: At approx. 4:15 a.m. of the 4 AUG 68 I had just drove into the drive-way of my home. As I drove up near the house I noticed an illuminated object hovering above the house. The object was of circular shape and moved in an oval shape about 100 feet above the house. I got out of my car and ran to the house but the door was locked so I went back to my car and watched the object. I backed the car up about 40 feet and sat there for about 10 minutes. I ran back to the house and kicked the door open. I then ran upstairs and woke my father up. He did not believe me but got up to look. I stayed upstairs for a couple minutes then joined my father outside. By this time when I saw/again it was above the barn but it was quite a bit lower. The object seemed to move away then come back. The object did not send out any light rays. There was no noise coming from the object. I watched the object for a few minutes while it was over the barn and then went into the house to bed.

It was still quite dark when I saw this object. It was a cloudy evening with a new moon. When the object was above the barn I saw it move about 100 feet to the right and stop for 15 seconds, then return to the barn. The object moved very quickly.

5. This is the statement of William PROCHNER of Qu'Appelle, Sask.
DB: 21 AUG 22. Taken 6:50 pm 9 AUG 68.

BEGINS: Approx. 4:00 a.m. on the 4 AUG 68 my son, Kenneth, came upstairs and told me that there was a funny light outside - going around and around and that he wasn't going outside again. I got up and walked outside. As soon as I stepped outside, I saw a round-shaped object hovering over the barn. It continued spinning there and my son and I watched it for approx. one minute. It then moved to the southeast for approx. 100 feet and began to hover again. I watched it for another minute and then left. It appeared as if it was moving away and since I couldn't do anything about it, I went back inside the house.

My house is situated on NW9-14-19 W2nd and is approx. 1½ miles south of Qu'Appelle, Sask. In the farmyard, the barn is situated approx. 150 yards northeast of my house.

The object appeared to be quite large but I could not see the whole object. It was still dark at the time and all I could see is lights that appeared to be revolving around. I could not see the origin of the light but it was evolving from the bottom of the object. From the angle at which I was watching it, it appeared as if the whole bottom was illuminating light. I can't recall what colour the light was but it did not appear very strong. When the object was hovering over the barn, it was approx. 30 feet above the barn. I could not see any light on the barn or on the ground. All I could tell was that it was spinning quite rapidly. When the object moved away from the barn, it moved very quickly--a lot faster than it was spinning. It was just a split second in moving from one position to the next. The object seemed to come out of its spin, fly to the next position and then begin to spin again. I don't think that the object was spinning at all when it moved to the southeast of the barn.

As soon as I walked out, I saw an object hovering over the barn. It seemed quite large -- maybe 25-30 feet across. The bottom of this object was all lit up and I could see that it was revolving quite quickly. The object was hovering at approx. twice the height of the barn. The light coming from the object was quite dull and I did not see

AND I DID NOT SEE any light cast on the ground or the barn. The light didn't appear white but rather a dull orange colour. The object appeared to be round-shaped, but I could not see what the top of the object looked like.

The object hovered over the barn for approx. one minute. It seemed to stop spinning and very quickly it flew to the southeast of the barn. It flew approx. 50 feet, stopped, and then began to spin around again. I don't think that the object was spinning when it moved from one position to the other. I could not tell if the bottom of the object was flat, all I could see were the lights.

The object was still hovering in the yard when I left and went back into the house. I have never seen anything like it before or since this incident. ENDS:


7. These three persons appeared to be sincere when divulging this information and since neither of them have anything to gain as a result of publicity, it is felt that they could be considered reliable.

8. Subsequent investigations in the surrounding area uncovered information regarding an unusual noise. Elizabeth (Mrs. Anton) EBERTS advised that approx. 4:00 a.m. on the date in question she had heard a noise resembling a whirling or whining sound. EBERTS looked out the window but was unable to see anything. The EBERTS farm is located approx. 1/2 mile to the northeast of the PROCHNER farm. Other inquiries in the surrounding district were non-resultant.

9. Reference to telex #R1448, the Meteorological Office at Regina, Saskatchewan advised that the following conditions existed on the 4-AUG-68 in the Regina area. The skies were cloudy with lightning and thunder. The rain commenced at approx. 2:30 a.m. and continued until approx. 3:30 a.m. The lightning started at 2:30 a.m. and continued until 4:55 a.m.


The report was made by me purely in the interest of our National Security and for no other purpose and it may be accepted by the Defence Department for what it is worth.

There are no longer any inhabitants living in that vicinity and people rarely go there these days.

This is of course just my personal opinion and a very very long shot, at that. If it is considered as being unworthy of notice and you may confine it to the limbo of unwanted speculative reasoning.

THE REPORT OF AN UNIDENTIFIED MOVING OBJECT OR OBJECTS AS SEEN IN THE SKY AT NIGHT TIME BY R. GRANDY IRWIN ON THE DATES AS LISTED FROM THE OBSERVATION POINT OF THE WESTERN VERANDA OF HIS RESIDENCE IN SHELBURNE AT THE CORNER OF WATER STREET AND ST. PATRICKS LANE.

August 12th 9.45 P. M.

While witnessing the departure of twilight from the vantage point of my veranda steps on the Western side of my residence in Shelburne at the Corner of Water Street and St. Patricks Lane and while observing the appearance of night-fall and the appearance of the first stars of the night, I observed the first star to appear to my vision was the Evening Star in a direction slightly North of West and at an angle of approximately 40 degrees above the horizon. I also observed a lesser star at an angle of approximately 35 degrees above the horizon and about 5 degrees to the right of the Evening Star.

Suddenly a light appeared between the two stars mentioned. It had the appearance of being another star and was fully as bright as the Evening Star and it was in motion at the precise time of its appearance and it quickly gave the appearance of passing between the two stars already mentioned and it proceeded in a South Westerly direction. There was no sound and the night was calm. The object left no vapor trail or other residue to mark its progress. I call to my wife who was home at the time to come and witness this unusual sight but she was watching television and did not hear me call and I was regretfully compelled to witness this happening alone.

The object was proceeding at an enormous speed and veered first to the left and then to the right at very sharp angles of approximately 45 degrees at each change of direction. These changes of direction were instantaneous and required no discernable lapse of time. It appeared to change direction about six times but always remained on its general course toward the South West, where it disappeared from my vision. Whether its disappearance was by reason of the great distance it had travelled or whether the light had been extinguished by mechanical means, it is impossible for me to say. The elapsed time from the time of sighting until the time of its disappearance, I would carefully estimate to have been ten seconds.

UNIDENTIFIED MOVING OBJECTS IN SKY : CONTINUED.

August 13th--Tuesday-- Nightfall.

Observed Western sky in the direction of the Evening Star. Sky was clear of clouds and many stars plainly visible. No unusual movement of any solid object. Contrails of vapor clearly visible criss crossing in area where previous night's initial sighting occurred. Probably an indication that Jets had recently reconnoitered the area. These contrails were quickly dissipated by a mild drift of air from the North West which carried them away to the South East.

August 14th--Wednesday Nightfall.

Sky in this locality overcast. Nothing observed.

August 15th. Nightfall. Thursday.

Witnessed the appearance of the Evening Star in the West about 40 degrees above the horizon and also a lesser star slightly to the right and slightly lower toward the horizon. Suddenly a bright light resembling a star appeared between the two stars already mentioned. This light was of a brightness and intensity as that of the Evening Star but having a slightly orange color. This object was moving in a South Westerly direction very steadily and at a leisurely rate of speed, comparable to the light from a slow moving plane. I called my wife who observed the object which was clearly visible to her. I observed the object without visual aid and also with my binoculars which have a power of 7 x 35. This object also passed in a line which appeared to pass mid way between the Evening Star and the lesser star already mentioned and along to the South West, very slowly and steadily straight on its course. At the end of about ten minutes it appeared to become motionless where it remained for the next two hours, after which I discontinued my observations.

1. Word was received this date that three local women observed what they believed, was an U.F.O. in the early a.m. of the 16 JUL 68. As a result of interviews with the three persons, the following information was obtained.

- (a) Date and time of sighting: Approx. 12:15 am - 16 JUL 68.
- (b) Condition of Sky: Scattered cloud.
- (c) Identification of observer: Yvonne (Mrs. John) BOSTON.
- (d) Location of observer at time of sighting: Fort Smith, N.W.T.
- (e) Identification of other persons sighting:
 - 1. Francis (Mrs. George) FILIATRAULT, Fort Smith, N.W.T.
 - 2. Molly (Mrs. Merton) MOHR, Fort Smith, N.W.T.
- (f) Description of sighting: The UFO is described by all persons sighting, as round in shape and luminous white in color. The UFO appeared to be travelling very high in the sky and very rapidly. In relation to Jet Planes which travel over this area, the UFO appeared to be travelling much faster. All persons agree that the UFO was travelling in a slight rising arc from South to North.
- (g) Duration of sighting: 4 to 5 seconds.
- (h) Other relevant information: The persons sighting further stated that the UFO was very bright, even though it travelled behind clouds present in the sky. Two of the observers stated that there was a vapour trail present after the UFO had passed. All were together in the same vehicle parked in the driveway at MOHR'S residence. All agree that the UFO did not resemble a falling star or fire ball. There was no noise at any time during or after the sighting.

2. The source of the sighting in this instance is considered very reliable. All the persons concerned are known to members of this detachment, and are considered not the type to invent or imagine the sighting described.



1. On the P.M. of this date, Mr. and Mrs. Richard A. SKEWES and baby sitter, Miss Gail YEMM were interviewed, and the following statements obtained separately:

Statement of Richard A. (Dick) SKEWES,

"I was on the Trans Canada Highway #4 between Truro and Springhill Nova Scotia, I believe I was about 4-5 minutes North of River Philip, Time approx. 2400-0100 when I went up a grade (good, well-marked hwy) and around a corner to the left when I noticed to my right a group of some type of aircraft (unconventional) as far as I could see) hovering at approx. 100 ft. over the trees also to my left I could see another craft approaching at a tremendous speed from about 5-6 miles away angle of sight about 25-30° as I came nearer the centre of this activity one of the forementioned craft broke away from the group moved over the hwy. in front of me and began a slow descent of about 60°. I was sure we would be on a collision course. I slowed to a crawl but feared to stop. I turned the radio off and put my head out the window could not hear a sound a distinct outline of this vehicle was obscured by the series of rapidly & brilliantly flashing lights on the craft the lights were extremely unconventional unlike any I had ever seen. When the closing craft was about 40-50 ft away at I would say 35-40 ft high it suddenly veared up and disappeared in the distance behind me. The group which was to my right was still visible to me in the mirrors until I was too far away (that is to say to my knowledge they were still hovering in the same area and circling at the same time.

"I feel that the time was closer to 11 P.M. on Thursday, August 15th. We left Halifax at 9:15 P.M. and maintained a steady 60 m.p.h. average until our first stop after Moncton. My first reaction on seeing the aircraft was that they must be spraying a fire out since they are so low, so numerous, and so well lit up! But they travelled in such close proximity that I couldn't understand how they did not collide. They appeared to me to be covered with (mostly) yellow and green (?) lights, and I counted at least five before one appeared over

the highway in front of us, heading directly for us. I was positive it was going to land and collide with us. Dick slowed the car right down but there seemed to me to be no way of missing a collision. I prayed hard!!! I think I was too frightened to even scream! It reared up just in time passed right over the car and back over the trees to our right. I watched it out the window and for the first time saw an outline other than the mass of lights. It was dark in colour with what looked like white dots all over it. It reminded me of the World War II plane on display in front of the CNE grounds. After we reached the end of that straight stretch of highway and rounded the corner we lost sight of the craft since they were so low. My last impression was of a light in the sky that Gail and I saw directly over the area where the craft were flying. Gail and I both wondered what the light was caused by since it was very dark out and the moon was in front of us. I would sleep comfortably again if someone could explain to me what the craft were and what they were doing!

Somewhere between Springhill and Truro, N.S., I saw 5 or 6 objects which I thought were airplanes hovering just above the trees, maybe 50 feet or so. It was too dark to see the color of these planes and all I can remember is there were a lot of lights. The only one I can remember is a yellow one, it appeared to be at the front and bigger than the rest. We slowed down and one passed in front of us and this is the one I thought was going to hit us. We did not stop nor could I hear any sounds from these objects. As I thought these were airplanes, I did not pay too much attention to them. It was just the yellow light I could remember best. When I glanced at it first I thought of a flying saucer then after I thought I could see wings without lights so thought nothing more about it.

"At approx. 11:00 PM - Aug. 17th we were passing Toronto and Mrs. SKEWES asked me what I thought those objects were we had seen on Thursday night. I told her airplanes, she then asked what I thought they were doing. I replied, "Possibly checking for a forest fire". This was the first time the subject had been brought up. Then on Monday Mrs. SKEWES telephoned me advising she had phoned the D.N.D. and the R.C.M.P.

A. I don't know. I seems funny there were so many and yet we couldn't hear them.

Q. Could they have been helicopters?

A. I don't think so. The window was open and we couldn't hear them. Helicopters make a lot of noise and these were real close.

Q. How many do you think there were all together?

A. There were 5 or 6.

Q. How long did you see them?

A. Between 5 and 10 minutes. We could see them for quite a ways before passing under. I did not look back.

Q. Were you scared of them?

A. No. Not until Toronto when we started talking about them.

2. Mr. R. A. SKEWES has served three years in the Royal Canadian Navy and advised that 50% of his job was identifying objects from the lookout position. He has never seen anything like this, and with the one coming so close to his auto he was very frightened. He advised he did not discuss this event with the other occupants of the car as he did not want to upset them. He was discharged (Honourable) from the navy approx. 4 years ago.

3. The people interviewed are sincere about this matter, and it has them very confused at the present time. Mr. SKEWES at first did not want anything mentioned about this sighting as people would think him mental. However, after discussing it with his wife and baby-sitter, he felt it only proper that the matter be brought to the attention of the authorities for their information.

4. Mr. and Mrs. SKEWES and Miss YEMM are intelligent people and discussed this matter fully. They would appreciate having a reply on this matter to ease their minds.

- a) Sighted on 5 August 1968 at 9:20 PM. CAMPBELL reported sighting on the 6th August 68. A detailed report was received on the 13th August 1968.
- b) The sky was very heavily clouded at the time of the sighting. CAMPBELL was flying below the ceiling. Visibility was approximately ten miles.
- c) The observer was identified as: James Harrold CAMPBELL,
259-1st. Street,
Brandon, Man.
- d) The observer was located 7 to 8 miles S.W. of Oakburn, Man., when he sighted the U.F.O. The object was approximately 1 mile west of CAMPBELL at this time.
- e) Another observer of the U.F.O. was CAMPBELL'S son Karry CAMPBELL, of the same address.
- f) There was only one U.F.O. sighted at this time. It resembled an object, being approximately 50 feet across and about 10 feet thick. The object was brilliant orange and did not look like it was burning. The object seemed to hover in one spot and then it moved off quite quickly to the west. CAMPBELL was flying at 1000 feet off the ground and sighted the object at the same altitude as he was flying.
- g) CAMPBELL and his son saw the object for a good 5 minutes and possibly close to 10 minutes. The object then headed due west, disappeared possibly going through a cloud then reappeared and then went out of sight.
- h) This is the first U.F.O. that CAMPBELL has seen. He has been flying for six months and does not wear glasses. The object seemed to be hovering over a field when it was first observed. CAMPBELL could not tell what the object was powered by. CAMPBELL estimated the distances by road allowances.


Dear Mrs. Mellanby:

Your letter of September 12 has been passed to me for reply.

Without more detailed information concerning the various objects which you have seen in the sky, it is very difficult to say exactly what they were. Your description tallies very well with the general appearance of certain times of experimental balloons and, as you know, these very often are sent up on a regular schedule. Just recently it was announced in the United States that many of the sightings made a couple of years ago were of a scientific balloon project which could not be announced to the public at that time.

Although we cannot always tell you exactly what has appeared in the sky, I can assure you that you need have no worry about any danger to Canadian citizens from these objects. In over thirty-five years of making records and of studying things seen in the sky, I have yet to see any evidence for objects operated by unfriendly intelligences over Canada either from outer space or from other nations. If such were present, you can be quite sure that both the Canadian and American Governments would take action.

Malton Confirms Oakville UFO Sighting



OAKVILLE — A flying saucer was reported three miles off Oakville lakeshore early this morning.

The UFO sighting was confirmed by an Oakville policeman and by the control tower of Toronto International Airport.

THE POLICEMAN saw an object in the sky off the end of Dunn Street. It was encircled with lights and had

green and orange flashing lights on top.

Flight observers at Malton confirmed seeing the lights, though the object did not appear on radar scanners.

The airfield observers, unable to explain what the object was, agreed the UFO was visible from the tower and that it did not move.

Const. Dennis Kaye said he watched the lights for more

than 20 minutes. The UFO, 1,000 feet above the water, had a circle of white lights. It appeared that the flashing green and orange light came from one source. It was not individual red and green lights as seen on an aircraft.

THE AIRFIELD observers watched the object through high-powered binoculars for almost 45 minutes. It sudden-

ly disappeared at daybreak they said.

"We get two or three sightings of UFOs reported here every week, with varying degrees of credibility," an airport official said. "This one appears to have been seen by some pretty knowledgeable and believable people. I really don't know what the object could have been."

The observers estimated the UFO's altitude to be about 3,

000 feet over Lake Ontario. It remained motionless during their observation.

Const. Kaye was forced to give up his observation of the UFO to investigate a report of a prowler.

Lakefront citizens also reported the object.

I am attaching herewith a clipping which appeared in the Hamilton Spectator of August 29th 1968 which is self explanatory.

I am writing to you as I watched this U.F.O. on this particular night. I have seen this same sparking light in the sky practically every night since. This light moves from the northern part of the sky towards the south and appears in the sky about 11:00 p.m. each night.

There is also another light which appears in the sky to the west and moves in a westerly direction every clear night. This light appears in the sky (sparks red and green) each evening as soon as it gets dark. It shows before any of the stars. I have watched this and think it must be there when it is light but it cannot be seen until darkness falls.

These two sparking objects appear in the sky at the same time. They seem to jump around as they continue to move out of the range of the binoculars, however it takes hours for them to cross the sky.

I live on the mountain in Hamilton where I have a very clear expanse of sky to view, however, I have a friend in Burlington who is also watching this unidentified object from his home.

My reason for writing you is that many people in Hamilton have seen these strange lights and I think it is time we knew what they were. These are not stars, not planes, if they are satellites or weather balloons I don't think they would appear at the same time and move in the same direction, therefore it makes me wonder if we in Canada are being surveyed by some foreign power.

Maybe the government know what these objects are, if so I think we should be told. If the government do not know what they are I think it is time they spent some money to investigate these, and then the Canadian people should be informed of their findings.

In closing I wish to advise I am alarmed that something unknown is allowed to hover over Hamilton and vicinity and in the interests of the defence of Canada I hope your department or some other department of the government will be interested enough to investigate these sightings.

Thank you for sending along your observations. I am afraid I haven't much to offer by way of explanation of them. The noise and smoke trail may have been only coincidentally connected. The trail may have been a jet trail which was oriented in such a way that it reflected an unusually large amount of moonlight making it appear very bright and hence very close. Distance can be very deceiving; since we tend to judge distance by size, when we really don't know size, then it becomes impossible to judge distances.

However, this is merely speculation on possible simple explanations and I have nothing certain to offer.

Smoke Trail:

Appeared from West - skimmed over escarpment (approx. 35 feet high) past garage, towards house - which is 200 yards away. Dipped down over small valley between house and garage - went straight up to miss trees at bed-room end of house. (These trees approx. 50 feet high) curved around back of house and disappeared over 45 foot birch tree, travelling North.

The trail was single and approx. 10 to 12 inches in diameter over escarpment. Right side cut in over road (which passes in front of garage) - but for entire course trail wasn't working properly.

This is the way it looked:



There being no wind, the whole thing didn't start to break up until 1:50 A. M. At 2:00 A. M. the regular jet went over but couldn't see it, which impresses on me, that had there been noise connected with smoke trail, our house would have been rocked and all the windows smashed, it was that close. Also, "what-ever" must have been down and in trouble when I heard the noise.

One guest at the Inn, (which is approximately 250 to 300 yards from the house) heard prowling at 1:00 A. M. and what sounded like someone bouncing a ball.







To check the theory that additional lights were lens reflections, Mr. Neal took some pictures of Venus and the moon with the same equipment and will forward them. (*Disputed*)

Interviewer's Comment

Both observers rather well above normal in both experience and training. Attitude one of reserved caution and interest.

Mr. Neal gives his occupation as "retired" but he says he was a photographer in the Himalayan mountains with National Geographic and also a policeman in India.

One sighting when the object came up over Esquimaux at about 7.45 pm. it was almost overhead at about 60° elevation it looked to be golden in colour & circular in shape on this occasion it was about $\frac{1}{3}$ the size of a full moon and shone a bright close beam of light down for about a second it then just disappeared. The object was seen from 12 to 15 times between the 30th Aug and 29th Sept.

In recent months, we have had exchanges of correspondence with Canadian Forces Bases at Esquimalt, B.C. and Greenwood, N.S. concerning UFO sightings in these areas during 1968.

Specifically, we are interested in the Nov. 26, 1968 report from Greenwood dealing with an object(s) that was observed by ground personnel as well as being tracked on radar. The initial sighting was made by a Cpl. Boudreau with subsequent reports from Greenwood Ground Control approach (both visual and radar).

Cpl. Boudreau's description of the object he observed would indicate that it was not attributable to aircraft or balloons and Greenwood GCA claim there was no traffic in the vicinity. We would like to know whether or not the sighting was fully investigated and what, if any, conclusion was reached.

The second case involves a report from Victoria, B.C. of Sept. 29, 1968 which I'm led to believe was also investigated by the Canadian Forces. We have accumulated a considerable amount of data on the sighting which involved a series of coloured slides that were allegedly taken by the two principal witnesses. At this point, we have been unable to arrive at a solution to the incident in terms of natural phenomena or misinterpretation of aircraft, weather balloons, flares and so on. We wrote to the Base Commander at Esquimalt and a Captain Frewer replied on May 20th to the effect that our letter dated April 15th had been referred to Canadian Forces Headquarters "in accordance with current regulations". Our letter requested information on aircraft activity and possible radar contact of the objects between 7:00 and 9:00 p.m. Sept. 29th, 1968.

We would very much appreciate your information pertaining to these two sightings. In addition, would you please advise where the responsibility now lies insofar as UFO investigation is concerned. We were under the impression that the matter had been turned over to Dr. Peter Hillman and his staff at the National Research Council. However, I interpret Capt. Frewer's remarks as to indicate that the Defence Dept. is handling at least a portion of the cases. Your comments would be appreciated.



1. On the above date at 8.40PM a call was received at this detachment from a Mrs. Mary AUSTIN advising that she and several other people in the Spruce Lake, City of St. John, N.B. area had just sighted an unidentified flying object.

2. A patrol was made to the home of Mrs. Mary AUSTIN, Spruce Lake, NB. where it was learned from her brother, Donald AUSTIN, that he was the first to sight this flying object while he was proceeding home in his automobile along the Golden Mile Road, St. John, NB. When Donald AUSTIN arrived home in the Spruce Lake area he pointed this object out to his sister, Mary AUSTIN, and to several other people in the immediate area. As the object appeared to be moving away from the Spruce Lake area, Donald AUSTIN followed this flying object along route #1 towards St. George, NB. This object travelled along the highway at speeds of 40 mph and 60 mph, at times it appeared to be very high in the sky and then at other times it appeared as close as a few hundred yards away. The object appeared to be the size of a helicopter, with a white light completely covering the object. This light would be very bright at times and at other times would appear dim, it also appeared to have red and green lights. The AUSTIN's and several other people in the Spruce Lake area who saw this flying object described it as being similar to a half-moon, flat on the bottom and round on the top.

3. The following persons; Mary AUSTIN, Donald AUSTIN, M.V. AUSTIN, Jo-Anne DUNHAM, Jane ROCHER and Kenneth FAIR saw the above described flying object at 8.30PM Atlantic Standard Time, it was a clear night with the unidentified flying object being observed in the Spruce Lake, N.B. area for approx. 1/2 of an hour.

4. The above mentioned people were questioned re: the sighting of the U.F.O. and all gave approx. the same description as noted above. These people were sober at the time and in my mind a reliable source of information.

5. In view of the above no further action is being taken at this point unless otherwise instructed.

7. Mr. and Mrs. Victor IMHOFF, Mill Wright, Netherlands Overseas, residing at 1001 Johnson Street, Prince George, B.C. advised that they had also observed a flying object at approximately 5:15 P.M., 1 JAN 69. Mr. IMHOFF advised that they were enroute to their residence on Johnson Street via taxi when the sighting was made. He advised that they were travelling on Fifth Avenue near Watrous Street when it was first sighted. He advised that they made a left turn on Carney. He described the object as about 3 or 4 feet in diameter and was approximately 200 feet off the ground. The object appeared to be a dull orange colour.

8. Mr. Frank KERBRAT, Officer in Charge, Department of Transport, Radio Sonde Branch, Prince George Airport, was contacted in this regard. Mr. KERBRAT advised that they had a floating balloon come down in this area on the 1st of January.

9. Further reports of sightings of unidentified flying objects were received from the following people. Dates of sighting are in brackets. Mr. William McLEDD (3 JAN 69); Mr. KOMAS (4 JAN 69) and Mr. Martin PEARSON (5 JAN 69). All above noted persons are residents of Prince George.

10. In accordance with Operational Manual, CO-AIR, Paragraph 6, Telex PGC 8 was dispatched to Prince George Sub Division.

9 JAN 69

11. This date, information was obtained that an object had landed in the back yard of Mr. William DOW, 730 Burden Street, Prince George, B.C. A patrol was made to the noted address and Mr. DOW interviewed. DOW advised that the object come down at approximately 12:30 A.M., 4 JAN 69. The object was a plastic laundry bag, with one end held open with circular construction on drinking straws. A cross formed in the centre made out of straws had a number of birthday candles held to it with the use of straight pins. The top end of the bag was made secure by taping it with Scotch Tape. With the permission of Mr. DOW, the object was taken to the Prince George Identification Section Office where it was photographed and then returned to Mr. DOW. Copies of the photograph are attached.

12. It is understood by the writer that this object operates on the following principle. The bag, after constructed, is held up and the candles lighted. The hot air created by the candles causes the bag to lift and float.

13. It is felt that the object sighted could have been one of these plastic laundry bags or a floating balloon. The object observed by WEBSTER was the same object as that observed by COOK, MAGNUSON, Mr. RICHMOND and Family and Mr. and Mrs. Victor IMHOFF. As the vicinity of the sighting were all on Fifth Avenue near the streets from Watrous to Carney, it is felt that the object was probably one of these plastic laundry bags. It is felt by the writer that with the vicinity of the sightings and the landing of this plastic bag this is probably what was observed, and probably the work of ingenious children.

1. At 7:30 P.M., Mr. Walter WEBSTER, Salesman, Biteso, residence 1120 Dahl Street, Prince George, B.C. called this office advising that he had observed an unidentified flying object. WEBSTER stated that this sighting occurred between the hours of 5:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M., Pacific Standard Time. WEBSTER advised that he was enroute to his residence and was travelling on Fifth Avenue, in the vicinity of Alward and Burden Streets, City of Prince George when he made the sighting. He stated that he was so astonished with what he had observed that he pulled into the Fifth Avenue Shell Service Station and drew his observation to the attention of one Donald COOK, Service Station attendant and a customer, Grant MAGNUSON. COOK and MAGNUSON are both residents of Prince George, B.C.

2. The object was described by WEBSTER as follows: One eighth the size of the moon, yellowish orange in colour with a glow around same. The object appeared to have a square attachment fastened to the bottom. The top portion of the sphere had diagonal straps across it. The object showed a radiant light and at times appeared very bright. It appeared to move and gain altitude. The altitude was estimated roughly at between 2,000 and 10,000 feet. The object gave no audible sound. The duration of the sighting was between one and one half hours.

3. COOK and MAGNUSON agreed with the description except that they did not observe the attachment on the bottom of the object.

4. Mr. WEBSTER advised his wife, Arlene, and his brother, Mr. Ernest WEBSTER of his observation. Mrs. WEBSTER advised that when she observed the object just before 6:00 P.M., it appeared dull and could not make out any pattern. She advised that it appeared to be very bright and then would get dim.

5. Mr. Ernest WEBSTER, Assistant Manager, Civic Properties Commission, City of Prince George, residing at 582 Radcliff Drive, Prince George advised that he viewed the object through binoculars. He stated that it was at such a distance that he could only observe a radiant orange glow. He further advised that the object would disappear and then re-appear much fainter. Ernest WEBSTER and family observed the object for approximately one half hour, between the hours of 6:30 and 7:00 P.M., Pacific Standard Time.

2 JAN 69

6. Further reports of the sighting on 1 JAN 69 were received from the following people. Mr. Geoff RICHMOND, Postal Clerk, 309 - 211 North Ospika Blvd., Prince George, B.C., accompanied by his wife and three teenage children, observed an object while travelling on Fifth Avenue near Carney Street. RICHMOND described the object as about 1/20th the size of the moon, spherical shape and had an orange glow to it. RICHMOND advised that he only observed the object for a couple of minutes as he was driving his automobile. The sighting was made at approximately 5:30 P.M.





1. On 9 JAN 69 at approximately 7.55pm after hearing a conversation over the Police radio at Bell Island Detachment Office concerning an unidentified object, this member made a patrol to the West end of Bell Island to see if the object could be observed from that point.
2. The weather conditions at the time were fine with the sky clear. There appeared to be a few light clouds to the East but in all there was nothing to hamper visibility.
3. While driving West on No. 2 Rd., I observed a round bright light high in the sky to the North West and it was moving at a downward angle of about 45 degrees to the West. This light was moving at a fairly high rate of speed but not as fast as a falling star. It was also brighter than a star.
4. After travelling for about five to ten seconds in this direction it stopped with the light fading and then turning to orange and at infrequent intervals changing to red. At various times this light would fade out to a point and disappear and then return again three to four seconds later. No noise could be heard and no shape of the object could be established.
5. The object was observed in the manner mentioned until 8.24pm at which time it faded to a point and disappeared fairly close to the Western horizon. After stopping from it's downward angle the light appeared to be moving very slowly to the Western and then went out of sight. The light was larger than the North star and when first sighted appeared to be such brighter.
6. There were no other known observers at this point. The conversation being carried on over the Police radio was from Harbour Grace Detachment to their various Police cars. The members in these cars also had the object in sight.
7. In view of the foregoing no further action deemed to be necessary at this point.
