Cases Proposed for [REDACTED] C

J 1. On 22 December 1960, as you suggested, I discussed the status  
of [REDACTED] with [REDACTED] of OS; [REDACTED] was also present, having A  
yesterday participated in a long discussion on connection with the  
J [REDACTED] examination given [REDACTED] by [REDACTED]. The problem C A  
here was to plan immediate cases for [REDACTED] to work on in order to C  
keep his skills in condition and establish without flaps the validity  
of his techniques so that we can commit him against more important  
targets as early as possible.

C 2. I explained that with our concurrence TSD planned to move  
[REDACTED] to Washington without disturbing his present cover, this  
would permit more convenient access for training, discussion and  
immediate deployment on cases.

A 3. [REDACTED] had several immediate suggestions:

J a. There are now two [REDACTED] men working under [REDACTED] who A  
are detailed full time to [REDACTED] and work primarily in J  
I [REDACTED] with frequent trips to [REDACTED]. It would be easy F/I  
and convenient for OS to arrange for a routine medical/  
psychiatric examination at the beginning of some or all of  
J the [REDACTED] interviews. This examination could include  
[REDACTED] applications of all types (e.g., rapid-unwitting,  
gradual-unwitting, gradual witting) with no danger of flaps.  
No logistical preparations beyond those normally used for  
J the [REDACTED] would be necessary, and there would be no  
G additional burden on [REDACTED]. Checking and testing post-hypnotic  
J behavior would be easy through the [REDACTED] operators and  
I OS people travelling frequently to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] suggested A  
that the best way to arrange it would be for you to approach  
A [REDACTED] directly and get his initial approval.

G b. [REDACTED] See notes of my conversation with [REDACTED] A  
below.

G c. [REDACTED] Staff. [REDACTED] will check with [REDACTED] to A  
see what suitable subjects there may be as of now.

F/I d. [REDACTED] security cases. [REDACTED] will check with [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] A  
to determine what low-level security cases may lend

F/I themselves to the treatment. He recalled one case, now doing time in a [redacted] jail for embezzlement of [redacted] J funds about whom there are a number of unanswered questions.

e. Local volunteers. OS has a number of local volunteers, staff members of OS, who have volunteered to act as subjects in previous experiments. After discussion we agreed that C while this might give [redacted] practice, it would not fit J the criteria for testing [redacted], since the voluntary element is not wanted at the present time.

h. Also on 22 December 1960 I discussed the problem with [redacted] G A [redacted], who was generally familiar with the program and with part in it. He gave me a general briefing on [redacted] and G suggested that I have a tour through [redacted] before making concrete G recommendations as to where in the [redacted] project the technique may J best be tested. He will arrange the tour without informing anyone other G than C, [redacted] of its actual purpose and we can then discuss further possibilities. On the basis of today's discussion, I should judge that several flapless and rather interesting cases can be found in [redacted] for immediate exploitation. G

5. Of the above, the one that I believe should be tackled immediately and vigorously is the first suggested by [redacted], namely use of J the [redacted] facilities now operating in [redacted] in connection with A J [redacted]. [redacted] said that if several of these worked satisfactorily, they A would be eager to make an experiment on a female [redacted] personality in J I [redacted] to whom they have access.
