I noticed a light, the approximate size of a tower clearance light, in the sky, to the North East. The light appeared to be almost directly North of Napinka, Manitoba. The light started to get larger and at this time I noticed it was moving in a Westerly direction towards P.T.H. #83. I glanced at my watch and the time was exactly 2:45 A.M.. The object appeared to be moving at approximately the same speed as I was travelling and it appeared that our paths would cross on P.T.H. #83 approximately 6 miles North of Melita, "anitoba. While soing North my view was momentarily obstructed by trees on the While going North my view was momentarily obstructed by trees on the East side of the road. Once I had a clear view again the object had stopped. Its location at this time appeared to be over the S/W 2 32-4-26 Rural Municipality of Arthur, Manitoba, which is approximately 6 miles North of Melita. I stopped the car on the side of the road, turned off the lights and ignition and got out of the car. At this time I had a chance to make the following observations. The object was perfectly round and the bottom half was lighted, the upper half seemed to be blacked out with only a thin line of light around it. The bottom half was a yellowish red and seemed to be of an illuminous nature. It did not cast any light on the ground or on any surrounding objects. I did not hear any sound and did not notice anything unusual in the immediate area. The object at this time was about twice the size of a full moon, it appeared to be a perfect circle with no ragged edges or glow surrounding it. The object stayed in this position for approximately 45 seconds and then started to move to the east retracing its path. The object diminished in size equal to that when it was first sighted and faded into cloud cover. The time the object was last seen was 2:49 A.M.

The weather at the time of the sighting was a heavy overcast sky, with a ceiling of approximately 1,000 feet. Earlier in the evening the area in question had a light rain, however there was no rain falling at the time of the sighting. Visibility was approximately 5 miles, the wind was a dead calm.

I observed it moving away from me and about 500 feet to 800 feet above me. As it moved away it was gyrating, it was teter tot-ering on a pivot through its centre and in line with my sight. By this time the noise could no longer be heard. I observed that when it gyrated, it stayed in a straight line and did not alter course due to the gyrating. I was able to observe it for some 20 to 30 seconds and at off point it did turn to the right but I didn't see the object banking to do this. When it turned it stayed at constant elevation then as it started back in my direction it began to lose elevation and I thought at the time that it had landed on the hill on the opposite side of the lake that fills the valley. I'm not exactly sure on its size but would estimate about 30 to 40 feet across and 10 to 15 feet deep. It did appear to be saucer like. The total timesobserved was approximately 40 seconds. I did hear the same noise again only once as the object made its turn and before I lost sight of it or it landed."



Through an investigation conducted, it was determined although discrepancies arose, that some object unknown was seen by these people. The object seen was white in color and circular. It travelled in an easterly direction at a slow rate of speed at approximately 20,000 feet from the ground. It should be noted here that the point of sighting is approximately twenty air miles from Gander International Airport and shortly after the sighting, a severe electrical storm occurred in this area. The fact that Gander International Airport is only a short distance away and the electrical storm which occurred, may have been the cause or contributed to the cause of the sighting.

- 8. Although these people have never come to the attention of this office at any previous time and they are unknown to us, this member feels that they did see an object which they could not identify.
- As no further action is deemed necessary at this point, this file will remain as hereunder noted.



"On Sunday, July 20, 1969, I was visiting my uncle in Grand Falls. About 10:35 p.m., I was out playing Ve were out ahead of my brother, with my cousin,

on Sutherland Drive. . They were about ten yards and or so behind us, walking in the same direction. It was fairly dark and it was raining lightly. I was looking up in the sky and all of a sudden a greenish coloured object came out of a low cloud, swooped down below the cloud and then went back up into the cloud. I only saw the object for about ten to fifteen seconds, just long enough to get a real good look at it, to point at it and to call to my cousin to look at it. I can't remember hearing any noise, before, after, or during the time I saw the object. The object was a greenish colour and it seemed to glow. I didn't see any light or windows on it. It was egg shaped, longer one way than the other, and it seemed to be travelling with the greater length up and down rather than sideways. There was an exhaust or vapour trail behind the object and this exhaust seemed to evaporate very quickly.

I became frightened then and both my cousin and I ran to my uncle's house. I told my uncle and he phoned the police station. Right at the time I saw the object, I didn't get a chance to tell the other boys behind us and I didn't tell them until I got to my uncle's place. I have never seen an item like this before and as it was some distance off I wouldn't be able to say now big it was, except that it looked to be a good size. I have seen quite a few aircrafts in the sky and this object appeared to be bigger than any large aircraft I have ever seen".

I went into the house and got my wife to come out. I brought a pair of binoculars and a compass from the house and went out and watched this object moving along the sky. My wife also went out to watch the object. We both watched the object for quite awhile and then we decided to telephone the Radio Station in Grand Falls. They told me to telephone the k.C.M.P. After telephoning them I went out and watched it again. I watched it until 2:00 a.m. There were a couple of times within the last half hour that it faded out. When the object was fading out for the first time, I noticed another object, which was round and red in colour, come from a douth East direction and travelled North at a high rate of speed. This object appeared to go under the first object and then disappeared. The first object that I saw was lower than the cloud cover and didn't appear to be travelling at a high speed. Neither objects made any sound. It appeared that the first object was approximately 4 miles from my house. Re my letter of August 22, your letter of August 1 and the U.F.O. Hunt Club Road Report dated August 11, HQ-400-Q-5 (Vol.4), 69A-400-214, 69-400-255.

I have had the grass sample studied at the Geological Survey in Ottawa. The grass was given X-ray analysis and the crystalline substance showed no evidence of a mineral content or any type of radio-activity. These results indicate that it was some type of biological mould of which there are many varieties and these may frequently assume a circular pattern. I might note the well-known mushroom rings found in Ireland and other parts of the world. Since no other phenomenon or aerial sighting was associated with this instance, I see no reason to pursue this further. Thank you for your assistance in calling this to our attention.

1. At approximately 9:15 pm, Atlantic Time Zone, Mr. Storeytown, N.B. phoned this office and advised that he could see an Unidentified Flying Object over his home.

- I patrolled to the residence and viewed the object. It appeared to be diamond shaped and shiny white in colour and seemed to be moving very slowly in a N.E. direction. The object was viewed by myself and Cst. G.W. SANFORD at Storetown, N.B. and I viewed the object from Priceville, N.B., which is approximately 8 miles west of Storeytown.
- When this object was viewed through a pair of binoculars, it appeared to be round at the top and came to a point at the bottom. It also had blue and red specks in it. It may be noted that the object appeared to be directly over us for the full duration of time it could be seen.
- As the sun set, the object lost its shiny colour and finally disappeared. When viewed by the naked eye, its colour was about the same as the moons when it is visible during the daylight hours, however it was considerably smaller than the moon and appeared to be much closer.
- 5. The object was in sight for approximately 3/4 of an hour, the sky was clear, with little or no cloud. The wind was very light and the objected appeared to be almost stationary.
- It is felt at this point that the object sighted here was possibly the weather balloon that had been sighted in Sussex, N.B. the previous day. No further action is anticipated at this point.



At approximately 2:00 a.m. on the 1st of July 1969, I was standing in the front yard of my house at 212 East 20th Street in North Vancouver, looking in the direction of Vancouver Airport.

I saw what appeared to be the port light of an airplane coming in to land. It was bright red in colour. After a few seconds of looking at it I realized that it wasn't moving. I then went inside the house and got my telescope, which is a TASCO and was on 35 power.

When I looked through the telescope, I noticed that the light had grown to approximately ten times its original size, however, was in the same location. I observed it through the scope for about ten minutes, during which time I observed it to move slowly in a west-south-westerly direction. It was now decreasing in size. The light was a bright orange colour now, more so on the bottom and right side.

At this time, I went into the house again and phoned Vancouver Airport Met. Section and asked them if they had a weather balloon in the sky, as I thought it could probably be a balloon high enough in the sky to reflect the sun's rays. I was informed they did not, and when I went outside to see if the light was still there, I saw it disappear in the direction I saw it traval.

The weather that night was clear and warm, and the sky was very clear. There were lots of stars in the sky. The moon had a "halo" effect around it, and was in the south.

- (h) WARNKE and I first saw these U.F.O'S and called JENKINS and HINES, and all were out of our vehicles. There was no naise noted along with these objects. 





On the above date, while on patrol in Seal Cove, Nfld., I was contacted by the Church of England in Baie Verte. He stated that he had been in Westport the previous night on 17 APR 69. While on his return trip from Westport, at appreximate ly 7 miles east of Westport on the Westport Road, he sighted, what appeared to him to be, a falling meteorite. The time was 8:40 p.m. He said that it appeared to be anywhere from 2 to 10 miles from his position, being extremely bright, probably because of its nearness. He described the object to be of a cone-shaped figure, its centre being a burning erange-red colour, surrounded with blue, which formed the cone-shape. He estimated the object to be about 8 feet long and 6 feet wide at its widest extremity. He further stated that it was travelling extremely fast, heading downwards towards the earth at about a 45 degree angle. He said that it was travelling in a North-westerly direction and estimated the entire sighting to have lasted from about 2 to 5 seconds.

Upon returning to Baie Verte, the incident was reported to Cpl. H.G. KENNEDY. Baie Verte Message No. 29 was compiled and ferwarded, via SSB, to the O.C. St. John's Sub/Division, 19 APR 69, as per existing instructions.

At approximately 10:15 P.M., while on patrol on Lower Drive on Parliament Hill I observed an object which appeared as a bright falling star descending vertically from an altitude of approximately 2000 feet to approximately 1000 feet north-north-east on the north side of the Ottawa River over Hull, Quebec. It hovered in this position for about thirty seconds, changing colors to red, green, and white. It then proceeded east and appeared to be circling, dropping and rising for about four to five minutes above eastern Hull and Pointe-Gatineau. It then hovered for about five minutes - blinking its lights constantly. At approximately 10:30 it proceeded west of Hull at an altitude of approximately 1000 feet, and came across the river in the Ottawa area and disappeared from view behind high buildings of Wellington St. at approximately 10:35. All this while the object was of no discernable shape. At approximately 10:50 a bright object appeared in the sky due south of Ottawa. It kept its bearings at approximately 1500 feet altitude with a smaller bright object approximately 500 feet below it. The objects disappeared and reappeared at different intervals but disappeared completely at about 11:10 P.M. However, it could not be ascertained if it was the same previously mentioned object.

2. At 10:19 P.M. all the lights on Parliament Hill (East, West and Centre Block) went out. Mr. L. TESSIER of the Ont. Hydro was notified who said the cause could not be ascertained at the time but could be due to an explosion in the sewers at the corner of Sparks and O'Connor Sts. which was being investigated.

This object was sighted by 3/Cst. L.J. FENDER, 3/Cst. W.L. MORRISSEY, Cst. W.S. MAJAURY, (age of 147 Cook St., Barrie, Ont.) and (age of 120 Rodney St., Barrie, Ont.). The civilians mentioned are presently staying at the Beacon Arms Hotel in Ottawa. The sky was clear with a few clouds but visibility was excellent.

- 1. At approximately 3.45 a.m. of the above date, Mr. of 2 Mullock Street, St. John's, contacted this office and stated that he had observed a U.F.O. on the Trans-Canada Highway approximately twenty miles West of St. John's.
- 2. Who sounded very excited when reporting the incident, stated that he had first observed the light ahead of his car on the Highway, at which time it resembled a star. As he continued East on the Trans Canada Highway, the light disappeared momentarily at which time his car radio cut out, his voltage indicator went to "Discharge" and the car stalled. He then observed the light to his rear, at which time the car appeared to function normally. The light followed him for approximately six miles, during which time he drove at a high rate of speed, and the light had no difficulty in keeping pace with him. There was no vapor trail visible or noise heard, other than from the car and the light was described as something unlike he had ever seen before. As went over the crest of a hill, the light disappeared momentarily and he then observed it proceeding over the woods in a southerly direction.
- 3. Mr. was alone in his car at the time and there were no other similar reports received at this office. There was also no other vehicular traffic present on the highway at the time.
- 4. The following self-explanatory statement was obtained from Mr. with the original being held on file:-

At approximately 3.05 a.m., 19 MAY 69, I was proceeding East on the Trans-Canada Highway at approximately 20 miles West of St. John's, Nfld. I was alone in my car when I observed a light ahead of me which I thought may have been a star. I continued onward and the light disappeared. Suddenly, my car radio went dead, my alternator went to "Discharge" and the car stalled momentarily. At almost the same time I observed a bright light in my rear view mirror. There was no other traffic around at this time. The light followed me for approximately six miles, during which time it seemed to change positions behind me at will, coming close and/or following behind a little. I heard no noise whatsoever. I drove at speeds up to 100 m.p.h. but the bright light or object had no trouble following me. The only way I can describe it would be as a bright oval shaped, fluorescent type light, unlike any

UNLIKE ANY ... light I had ever seen before. After about six miles, the object veered South over the woods and that was the last I seen of it.

I was perfectly sober at the time of the incident and it really scared me. I cannot offer a logical explanation but, nevertheless, the light was there and it did follow me for approximately six miles, approximately 200 feet to my rear and possibly 20 feet high. It maintained perfect co-ordination with my speed.

L. At 10:35 PM this date Captain V.A. NAUGLER, Duty Traffic Control Officer at the C.F.B. Southport, Maniteba contacted this office and advised that at 10:16 PM he received a report of an Unidentified Flying Object from Mr. Of the above address. Captain NAUGLER gave a brief description of the object and further advised their Traffic control and Winnipeg Airport Traffic Centrol had no V.F.R. flight traffic in the area or any overdue. The Portage Flying Club was contacted by the writer with negative results Captain NAUGLER also contacted Winnipeg Search and Rescue in this regard and they advised that they could not search the area unless there was an actual report of a missing air craft.

27 APR 69

- was contacted immediately and gave the following information 2. concerning the U.F.O. At 9:45 PM he alone was standing in his front yard at the above address, facing in a northerly direction when he noted a pinkish colored light in the sky north of Portage la Prairie, Manitoba. The light appeared as that of a vehicle headlight at a distance of one-quarter of a mile or one-twentieth the size of the moons appearance. It appeared to be approximately one thousand feet from the earth, and five miles north and two miles east of the City of Portage. It was travel from north to south, horizontal to the earths surface but moving in a waving motion, up and down and about three times the light appeared to flash. At about 9:46 he went into the house and returned immediately with his wife and two children, same shown under 'et al' above. They all watched as the light turned in an easterly direction and it flashed about two times once again. At approximately 9:48 the light dropped towards the earth almost vertically, maybe a little from a westerly direction to an easterly direction. As the light drepped it disappeared behind the horizon of the viewer's which was blocked by buildings in the foreground. This was the last the viewer's saw of the light. was no after affect as it went beyond their horizon. The light had no trailing affect at all nor any audible sound. None of the observers could give any explanation for the sighting. No further complaints were received about this time.
- 3. The general atmospheric conditions in the Portage Area at the time of the sighting were as follows. The sky was absolutely clear of clouds, visability was fifteen miles plus, with no obstructions such as smoke, fog, dust etc., the wind was steady from the north at fifteen miles per hour.
- 4. Cst. L. STRIGHT and Cst. N. TUHES respectively of Portage H.P. and Det. made a patrol in the general area north of Portage to observe any unusual peculiarities, this met with negative results. Numerous persons in the area were question in regards to the U.F.O., this likewise met with negative results.

- 5. At 12:12 AM this date Portage City Det. telex #195 was dispatched to the O.C. Winnipeg Sub-Division and Info. 'D' Division.
- 6. Later this date the local Portage News Paper was advised of the circumstances of the sighting and published same. The local radio station C-FRY assisted by broadcasting the circumstances to the public and requesting that any person sighting the light contact this office. This met with negative results.
- 7. At 9:15 AM the C.F.B. Southport, Manitoba sent up a C-45 aircraft to search the area between the base of Lake Manitoba and the City of Portage for any peculiarities, but this met with negative results. There was no report of any missing aircraft which could have been in the area. The area north of Portage is completely flat farm country, swampy in parts with little tree and bush life. The area is moderately populated.
- 8. As the possibility existed that the light could have been a Gyra-lite used on passenger trains, the C.N.R. and C.P.R. in Portage were contacted. The C.N.R. advised that they do not have such lights on their Units and the C.P.R. which has them advised that there were no trains in the area within two hours before and after the sighting. The Gyra-lite in question is located on top of the head Unit. It rotates in a circle and sends a beam of light at about a twenty degree angle towards the sky. On a clear night only the beam of light can be seen but on an overcast night if the overcast is low enough a light spot will reflect off the clouds. From the description given by the observers this would definitely not have been a Gyra-lite.
- 9. Although Mr. was unknown to the members of this Detachment it was felt that the information in question was fairly reliable.

29 APR 69

- 10. This date further investigation revealled the identity of the U.F.O. At 9:30PM on the date in question the date in question the light of Portage were flying a kite in the North Memorial School grounds in Portage, which is located approx. one quarter of a mile north of Mr. the pinkish color of the light tail piece had a four cell flashlight attached to it. The pinkish color of the light was caused from a red plastic ring which is part of the head of the flashlight. At approximately 9:45 PM the kite string broke and the kite came to the ground about a block south of where it had been flying. This same instance occurred the following night by three unknown youths and was identified as such.

Carlisle Road, Douglas, York Co., N.B. reported to this detachment that he had just viewed an unusual flying object flying over the Saint John River and travelling in the direction of Fredericton, N.B. He further stated that he viewed the object through a set of 7 % 50 binoculars and described it as being oval, round, quite large and displaying red, blue and white lights. He believed the object to be flying approximately 3,000 feet above the Saint John River.

The Fredericton Airport and Control Tower were contacted and both advised that no aircraft were in the area and none had been in the Fredericton area since 10:40 p.m. 14 APR 69.

3. Radiogram # 145 was submitted to Fredericton Sub/Division in this respect.

18 APR 69

On this date (Mrs. Carlisle Rd., Douglas, York Co., N.B. was interviewed concerning the sighting of the unidentified flying object. She advised that her , had first sighted the object at approximately 12:10 a.m. and had called her to view it. She stated that when she first saw it, the object was above the Saint John River, opposite her home at Douglas, at a height of approximately 3,000 feet. She further stated that it appeared oval shaped with a green light on the front of it and a red light to the rear of it. She saw a dome of the top of the object which seemed to emit a bright yellowish-white glow. The object glided through the air and then would hover and appear to take a different shape. The object would move very slowly from one point to another. She further advised that the object would spin at a very fast rate and glow or shine light as bright as the sun striking a bright metal object. She advised that the object glided down the Saint John River in the direction of Fredericton and she watched it for about 15 minutes at which time she left the window and her husband continued to watch it. She advises that the object was definitely not an aircraft.

He stated the object would glide along, stop and hover and then gyrate in a wobbling motion and appear to bellow up and down, completely out of shape. The object would then stop and return to its normal shape. At this time the lights were blurred and he could not ascertain their colour. The object was first seen over the Saint John River in the Douglas area and then glided down the Saint John River over the Fredericton area to the area of New Maryland. watched the object until it was distant enough to appear as a pinpoint of light and then it disappeared. At this time it was red in colour. The object disappeared in a south-westerly direction from Douglas, N.B. He stated that the object appeared to be 100-150 across and 10 feet thick.

6. No other reports of sightings were reported in the area and the Fredericton Airport Control Tower did not receive any reports of sightings.

7. The weather office at the Fredericton Airport was contacted concerning weather conditions at 12:00 midnight on the 14 APR 69 and it was learned that the temperature was 41 degrees, dew point 29, barometric pressure 30.13, no wind and the skies were clear and visibility was unlimited.

8. From investigation it would appear that the object seen by the was not a meteorite and both are positive that it was not an aircraft.

not known but after conversing with each of them it would appear that their imaginations may have gotten the better of them as each have read numerous articles on unidentified flying objects and it was learned that each read of similiar descriptions as they gave me of the object they saw. There is no reason to discredit them in their sightings, but on the other hand there is no reason to credit them on what they saw.

No explanation is available as to the origin of the unknown object, but should further sightings be reported the appropriate action will be taken.

According to _____, when ____ sighted the first U.FO. he got out a transit and put the most powerful lens in camp in it. 40 power, and after watching the object for a while alone, summoned. After this sighting, both men kept watch on the sky each night thereafter, in hopes of seeing something again.

Local enquiries were made but nobody reported seeing any of the U.F.O.'s reported by these two men. The general direction of the sightings was towards Pointed Mountain which is south west of Fort Liard. The location of the camp at the times of the sightings was east of Liard and several hundred feet higher. From this vantage point, the camp overlooked a height of land which is directly west of Fort Liard and which blocks vision in that direction.

On Thursday, 20 MAR 69, I patrolled to the Pointed Mountain air-strip, about 15 air miles south west of Fort Liard to conduct enquiries at that point. Pouce Coupe, B.C. a for Pan American Oil Co. reported the following sighting. As in the previous sightings, details are as outlined in Operational Manual, CO-air.

- (b) Clear overhead, possibly some light clouds in area of sighting.

This second object appeared to move back to object at original position and take on original size and colour. Both objects seemed to fade away completely. The position of these objects was about 10° above the horizon. The direction of the object from the observers was towards the north and no directional movement was noticed.
- The sighting lasted approximately ten minutes. g)
- Five minutes after the object disappeared, the three men were h) proceeding to shore with their Ski-Doo. At this time the entire area was lit up by a blue light, similar to that which would be given off by an arc welder. The light made objects all around the lake clearly visible. This flash of light lasted approximately two to three seconds and at this time, the Ski-Doo motor cut out and almost stopped for no apparent reason and started running normally after the flash subsided. The observers indicated that they felt heat from this flash similar to rays of sun passing through window glass. Enquiries from other observers and locally in Whitehorse area indicated that this flash of light was not

- 1. On the above date a complaint was received at this office from Mrs. Constance DOYLE of 25 McLaren Drive, Cromocte, New Brunswick stating that she and her husband (Capt. James DOYLE) had observed an Unidentified Flying Object in the sky the nights of 2 DAR 69 and 4 MAR 69 about 9:00 PM directly above their residence in what appeared to be a fixed position until about 9:30 PM when the object began to move in a Northeast Direction and after moving in this direction for about one-half hour to an hour it disappeared.
- The U.F.O. was observed on Sunday, 2 MAR 69, and Tuesday, 4 MAR 69 at 9:00 PM, Atlantic Standard Time, for about half an hour until it began to move out of sight. - 4. About 7:30 PM on the above date the U.F.O. was observed by Oromocto, New Brunswick and myself which was identical as described by Mrs. DOYLE. The sky was clear and starlight.

- At 7:45PM, an object was seen from Parliament Hill going through the sky at a terrific rate of speed, heading from south to .. north. This object stopped and appeared in the sky over Hull, P.Q.
- This object was seen by Commissioner M.F.A. LINDSAY and D/Comm. W.H. KELLY as they drove onto Parliament Hill. This object was also seen by 3/Cst. D.B.BEST , 3/Cst. R.D. LLOYD, 3/Cst. R.V. MCCROSSIN and Cst. W.S. MAJAURY. This object was seen from Parliament Hill near the Privy Council Door.
- 3. After this object appeared to stop it gradually moved in a north west direction and at 9:34PM disappeared from view. The sky at the time was clear and visibility was excellent. This object appeared to have the same shape and colour as a star or planet but was much brighter and larger. It appeared to be round in shape and much smaller than the moon in size. This object was observed from 7:45PM until it went out of sight at 9:34PM. No estimate could be made of the altitude, however it appeared quite high in the sky.
- Captain H.R. WOLFF, R.C.A.F. Uplands, Ottawa, from Base Operations was notified of the object and given the above noted information. Captain WOLFF was notified a short time later and he advised that he would not be taking any action concerning this object.



The disc was described as being like two saucers placed face to face but the upper part was more oval than the bottom portion. The disc was revolving in an awkward manner, like a coin revolving after being spun on a flat surface and coming to a stop, flat on the surface. He stated the light remained about 2 minutes in a stationary position and he went in the house. He did not see the light disappear.

- No other reports of sightings were reported in the area and the pilots of the three aircraft in the area did not see any unusual lights and nothing was noted on radar at Fredericton Airport.
- The weather office at Fredericton Airport was contacted concerning weather conditions at 8.00 P.M. on the 23 FEB 69. The basic light was rectangular in shape; but when the light orightened the shape increased in size and intensity of light. As it brightened it halso turned from a dull to bright in colour. The object crossed the sky in a north to south zig-zag, however, the main direction was westerly. It appeared to move about two miles from north to south. It seemed to travel just above tree top level, and disappeared below the tree tops several times. In completing the zig-zag moves the object would come to a complete stop before reversing direction.

8. During this sighting the carload continued driving, and arrived at the farm. Contacted the persons in the farm, and all of those persons in paragraph 4 viewed the object from the farm. Further information gathered from the persons who viewed the object from the farm indicated:

When there was a colour change, there was a direction of movement change. The colours definitely noted were: red, yellow, and white. The persons interviewed are unable to associate any specific colour with a direction of flight pattern. The object appeared to drop at Hairy Hill.

9. There is no indication of the time length that the object was viewed. However, it would not be longer than a total of ten minutes. As Cst. SIG-MUNDSON was operating the police vehicle he was unable to make any obser-vations of the object.

10. I have travelled a number of times in aircraft, and worked on an RCAF Station at Portage La Prairie, Manitoba. This object was not like any aircraft or helicopter that I have ever seen.

Mr. and Mrs. KNIGHT are known to this detachment and both are considered fairly reliable. They expressed certainty that the object that they had seen was not an ordinary airplane or helicopter.

In company with Cst. K.D. GILL, an immediate patrol was made to the scene. In compliance with "C" Department Policy, the following data was obtained from Mr. KNIGHT:

(a) 6 FEB 69, Friday, 7:30 PM to 9:30 PM (Pacific Standard Time)
(b) Clear with stars and northern lights
(c) Shirley (Mrs. Raymond) KNIGHT
(d) D.O.T. Airport, Fort Simpson, N.W.T. - Through front room picture window of own home, opposite the D.O.T. airstrip
(c) Paymond KNIGHT Airport Manager

(e) Raymond KNIGHT, Airport Manager

(f) Red dot, surrounded by white background with green and blue spikes which sparkled like a piece of crystal. Descended to about 600 or 700 feet above ground level and then to tree top level where it hovered up and down for about 10 minutes before disappearing behind the trees.

(g) Two hours
(h) Was not seen again after disappearing behind the trees. No noise was heard as the KNIGHTs remained in their home.

With Mr. KNIGHT, a patrol was made across the main D.C.T. strip to its junction with the old unused field. Due to the deep snow it was impossible to continue with a vehicle past this point and since Mr. KNIGHT now expressed uncertainity as to just how far away the object may have landed, there was no advantage to patrolling any farther on foot. Mr. KNIGHT stated that the object may have continued to move after it was cut off from his line of vision as it went below tree top level. D.O.T. Aeradio were contacted but advised that they had not seen an UFO nor had they received any notification of an aircraft in the vicinity.



On the 22nd of January at about 7:30 PM, and I were just going out to the barn to feed the horses. The horses usually hang around the corner of the barn yard, but that particular day they had been about the centre of the yard, along the fence line. They had been acting up all day and they wouldn't go anywhere near the barn. We got about half way up there and the horses just took off to the top field. We went up to the barn and Janet went inside. I whistled for the horses but they wouldn't come. The stallion came part ways a number of times but he'd shake his head and run back. I went inside the barn to see if the curiosity would bring them down, but they didn't come. I came back out to see what they were doing and tried to call them in again and the stallion did the same as before, so I went back into the barn to see if the curiosity might bring them down again. We were in the barn, and we heard a loud crash in the bush and I thought maybe it was a Bull Elk that had gone crazy from a lung disease they get. I told the girl to head for the house. She ran down to the house and I followed. I ran in and grabbed my rifle and I took my 6 volt flashlight and I ran up to where I've got the hay on a platform. I saw the horses were in the top field along the fence line and they seemed quite uneasy so I shone the light up to see if I could see any game or anything up in there. Then I noticed that the horses were looking in a Westerly direction, and the way they were holding their heads up, I knew there was something attracting their attention. So I sorta turned half way around and looked towards the West. I saw two bright white lights and they were coming down at a 45 degree angle in a Northerly direction. I figure that they were about four miles away from me and about 100 feet apart. When they got to about 500 feet altitude they both went out at the same time. I saw these two lights for about a minute. From the distance away and the altitude and their brightness. I have seen these strange lights about five or six times previous to this in the last year. They have always looked the same bright whiteness. They have all been farther away except one I saw around the 15th of September at about 7:00 PM. At that time I was emptying a bucket into a hole in the ground when I happened to glance across past the house, and I saw a bright white light travelling horizontally at a teriffic speed. I'd say this light was about half a mile from me and about 300 feet high.

I've never seen any lights like these other than the times I've mentioned, and I don't have any idea what they are. I know they're not planes or flares, and I'm sure they're not shooting stars.

1. At 10:00 p.m. this date while driving north towards Carmacks, Y.T. on highway #2, I noticed an unusual white light in the sky towards the Mt. Nansen area. I stopped the vehicle at Mile 96 and observed this phenomenon for at least 5 minutes. It dodged behind the hills at Carmacks, and in order to get a better look, I continued through the village, and up Coal Mine hill to Mile 106. I again observed it for about 5 minutes. There was no noise, movement, or colour, just a pulsating white glow. It appeared about 1/8th. the size of the full moon which was also out that night. The sky was dark, with scattered wisps of cloud, and the other stars were clearly visible.

The light still appeared to be about 15 miles away towards the Mt. Nansen area, and about a mile off the ground as it cleared the local mountain tops. However, as we observed it, it grew brighter, them slowly faded softer, and appeared to diminish in size and intensity until it disappeared altogether.

also parked at Mile 107, and had observed the same object for several hours while driving south from Pelly Crossing. He was interviewed, and his statement is attached. The reliability of this witness is unknown.

Mrs. Gloria JARED, my wife, was accompanying me at the time, and also witnessed the above described object.



- On 9 JAN 69 at approximately 7.55pm after hearing a conversation over the Police radio at Bell Island Detachment Office concerning an unidentified object, this member made a patrol to the West end of Bell Island to see if the object could be observed from that point.
- The weather conditions at the time were fine with the sky clear. There appeared to be a few light clouds to the East but in all there was nothing to hamper visibility.
- 3. While driving West on No. 2 Rd., I observed a round bright light high in the sky to the North West and it was moving at a downward angle of about 45 degrees to the West. This light was moving at a fairly high rate of speed but not as fast as a falling star. It was also brighter than a star.
- After travelling for about five to ten seconds in this direction it stopped with the light fading and then turning to orange and at infrequent intervals changing to red. At various times this light would fade out to a point and disappear and then return again three to four seconds later. No noise could be heard and no shape of the object could be established.
- The object was observed in the manner mentioned until 8,24pm at which time it faded to a point and disappeared fairly close to the Western horizion. After stopping from it's downward angle the light appeared to be moving very slowly to the Western and then went out of sight. The light was larger than the North star and when first sighted appeared to be much brighter.
- There were no other known observers at this point. The conversation being carried on over the Police radio was from Harbour Grace Detachment to their various Police cars. The members in these cars also had the object in sight.

In view of the foregoing no further action deemed to be necessary at this point.

- Sighting of Unidentified Flying Object Near Ucluelet, B.C. 29 NOV 71 (UCLUELET DETACHMENT CASE) U

At 11:00 A.M. 29 NOV 71, Mrs. , of Long Beach, B.C. called this office and reported that she and her husband, ! saw a U.F.O. early morning of the same date.

Patrol made to the residence which is situated approx. fourteen (14) miles North of Ucluelet, B.C., on Highway #4. The following story was related to the writer. At approx. 0500 P.S.T., 29 NOV 71, Mr. awoke and looked out the bedroom window, as he usually does to see what the weather is like. Mr. and noticed a bright light in the West just above the treeline. The light appeared to be a star, but was much brighter and larger. Mr. and jumped out of bed and this is when Mrs. awoke. She asked her husband what was wrong and he told her that he had just seen a U.F.O. Both of them then looked out the window and observed a large star which then turned into a part of the start of the sta and observed a large star which then turned into a round hazy ball of light, first greenish in color, then a reddish pink. A/N stated that this ball of light which was much larger than a full moon, appeared like a moon shining through a cloud. A/N stated there were no clouds in the sky. This hazy ball of light would disappear for a few minutes and then reappear as a large star. After about thirty (30) minutes they lost sight of this star behind the trees. After a few minutes it again reappeared, in the shape of a large ball. Mr. & Mrs. Deserved this object until approx 0610, at which time they went back to bed. At 0630 Mrs. got up and looked for the object but could not see it.

Inquiries in this area did not reveal any other persons who saw this object. We have had no other reports of this type at this office. Mr. & Mrs. are well known in this community and are regarded as rational people.

On the 2 DEC 71, Ucluelet detachment message #153 was sent to NRC Meteor Centre, with info to Canforcehed, the Commissioner, and Victoria Sub/Division.

TRAFFIC AT THE time of the sighting, where it was learned that no light aircraft were flying that particular morning due to heavy winds. It was further learned that they have no knowledge of any aircraft which might have been in this area at the time, but that it was extremely unlikely that an aircraft would be that close to the airport without their knowledge. The weather at 8.30A.M., 27 OCT 71 was cloudy with 1200 foot ceiling and 15 miles visibility, wind was 290 at 17 MPH.

Enquiries were conducted in the general area of the sighting however nothing of value was learned with no more sightings being reported and nothing apparently amiss or unusual noted. Checks were also run on to determine his reliability and it was found that this subject is not known to the Brandon City Police but our Detachment indicies indicate his envolvement as a Juvenile in 1966 in a B.E. & Theft wherein no charges were laid. This subject was quite in ernest when interviewed and did not hesitate either in reporting this incident or in describing what he saw. However he claims that there was East bound traffic on the highway at the time of the sighting and indicates that it was a bright white colour clearly visible and large in size. This brings to mind the question as to why this object was not seen and reported by the people travelling East on the highway at the same time as he indicates it was so obviou as to be clearly visible through his rear and side view mirrors.

- 1. As stated through Camrose Telex #100 I sighted a fireball on the above noted date. The following observations were made and are listed below as set out in the Operational Manual.
- A. The fireball was sighted on the 2 OCT 71 at approx. 10:30 P.M.
- B. The sky was clear with light scattered clouds and a full moon.
- C. The fireball was observed approx. 3 miles north of Rosalind, Alta.
- D. Two bursts were noted. The first burst on the initial sighting and the second burst occurred when the fireball appeared to burn out.
- E. The initial burst compared in brightness with an extremely bright flash of lightning. The trail of the fireball appeared to be two or three times as bright as the moon.
- F. The color of the fireball changed from a bright yellow/orange to a greenish blue similar to a mercury vapor light.
- G. The fireball appeared approx. two times as large as the moon in relation to the moon.
- H. The fireball was observed in flight approx. 3 seconds. The trail remained approx. 8 to 10 seconds.
- No sound was audible as the observation was made from a moving vehicle.
- J. The fireball travelled from the northwest to the southeast at approx. a 30° angle above the horizon and an approx. 10° downward angle.
- K. The trail of the fireball grew in intensity after the fireball burned out for approx. 4 seconds and then faded from sight in another 4 to 5 seconds. On the second burst the fireball appeared to explode into small fragments and fade out.





We were going North on #6 highway towards Ashern about 3:30 - 4:00 A.M. 19 SEPT 71 and my brother, ..., said look. He said he saw a flash across the highway in front of thecar. was driving at the time. Then we looked up and saw this big spotlight, a big white light on the right side of the highway. At this time it was about a mile or a mile and a half in front of us. We were about 10 miles from the Perimeter. It was about of us and just off the highway and was the Perimeter. It was ahead of us and just off the highway and was moving real slow so we speeded up and got along beside it and we stopped the car and turned it off. We rolled down the windows to see if we could hear anything. At this time the object was just sitting still and was spinning. It was only about 50 - 75 yards away. There was sort of a humming noise, low pitched of medium volume. It was quiet enough that if you were inside a house that you wouldn't hear it. You'd have to be outside.

The object was shaped like two saucers, one on top of the other and there was a red light on the left side in the middle, and a green light right in the very centre of it and a white light to the right of it still in the middle. The lights appeared to be stationary and just blinked on and off while the rest of it was spinning. The red and green lights were both flashing together while the white one stayed on, I think. It spun there like that for about 30 seconds. Once it tilted, the back side of it (the other side from us) seemed to drop down and then it righted itself again.

Then it took off real slow, about 15 m.p.h. I guess, towards the South. It seemed to be following the highway. said let's turn around and follow it and see what it is. and I didn't want to and we continued North to go into Woodlands to see if we could find an R.C.M.P. It was about three miles away, we couldn't see the shape any more but we could still see the lights flashing. We still kept on going North and then it seemed to catch up to us rather than going farther away. Then we told that it was catching up and turned to see it but I don't think he would because he was driving. It seemed to be catching up to us and it got about a mile away and then we couldn't see it anymore because we went past some trees. Then we hit Woodlands and we saw that it was just a store so there wouldn't be any R.C.M.P. there and we kept on driving. From that time we first saw it until we lost it behind the trees approx. 10 minutes had passed and all this time it was within eye sight.

After we took the turn in the highway we saw it again behind us and we saw it all the way up to St. Laurent. Then a graveltruck was coming up behind us and we lost sight of it. Gordon says he saw it cross the highway, but we never saw it after that. I guess about a half hour or 45 minutes had passed since we lost it behind the trees, down at Woodlands, for about 10 or 15 minutes.

Then we never saw it after that.

- COLOUR -It must have been a dark colour because it was a clear night and we could see the stars and the Northern lights, because we couldn't see a colour, really, just the outline of it and the lights blinking on and off continually. I think the white light stayed on continually.
- SHAPE It was like two saucers being upside down on top of each other but more oval. The bottom half of it was deeper or thicker, than the top half. When we were up close to it, 50 - 75 yds., it seemed to be about a car length long and a car width deep.
- ALTITUDE When we saw it up close it was about 30 feet off the ground. It seemed about the same distance from the ground while it wasmoving both South and then again to the North. If it was much higher than that we wouldn't have lost it behind those trees. When we saw it the second time, after going around the bend, it was out over the fields, farther and seemed to be up higher.
- MOVEMENTS- The object seemed to be following the highway. Every time the highway curved it would sort of curve too. It stayed on the right side of the highway and sort of ran parallel to it most of the time. It ran parallel to the ground when it moved and when it was motionless and just sat spinning. We only saw the one object.
- DURATION About 45 minutes I think, I don't know. I kept watching it. I didn't keep an eye on the time. There was that one time in there for about 10 minutes when we didn't see it.
- SOUND It was a constant humming noise. I don't think it variated. It didn't increase in volume or pitch when it started to move off.
- Had you had anything to drink prior to this?
 No, it was at least 2 weeks ago that I last had anything alcoholic. A.
- You aren't on drugs or anything are you?
- No alcohol yes, but drugs no. A .
- When was the last time you had some sleep? How many hours previous and for how many hours did you sleep?
- The last time I slept was about 13 hours previous. I had gotten about 11 hours of sleep.

We were going out chicken hunting and we just got about 10 miles out of the city and I spotted this big white light crossing the road ahead of us. I called and attention to it and I thought that it was a plane or something. It was quite a ways off and the light was kind of bright, like a big spotlight. I went faster in the car to catch up to it to see what it was. We caught up to it and it was just floating there. It was just about a 100 yards or so away. Then we stopped the car and shut it off and rolled down the window to listen to it. It was making a humming sound. There didn't seem to be a variation in the pitch. It was loud enough that we could hear it.

There was three lights on it. A big bright white one, a red and a green (they were smaller than the white one). The white light seemed to have faded because it was not as bright as when it was farther away.

We were going North on #6 highway and it followed us for about 30 to 40 miles.

When it was just hovering there, it was about 20 feet off the ground. It stayed there for about a minute or so and then it started off towards the direction we had come from (South). It was travelling about 15 or 20 m.p.h. and we took off towards the North. There was a mile or more - quite a distance away and we could still see it, just the white light, it was blinding us so we couldn't see the others and then it came back towards us. It came in just a matter of seconds and then followed us, not too close but we could still see the white light. It followed us for about 30 or 40 miles about \(\frac{1}{2} \) of a mile off the highway into the fields.

We were going to report it to the R.C.M.P. but we didn't cause thought we'd be locked up or something.

It wasn't a plane or anything. It's like something I've never seen before. I've never seen anything like this before.

Whatever it was, it was about 30 - 35 feet long and about 15 - 20 feet in depth.

- COLOUR I'd say it was a light colour. A grey or something. It's hard to tell with that light on it. Actually it was more of an outline rather than seeing a colour.
- SHAPE It was sort of round. The bottom was like a saucer. It looked like the lights were on top. It was 20 35 feet long and about 15 feet high or so.

ALTITUDE - When we first saw it, it wasn't really high. You couldn't see anything but the white light. When you got closer you could see the other two lights. While it was hovering it was about 20 - 30 feet off the ground. It didn't hover too long. When it was following us it was quite a ways away, but I would guess that it was about 100 feet up.

We were driving down #6 highway (North). We were around Grosse Isle and sighted a bright light going across the highway and he mentioned it to us, and when I noticed it. It had one bright white light and flashing red andwhite light. It seemed like it was hovering over the field about 75 - 100 yards. We stopped the car and shut off the motor and we could hear a humming noise and it looked like it was rotating. It started to move East and we drove on. We watched it for about 3/4 of an hour 'til we got to St. Laurent and then it went out of sight..

- COLOUR I didn't see a colour. It was too dark. I just saw an outline of it.
- SHAPE Oval it was just an outline. Red and green light flashed on and off, alternately, but the white light stayed on constantly and quite bright, like a spotlight. The ship was rotating or seemed to and the lights appeared to be stationary.

DURATION - I saw it for about 3/4 of an hour.





Reference to the above and our Telex #ASH/240 and Op. Man. CO-AIR para 6, Unidentified Flying Objects, I report the following.

At approximately 12:15 AM, 19 SEP 71, Mr. (B: (B:), 6478 Victoria Drive, Vancouver 16, B.C., and Mr. (B:), 1402 East 27th, North Vancouver, B.C., came to our office and reported the sighting of some unidentified flying objects the evening before. They appeared to be sensible type persons and were quite sincers in the information that they gave. Information is as following and in compliance with Op. Man. CO-AIR, para 6:

- (a) Date and time of sighting 18 SEP 71 between the hours of 10:00 PM and 12MN Pacific Standard Time.
- (b) Condition of sky Clear.
- (c) Identification of observer As above noted.
- (d) Location of observer at time of sighting on top of a mountain north of Loon Lake, B.C., which is approximately 20 miles north of Cache Creek, B.C.
- (e) Identification of other persons also observing the U.F.O. Nil.
- (f) Description of sighting As follows: There were three objects sighted. #1 was in a southerly direction approximately 25 degrees above the horizon at about two to ten miles away. The object appeared bright white in colour and was shaped like a peace symbol. It bobbed up and down for a while and then became stationary. #2 and #3 were in a westerly direction and about 2 degrees above the horizon. #2 was hexagon in shape and all red in colour. It held a stationary position most of the time. #3 had a white centre with a red ring around it. It bobbed up and down most of the time it was watched. Asketch of the above objects with explanation is attached.
- (g) Duration of observation Approximately two hours. Subjects observed U.F.O.'s through the scope on their rifle.
- (h) Other relevant information Subjects had only one hour sleep the night before, had not been drinking and were quite positive in what they saw. They stated that the reason they could not watch the objects any longer was due to them being over tired. In the morning when they awoke they looked in the direction in which they had observed the U.F.O.s and could see nothing. 



1. With reference to the above may you please be advised that at 8:30 P.M. on Monday the 16 th day of August. 1971 a phone call was received at this Detachment from one the call of 144 Dover St., Campbellton, N.B. advising that during the early mornin hours he had seen a mysterious object that he could not identify and he requested that we make an attempt to identify it for him.

Immediate investigation revealed that at approximately 4:30 A.M. of this date had occasion to get out of bed and he noticed an ambur light approximately 500 yards above Sugarloaf Mountain, which is in the City of Campbellton. Since watched it for a this light did not resemble the stars few minutes. During this time the object moved in an easterly direction and in so doing came closer to _____. At this time got his wife out of bed and both of them observed the . At this time object as it appeared to hover near the same spot. During this time counted five (5) amour lights that appeared to be pulsating. After a period of approximately 15 minutes the object started moving toward the South and as it neared the horizon it dissappeared as a streak of light, as described it, "as fast as the eye could follow." could not determine any shape to this object nor could he tell how far away it was.

3. On Thursday the 19 th day of August, 1971 at approximately 2:00 A.M. Cst. G.BARAGAR and Cst. D. MARTEL of this Detachment were on patrol in the area of Sugarloaf Mountain when they also noticed a mysterious light on the East side of the Mountain. A short time later the same light was observed on the West side of the Mountain and at this time these members drove as near to the Mountain as they could and in so doing noticed that this object
was moving in the same direction as they were. In view of this
they kept driving in the same direction for approximately 7 miles
with the object following, or at least travelling in the same
direction. At times this object was on the right hand side of the car and on other occasions it was on the left hand side. These members stopped on several occasions and when they did so the object stopped as well. On one occasion they stopped and turned all of the lights on the P.C. out. This object also stopped and it's lights became very dim. The flashing red dome light of the Police car was put on and at this time two objects that resembled rabbit ears (T.V. Antenna) appeared on each side of the object. These rabbit ears appeared to take on a dull red colour. At approximately 7 miles from the City the P.C. was turned and brought back the same highway it had left on. The object followed again stopping when they did until they reached the Sugarloaf Mountain again at which time it stopped. Shortly thereafter it dissappeared behind the Mountain and they were unable to see it again.

of this object nor could they tell how far away it was. They could tell that at times it was much brighter than others and also at times it was much larger than others. They described it as being as large as a softball at times and other times it resembled the stars. The time of their observation was approximately 3 hours.

4. On each of the two occasions mentioned previously a check was made with the Charlo Airport and C.F.B. Chatham both were met with negative results. I might also point out that no sound was heard on either of these two occasions, from this object. On each of these two occasions Telex messages were forwarded to NRC Meteor Center with Info to CANFORCHED, Comm. Ottawa, "J" Division, and Moncton Sub/Division.

5. Since these two sightings several reports of sightings have been made from Matapedia, Rimouski, New Carlisle and New Richmond, P.Q.

6. On the 1st day of September, 1971 I had occasion to be speaking with one that he had also seen this object, however, because of the fact that he had mentioned it to his wife and she laughed at him, he had not told anybody else about it. He described his sightings as being nearly every night for about three weeks. On the first
occasion he saw it, the day Appollo 15 was launched, it was quite a distance from him and he assumed that this bright light was Appollo 15. He observed the object for approximately 10 minutes and it gave the appearance of being very bright and sparkling. On the next occasion that he recalls the object was much closer and at this time he could determine that this object was flat on the top and rounded on the bottom, he also advises that he was able to see lights from the interior of this object and that it was giving off a noise similar to that of a siron. He advises that he walked from his work to his home, a distance of approximately I mile and this object followed him. Again the object was near the Sugarloaf Mountain. Once he reached his home he went inside and never bothered to look out again. He has seen this object on several occasions since and the last being on the 30th of August, 1971. He finishes work at 12:00 MN each night from Monday through Friday and he has been advised to call the writer immediately should he see this object again.

7. In view of the above this file will remain open until such time as these mysterious objects are identified or further investigation appears fruitless. Two copies forwarded direct to H.Q. Ottawa.



- l. At 9:10 PM this date, Mr. Contacted this office advising that he presently has in view an unidentified object in the sky which seems to be moving. Myself and Cst. L. LANZA made a patrol to the residence which is located approximately two miles east and one mile north of city centre Creston, B.C. The object at this time was found to have moved from the original sighting in an upwards direction and was not quite as distinct. The object was located in the sky in a north north-east direction. In relation to the stars, it was found to be in almost a straigh line across from the top stars of the "Big Dipper."
- 2. The object was examined by myself through the detachment binoculars which are 7 x 50 power. At the time of the observation, the object appeared to be ovular in shape and emitted three distinct lights in a flashing pattern. The most intense light was red which seemed to flash at different points on the object. The bottom portion of the object emitted a green flashing light while the top portion emitted a weaker amber flashing light. The object appeared to be moving in an easterly direction and upwards in relation to the stars. Eventually the object moved further away and became fixed in a position too far away to examine the object any further.
- 3. A patrol was made back to the detachment where contacted the office again advising that the object had moved closer and could be seen contacted this readily. A patrol was made to the residence by myself and the object viewed again. This time the object had moved westward and found to be much closer than the previous viewing. The object was once again viewed through the detachment binoculars and found to have the same shape as previously noted. At times, the flashing would be more vivid than other times. The The object was viewed further by myself time was approximately 10:00 PM. and at one point a bright white light emitted from the object southwards in a beam similar to the beam of light from car headlights. This beam of light eventually disappeared and couldn't be seen again. It also appeared that the object was revolving as a unit thus giving the flashing light effect. The sky on these sightings was found to be very clear and heavily clustered with stars. After approximately 20 minutes the object appeared to move upwards rapidly and eventually came to a fixed position where it couldn't be seen readily with binoculars.

This is the statement of (B: (B: E), Erickson, B.C. taken at his residence at 10:10 PM; 26-3-71.

On the 24th of August, 1971, I saw an object in the sky which I thought was an airplane as there were distinct green & red flashing lights. I got out of my car at my residence and shut off the engine. I couldn't hear an airplane and the object appeared to be fixed. This was at approximately 10:00 PM. I looked at it through my binoculars (8 x 40). The object was very close. It appeared to be oval shaped and revolving. The green seemed to be above the red. There also appeared to be an amber colour which would flash periodically. The red was the strongest colour and was also flashing. It was NNE at the time and moved slowly westward. The object also appeared to be revolving. It eventually stayed in a fixed spot. I quit looking about 11:00 PM.

On 25th August 1971, I spotted the object was much closer than the last time I saw it last night. The colours were the same in hue and brightness, however, the red flashing light seemed to flash at different spots on the object. I called the RCMP at this time and they attended. The object moved eastward, then down and up to the west. The RCMP left before it came to the west. When it appeared in the westward position it was clearer again and I called the RCMP. They arrived and viewed it with me again. Same observations were made at this time except a white beam of light like headlights was seen emitting from it southward. The object then rapidly moved away and stayed fixed in the sky. At ll:00PM, I stopped viewing the object.

About 8:30PM; 26-8-71, the object was seen again and was quite close again but not as close as the first night. The first night was the closest I've ever seen it. I once again called the RCMP and they attended. At 10:00 PM the object was very faint and far away.
