In a recent conversation with Mr. [redacted] concerning the need of the agency to learn as much as possible about psychotropic drugs, not only those being developed abroad but also those being developed in this country as well, he suggested that he would be happy to cooperate with the agency in this endeavor.

In bringing to his attention that many times drugs of unusual types and properties are uncovered in commercial laboratories screening programs he stated that such was the case with [redacted] One type which he mentioned has been uncovered in their screening program for tranquilizing agents. This drug, in tests, caused ~~marked~~ breakdown in total personality insofar as it was possible to discover this in animal experimentation. He stated that there were probably many others which he knew little about but which would be of no use to them commercially, and might be of some use to us.

He further stated that the way to go about making these available to us is to have someone from Washington who is a trained scientist in the drug field come to [redacted] for the purpose of sitting down with their scientists and discussing the matter.

We would suggest that you discuss this matter with the interested parties in [redacted] for the purpose of arranging a visit to the [redacted] for the purpose of discussing the above mentioned.
