MEMORANDUM FOR: THE RECORD

SUBJECT : Addendum to Subprojects 5, 25, 29
and 49.

1. The purpose of this addendum is to set forth the mutual administrative responsibilities of the contractor and sponsor.

C 2. The above subprojects represent the research program of Mr. ██████████, financed under NEUMTRA, covering the period of 1 September 1953 through 30 June 1956.

C 3. It was agreed that Mr. ██████████, the principal investigator, would submit annual informal summary accountings covering the entire period of the program. It is understood that upon completion of the research program any unexpended or surplus funds advanced Mr. ██████████ would be returned to the sponsor. Also, the ██████████ has requested the Universities to submit to them a summary accounting of monies received from the Fund. They also requested the return of any unexpended funds received under a grant from the Fund.

C 4. Mr. ██████████ has established a special bank account for all funds advanced by the ██████████, and a signed Declaration of Trust on this account has been obtained and is on file in 158/09.

5. Title to any permanent equipment purchased by funds granted the Universities shall be retained by the Universities in lieu of higher overhead rates.

6. Title to any permanent equipment purchased by funds granted to Mr. [redacted] shall be retained by the Agency and an annual inventory of such equipment shall be submitted to TSS/CD. Upon completion of the research program all permanent equipment will be returned to TSS/CD or disposal made at the direction of and with the approval of Chief, TSS.

7. It was mutually agreed that Mr. [redacted] will document all travel expenses (transportation stubs, hotel bill, etc.) that are debited against funds advanced to his personal grant. Documentation and accounting for travel expenses which are reimbursable by the University shall conform with accepted University practices.

Dear Dr. Miller,

- In regard to our conversation last December about moving the research project [Redacted], I have finally finished clearing this with the [Redacted] the fund I am working under. I am enclosing a copy of my letter to them and also the proposed budget that would be handled by [Redacted] University. This budget will need to be formally submitted to the fund for their approval; which will, I am assured be given. There are two items in the budget which I feel should be explained:
- I. Miss [Redacted] is the assistant that I have trained for the project. She will be a part time student and will be a senior next year. She has consented to go with the project to [Redacted]
 - III. I do not know just what percentage [Redacted] University charges for handling funds of this kind so this item will have to be filled in there.

There were several points about the project that you wanted explained:

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Visit to Project [REDACTED]

1. On this day the writer spent the day observing experiments with Mr. [REDACTED] on project [REDACTED] and in planning next year's work on the project (Mr. [REDACTED] has already submitted his proposal to the [REDACTED]).

2. The general picture of the present status of the project is one of a carefully planned series of five major experiments. Most of the year has been spent in screening and standardizing a large group of subjects (approximately 100) and the months between now and September 1 should yield much data, so that these five experiments should be completed by September 1. The five experiments are: (N stands for the total number of subjects involved in the experiment.)

Experiment 1 - N-18 - Hypnotically induced anxieties to be completed by September 1.

Experiment 2 - N-24 - Hypnotically increasing ability to learn and recall complex written matter, to be completed by September 1.

Experiment 3 - N-30 - Polygraph response under Hypnosis, to be completed by June 15.

Experiment 4 - N-24 - Hypnotically increasing ability to observe and recall a complex arrangement of physical objects.

Experiment 5 - N-100 - Relationship of personality to susceptibility to hypnosis.

3. The work for next year (September 1, 1953 to June 1, 1954) will concentrate on:

Experiment 6 - The morse code problem, with the emphasis on relatively lower I.Q. subjects than found on University volunteers.

SUBJECT: [redacted]

[redacted] comprised an experiment in hypnosis designed to demonstrate potentialities of hypnosis as a tool of the clandestine services. Additionally, it was felt that a stimulation of the thinking of Operation's personnel in this somewhat virgin field would produce considered and practical guidance upon which to base further research.

There follows a brief chronological relation of the events of the week of 21 March 1954: (C)

22 March - Mr. [redacted] established in a suite in the [redacted] Hotel. 12 volunteer subjects were screened for suggestibility. (C)

23 March - Seven subjects were screened for suggestibility in the forenoon.

In the afternoon the three subjects scoring highest on suggestibility screening returned for one hour individual interviews with Mr. [redacted]. (C)

Each subject was given the attached information report to study for 1/2 hour with instructions to remember the contents.

24 March - Each subject spent one hour in the morning and one hour in the afternoon with Mr. [redacted]. Immediately prior to the afternoon appointment each subject was allowed to observe a hotel room for one minute under instruction to remember all features for later relation. (C)

25 March - One hour was spent with each of the subjects in the morning. In the afternoon each subject was asked to reproduce consciously the written material studied and the features of the observed room. Following this and in the presence of CC/TSS Personnel, each subject was hypnotized, and reproduced, while in trance, either the written or observed material.

26 March - A demonstration was given for selected representatives of Senior Staffs and Area Divisions. Limb catalepsy, reproduction of written material and visualization and verbal description were demonstrated.

Discussion:

At all times when subjects were being hypnotized a CD representative (Dr. Gottlieb or Major [REDACTED]) was present. His presence served a double purpose of reassurance to the subject and observation of technique for possible later exploitation.

It should be emphasized that from the hypnotist's point of view the entire operation was carried out under the most difficult conditions. He had no previous contact with subjects, hence, no initial rapport existed. He had no background knowledge of subjects from which to develop leads indicating depth of trance. It is an established fact that trance depth develops most satisfactorily if time (a few days) is allowed between interviews. Here subjects took part in four developmental interviews within a period of 48 hours thus allowing very little assimilatory time.

Despite the difficulties under which he worked, Mr. [REDACTED] was able to demonstrate medium trance phenomena quite satisfactorily.

With respect to techniques used by Mr. [REDACTED] in suggestibility testing and hypnosis, the methods are essentially as follows: A constant speed black on white spiral color wheel was used for visual fixation along with verbal suggestion in initial testing. With these subjects demonstrating susceptibility, suggestions were made that future trance induction would be accomplished on verbal command to sleep. In later interviews verbal suggestions and commands were given with a background of metronome beats.

Results:

As indicated previously, three subjects were chosen for further development. Results with each subject will be treated separately. Subject A [REDACTED] attained a medium trance state. In the short time for development, however, he was unable to reach a somnambulistic state as characterized by amnesia. In the preliminary demonstration subject A demonstrated arm catalepsy and hypnotic recall of written material. In the final demonstration Subject A demonstrated arm paralysis and induced pain as a form of physical and psychological control.

(D) Subject B [REDACTED] attained medium trance state and in both demonstrations produced under hypnosis a quite accurate copy of written material previously observed. Unfortunately both A and B proved to have excellent memories. They were able to recall the material quite accurately without hypnosis so that little, if any, improvement could be noticed.

(D) Subject C [REDACTED] attained medium trance state with a particular flair for visualization and verbalization. In the preliminary demonstration "C" reproduced the layout of the room observed noting additional features and correcting erroneous relationships evident in a previous conscious recounting. Interrogation indicated that further information as to detail could be obtained. In the final demonstration subject C was regressed to the time in 1948 when he visited [REDACTED] and asked to describe the scene. Verification as to accuracy of the description came from an observer who had recently visited the area. It is interesting to note that the description was in terms of the 1948 appearance and did not allude to extensive fire destruction which occurred later.

Written productions of subjects are attached in their original state.

Comments:

Whereas the experiment was only partially successful in the light of failure to achieve amnesiac states and the lack of marked improvement in hypnotic recall, the interest aroused among observers of the demonstration attests to the success of one of the main objectives--stimulation of thinking in the operational fields.


