1. On 2 March 1953, [redacted] and the writer (Lubar) interviewed [redacted]

The reason for this visit was that the [redacted] boys intend possibly to use [redacted] in an operation in [redacted] and wish to find out whether or not [redacted]

1. He had too much knowledge from a medical point of view (anatomy, dentures, lockpicks, drugs, etc.)

2. From a security point of view, could he give too much information to the [redacted] if he could get directly to them.

2. [redacted] expressed the professional opinion: in view of the ANTIHIST work in June 1952 was considered that [redacted] would not have any valuable knowledge of the ANTIHIST technique. He stated that in his opinion [redacted] believed he was given a medical treatment and that questions asked of him were of a medical nature and not pure information.

3. [redacted] further stated that he felt that in consideration [redacted] would have total amnesia for such that went on during June when ANTIHIST treatment was applied. He also stated he would have no knowledge of the chemicals, techniques, personalities, etc. that would be of value to the [redacted] if he could get. In connection with the trip in August 1951 [redacted] stated he believed [redacted] would know that he had been subjected to drugs since his behavior was not normal and [redacted] himself in an intelligent, shrewd, hard-core agent [redacted]

[redacted] stated it would not make any difference any way since [redacted] was not asked pertinent or intelligence-type questions and certainly would have no knowledge of chemicals (even those that were put in coffee, beer, and in his food).

4. [redacted] stated he felt, from a medical point of view, there would be no real harm in using [redacted] for another operation and that if [redacted] could get to the [redacted] he could give them no truly valuable information and if he did give them information, the information would do no harm than describe their plans. [redacted] could give no factual details.
