appear at the Queens County Court, Long Island City,
New York, on June 18, 1958, for trial. It should be
noted that on May 14, 1958, a Postal Inspector, accompanied
by two New York City Police Department Detectives, visited
the residence located at 25-45 99th Street, East Elmhurst
Long Island, New York, to serve a warrant on one [redacted]
[redacted] reportedly residing at said address, for mail
fraud. Upon making inquiry, they were not admitted and
advised that [redacted] did not reside at this
address. They were treated in a very hostile manner.
One officer was kicked in the groin and the other officer
was hit by milk bottles thrown by [redacted] Both
police officers received hospital treatment in connection
with this matter. Others arrested with the subject were

[redacted], age 13.

B. APPROX 1/1

On June 9, 1958, T-1 made available a letter
that was written by MALCOLM X to Mayor ROBERT F. WAGNER
of New York City, dated May 23, 1958, concerning the
incident which occurred on May 14, 1958. Portions of
it read as follows:

"Honorable Mayor

"The outraged Moslems of the African-Asian world join us in calling for an immediate investigation by your office into the insane conduct of irresponsible white police officers who seem to have thought their white faces were sufficient 'badge' to force the way into private homes of innocent law-abiding darker citizens under the false pretense that they are looking for an unknown unidentified party called Margaret Dorsey.

"The white officers of the law were not satisfied invading and endangering the homes and lives of the first floor occupants. Instead of searching downstairs where their professed suspect was supposed to be they dashed up the back stairs and smashed away into the upstairs apartments too. They battered down the door to my private apartment shattering glass throughout my residence. In their frenzy the white maniacs representing the New York City Police Force endangered the lives of our wives, babies and children who had locked themselves into my private bedroom to escape the uncontrollable wrath of the inhuman white cops who were tearing up our home like ferocious wild beasts. Your New York police officers threatened to break down my bedroom door if my pregnant wife did not unlock it and let them in and then to throw her down the back stairs because she wasn't moving fast enough to suit them."

T-2 advised on June 6, 1968, that he knows the subject to be the wife of MALCOLM LITTLE, Minister of Temple Number 7, Nation of Islam (NOI), but he has no information to report concerning any possible NOI activities on her behalf.

T-3 advised on June 10, 1958, that he knows the subject to be married to MALCOLM LITTLE, Temple Number 7 Minister, but that he does not know her personally.

T-4 advised on June 12, 1958, that he does not know the subject.

T-5 advised on June 3, 1958, that he knows the subject to be the spouse of MALCOLM LITTLE, Temple Number 7 Minister, but that he has no information to report concerning her activities.

T-6 advised on February 26, 1958, that BETTY X, wife of MALCOLM LITTLE, was in attendance at the NOI meeting at the Tabernacle Baptist Church, Chicago, Illinois, Temple Number 2, on February 23, 1958. T-6 advised that this was the first meeting of the Annual NOI Convention that was held in Chicago, Illinois, from February 23 to 26, 1958.

T-7 advised on March 5, 1958, that BETTY LITTLE attended the NOI Annual Convention which was held in Chicago, Illinois, during the period February 23 through 26, 1958.

T-7 advised on March 17, 1958, that BETTY X was in attendance at the Afro-Asian Educational and Crafts Display that was held by NOI Temple Number 7, New York City, on February 8, 1958, at the Park Palace, New York City.

The files of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York were caused to be checked by SA [REDACTED] on May 28, 1958, and they reflect no record for the subject.

[redacted] further advised that the record reflects the following relative to BETTY D. SANDERS: sex female; age 23; place of birth Detroit, Michigan; color "black"; residence 313 Hague Street, Detroit, Michigan; occupation nurse; first marriage; father SHELMAN SANDLIN - LORENZO D. MALLOY legal guardian; mother is HELEN LOWE.

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The marriage license reflects that the marriage ceremony was performed at Lansing Township on January 14, 1958, in the court of GEORGE J. HUTTER, Justice Court, Lansing Township, Michigan, 2705 East Michigan Avenue, Lansing, in the presence of witnesses [redacted] of Lansing, Michigan, and [redacted] of East Lansing.

On May 22, 1958, [redacted] Clerk, Bureau of Identification, Detroit Police Department, checked their file pertaining to the subject with negative results.

[redacted] Clerk, Wayne County Sheriff's Office, Detroit, Michigan, advised that they have no record for the subject. [redacted] furnished this information to SE [redacted] on May 22, 1958.

On May 19, 1958, [redacted] Supervisor, Merchants Credit Bureau, Detroit, Michigan, advised SE [redacted] that their files do not reflect a record for the subject.

APPENDIX

NATION OF ISLAM,
FORMERLY REFERRED TO
AS MUSLIM CULT OF ISLAM,
ALSO KNOWN AS
MUHAMMAD'S TEMPLES OF ISLAM

In February, 1957, a confidential informant advised that the "Nation of Islam" is an organization composed entirely of Negroes which was organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. The national leader is Elijah Muhammad, who claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America. According to Muhammad, the purpose of the organization is to establish an independent black nation in the United States.

Members follow the teachings of Muhammad, which are allegedly based on his interpretation of the "Koran." They are taught that there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negro race is the original race on earth and is Asiatic in origin and nature; that they are not citizens of the United States but merely slaves; that the white race, referred to as "white devils," is inferior to the Negro race but has exploited the Negroes, imposed slave names upon them, withheld from them the history of their true identity and culture, and, as a consequence, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the "Nation of Islam," including Elijah Muhammad, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

In January, 1957, another confidential informant related that Muhammad stated that upon advice of legal counsel, he had tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the tenets and principles of this organization in order to avoid prosecution by the Government for violation of the laws of the United States. However, he has not indicated any fundamental changes are proposed in the teachings of the organization.

NATION OF ISLAM (CONT'D)

Another source of information advised on March 22, 1957, that Muhammad's Temple of Islam, Incorporated, Temple No. 7, 102 West 116th Street, New York, New York, is the New York City affiliate of the Nation of Islam under Elijah Muhammad of Chicago, Illinois.

On April 30, 1957, the first source of information mentioned above advised that the Fruit of Islam (FOI) is a group within the Nation of Islam composed of all able-bodied male members of the Nation of Islam. The purpose of the FOI is to protect officials and property of the Nation of Islam, assure compliance of members with Nation of Islam teachings, and to prepare for the "War of Armageddon." Members of the FOI are required to participate in military drill and are afforded the opportunity to engage in judo training. The FOI is governed by a military system wherein the members are controlled by general orders similar to those issued by regular military organizations.

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On August 19, 1958, a suitable pretext interview was conducted by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, at the subject's residence 25-46 99th Street, East Elmhurst, Long Island of an unknown female individual. It was ascertained the subject is pregnant and expected time of birth not known. That she is a resident of said address, and that at the present time the subject is out of town on a trip. This unknown female advised that she did not where or how long the subject would be away.

Confidential informants, who are familiar with some phases of Nation of Islam (NOI) activities at Temple Number 7 New York City were contacted during August, 1958, and advised that they knew the subject to be the wife of MALCOLM LITTLE, Minister of Temple Number 7 New York City, but they have no other information to report concerning her NOI activities.

T-1 advised on August 21, 1958, that the photograph taken of the subject by the New York City Police Department on June 3, 1958, is not a very good resemblance of the subject. T-1 advised that when she has seen the subject at Temple Number 7 she is usually dressed with a white bandanna or hood. T-1 further advised that he does not know the subject personally, that he has seen her at NOI meetings in the past, but that most recently she not been in attendance at meetings.

[redacted] Calendar Clerk, Queens County Court House, Long Island, New York, on June 18, 1958, advised that [redacted] BETTY LITTLE and [redacted] were indicted by the Queens County Grand Jury in an indictment Number 521-58 filed on June 2, 1958, charging them with assault in the second degree, four counts, conspiracy, Violation of Section 1824 of the Penal Law, two counts, (attempting to prevent officer from performing duties) violation of Section 1825, two counts (resisting officer of law), and violation of Section 1851, two counts (resisting public officer in discharge of his duties). He stated further that Indictment Number

522-58 was also filed on June 2, 1958, charging [redacted] with the above same charges.

B. APPROX 1958

[redacted] stated that on June 3, 1958, warrants were issued for the arraignment and pleading of the above-mentioned individuals. These individuals were arraigned on June 3, 1958, however, pleading was adjourned until June 18, 1958, with [redacted] being released on \$1500 bail. He further advised that [redacted], BETTY LITTLE, [redacted] and [redacted] were also released on \$1000 bail each.

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[redacted] further advised that [redacted] BETTY LITTLE, [redacted] and [redacted] appeared before Queens County Judge GEORGE J. SPIER on June 18, 1958, for pleading, however, at the request of EDWARD JACKO, attorney for the defendants, the pleading was postponed until June 25, 1958. [redacted] indicated that [redacted] age 17, will be entitled to consideration

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[redacted] advised on August 4, 1958, that demurrers had been filed by defense attorney JACKO against Indictment 521-58 and that the time of August 13, 1958, had been set as the time when the ruling would be made concerning these demurrers.

[redacted] on August 18, 1958, advised that the subject's arraignment under Queens County Grand Jury Indictment Number 521-58 has been postponed until October 1, 1958. He stated the no ruling concerning the demurrers filed by defense attorney JACKO had been rendered by Queens County Court.

Lieutenant [redacted] 114th Precinct, Astoria, New York, advised SA [redacted] from his record on August 20, 1958, that the subject was arrested on June 3, 1958; arrest number 796 for felonious assault and conspiracy. The subject was released on \$1,000 bail.

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Lieutenant [redacted] advised that the subject and [redacted] were brought to the 114th Precinct on May 14, 1958, with [redacted] and [redacted] and [redacted] but that the subject and [redacted] were not booked at that date because Detectives [redacted] and [redacted] the officers who would sign the complaints against the subject, were not present inasmuch as they were in the hospital receiving medical treatment for the injuries they sustained at the time of the arrest of [redacted] [redacted] and [redacted] said that [redacted] and [redacted] appeared at the Grand Jury on June 3, 1958, to testify to the facts upon which the Grand Jury handed up indictments, and the subject was arrested on said date. [redacted] further advised that the arrest records at the 114th Precinct do not indicate whether or not the subject was pregnant or required any aid at the time of the arrest.

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On August 20, 1958, [redacted] 25-50 99th Street, and [redacted] advised SA [redacted] from a photograph that the subject does reside at [redacted] but they do not know if she is pregnant. They also advised that they did not know her name, and did not know to whom she is married. [redacted] advised upon reviewing the photograph of the subject that it would be her opinion that the subject is approximately 17 years of age. [redacted] and [redacted] advised that they could not give any accurate description of the subject inasmuch as there are quite a few women who reside at the subject's residence.

[redacted] Long Island, advised SA [redacted] on August 20, 1958, that she does not know if the subject is residing at 25-46 99th Street. She stated that there are numerous females residing there, and that they all dress alike which would make it almost impossible to identify any of them.

On June 18, 1958, Special Agents of the Federal

On June 23, 1958, a source advised that Nation of Islam Temple No. 7, 102 West 116th Street, New York, New York, is the New York City affiliate of the Nation of Islam (NOI), formerly referred to as the Muslim Cult of Islam and Muhammad's Temple of Islam, under the direction and control of Elijah Muhammad, the national leader of the NOI with headquarters at Chicago, Illinois. This source further advised that the Nation of Islam Temple No. 7 was founded in New York shortly following World War II.

In February, 1957, a source advised that the "Nation of Islam" is an organization composed entirely of Negroes which was organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. The national leader is Elijah Muhammad, who claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America. According to Muhammad, the purpose of the organization is to establish an independent black nation in the United States.

Members follow the teachings of Muhammad, which are allegedly based on his interpretation of the "Koran." They are taught that there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negro race is the original race on earth and is Asiatic in origin and nature; that they are not citizens of the United States but merely slaves; that the white race, referred to as "white devils," is inferior to the Negro race but has exploited the Negroes, imposed slave names upon them, withheld from them the history of their true identity and culture, and, as a consequence, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the "Nation of Islam," including Elijah Muhammad, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

~~CONFIDENTIAL~~NATION OF ISLAM (CONT'D)

In January, 1957, another confidential informant related that Muhammad stated that upon advice of legal counsel, he had tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the tenets and principles of this organization in order to avoid prosecution by the Government for violation of the laws of the United States. However, he has not indicated any fundamental changes are proposed in the teachings of the organization.

On April 30, 1957, the second source of information, mentioned above, advised that the Fruit of Islam (FOI) is a group within the Nation of Islam composed of all able-bodied male members of the Nation of Islam. The purpose of the FOI is to protect officials and property of the NOI, assure compliance of members with NOI teachings, and to prepare for the "War of Armageddon." Members of the FOI are required to participate in military drill and are afforded the opportunity to engage in judo training. The FOI is governed by a military system wherein the members are controlled by general orders similar to those issued by regular military organizations.

After the divorce of her parents, BETTY SANDERS lived for a time with her grandparents in Georgia and then with her mother in Georgia. She is related to the MALLOYS, just how Mrs. MALLOY would not state, and when she was fifteen years of age, the MALLOYS took over her guardianship. She lived with the MALLOYS at 313 Hague Street, Detroit, until she graduated from Northern High School in Detroit in January, 1952, when she left Detroit to attend Tuskegee Institute in Alabama. She attended Tuskegee Institute, Tuskegee, Alabama, for two years, taking a nurse's training course, but did not complete it. She then went directly to Brooklyn State Hospital for nurse's training. She has only visited in Detroit once for a few days since she graduated from high school in January, 1952.

B. Miscellaneous Background Information

On November 14, 1958, a Special Agent of the FBI using a suitable pretext, interviewed Mrs. LORENZO D. MALLOY, 313 Hague Street, Detroit. Mrs. MALLOY advised as follows:

She and her husband were the guardians of BETTY D. SANDERS, but not the legal guardians. This BETTY D. SANDERS was born May 28, 1934, in Georgia, place unknown. Her mother and father are divorced and her mother remarried. She does not know the present whereabouts of BETTY SANDERS' mother or father.

After the divorce of her parents, BETTY SANDERS lived for a time with her grandparents in Georgia, and then with her mother in Georgia. She is related to the MALLOYS, just how Mrs. MALLOY would not state, and when she was fifteen years of age, the MALLOYS took over her guardianship. She lived with the MALLOYS at 313 Hague Street, Detroit, until she graduated from Northern High School in Detroit, in January, 1952, when she left Detroit to attend Tuskegee Institute in Alabama. She attended Tuskegee Institute, Tuskegee, Alabama, for two years, taking a nurse's training course, but did not complete it. She then went directly to Brooklyn State Hospital for nurse's training.

BETTY SANDERS has only visited in Detroit once for a few days since she graduated from high school in January, 1952. While in Detroit, she was a member of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. She recently married a man

named LITTLE in New York City. Mrs. MALLOY advised that formerly her husband operated a shoe repair shop on Hastings Street, Detroit, but now they have no regular employment.

In January, 1957, a Source advised that ELIJAH MUHAMMAD had described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On December 22, 1958, another Source advised that the NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. MUHAMMAD, its present national leader, claims to have been selected by ALLAH, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States.

Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first Source related that MUHAMMAD, upon advice of legal counsel, had tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government. However, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

On December 16, 1958, another Source reported that MUHAMMAD early in July, 1958, had decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to MUHAMMAD, would help him to acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.

"Betty X, the wife of Malcolm X from Temple Number 7, New York City, said that Elijah Muhammad is providing jobs and opportunity for all of us. She said we are going to have a bank of our own here in Chicago and we are going to loan money. This bank is being organized on paper now. Everytime there are enough members to get a number for a temple, we are going to have a restaurant, dress shop, and bakery, just like we have in Chicago. We are also going to open a health center here. We want educated members with college degrees to help us so they can help their own people."

NY T-1 advised on April 7, 1959, that a hygiene class was taught by BETTY X from Temple Number 7, New York City at the MGT meeting held on April 2, 1959, at the University of Islam Number 2, 5333 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

APPENDIX

MUSLIM GIRLS TRAINING (MGT)

On January 20, 1959, a source advised that the MUSLIM GIRLS TRAINING is a group within the NATION OF ISLAM and is composed of all female members of the NOI. The MGT is similar in structure to the FRUIT OF ISLAM, which is composed of all male members of the NOI, in that the MGT has officers similar to military organizations to whom other female members are accountable. MGT members receive instructions in homemaking, hygiene, calisthenics, and other subjects such as Muslim history and the English language. There also exists a Junior MGT which is composed of female members of the NOI who are between the ages of 15 and 19 and who are afforded military-type drill.

Since 1957 various officers and "sisters" of the MGT have, at meetings of the MGT, used the term MGT so that it also means General Civilization Class. General Civilization Class refers to classes conducted within the MGT.

The above refers to activities of the MGT at Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood, Chicago, Illinois.

On January 19, 1959, another source advised that the MGT is a group within the NOI which is composed of all female members of the NOI. The MGT is similar in structure to the FRUIT OF ISLAM, which is composed of all male members of the NOI. In theory the MGT exists in all Temples of the NOI and is patterned after the MGT at Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, Chicago. General Civilization Class refers to the collective group of classes held within the MGT.

LITTLE, commonly known as MALCOLM X, who is also President of the MMI and who was also expelled from the NOI. BETTY LITTLE on numerous occasions in 1959, was a house guest of ELIJAH MUHAMMAD, national leader of the NOI. BETTY LITTLE has attended meetings of the OAAU in NY in 1964.

In view of the fact that BETTY LITTLE was very active in the NOI and the MGT from 1958 to 1963, and is now attending OAAU meetings, and is the wife of MALCOLM X., founder and president of the MMI and founder and chairman of the OAAU, it is believed that BETTY LITTLE meets the Security Index criteria and it is recommended that she be placed on the Security Index.

No mention is made of events occurring at some of the NOI, FOI, MGT and OAAU functions mentioned in this report, inasmuch as no information was reported which could be construed as being anarchistic, seditious or revolutionary.

Persons conducting investigation at Detroit, Michigan to verify subject's marriage and the checking of files at NYCPD, are unknown.

SA [redacted] was the Special Agent who interviewed Mrs. LORENZO D. MALLOY on 11/14/58, using the pretext that he was conducting an investigation to identify one BETTY SANDERS, reason not specified.

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The address 403 South Butler St., Lansing, Michigan, given by BETTY LITTLE's husband on marriage records, is the home of PHILBERT LITTLE, then Minister, Temple #16, NOI, and brother of subject's husband, MALCOLM LITTLE.

A suitable photograph of the subject is available.

No request being made to interview the subject at this time, in view of the fact that she is the wife of MALCOLM K. LITTLE, former Minister of NOI, Mosque Number 7 and Founder and President of the Muslim Mosque Incorporated and Founder and Chairman of the Organization of Afro-American Unity, who has been touring Africa during the summer of 1964, denouncing the US for it's "oppression against Negroes." Although MALCOLM himself, has been interviewed in the past by Bureau agents, an attempt to interview his wife could cause embarrassment to the Bureau and deemed inadvisable.

This report is classified "Confidential" because of information furnished by NY T-3, T-5, T-6, T-7, T-11, T-14, T-15, T-16, T-17 and T-18 of subject's activities, the unauthorized disclosure of which could reveal the sources and impair their future effectiveness of continuing value, and such impairment could have an adverse effect upon the national defense interests of the US.

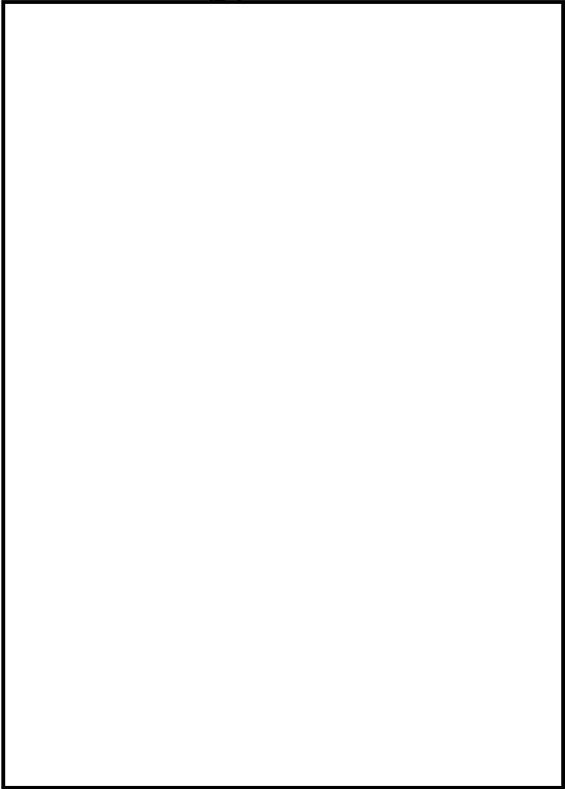

I. BACKGROUND

A. Birth

[redacted] Registrar, Tuskegee Institute, Tuskegee, Alabama, advised Special Agent (SA) [redacted] on December 4, 1958, that his records reflect that BETTY D. SANDERS was born on May 28, 1934, at Pinehurst, Georgia.

B. Education.

[redacted] mentioned above, produced the student file of BETTY D. SANDERS of 313 Hague Street, Detroit, Michigan, which file reflected that she entered Tuskegee Institute for the spring quarter of March, 1952, and who attended through May, 1953. The school file reflects that LITTLE commenced a teacher's training course in Elementary Education and maintained an average scholarship record. She was not graduated from Tuskegee Institute, and no reason was shown for her failure to return to this school.

Mrs. FLORENCE UNWIN, Principal, School of Nursing, Brooklyn State Hospital, 681 Clarkson Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, advised SA [redacted] on February 2, 1959, from her records that BETTY D. SANDERS lived in and attended said nursing school from September 16, 1953, until she graduated as a nurse on September 15, 1955. Miss UNWIN stated that LITTLE also successfully passed her State Board Examination and is a Registered Nurse (RN).

On November 14, 1958, [redacted], Clerk, Registrar's Office, Northern High School, Detroit, Michigan, provided SA [redacted] with a school file pertaining to BETTY SANDERS, which reflected the following information:

BETTY SANDERS entered the above school on September 19, 1949 from Miller School. Her date of birth was listed as May 28, 1934, at Georgia. Her parents are SHELIAN and OLLIE (BURKE) mother-divorced. Her godparent is listed as W. A. MALLON. She graduated on January 23, 1952 and on January 16, 1952, a transcript of her school records had been sent to Tuskegee Institute, Alabama. The school records further reflect that on April 22, 1952, a transcript had been sent to Miss W. LEWIS, 3818 Biddle, Detroit. On April 13, 1953, a transcript of LITTLE's school records had been sent to Brooklyn State Hospital, New York.

C. Residence and Employment

On November 20, 1954, NY T-20 advised that BETTY LITTLE continues to reside at 23-11 97th Street, East Elmhurst, Queens, New York, and is a housewife and not gainfully employed.

On June 17, 1958, [redacted] East Elmhurst, Queens, New York, and [redacted] Street, East Elmhurst, Queens, New York, advised [redacted] after reviewing a photograph of BETTY LITTLE, that she, at that time, resided at 25-46 99th Street, East Elmhurst, Queens, New York.

On May 7, 1958, [redacted] Vital Records Section, Michigan Department of Health, Old De Witt Road, Lansing, Michigan, advised that marriage records, State File Number 33-595, Ingham County Records Number 50-31, reflect a marriage license issued on January 14, 1958, in Ingham County Court, Lansing, to MALCOLM X. LITTLE and BETTY D. SANDERS.

The marriage license reflects that the marriage ceremony was performed at Lansing Township on January 14, 1958, in the court of [redacted] Justice Court, Lansing Township, Michigan, Lansing, in the presence of witnesses [redacted] of Lansing, Michigan and [redacted] of East Lansing.

F. Children of BETTY LITTLE

The "New York Herald Tribune", a local newspaper, dated June 30, 1963, contained an article on an interview with BETTY LITTLE, at which time LITTLE stated she has three daughters, [redacted]

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At this interview BETTY LITTLE was introduced as Mrs. SHABAZZ by her husband MALCOLM K. LITTLE, who stated that the name SHABAZZ comes from the original tribe from which the Moslems have descended.

G. Identification Records

Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Identification Record dated September 8, 1960, reflected that BETTY LITTLE, FBI Number B-415754, was arrested on June 3, 1958, charged *with assault and conspiracy.*

H. Arrest Record

On May 22, 1958, [redacted] Clerk, Bureau of Identification, Detroit Police Department, checked their files and were unable to locate any arrest record identifiable with BETTY LITTLE.

[redacted] Clerk, Wayne County Sheriff's Office, Detroit Michigan, advised Special Employee (SE) [redacted] on May 22, 1958, that no arrest record could be located identifiable with LITTLE in the files of the Wayne County Sheriff's Office.

On May 19, 1958, [redacted] Supervisor, Merchants Credit Bureau, advised SE [redacted] that their file contained no information identifiable with BETTY LITTLE.

Lieutenant [redacted] Bureau of Special Services (BSS), New York City Police Department, advised SA [redacted] on June 16, 1958, that BETTY LITTLE was indicted for Felonious Assault on a police Officer and Conspiracy on June 3, 1958. He advised that LITTLE was to appear at the Queens County Court, Long Island City, New York, on June 18, 1958, for trial. It should be noted that on May 14, 1958, a Postal Inspector accompanied by two New York City Police Department (NYCPD) Detectives, visited a residence at 25-46 99th Street, East Elmhurst, New York, to serve a warrant on one [redacted], reportedly residing at said address, for mail fraud. Upon making inquiry, they were not admitted to the residence and were advised that [redacted] did not reside at this address. They were threatened in a very hostile manner. One officer was kicked in the groin and the other officer was hit by milk bottles thrown by one [redacted]. Both police officers received hospital treatment in connection with this matter. Those arrested because of

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the above incident were BETTY LITTLE.

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On June 9, 1958, NY T-1 made available a letter that was written by MALCOIM X. (husband of BETTY LITTLE) to Mayor ROBERT F. WAGNER, New York City, dated May 23, 1958, concerning the incident which occurred above on May 14, 1958.

Portions of it read as follows:

"Honorable Mayor

"The outraged Moslems of the African-Asian world join us in calling for an immediate investigation by your office, into the insane conduct of irresponsible white police officers who seem to have thought their white faces were sufficient 'badge' to force their way into private homes of innocent-law-abiding darker citizens, under the false pretense that they are looking for an unknown, unidentified party called Margaret Dorsey.

"The white officers of the law were not satisfied invading and endangering the homes and lives of the first floor occupants, instead of searching downstairs where their professed suspect was supposed to be, they dashed up the back stairs and smashed a way into the upstairs apartments, too. They battered down the door to my private apartment, shattering glass throughout my residence. In their frenzy, the white maniacs representing the New York City Police Force, endangered the lives of our wives, babies and children, who had locked themselves into my private bedroom to escape the uncontrollable rath of the inhuman white cops who were tearing up our home like ferocious wild beasts. Your New York Police Officers threatened to break down my bedroom door if my pregnant wife did not unlock it and let them in, and then to throw her down the back stairs because she wasn't moving fast enough to suit them."

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NY T-2 advised on June 6, 1958, that he knows BETTY LITTLE to be the wife of MALCOLM LITTLE, the Minister of Temple Number 7, Nation of Islam (NOI).

[redacted] Calendar Clerk, Queens County Courthouse, Long Island, New York, on June 13, 1958, advised that BETTY LITTLE and three others were indicted by the Queens County Grand Jury in an indictment Number 521-58, filed on June 2, 1958, charging them with Assault in Second Degree, 4 Counts, Conspiracy, Violation of Section 1824 of the Penal Law, 2 Counts, (attempting to prevent officers from performing duties), Violation of Section 1825, 2 Counts (resisting officer of law) and Violation of Section 1851, 2 Counts (resisting public officer in discharge of his duties).

[redacted] stated on June 3, 1958, that warrants were issued for the arraignment and pleading of BETTY LITTLE and others. They were arraigned on June 3, 1958, however, pleading was adjourned until June 18, 1958. BETTY LITTLE was released on \$1,000.00 bail.

[redacted] advised SA [redacted] on March 18, 1959, that the jury return a verdict on the same date, acquitting BETTY LITTLE of all charges contained in Queens County Grand Jury, Indictment Number 521-58.

On December 4, 1958, SA [redacted] requested a search be made of the arrest records of the Tuskegee Police Department, Tuskegee, Alabama. No arrest record could be located identifiable with BETTY LITTLE. A search was also made on the same date of the criminal docket in the Office of the Criminal Court of Macon County, Alabama, and no arrest record could be located identifiable with BETTY LITTLE.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York, were reviewed on September 6, 1950, by [redacted] at the request of Investigative Clerk (IC) [redacted]. A credit

1.APPENDIXFRUIT OF ISLAM

On May 8, 1964, a source advised that the Fruit of Islam (FOI) is a group within the Nation of Islam (NOI) composed of male members of the NOI. The purpose of the FOI is to protect officials and property of the NOI, assure compliance of members with NOI teachings and to prepare for the "War of Armageddon." Members of the FOI are required to participate in military drill and are afforded the opportunity to engage in judo training. The FOI is governed by a military system wherein the members are controlled by general orders similar to those issued by regular military organizations.

1.APPENDIXMUSLIM GIRLS TRAINING

On May 19, 1960, a source advised that the Muslim Girls Training (MGT) is a group within the Nation of Islam (NOI) and is composed of all female members of the NOI. The MGT is similar in structure to the Fruit of Islam (FOI), which is composed of male members of the NOI, in that the MGT has officers similar to military organizations to whom other female members are accountable. MGT members receive instructions in homemaking, hygiene, calisthenics and other subjects such as Muslim history and the English language. There also exists a Junior MGT which is composed of female members of the NOI who are between the ages of 15 and 19 and who are afforded military-type drill.

Since 1957 various officers and "sisters" of the MGT have at meetings of the MGT used the term MGT so that it also means General Civilization Class. General Civilization Class refers to classes conducted within the MGT.

The above refers to activities of the MGT at Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood, Chicago, Illinois.

On May 7, 1964, another source advised that the MGT is a group within the NOI which is composed of all female members of the NOI. The MGT is similar in structure to the FOI which is composed of male members of the NOI. In theory, the MGT exists in all Temples of the NOI and is patterned after the MGT at Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, Chicago. General Civilization Class refers to the collective group of classes held within the MGT.

1.APPENDIXMUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED

The March 13, 1964, edition of "The New York Times," a daily newspaper published in New York, New York, contained an article on page 20 which indicated that MALCOLM X (LITTLE), former national official of the Nation of Islam (NOI) and Minister of NOI Mosque #7, New York, who broke with the NOI on March 8, 1964, publicly announced in New York City on March 12, 1964, that he had formed the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI). The MMI, according to the article, would be a broadly based politically oriented black nationalist movement for Negroes only, financed by voluntary contributions. In this public statement MALCOLM X urged Negroes to abandon the doctrine of non-violence when it is necessary to defend themselves in the civil rights struggle, and he also suggested that Negroes form rifle clubs to protect their lives and property in times of emergencies in areas where the government is unable or unwilling to protect them.

Incorporation papers of the MMI filed on March 16, 1964, with the Business Section, Clerk of Courts, New York County, New York, New York, reflect that the MMI was incorporated under the Religious Corporation Law of the State of New York to work for the imparting of the Islamic Faith and Islamic Religion in accordance with "accepted Islamic principals." The principal place of worship to be located in the Borough of Manhattan, New York, New York.

During an appearance over KYW - Television, Cleveland, Ohio, on April 7, 1964, MALCOLM X stated that the MMI does not stand for integration, but for complete freedom, justice, and equality for Negroes. He stated that Islam was the religious philosophy of the MMI, while the political, economic and social philosophy was black nationalism.

On May 15, 1964, a confidential source advised that the headquarters of the MMI are located in Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 Seventh Avenue, New York City, where they were established on March 16, 1964.

APPENDIX

NATION OF ISLAM, formerly referred to as the Muslim Cult of Islam, also known as Muhammad's Temples of Islam

In January, 1957, a source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam," (NOI) and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On May 8, 1964, a second source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the NOI; Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960, MUHAMMAD and other NOI officials, when referring to MUHAMMAD'S organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following MUHAMMAD'S teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised MUHAMMAD had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

NATION OF ISLAM, formerly

On May 7, 1964, a third source advised Muhammad had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to MUHAMMAD, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.

NATION OF ISLAM, MOSQUE #7,
NEW YORK CITY

On May 5, 1964, a source advised that the Nation of Islam (NOI) affiliate in New York City is known as Mosque #7, also known as Temple #7, and is located at 102 West 116th Street, New York City. Mosque #7 is part of the NOI headed by ELIJAH MUHAMMAD, with headquarters in Chicago, Illinois. Mosque #7 has two branches; Mosque #7B at 105-03 Northern Boulevard, Queens, New York City, and Mosque #7C at 120 Madison Street, Brooklyn, New York. These branches are part of Mosque #7.

The date Mosque #7 originated in New York City is not known.

However, in connection with the origin of Mosque #7, it should be noted that in 1953 a second source advised that there was a Temple of the NOI (known to source then as the Muslim Cult of Islam) in New York City located at 135th Street and 7th Avenue, as far back as 1947.

~~CONFIDENTIAL~~1.APPENDIXORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN UNITY (OAAU)

On June 28, 1964, MALCOLM X LITTLE, founder and leader of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), publicly announced the formation of a new, all Negro, militant civil rights action group to be known as the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), with himself as Chairman. This announcement was made at a public rally held by the MMI in the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

A printed and published statement of basic OAAU aims read by MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that it shall include "all" people of African descent in the Western Hemisphere, as well as "our" brothers and sisters on the African continent. It is patterned after the "letter and spirit" of the Organization of African Unity established (by African heads of States) at Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, in May, 1963.

A recording of the remarks of MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that the aim of the OAAU is to eliminate differences between Negroes so they can work together for "human rights," while the initial objective is to "internationalize" the American civil rights movement by taking it to the United Nations. LITTLE condemned the non-violent civil rights movement and claims that Negroes should be taught to protect themselves, when and if necessary. The OAAU will sponsor a program for Negroes of education, politics, culture, economics and social reform.

On August 19, 1964, a confidential source advised that the headquarters of the OAAU are located in MMI headquarters, Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 7th Avenue, New York City.

On May 14, 1958 a postal inspector accompanied by two New York City Police Department Detectives, visited a residence in East Elmhurst, New York to serve a warrant on a person for mail fraud. Upon making inquiry, they were not admitted to the residence and were treated in a very hostile manner. One officer was kicked in the groin and the other was hit by a milk bottle thrown at him. Four persons one being Betty Little were arrested and indicted for felonious assault on a police officer and conspiracy, on June 3, 1958 by the New York Police Department.

Little was released on \$1,000. bail and on March 18, 1959 a jury acquitted Betty Little of all charges.

Characterizations of the NOI, NOI #7, MGT, MMI and the OAAU are attached hereto and Confidential sources mentioned therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

Malcolm X Widow Faced Action For Contempt in Quiz by Jury

By PAUL HOFFMAN

The widow of Malcolm X was threatened with contempt action when she balked at answering questions before the grand jury investigating her husband's death. The New York Post learned today.

The grand jury returned first-degree murder indictments yesterday against three men in the Feb. 21 assassination of the Negro leader. They will be arraigned tomorrow in Supreme Court.

Malcolm's widow, who goes by the name of Mrs. Betty Shabazz, appeared voluntarily before the jury on Tuesday. Her

attorney, Oliver Sutton, said she was "cooperating" in the investigation.

But she balked at almost the first question—her current address. Mrs. Shabazz has been in hiding since several days before the assassination when her Queens home was fire-bombed. She is reported still fearful for her life.

Asst. DA Stern, who is conducting the murder inquiry, wanted to hale Mrs. Shabazz before Supreme Court Justice Gelinoff to direct her to answer, but the differences were ironed out in a corridor conference between Stern, Sutton and Mrs.

Mrs. Shabazz agreed to answer and returned to the grand jury room. She came out again a few minutes later, after balking at disclosing where she had stayed the eve of the murder and at telling who took her to the fatal meeting.

Again, there was a corridor conference and again, she finally agreed to answer. Her appearance before the panel lasted 20 minutes.

The Indicted Three

The three indicted yesterday were Thomas Hagan (alias Talmadge Hayer), Norman 3X Butler and Thomas 15X Johnson, the latter two both identified with the Black Muslim movement from which Malcolm defected. They were charged with the premeditated murder of "Malcolm Little, also known as Malcolm Shabazz, also known as Malcolm X."

The grand jury also indicted one of Malcolm's lieutenants, Reubin Francis, on assault and Sullivan Law charges in the shooting of Hagan moments after the assassination in the Audubon Ballroom. Hagan is recovering from his wounds in the prison ward of Bellevue Hospital. The others indicted are in the Tombs.

District Attorney Hogan's office would not say if the grand jury is still investigating the role others may have played in the assassination—either in the shooting itself or in its planning.

After the slaying, police said that at least five persons had participated in the shoot-

DuBois, famed historian and Scholar".

Malcolm X was founder and leader of the Muslim Mosque Incorporated (MMI) and founder and Chairman of the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU) at New York City. He was assassinated on February 21, 1965, at an OAAU rally at New York City.

The records of the New York Secretary of State, Albany, New York, show that the certificate of incorporation of Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, was filed on March 2, 1961.

The Spring, 1964, issue of "Freedomways" is self-described as "A Quarterly Review of the Negro Freedom Movement" published by Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, 799 Broadway, New York City.

On May 24, 1961, a source advised that a report was given on "Freedomways" at a meeting of the National Board, Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), held on May 24, 1961. It was stated that the original plan called for the publication to be openly Marxist, but that it was later decided it would not be avowedly a Marxist publication. Editorials are in the hands of a mixed group of Marxists and non-Marxists. It was stated that the central purpose of "Freedomways" is to develop a theory and positive criticism of currents in the Negro movement, as well as to raise the level of understanding and discussion taking place in Negro life today and to project a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation.

On May 25, 1961, another source advised that "Freedomways" was set up for the CPUSA by [redacted] a member of the National Committee of the CPUSA.

AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR MARXIST STUDIES

A source advised on April 9, 1963, that on April 7, 1963, at a meeting of the District Committee of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA) of New England, held in Boston, Massachusetts, HERBERT APTHEKER stated he was developing an organization called American Institute For Marxist Studies (AIMS), which would eventually legalize the CP. He stated AIMS would publish literature on History, Science, Physics, Archeology and other subjects which would be put out quarterly with various supplements.

A second source advised in December, 1959, that HERBERT APTHEKER was elected to the National Committee, CP, USA, at the 17th National Convention of the CP, USA, held in December, 1959.

A third source advised on June 7, 1963, that on June 3, 1963, HERBERT APTHEKER spoke at the CP, USA, New York District Board meeting concerning AIMS. APTHEKER stated that AIMS would unite and strengthen the CP although the CP would not be connected with it. He stated AIMS was being formed to operate within the scope of the MC CARRAN and SMITH Acts and would legally bring Marxist material and opinions to the attention of American scholars and the general public.

A fourth source advised on May 15, 1964, that, as of that date, AIMS was located on the fifth floor west at 20 East 30th Street, New York City, New York.

A characterization of the Muslim Mosque, Inc. (MMI) and Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU) is attached hereto and sources used therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

The New York "Amsterdam News", a New York weekly Negro newspaper, dated April 3, 1965, contained an article captioned "Malcolm's Widow in Mecca". This article in part states that "The possibility of a split in the ranks of followers of the late Malcom X Shabazz loomed heavily this week as Malcolm's widow, Mrs. Betty Shabazz was on her way to Mecca for the annual Moslem pilgrimage during the Hajj pilgrimage season which begins April 13.

"Sources close to Mrs. Shabazz, who left New York last weekend and arrived early this week in Jedda, Saudi Arabia, said she would be making her first pilgrimage to Mecca and would announce her decision on whether she would take the leadership of the Organization of Afro-American Unity upon her return to the United States in late April.

"Friends said Mrs. Shabazz had agreed to make the pilgrimage prior to her husband's death, but had debated whether to go because of the tragic death, but decided to go.

"Her trip, however, also put some question on the future leadership of the OAAU as the organization's provisional committee last week denied that it had selected any new leader, contradicting a statement made by Malcolm's half-sister, [redacted] of Boston, who announced that she was taking over the reins of the organization.

[redacted] moved swiftly and in Supreme Court this week as she and a group of five persons were granted a certificate for a charter. The five incorporators included [redacted] also of Boston; and three New York lawyers, [redacted] and photographer [redacted].

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"While Malcolm had always sought to hire Negro lawyers to handle his activities, it was noted that the papers in Supreme Court for the OAAU were handled by a white lawyer, Sidney J. Ettman of 55 Liberty St., New York, N.Y.

"Meanwhile Malcolm's former secretary, [redacted] who has taken over leadership of the Muslim Mosque, Inc., the religious group of Malcolm's followers, pointed out to the Amsterdam News that the two organizations are separate and distinct and that many followers of one are not necessarily followers of the other..."

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on February 5, 1965, that [redacted] and [redacted] are members of the OAAU. He further stated that [redacted] is the son of [redacted] of Boston, and [redacted] was the Executive Secretary of the MMI until the death of Malcolm X on February 21, 1965.

A second source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on March 30, 1965, that [redacted] recently stated that Betty Little could do nothing but make a pilgrimage to Mecca since the death of her husband, Malcolm X. [redacted] remarked that she made arrangements for Betty Little to make the trip to Mecca.

Betty Little

On March 30, 1965, [redacted] United Arab Airlines, 720 Fifth Avenue, New York City, advised that he could locate no reservation for Betty Little through United Arab Airlines for Saudi Arabia. He stated that there are no direct flights to Saudi Arabia, and that Pan American and Air India Airlines have daily flights to Beirut, Lebanon.

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On March 31, 1965, [redacted] Air India Airlines, 565 Fifth Avenue, New York City, advised that he could not locate a reservation for Betty Little for March 26, 27 and 28, 1965, on Air India Airlines for Beirut, Lebanon.

[redacted] stated that Air India Airlines has no direct flight to Jedda, Saudi Arabia. He further stated that persons going to Saudi Arabia will usually fly to Europe and then take a direct flight to Jedda, Saudi Arabia.

The New York "Herald Tribune," a local New York daily newspaper, dated March 29, 1965, contained an article captioned, "Mrs. Betty X to Mecca." This article stated that "Mrs. Betty X, also known as Betty Shabazz, widow of the slain Malcolm X, arrived in Jedda, Saudi Arabia on her way to Mecca on a Moslem pilgrimage during the Hajj pilgrimage season. She refused to talk to newsmen but friends - according to United Press International - said she would decide after the pilgrimage whether to take over the leadership of her late husband's Black Nationalist Movement.

Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), New York City, Manifest Records were reviewed for passengers on Pan American Airlines, Trans World Airlines, British Overseas Airways Corporation, Air France and Air India Airlines travelling from J.F.K. International Airport, New York to Europe and Spain during period March 24 to 28, 1965. Manifest Records failed to list the name Betty Shabazz or Betty Little.

ETTMAN, 29 Broadway, NYC was an active member of the National Lawyers Guild. Although the ETTMAN referred to by the anonymous source in 1949 is probably identical with the ETTMAN used by the OAAU, there is no information available that could definitely link them together.

In this letter subject indicated he had known MALCOLM X intimately for three years and since his pilgrimage to Mecca he has been accepted by the Moslems as a brother under Islam. He further indicated that MALCOLM X has been portrayed by the press

in an unfair manner; he has never been involved in violence, preached segregation or has been a racist and has never advocated any of the above since he returned from his pilgrimage.

[redacted] further stated in this letter that on a Sunday afternoon he had attended a meeting at the Black Muslim Mosque in New York City at which time during a question period he had confronted MALCOLM X and told him many of the statements and beliefs of the Black Muslims were contrary to the teachings of Islam. He then began writing to MALCOLM X, exchanging correspondence and sending him Islamic literature, urging him to make a pilgrimage to Mecca.

[redacted] stated that MALCOLM X has been bestowed the honor of being entrusted by the Muslim League, made up of all Muslim countries, to be its representative in America and on his return from Mecca he began a stage of life which was entirely different than that which he had previously led.

An item in The Dartmouth of 1/26/65 identified [redacted] as a personal friend of MALCOLM X and instrumental in getting him to visit Dartmouth College where he spoke on 1/26/65.

On 3/25/65 [redacted]

[redacted] an established source of the Boston Office (Protect Humanity), advised that [redacted] Post Office Box 45, Khartoum, Sudan, undoubtedly identical with subject, a foreign student, was admitted 9/22/62 as an unclassified student. He was born [redacted] and his father is principal of a secondary school in Khartoum. He is majoring in economics and is attending on a scholarship furnished by the Alumni Association of 1956. [redacted] said that subject has been granted a leave of absence during the Spring term, beginning 3/31/65, to make a pilgrimage to Mecca on a fellowship underwritten by the Muslim League, he being a Muslim. He is scheduled to return to Dartmouth about the latter part of May, 1965, and is to complete his degree requirements during the Summer Term and graduate in September of 1965. He intends to attend graduate school at either Harvard or Stanford.

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[redacted] for subject last summer with the Marine Research Trust Company, New York City.

[redacted] who has known subject as a student, advised that he is not an agitator in racial matters, is smooth, articulate, not the violent type, no communist sympathies on his part have come to his attention and he is not militant in any way.

On 4/7/65 chief of police DENNIS J. COONEY, Hanover, New Hampshire, advised subject has no record with his department and has never come to his attention.

On 4/12/65 [redacted] Secretary, New Hampshire Investigation Into Subversive Activities, New Hampshire Attorney General's Office, Concord, New Hampshire, advised that subject has not come to the attention of her office.

Malcolm X was founder and leader of the Moslem Mosque Incorporated (MMI), and founder and chairman of the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU). He was shot and killed as he addressed a OAAU public rally on February 21, 1965, at New York City.

Characterizations of the MMI and OAAU are attached hereto and sources used therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

Shirley Graham Du Bois

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available on January 22, 1965, stationery of the American Institute of Marxist Studies (AIMS). Included among the "founding sponsors" is the name Mrs. Shirley Graham Du Bois.

The Winter, 1963 issue of "Freedomways" identified Shirley Graham as the wife of Dr. W.E.B. Du Bois.

W.E.B. Du Bois

Dr. Du Bois died in Ghana, Africa, at the age of 96. He joined the Communist Party (CP) at the age of 93. His letter of application to the CP, United States of American (USA) and his acceptance were printed in "The Worker" an east coast communist newspaper, issue of November 26, 1961.

Betty Little

A characterization of AIMS and Freedomway Associates, Incorporated, publishers of the magazine "Freedomways" is set forth in the attached Appendix pages and sources used herein have furnished reliable information in the past.

A second confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on April 26, 1965, that a benefit show was held at the Apollo Theatre, at 12 midnight on April 23, 1965, by Negro entertainers, namely Sammy Davis, Jr., [redacted] Ossie Davis, [redacted] [redacted] and the Lee Roc. Bey Dancers to help raise money for the family of Malcolm X.

The second source stated that during the evening it was announced that Malcolm X's wife, Betty, was unable to appear at the benefit show because she was out of the country. A telegram sent by Betty Little was read to the audience in which she thanked all those who made this benefit show possible.

The New York "Courier", a Negro weekly newspaper dated April 24, 1965, contained an article captioned, "Who Paid for Mrs. X's Moslem Trip to Mecca?" This article stated that "Many questions are being asked by followers of the assassinated Malcolm X following his widow's trip to Saudi Arabia at a time when she was described as 'penniless and destitute' at the time of the slain Black Nationalist leader's death.

" A high-ranking official of the Organization of Afro American Unity which he founded after he defected from the Black Muslim movement last year indicated that efforts to raise money for her and the four children that Malcolm left behind were 'seriously hurt' by her trip. She flew to Mecca

on a Moslem pilgrimage during the Hajj pilgrimage season, a highlight in any Moslem's life.

" Gunned down by several assassins on Feb. 21 in front of 400 people as he prepared to address them at Aububon ballroom, Malcolm X was reported to have died 'broke'. His attorney at that time said that he hadn't even left an insurance policy.

" Since that time many groups and individuals throughout the nation have staged fund-raising benefits in behalf of Mrs. Betty Shabazz. [redacted]

[redacted] of Committee of Concerned Mothers recently reported that more than \$4,000 has been raised to aid the family.

" A benefit show is being planned for the Apollo theatre late this month. In Chicago a memorial service was held Sunday at the Baptist church to collect funds for a scholarship project for the children. Mrs. X is also expecting a fifth child sometime in November.

" Rumors have circulated that her trip may have been sponsored by several African nations which Malcolm visited within the last two years. A name that keeps cropping up among the alleged sponsors of her trip is Gamal Nasser, ruler of the United Arab Republic, and also a good friend of her late husband.

'How can she expect her friends to beg for money for her welfare at a time like this when she makes a trip that's played up in the papers,' a OAAU official asked. 'We've received many inquiries regarding this and it's hard to answer them'."

Ossie Davis and [redacted]

A third confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised on 4-12-62 that Ossie Davis and [redacted] are not known to be members of the CP, however, they have the reputation of supporting or aiding causes, through personal appearances which are also supported by the CP.

APPENDIX

MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED (MMI)

The March 13, 1964, edition of "The New York Times," a daily newspaper published in New York, New York, contained an article on page 20 which indicated that MALCOLM X (LITTLE), former national official of the Nation of Islam (NOI) who broke with the NOI on March 8, 1964, publicly announced in New York City on March 12, 1964, that he had formed the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI). The MMI, according to the article would be a broadly based politically oriented black nationalist movement for Negroes only, financed by voluntary contributions. In this public statement MALCOLM X urged Negroes to abandon the doctrine of non-violence when it is necessary to defend themselves in the civil rights struggle, and he also suggested that Negroes form rifle clubs to protect their lives and property in time of emergencies in areas where the government is unable or unwilling to protect them.

Incorporation papers of the MMI filed on March 16, 1964, with the Business Section, Clerk of Courts, New York County, New York, New York, reflect that the MMI was incorporated under the Religious Corporation Law of the State of New York to work for the imparting of the Islamic Faith and Islamic Religion in accordance with "accepted Islamic principals." The principal place of worship to be located in the Borough of Manhattan, New York, New York.

The May 23, 1964, edition of the "New York Amsterdam News," a weekly Negro newspaper published in New York City, contained an article by columnist JAMES BOOKER in which he indicated that he had heard that the visit by MALCOLM X with Muslim leaders during his African tour has changed him to become soft in his anti-white feelings and to become more religious.

On October 6, 1964, a confidential source advised that the MMI is apparently affiliated with the true orthodox Islamic Religion through its affiliation with the Islamic Foundation (of New York), 1 Riverside Drive, New York City. The only teachings of the MMI are on the Islamic Religion.

MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED

A second confidential source advised on October 20, 1964, that the headquarters of the MMI are located in Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 Seventh Avenue, New York, New York, where they were established on March 16, 1964. These headquarters are shared with the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU) which is also headed by MALCOLM X.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

APPENDIX

ORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN UNITY, INCORPORATED (OAAU)

On June 28, 1964, MALCOLM X LITTLE, founder and leader of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), publicly announced the formation of a new, all Negro, militant civil rights action group to be known as the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), with himself as Chairman. This announcement was made at a public rally held by the MMI in the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

A printed and published statement of basic OAAU aims read by MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that it shall include "all" people of African descent in the Western Hemisphere, as well as "our" brothers and sisters on the African continent. It is patterned after the "letter and spirit" of the Organization of African Unity established (by African heads of States) at Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, in May, 1963.

A recording of the remarks of MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that the aim of the OAAU is to eliminate differences between Negroes so they can work together for "human rights," while the initial objective is to "internationalize" the American civil rights movement by taking it to the United Nations. LITTLE condemned the non-violent civil rights movement and claims that Negroes should be taught to protect themselves, when and if necessary. The OAAU will sponsor a program for Negroes of education, politics, culture, economics, and social reform.

On August 19, 1964, a confidential source advised that the headquarters of the OAAU are located in MMI headquarters, Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 7th Avenue, New York City.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, New York City.

On April 13, 1965, a second confidential source advised that on March 26, 1965, the OAAU filed a Certificate of Incorporation with the Department of State, State of New York, Albany, New York, and henceforth the organization's true name will be Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated.

[redacted] stated that until 4/25/65, there were no direct flights to Europe from Philadelphia. There were European flights originating in Philadelphia, but they all stopped at New York and Boston.

[redacted] Operations Officer, Pan American Airways, advised SA [redacted] on 5/3/65, that Flight 56 went to Europe on the night of March 26. Subject was not listed among the passengers. There were no other flights to Europe over the weekend of March 26.

The files of the Passport Office, United States Department of State (USDS), reviewed by a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on May 10, 1965, contained the following information:

Passport F-558914 was issued on March 16, 1965, at New York, New York, in the name of Betty Malik Shabazz, for proposed travel of one month to Africa for the purpose of business. In her application dated March 15, 1965, at New York, New York, she stated that she intended to depart via air. No other travel plans were given on this application. This passport was valid for three years' travel to all countries except Albania, Cuba and those portions of China, Korea and Viet-Nam under communist control.

This individual stated that she was born on May 28, 1934, at Pinehurst, Georgia. She gave her permanent residence as 3450 110th Street, Carana, New York. She listed her father as Shelman Sanders, born at Pinehurst, Georgia, and her mother as Ollie Burks, born at Pinehurst, Georgia. She stated that she was last married on January 14, 1958, to Malik Shabazz, who was born on May 19, 1925, at Omaha, Nebraska. She indicated that this marriage was terminated by death on February 21, 1965. In the event of death or accident she requested that Antoinette Wallace, a friend, be notified at 3450 110th Street, Carana, New York.

LITTLE, in a heated argument with OAAU officials, turned to one of the OAAU members and told him he was "working for the wrong group, they killed my husband" and then implied that the killing "was an inside job".

[redacted] New York, advised SAS [redacted] and [redacted] on August 12, 1965, that she was a member of the OAAU until the death of MALCOLM X in February, 1965.

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[redacted] stated that following the death of MALCOLM X, his half-sister, [redacted] took over the leadership of the OAAU. [redacted] said she would not support [redacted] and the OAAU and became inactive. According to [redacted] the OAAU is not carrying out the true work of MALCOLM X, and is the OAAU in name only. [redacted] advised that within a week or two after the death of MALCOLM X, she and a few other "true followers of MALCOLM" who had been in the OAAU, broke away from that organization. They rallied around his, MALCOLM X's, widow, BETTY LITTLE, who was unable to get along with [redacted] and therefore they formed the OAAU Provisional Committee, of which she, [redacted] is the head. [redacted] advised, however, that the OAAU Provisional Committee is not now a real organization. According to [redacted] it has no headquarters or office, it has no regular meetings scheduled, and there is no individual who is currently considered the leader of this group. The OAAU Provisional Committee, states [redacted] is, in reality, just a number of individuals who were followers of the late MALCOLM X and the memory of the latter continues to linger in their hearts.

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The OAAU currently suffers from dissension in that the OAAU Provisional Committee has been set up and has issued a statement that it is governing the OAAU. This group reportedly holds meetings and claims to be the legitimate successor to MALCOLM X. The Director of this group is [redacted] who claims that MALCOLM X made her head of the OAAU on the day he was killed. This group also claims to have the majority of members who were with MALCOLM X. Among the members of this group is BETTY LITTLE and the implication is that the more militant members of the OAAU under MALCOLM X are now associated with the OAAU Provisional Committee.

BETTY LITTLE has aligned herself with the OAAU Provisional Committee because of a disagreement she had with officials of the OAAU on March 16, 1965. BETTY LITTLE on this date entered the office of the OAAU at the Hotel Theresa, New York City, and demanded all her late husband's papers and all contributions being received through the OAAU for him. OAAU officials refused to furnish BETTY LITTLE with any of MALCOLM X's papers and/or contributions stating that everything belonged to the OAAU.

BETTY LITTLE was in attendance at an OAAU Provisional Committee meeting held on May 7, 1965, at New York City.

Immediately after MALCOLM X's death, his step-sister, [redacted] took over leadership of the OAAU and there was some discussion among the members of the OAAU who did not want to support [redacted] had a disagreement with MALCOLM X's widow, BETTY LITTLE. 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broke away from [redacted] and rallied around BETTY LITTLE, calling themselves the OAAU Provisional Committee. Their plans were to oust [redacted] as the leader of the OAAU and to take control of the organization. The only activity of the OAAU Provisional Committee as of August 25, 1965, was to sponsor a memorial tribute to MALCOLM X on May 26, 1965, at Rockland Palace, 280 155th Street, New York City.

His warmth and sensitivity and his sense of humor made us feel close to him as a person. In our efforts to work for a better world his life will continue to inspire us to live up to his example of courage and honesty.

This will especially be felt by the younger generation of revolutionists in this country and abroad of whom he was so fond and who look upon him as one of them.

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V. FOREIGN TRAVEL OF
BETTY LITTLE

The New York "Amsterdam News", a New York weekly Negro newspaper, dated April 3, 1965, contained an article captioned "Malcolm's Widow in Mecca". This article in part states that "The possibility of a split in the ranks of followers of the late Malcolm X Shabazz loomed heavily this week as Malcolm's widow, Mrs. Betty Shabazz was on her way to Mecca for the annual Moslem pilgrimage during the Hajj pilgrimage season which begins April 13.

"Sources close to Mr. Shabazz, who left New York last weekend and arrived early this week in Jedda, Saudi Arabia, said she would be making her first pilgrimage to Mecca and would announce her decision on whether she would take the leadership of the Organization of Afro-American Unity upon her return to the United States in late April.

"Friends said Mrs. Shabazz had agreed to make the pilgrimage prior to her husband's death, but had debated whether to go because of the tragic death, but decided to go.

"Her trip, however, also put some question on the future leadership of the OAAU as the organization's provisional committee last week denied that it had selected any new leader, contradicting a statement made by [redacted] of Boston, who announced that she was taking over the reins of the organization.

[redacted] moved swiftly ^{MISS.} and in Supreme Court this week as she and a group of five persons were granted a certificate for a charter. The five incorporators included [redacted], also of Boston; and three New Yorkers, [redacted] photographer [redacted] N.Y.

"While Malcolm had always sought to hire Negro lawyers to handle his activities, it was noted that the papers in Supreme Court for the OAAU were handled by a

"Meanwhile Malcolm's former secretary, James ~~X~~ Shabazz, who has taken over leadership of the Muslim Mosque, INC., the religious group of Malcolm's followers, pointed out to the Amsterdam News that the two organizations are separate and distinct and that many followers of one are not necessarily followers of the other ... member

It was learned on April 18, 1965, that BETTY LITTLE made her trip to Africa through aid of the Muslim World League, and that she may have left by way of Philadelphia.

The New York "Courier", a New York City Negro newspaper, dated April 24, 1965, contained an article captioned "Who Paid For Mrs. X's Moslem Trip To Mecca?".

This article in part states:

"Many questions are being asked by followers of the assassinated Malcolm X following his widow's trip to Saudi Arabia at a time when she was described as 'penniless and destitute' at the time of the slain Black Nationalist leader's death.

"A high-ranking official of the Organization of Afro-American Unity which he founded after he defected from the Black Muslim movement last year indicated that efforts to raise money for her and the four children that Malcolm left behind were 'seriously hurt' by her trip. She flew to Mecca on a Moslem pilgrimage during the Hajj pilgrimage season, a highlight in any Moslem's life.

"Rumors have circulated that her trip may have been sponsored by several African nations which Malcolm visited within the last two years. A name that keeps cropping up among the alleged sponsors of her trip is Gamal Nasser, ruler of the United Arab Republic, and also a good friend of her late husband."

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The New York "Amsterdam News" dated March 20, 1965, page 23, contained an article captioned "Malcolm X Widow Gets \$500. Gift". This article stated that "funds to aid the family of Malcolm X soared to nearly \$6000. this week with the receipt of a \$500. check from Ghana from Mrs. Shirley DuBois, widow of the late Dr. W.E.B. DuBois, famed historian and Scholar".

Shirley Graham DuBois:

NET-13, made available on January 22, 1965 stationery of the American Institute of Marxist Studies (AIMS). Included among the "Founding sponsors" is the name of Mrs. Shirley Graham DuBois.

The Winter, 1963, issue of "Freedomways" identified Shirley Graham as the wife of W.E.B. DuBois.

Dr. W.E.B. DuBois:

Dr. W.E.B. DuBois died in Ghana, Africa, at the age of 96. He joined the Communist Party at the age of 93. His letter of application to the Communist Party -United States of America (CP-USA), and his acceptance were printed in "The Worker", an east coast Communist newspaper issue of November 26, 1961.

A characterization of AIMS and Freedomways Associates Incorporated, publishers of the magazine "Freedomways" is set forth in the in the Appendix Section of this report.

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NY T-1 advised on May 5, 1965, that BETTY LITTLE returned to the United States from her recent trip to Saudi Arabia about two days ago.

The New York "Amsterdam News" dated May 8, 1965, contained an article captioned "Mrs. X Is Back, Has No Plans".

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This article states that:

"Back from a pilgrimage to the Moslem holy city of Mecca, Mrs. Betty Shabazz, widow of slain Malcolm X, revealed this week that she will make her first public appearance at a memorial meeting celebrating her late husband's fortieth birthday, on Sunday, May 26, at Rockland Palace, at 8 p.m.

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"Her comments thus hinted a split with the Organization of Afro-American Unity of which [redacted] has assumed the leadership."

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Passports

The files of the Passport Office, United States Department of State, were reviewed by a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on May 10, 1965, and contained the following information:

Passport Number F-558914 was issued on March 16, 1965, at New York, New York in the name of BETTY MALIK SHABAZZ for proposed travel of one month to Africa for the purpose of business. In her application dated March 15, 1965, at New York, New York, LITTLE stated that she intended to depart via air. No other travel plans were given on this application. This passport was valid for three years travel to all countries except Albania, Cuba, and those parts of China, Korea and Viet Nam under Communist control.

The file further reflects that LITTLE was born on May 28, 1934 at Pinehurst, Georgia. She gave her permanent residence as 3450 110th Street, Corona, New York. She listed her father as SHELMAN SANDERS, born at Pinehurst, Georgia. She indicated that she was last married on January 14, 1958 to MALIK SHABAZZ who was born on May 19, 1925, at Omaha, Nebraska. She indicated that this marriage was terminated by death on February 21, 1965.

In the event of death or accident, LITTLE requested that [Redacted], a friend, [Redacted] Corona, New York, be notified.

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LITTLE lists her description as height 5 feet 7 inches, hair black, eyes brown, occupation housewife.

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Miscellaneous

Other confidential informants of the New York Office who are familiar with OAAU and MMI activities in the New York area were contacted in November, 1965, and all advised they could furnish no information on the activities of BETTY LITTLE.

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APPENDIX

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AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR
MARXIST STUDIES

A source advised on April 9, 1963, that on April 7, 1963, at a meeting of the District Committee of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA) of New England, held in Boston, Massachusetts, [redacted] stated he was developing an organization called American Institute for Marxist Studies (AIMS), which would eventually legalize the CP. He stated AIMS would publish literature on History, Science, Physics, Archeology and other subjects which would be put out quarterly with various supplements.

A second source advised in December, 1959, that [redacted] was elected to the National Committee, CP, USA, at the 17th National Convention of the CP, USA, held in December, 1959.

A third source advised on June 7, 1963, that on June 3, 1963, [redacted] spoke at the CP, USA, New York District Board meeting concerning AIMS. [redacted] stated that AIMS would unite and strengthen the CP although the CP would not be connected with it. He stated AIMS was being formed to operate within the scope of the MC CARRAN and SMITH Acts and would legally bring Marxist material and opinions to the attention of American scholars and the general public.

A fourth source advised on May 7, 1965, that as of that date, AIMS was located on the fifth floor west at 20 East 30th Street, New York City, New York.

FREEDOMWAYS ASSOCIATES, INC.

The records of the New York Secretary of State, Albany, New York, show that the certificate of incorporation of Freedomways Associates, Inc., was filed on March 2, 1961.

The Winter, 1965, issue of "Freedomways" is self-described as "A Quarterly Review of the Negro Freedom Movement" published by Freedomways Associates, Inc., 799 Broadway, New York City. This issue lists [redacted] as Associate Editor, [redacted] as Managing Editor, and [redacted] as Art Editor of the publication.

A confidential source made available information on July 1, 1964, reflecting that [redacted] attended the first and founding meeting of the American Institute for Marxist Studies (AIMS) which was held on December 19, 1963, and continued on January 10, 1964.

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This source also made available information on August 14, 1964, reflecting that [redacted] is an "associate" of AIMS.

The Winter, 1963, issue of "Freedomways," page 44, states that [redacted] became one of the leaders of the Southern Negro Youth Congress (SNYC) which existed from 1937 to 1949.

The SNYC has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

According to a confidential source, [redacted] is the wife of [redacted] whom the source identified on October 14, 1964, as being a member of the National Committee of the Communist Party, United States of America (CP, USA.)

On January 30, 1961, [redacted] 415 South 50th Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, advised that her former husband, [redacted] mentioned on December 17, 1960, that he was still in the CP and that the CP is his whole life.

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APPENDIX

FREEDOMWAYS ASSOCIATES, INC.

On July 24, 1963, a confidential source described [redacted] as a CP member.

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On May 24, 1961, a source advised that a report was given on "Freedomways" at a meeting of the National Board, CP, USA, held on May 24, 1961. It was stated that the original plan called for the publication to be openly Marxist, but that it was later decided it would not be avowedly a Marxist publication. Editorials are in the hands of a mixed group of Marxists and non-Marxists. It was stated that the central purpose of "Freedomways" is to develop a theory and positive criticism of currents in the Negro Movement, as well as to raise the level of understanding and discussion taking place in Negro life today and to project a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation.

On May 25, 1961, a source advised that "Freedomways" was set up for the CP, USA, by [redacted]

MILITANT LABOR FORUM
NEW YORK, NEW YORK

A source advised on April 16, 1965, that public forums are regularly sponsored by the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), New York Local, usually on Friday evenings and are held at SWP headquarters, 116 University Place, New York, New York. These are called Militant Labor Forums.

MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED (MMI)

The March 13, 1964 edition of "The New York Times," a daily newspaper published in New York, New York, contained an article on page 20 which indicated that MALCOLM X (LITTLE), former national official of the Nation of Islam (NOI) who broke with the NOI on March 8, 1964, publicly announced in New York City on March 12, 1964, that he had formed the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI). The MMI, according to the article, would be a broadly based politically oriented black nationalist movement for Negroes only, financed by voluntary contributions. In this public statement, MALCOLM X urged Negroes to abandon the doctrine of non-violence when it is necessary to defend themselves in the civil rights struggle, and he also suggested that Negroes form rifle clubs to protect their lives and property in time of emergencies in areas where the government is unable or unwilling to protect them.

Incorporation papers of the MMI filed on March 16, 1964, with the Business Section, Clerk of Courts, New York County, New York, New York, reflect that the MMI was incorporated under the Religious Corporation Law of the State of New York to work for the imparting of the Islamic Faith and Islamic Religion in accordance with "accepted Islamic principals." The principal place of worship to be located in the Borough of Manhattan, New York, New York.

The May 23, 1964 edition of the "New York Amsterdam News," a weekly Negro newspaper published in New York City, contained an article by columnist JAMES BOOKER in which he indicated that he had heard that the visit by MALCOLM X with Muslim leaders during his African tour has changed him to become more religious.

On October 6, 1964, a confidential source advised that the MMI is apparently affiliated with the true orthodox Islamic Religion through its affiliation with the Islamic Foundation (of New York), 1 Riverside Drive, New York City. The only teachings of the MMI are on the Islamic Religion.

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APPENDIX

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2.

MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED (MMI)

This confidential source advised on May 17, 1965, that the headquarters of the MMI are located in Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 Seventh Avenue, New York, New York, where they were established on March 16, 1964. These headquarters are shared with the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU) which was also headed by MALCOLM X.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965 while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

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APPENDIX~~SECRET~~NATION OF ISLAM

In January, 1957, a source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the 'Nation of Islam' and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On May 7, 1965, a second source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam Number 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960 Muhammad and other NOI officials, when referring to Muhammad's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of 'Muhammad's Temples of Islam.'

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as 'white devils,' in the United States; and the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised MUHAMMAD had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

On May 3, 1965, a third source advised MUHAMMAD had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI.

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APPENDIX

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1.

NATION OF ISLAM, MOSQUE #7

On May 3, 1965, a source advised that the Nation of Islam (NOI) affiliate in New York City is known as Mosque number 7, and is also referred to as Temple number 7. It is part of the national organization of the NOI headed by Elijah Muhammad with headquarters in Chicago, Illinois.

There are three branches of Mosque number 7; One at 105-03 Northern Boulevard, Queens (known as Mosque number 7B), another at 120 Madison Street, Brooklyn (known as Mosque number 7C), and one at 878 Prospect Avenue, Bronx (known as Mosque number 7D).

There is no branch in Manhattan, although plans are being made to obtain a located which will be the principal meeting place of the Mosque and will be known as Mosque number 7.

The date Mosque number 7 originated in New York City is unknown but in this connection it should be noted that in 1953, a second source advised that there was a Temple of the NOI (known to source then as the Muslim Cult of Islam) in New York City located at 135th Street and 7th Avenue, as far back as 1947.

APPENDIX~~SECRET~~ORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN
UNITY, INCORPORATED (OAAU)

On June 28, 1964, MALCOLM X LITTLE, founder and leader of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), publicly announced the formation of a new, all Negro, militant civil rights action group to be known as the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), with himself as Chairman. This announcement was made at a public rally held by the MMI in the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

A printed and published statement of basic OAAU aims read by MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that it shall include "all" people of African descent in the Western Hemisphere, as well as "our" brothers and sisters on the African continent. It is patterned after the "letter and spirit" of the Organization of African Unity established (by African heads of States) at Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, in May, 1963.

A recording of the remarks of MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that the aim of the OAAU is to eliminate differences between Negroes so they can work together for "human rights," while the initial objective is to "internationalize" the American civil rights movement by taking it to the United Nations. LITTLE condemned the non-violent civil rights movement and claims that Negroes should be taught to protect themselves, when and if necessary. The OAAU will sponsor a program for Negroes of education, politics, culture, economics, and social reform.

On May 17, 1965, a confidential source advised that the headquarters of the OAAU are located in MMI headquarters, Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 7th Avenue, New York City.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, New York City.

APPENDIX~~SECRET~~YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960, issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page one, column 3, disclosed that during April 15 through 17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page six, set forth the Founding Declaration of YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have some into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

A source advised on May 7, 1965, that the original YSA was an organization formed during October, 1957, in New York City by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The leaders of this group were the guiding forces in the establishment of the national organization.

The source further advised on May 7, 1965, that the YSA is dominated and controlled on a national basis by the SWP through having SWP members comprise exclusively the National Executive Committee (NEC) and through an official SWP representative at all YSA NEC meetings. The YSA, in reality, is the youth and training section of the SWP and the main source of new SWP members.

NATION OF ISLAM

In January, 1957, a source advised that ELIJAH MUHAMMAD has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On April 29, 1966, a second source advised that, ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960, MUHAMMAD and other NOI officials, when referring to MUHAMMAD's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by ALLAH, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised that MUHAMMAD had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government;

however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

On May 2, 1966, a third source advised that MUHAMMAD had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to MUHAMMAD, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.

ORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN
UNITY, INCORPORATED (OAAU)

On June 28, 1964, MALCOLM X LITTLE, founder and leader of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), publicly announced the formation of a new, all Negro, militant civil rights action group to be known as the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), with himself as Chairman. This announcement was made at a public rally held at the MMI in the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

A printed and published statement of basic OAAU aims read by MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that it shall include "all" people of African descent in the Western Hemisphere, as well as "our" brothers and sisters on the African continent. It is patterned after the "letter and spirit" of the Organization of African Unity established (by African heads of States) at Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, in May, 1963.

A recording of the remarks of MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that the aim of the OAAU is to eliminate differences between Negroes so they can work together for "human rights," while the initial objective is to "internationalize" the American civil rights movement by taking it to the United Nations. LITTLE condemned the non-violent civil rights movement and claims that Negroes should be taught to protect themselves, when and if necessary. The OAAU will sponsor a program for Negroes of Education, politics, culture, economics, and social reform.

In May, 1958, she engaged in hostile activity against a postal inspector and two New York City Police Department detectives for which she was arrested and indicted for felonious assault. She was subsequently acquitted of all charges. There is no indication subject would be cooperative, and when weighed with her background and felonious assault record and potential embarrassment, a contact is not warranted. Will reconsider when next annual report is received.

Jamaica Rifle and

On November 10, 1966, NY T-1 advised that the JRPC is a subsidiary of the Revolutionary Action Movement (RAM).

A characterization of RAM is attached hereto.

On August 11, 1967, NY T-2 advised that on August 6, 1967, the subject was one of the speakers at a rally that was held at St. Albans Ballroom, 190-01 Linden Boulevard, St. Albans, Queens, New York.

The purpose of this rally was to raise money for the defense of 17 members of the JRPC who were arrested during June, 1967, in the New York City area for planning to assassinate Negro leaders in the civil rights movements.

On February 17, 1967, NY T-3 advised that on February 16, 1967, during the evening hours, the subject attended a rifle training session at the Nassau County Indoor Rifle Range, Hempstead Turnpike, East Meadows, Long Island, New York. This training session was sponsored by the JRPC.

Socialist Workers Party (SWP)

On October 28, 1966, NY T-4 advised that the subject received a check on October 10, 1966, from Merit Publishers, an organ of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), in the amount of \$20.62.

A characterization of the SWP is attached hereto.

"New Breed"

On March 3, 1967, NY T-5 advised that an organization known as "New Breed" involving the subject, is operating in Chicago, Illinois.

According to NY T-5, this group consists of members of the Republican Party working for [redacted] Cook County Board President.

The purpose is to improve the image of the Republican Party among Negroes in Chicago.

MALCOLM X
Grassroots Memorial

On February 28, 1967, NY T-6 advised that during the period February 21, to February 24, 1967, services known as the MALCOLM X Grassroots Memorial Services were held at the Bayview Community Center, 4701 3rd Street, San Francisco, California.

A characterization of MALCOLM X may be found in a characterization of the Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated (OAAU) in the appendix attached hereto under the name MALCOLM X LITTLE.

According to NY T-6 and NY T-7, the subject spoke at this affair on February 21, and 24, 1967. According to NY T-6, on February 24, the subject told the audience the world was going to a pinnacle and that there would be changes. She urged the audience not to relax in their thinking, and to help one another.

On February 23, 1967, NY T-7 advised that on February 21, 1967, a collection was taken up for the subject and afterwards in her speech she stated that the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) was behind her husband's death. She further stated "we have

enough guns and knives to do some harm so that the white man will recognize that the Negroes mean business."

The newspaper edition of the San Francisco Examiner of February 22, 1967, Page 3, reflects that on February 21, 1967, the subject arrived at the South Terminal of the San Francisco Airport, San Francisco, California, where she was met by 20 armed Negroes who carried pistols, rifles, and shot guns. According to the article, these guards were present to protect the subject whose purpose was to attend services for her husband MALCOLM X, who is deceased.

Miscellaneous

On February 21, 1967, NY T-3 advised that the subject appeared at a memorial service for MALCOLM X at the Faith Temple in Harlem, New York City on February 19, 1967, during the afternoon hours.

IV. MISCELLANEOUS

Other confidential sources who are familiar with racial matters in the New York City area, were contacted during November and December, 1967, concerning the subject. These sources could furnish no information concerning the subject.

APPENDIX

1.

REVOLUTIONARY ACTION MOVEMENT

On November 3, 1964, a source made available a document entitled, "The Revolutionary Action Movement Manifesto", the document having been obtained by the source from an individual known to be a member of the Revolutionary Action Movement (RAM).

This document stated, in part, that RAM was officially organized in the Winter of 1963 by Afro-Americans who support the revolutionary objectives of [redacted] then residing in Cuba, and his concept of organized violence to achieve the liberation of the Afro-American people in the United States. This Manifesto disclosed that RAM had oriented its program to one of education and political revolution and the organization of a "black" political party with revolutionary objectives, having recognized the need for a "black revolution" that could and would seize power. RAM philosophy is described in this document as one of revolutionary nationalism, that is, one involving the struggles of the non-white races of the world against exploitation and enslavement by the white capitalist and imperialist nations.

Regarding [redacted] it should be noted that on August 28, 1961, a Federal warrant was issued at Charlotte, North Carolina, charging him with Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution for the crime of kidnaping. Subsequent to the issuance of this warrant, [redacted] fled the United States to Cuba, where he published a monthly newsletter entitled "The Crusader" from Havana. As of December, 1966, [redacted] was residing in Peking, China.

This source, in September, 1964, advised RAM is dedicated to the overthrow of the capitalist system in the United States, by violence, if necessary, and to its replacement by a socialistic system oriented toward the Chinese Communist interpretation of Marxism-Leninism. RAM is entirely non-white in membership, clandestine in nature, and owes its primary allegiance to the "Bandung World", that is, the non-white races of the world rather than to any national entity, as such.

2.

REVOLUTIONARY ACTION MOVEMENT (CONTINUED)

On November 16, 1964, a second source advised he learned recently from a RAM member that the organization began in Detroit, Michigan, largely under the impetus of [redacted] described as the "Father" of RAM and referred to as [redacted] served as RAM Chairman, with [redacted] (now of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania) serving as RAM Field Chairman.

On May 12, 1967, a third source advised that the RAM still remains active; however, there is no formal headquarters as such, for the RAM. The source advised that [redacted] of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, is considered the leader of RAM and if a RAM headquarters ever existed, it will most likely be where [redacted] resides.

SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY
- NEW YORK LOCAL

A source advised on August 25, 1960, that the Socialist Party (SWP) - New York Local (NYL) was founded in 1938, in New York City.

A second source stated on May 17, 1967, that the SWP-NYL was affiliated with and followed the aims of the National SWP.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

1.

ORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN UNITY, INCORPORATED (OAAU)

On June 28, 1964, MALCOLM X LITTLE, founder and leader of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated, (MMI), publicly announced the formation of a new, all Negro, militant civil rights action group to be known as the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), with himself as Chairman. This announcement was made at a public rally held by the MMI in the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

A printed and published statement of basic OAAU aims read by MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that it shall include "all" people of African descent in the Western Hemisphere, as well as "our" brothers and sisters on the African continent. It is patterned after the "letter and spirit" of the Organization of African Unity established (by African heads of States) at Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, in May, 1963.

A recording of the remarks of MALCOLM X at this meeting indicates that the aim of the OAAU is to eliminate differences between Negroes so they can work together for "human rights", while the initial objective is to "internationalize" the American civil rights movement by taking it to the United Nations. LITTLE condemned the non-violent civil rights movement and claims that Negroes should be taught to protect themselves, when and if necessary. The OAAU will sponsor a program for Negroes in education, politics, culture, economics, and social reform.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, New York City.

On April 13, 1965, a confidential source advised that on March 26, 1965, the OAAU filed a Certificate of Incorporation with the Department of State, State of New York, Albany, New York, and henceforth, the organization's true name will be Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated.

Malcolm X Widow Speaks

Negro Women Urged to Push Rights Fight

The widow of slain black nationalist Malcolm X said in Detroit that Negro women must strive to build stronger family units and become more involved in the struggle for Negro rights.

Mrs. Betty Shabazz appeared here yesterday as part of "Woman's Day" in Central United Church of Christ, 7625 Linwood, during its 19th anniversary. The church is the spiritual headquarters for the city's black nationalists.

"Black women can not afford not to become involved in the struggle," Mrs. Shabazz declared. "They must build strong families so their sons will not have to suffer the same pains as their fathers."

SHE IMplored black women "not to become the slaves of welfare."

"Remember," she said, "when whites give you welfare and poverty money, they can cut it off anytime. It's only temporary. Don't become a slave to this welfare system."

Nearly 1,000 persons, including about 15 whites, jammed the church, located in the midst of the riot-torn west side, to hear Mrs. Shabazz.

In a 45-minute speech she told the gathering to "teach your children to keep their hearts, minds and souls on the goals they hope to achieve."

She made a passing reference to the Israeli-Arab war declaring, "Some people can get their rights in six days, we should not have to wait 500 years."

"Black people are not violent," Mrs. Shabazz declared, "because they resist oppression — this is self-defense."

A native Detroit, Mrs. Shabazz graduated from Northwood High School before she married Malcolm X in New York.

"I do not minimize the help whites have given us during our struggle," Mrs. Shabazz said, "but we must learn to help ourselves and each other."

"Whites can best help us now by working among whites trying to make them understand our cause. Many white people who socialize with us now know it is much easier to join us than to convince other whites of the justice of our cause."

THE NEGRO family unit was broken up during slavery, Mrs. Shabazz said, "and we must now put it back together."

"We don't mind intergrating," she said, "but we do not want to assimilate. Our culture is in Africa just as much as the white man's is in Europe."

"Black mothers must teach

their children of their own past, make them understand that it is just as glorious as any other culture."

On May 17, 1968, NY T-1 advised that Betty Shabazz is scheduled to travel to Los Angeles, California, on May 17, 1968, for the purpose of attending the Malcolm X Holiday, which is sponsored by the Republic of New Africa (RNA). USA

On May 23, 1968, NY T-2 advised that Betty Shabazz is a name used by Betty Little, widow of Malcolm X Little, founder and chairman of the Organization of Afro American Unity (OAAU), who was assassinated in New York City, in February, 1965.

A characterization of Malcolm X Little may be found in the characterization of the OAAU, attached hereto.

On April 3, 1968, NY T-1 advised that Betty Shabazz is Second Vice-President of the RNA.

On April 17, 1968, NY T-1 advised that a conference was held on March 30 to 31, 1968, sponsored by the Malcolm X Society, at the Shrine of the Black Madonna, 7625 Linwood Avenue, Detroit, Michigan. This source advised that the RNA is planning to make efforts for international recognition with assistance from Red China. This source advised that [redacted] was to be the President of the RNA.

MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED (MMI)

The March 13, 1964, edition of "The New York Times", a daily newspaper published in New York, New York, contained an article on page 20 which indicated that MALCOLM X (LITTLE), former national official of the Nation of Islam (NOI), who broke with the NOI on March 8, 1964, publicly announced in New York City on March 12, 1964, that he had formed the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI). The MMI, according to the article, would be a broadly based politically oriented black nationalist movement for Negroes, only, financed by voluntary contributions. In this public statement, MALCOLM X urged Negroes to abandon the doctrine of non-violence when it is necessary to defend themselves in the civil rights struggle, and he also suggested that Negroes form rifle clubs to protect their lives and property in time of emergencies in areas where the government is unable or unwilling to protect them.

Incorporation papers of the MMI filed on March 16, 1964, with the Business Section, Clerk of Courts, New York County, New York, New York, reflect that the MMI was incorporated under the Religious Corporation Law of the State of New York to work for the imparting of the Islamic Faith and Islamic Religion in accordance with "accepted Islamic principles". The principal place of worship to be located in the Borough of Manhattan, New York, New York.

The May 23, 1964, edition of the "New York Amsterdam News", a weekly Negro newspaper published in New York City, contained an article by columnist [redacted] in which he indicated that he had heard that the visit by MALCOLM X with Muslim leaders during his African tour has changed him to become soft in his anti-white feelings and to become more religious.

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On October 6, 1964, a confidential source advised that the MMI is apparently affiliated with the true orthodox Islamic Religion through its affiliation with the Islamic Foundation (of New York), 1 Riverside Drive, New York City. The only teachings of the MMI are on the Islamic Religion.

MUSLIM MOSQUE, INCORPORATED (MMI)

This confidential source advised on May 17, 1965, that the headquarters of the MMI are located in Suite 128, Hotel Theresa, 2090 Seventh Avenue, New York, New York, where they were established on March 16, 1964. These headquarters are shared with the Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated (OAAU) which was also headed by MALCOLM X.

MALCOLM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

This same confidential source advised on September 8, 1965, that the activities of the MMI following the death of MALCOLM X were limited to the teaching of classes in the Islamic religion and a class in judo for self-protection. These classes were held regularly until the latter part of July, 1965, when they were discontinued. Since then, the MMI has held no meetings and there has been absolutely no activity by the MMI which appears to be completely "dead".

NATION OF ISLAM, FORMERLY REFERRED
TO AS THE MUSLIM CULT OF ISLAM, ALSO
KNOWN AS MUHAMMAD'S TEMPLES OF ISLAM

In January, 1967, a source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

On May 5, 1967, a second source advised ELIJAH MUHAMMAD is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960 MUHAMMAD and other NOI officials, when referring to MUHAMMAD's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. MUHAMMAD claims to have been selected by ALLAH, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following MUHAMMAD's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils", in the United States; and the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including MUHAMMAD, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised MUHAMMAD had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

NATION OF ISLAM (CONTINUED)

On May 2, 1966, a third source advised MUHAMMAD had, in early July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to MUHAMMAD, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.

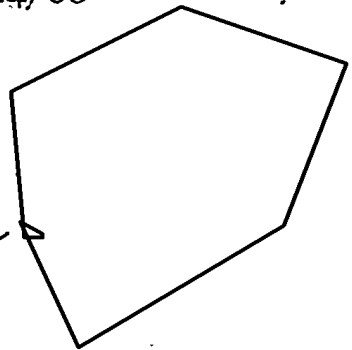

II. AFFILIATION WITH SUBVERSIVE ORGANIZATIONS

BETTY SHABAZZ is a name used by BETTY LITTLE, widow of MALCOLM X LITTLE, Founder and Chairman of the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), who was assassinated in New York City (NYC) in February, 1965.

A characterization of MALCOLM X LITTLE may be found in the characterization of the OAAU attached hereto.

The purpose of this conference was to form a national black government to be known as the Republic of New Africa (RNA). Approximately 50 delegates and 100 observers participated in this conference. The delegates represented a majority of northern cities and several southern cities. It was decided that this new government would be revolutionary in nature. It was indicated that the RNA is planning to make efforts for international recognition with assistance from Communist China. [redacted] was designated as President of the RNA.

REPUBLIC OF NEW AFRICA (RNA)

Source advised on May 1, 1968, that the Black Government Conference sponsored by the Malcolm X Society met March 30-31, 1968, at Detroit, Michigan, to establish a provisional government. At this conference, the Republic of New Africa (RNA) was formed for the purpose of organizing an independent Negro nation which was to be made up of several states of the United States. According to source, ROBERT F. WILLIAMS, currently in China, was elected President of the RNA; MILTON ROBINSON HENRY was elected First Vice President of the RNA.

Regarding WILLIAMS, it should be noted that on August 28, 1961, a Federal warrant was issued at Charlotte, North Carolina, charging him with Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution for the crime of Kidnaping. Subsequent to the issuance of this warrant, WILLIAMS fled the United States to Cuba where he published a monthly newsletter entitled "The Crusader" from Havana, Cuba. As of December, 1966, WILLIAMS was residing in Peking, China.

Source advised during May, 1968, that MILTON ROBINSON HENRY is an attorney of law from Pontiac, Michigan, area and is regarded as one of the leaders of the Black Nationalist Movement in the Detroit, Michigan, area.

"The New York Times, 2/9/66, page 26, contained information to the effect that as a result of [redacted] remarks at a meeting of the Mt. Vernon School Board he was requested to resign from CORE. JAMES FARMER, Director of CORE, called the resignation "a fine idea".

On July 9, 1969, NY T-1 advised that on June 8, 1969, Betty Shabazz gave a speech in Paris, France. She then was expected to travel to London, England.

On August 1, 1969, NY T-2 advised that on June 29, 1969, Betty Shabazz gave the dedication speech at the opening of the Malcolm X Community Mental Health Center, Chicago, Illinois.

On August 14, 1969, NY T-3 advised Betty Shabazz is the name used by Betty Little, widow of Malcolm X Little, founder and Chairman of the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU), who was assassinated in New York City in February, 1965.

A description of Malcolm X Little is found in the characterization of the OAAU attached to this memorandum.

On August 8, 1969, a representative of the Security Section of the United States Department of State in New York City, advised they could locate no current information concerning the recent overseas travel of one Betty Little or Betty Shabazz.

On August 22, 1969, NY T-3 advised that Betty Shabazz participated as a judge at the "Miss Black America Pageant" held at Madison Square Garden, New York City on that date.

NY T-3 further advised that Betty Shabazz did not participate at the National Legislative Council Meeting of the Republic of New Africa (RNA) held August 21-24, 1969, at Washington, D. C. According to NY T-3, Betty Shabazz was at one time an executive of the RNA.

ORGANIZATION OF AFRO-AMERICAN
UNITY, INCORPORATED

On June 28, 1964, MALCOM X LITTLE, founder and leader of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated (MMI), publicly announced the formation of a new, all Negro, militant civil rights action group to be known as the Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU) with himself as Chairman. This announcement was made at a public rally held by the MMI in the Audubon Ballroom, Broadway and 166th Street, New York City.

A printed and published statement of basic OAAU aims read by MALCOM X at this meeting indicates that it shall include "all" people of African descent in the Western Hemisphere, as well as "our" brothers and sisters on the African continent. It is patterned after the "letter and spirit" of the Organization of African Unity established (by African heads of States) at Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, in May, 1963.

A recording of the remarks of MALCOM X at this meeting indicates that the aim of the OAAU is to eliminate differences between Negroes so they can work together for "human rights", while the initial objective is to "internationalize" the American Civil Rights movement by taking it to the United Nations. LITTLE condemned the non-violent civil rights movement and claims that Negroes should be taught to protect themselves, when and if necessary. The OAAU will sponsor a program for Negroes in education, politics, culture, economics, and social reform.

MALCOM X was assassinated on February 21, 1965, while addressing an OAAU rally at the Audubon Ballroom, New York City.

On April 13, 1965, a confidential source advised that on March 26, 1965, the OAAU filed a Certificate of Incorporation with the Department of State, State of New York, Albany, New York, and henceforth, the organization's true name will be Organization of Afro-American Unity, Incorporated.

Malcolm X's Widow Calls For End to Racial Dominance

Betty Shabazz, mother of six, world traveler, registered nurse and widow of Malcolm X, looked around at the 350 persons in the D'Youville College Center dining room Thursday evening and asked:

"What god ever decreed that the white man could rule the black man?"

She said that Africa is the birthplace of man and civilization, but that whites ignore black culture. She praised black studies courses, but predicted that "many are doomed before they start."

Mrs. Shabazz cited Negro disinterest in black studies as an example of white rule. "Some blacks consider African studies to be a direct threat because they have lived so long in a dominant white culture."

Warns of Impending Violence

Saying that most of the nation's poor housing, poor schools, and poor jobs are for the black man, she warned: "This must be changed now, not 20 years from now. Or there will be no 20 years from now!"

"This is not a threat," she said. "The forces of violence are already in motion."

Mrs. Shabazz, whose husband was slain by a fellow Black Muslim in 1965, explained that she believes whites will face problems now faced by Negroes unless they help to solve them.

For example, she said, "No one was concerned when black mothers cried and moaned about the drug problem. Now it is completely out of hand, spilling over into the white communities."

Continuing her attack on drug abuse she cautioned: "Young people must realize that a freer society does not mean a society dealing in vice."

Criticizes School Methods

She urged students to "read,

listen, watch TV, go outside of your neighborhoods and learn," because schools don't equip students to adjust to change.

Mrs. Shabazz spoke in slow, measured phrases, never raising her voice.

"The public schools need re-evaluation and curriculum change," she said. "Adults and educators have a responsibility to reduce conflict and confusion. But some create it."

Occasional murmurs of "right on, right on" filtered through the racially mixed audience as Mrs. Shabazz spoke.

Her appearance was part of D'Youville's "Black American Week," sponsored by the Student Government Association.

II. BLACK NATIONALIST ACTIVITIES

From September 3 - 7, 1970, the ^{Attended} Congress of African Peoples (CAP) held a general conference in the Student Union of Morris Brown College, Atlanta, Georgia. BETTY SHABAZZ, formerly of the Republic of New Africa (RNA), New York, New York was in attendance. Subject did not seem to be representing any specific group at the CAP. She was formerly associated with RNA, but quit that organization.

III. MISCELLANEOUS

Additional confidential informants of the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation were contacted during September and October, 1970, but were unable to furnish any additional information regarding subject.

APPENDIX

1.

REPUBLIC OF NEW AFRICA

A source advised on May 27, 1969, that the Republic of New Africa (RNA) is an all-Negro organization founded in Detroit, Michigan, at a Black Government Conference held on March 30-31, 1968.

At this conference [redacted] was elected President of the RNA. Regarding [redacted] it should be noted that on August 28, 1961, a Federal warrant was issued at Charlotte, North Carolina, charging him with Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution for the crime of Kidnaping. Subsequent to the issuance of this warrant, [redacted] fled the United States.

This source advised that the purpose of the RNA, which is to be revolutionary in nature, is to make efforts for international recognition with assistance from other black nations of the world. The RNA proposes to make attempts to obtain land in one of the southern states, establish a government in exile, petition for a seat in the United Nations, and demand reparations from the United States Government for ancestral slave labor.

A second source advised that the purpose of the RNA is to establish an independent black nation within the United States; demand that the United States give them five southern states--Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and South Carolina; and demand reparations from the United States for ancestral slave labor. These reparations are to be \$10,000 for every black person in the United States.

At the session of the RNA Second National Convention held in Detroit, Michigan, on March 29, 1969, members of the Black Legion, acting as bodyguards for [redacted], First Vice President of the RNA, opened fire on two Detroit policemen, killing one and critically wounding the other.

REPUBLIC OF NEW AFRICA (cont'd)

A third source advised on March 14, 1969, that the Black Legion is a group within the RNA composed of male and female members dedicated to black freedom and committed to the concept of systematic armed revolution. It is organized along military lines and its members are bound together with the oath of allegiance to the RNA. Members are expected to participate in military drill and engage in firearms training. Its purpose is to bring about the fruition of black power and the establishment of a black nation within the United States.

The Black Legion's mission is: (a) to defend the citizens of the RNA; (b) to defend the territory and property of the RNA; (c) to support the national objectives of the RNA.

A training program has been authorized which provides training in three categories of skills: (a) fighting skills; (b) operating skills; (c) supporting skills.

Because of the police action taken against black nationalist organizations, the RNA is making plans to have an underground Black Legion and an open Black Legion in order to avoid detection by the police.

Succinct Resume of Case

Subject married the late civil rights leader MALCOLM X on 1/14/58. Subject was indicted on 6/2/58 for felonious assault in 2nd degree on a police officer, conspiracy, attempting to prevent police officer from performing duties, resisting officer of law, and resisting public officer in discharge of his duties. On 3/18/59, she was acquitted on all these charges.

She was active in Nation of Islam (NOI) and Muslim Girls Training (MGT) from 1958, to March, 1964, when she was expelled because she attended meetings of Muslim Mosque, Inc. (MMI) founded by her husband. In 1959, she was guest of ELIJAH MUHAMMAD, national leader of NOI. In 1964, she attended meetings of Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU).

Subject was approved for Security Index in December, 1964.

On 2/21/65, MALCOLM X was assassinated in NYC. During 1965 she was active in OAAU Provisional Committee. She expressed discontent with NOI on 5/20/66; and became inactive in OAAU in 1966. During February, 1967, she attended rifle training session at Jamaica Rifle and Pistol Club, a subsidiary of Revolutionary Action Movement (RAM). During 1968, she indicated she was second Vice-President of RAM, but she resigned in March, 1969, and is no longer an officer or member in that organization.

In 1970, she attended the Congress of African Peoples (CAP), but did not seem to represent any specific group.

In addition to the above, since 1965 subject has attended various memorial services for her late husband.

Recommendation

The above indicates that since March, 1969, subject has not been affiliated with any known subversive organizations and her appearances in Black Nationalist activities is declining.

NY 105-29845

For her only arrest in 1958, she was acquitted. She had been unemployed during her period of greatest activities, but recent investigation shows that she now works for the Mt. Vernon School System. In view of subject's declined in subversive activities and the fact that she has never participated in violent actions since 1958, it is recommended that subject be deleted from the SI of the NYO.

Summary

Captioned individual, who you advised was born May 28, 1936, at Detroit, Michigan, and currently resides at 234 East Fifth Street, Mount Vernon, New York, was the subject of a security-type investigation conducted by the FBI beginning in 1958.

The captioned individual, reportedly was born as Betty D. Sanders, also has used the following names: Mrs. Malcolm K. Little, Mrs. Malcolm Shabazz, Betty X, Betty Malik Shabazz, and Mrs. Malcolm X. Education and marriage license application records indicate captioned individual claimed to have been born May 28, 1934, at Pinehurst, Georgia. School records indicate her father to be Shelman and Ollie Burks with the mother divorced while marriage license data given by her is that her father was Shelman Sandlin and mother was Helen Lowe. The marriage license data indicates a ceremony was performed at Lansing Township, Michigan, on January 14, 1958, between Malcolm X. Little, a minister, and Betty D. Sanders. Her birth data could not be verified by Georgia or Michigan birth records.

The FBI investigation was predicated on information from the New York City Police Department (NYCPD) in June, 1958, that Betty Little was one of four females and one male arrested on June 3, 1958, for felonious assault on a police officer and conspiracy in connection with a U.S. postal matter. On May 14, 1958, a postal inspector and two NYCPD detectives arrived at 25-46 99th Street, East Elmhurst, Long Island, New York, to serve a warrant for mail fraud on another woman reportedly living at the address. The officers were not admitted to the premises. One officer was kicked in the groin and the other officer was hit by thrown milk bottles. On March 18, 1959, a jury acquitted Little of the police charges.

Shabazz was reported to have attended the Nation of Islam (NOI) Annual Conventions in 1958 and 1960 at Chicago, Illinois. In 1959 Shabazz was the house guest of Elijah Muhammad, National NOI leader, on numerous occasions. From 1968 through 1963, she attended numerous NOI and Muslim Girl Training (MGT) meetings or affairs in Chicago, Illinois; Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; Hartford, Connecticut; Dorchester, Massachusetts; Detroit, Michigan; and Atlantic City, New Jersey. MGT is the female NOI group afforded military-type drilling and feminine topics.

Betty Shabazz

The NOI is an all-Negro organization under Elijah Muhammad at Chicago, Illinois, who is to lead the race out of slavery by establishing an independent black nation in the U.S. Claiming there is no such thing as a Negro but slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," NOI officials and members have refused to register under the Selective Service Act and have declared members owe no allegiance to the U.S.

A U.S. passport was issued March 16, 1965, at New York City in the name of Betty Malik Shabazz for the purpose of her travel to Africa. She listed as being last married to Malik Shabazz (Malcom X). She went to Jedda, Saudi Arabia, for the 1965 Haj pilgrimage to Mecca as a guest of the World Islamic League (WIL). Other than having her trip paid for, she received no funds from the Saudi government or the WIL.

The files of the Records Division of Land Records, County Clerks Office, White Plains, New York, indicated that Maurice and Bella Abzug had conveyed their residence at 234 East Fifth Street, Mount Vernon, New York, to Betty Shabazz on September 15, 1965.

From October, 1964, to February, 1965, she attended six Organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU) meetings or affairs in New York City. OAAU was founded by Malcolm X in 1964 as an all-Negro militant civil rights group. Malcolm X was shot to death by Negro members at an OAAU rally on February 21, 1965, at New York City.

In March, 1965, she was threatened with contempt of court action when she refused to answer questions before the Grand Jury investigating her husband's death.

Also in March, 1965, Betty Shabazz became a member of the OAAU Provisional Committee after arguments with OAAU officials and her dispute over control of the organization.

On [redacted] twin girls were born to the captioned individual. Her other children at the time were [redacted]

Betty Little was known to receive financial donations from the Socialist Workers Party and the Militant Labor Forum after the death of Malcolm X.

Betty Shabazz

She expressed discontent with the NOI on May 20, 1966, because Malcolm X was assassinated by Afro-Americans. She became inactive in OAAU after disagreements with Ella Collins who assumed leadership of OAAU.

In a memorial service speech at San Francisco, California, on February 21, 1967, Shabazz stated the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) was behind her husband's death. She said, "We have enough guns and knives to do some harm so that the white man will recognize that the Negroes mean business."

On August 11, 1967, she was one of the speakers at a rally in Queens, New York, to raise defense money for 17 members of the Jamaica Rifle and Pistol Club (JRPC). The JRPC members were arrested in June, 1967, in New York City for planning to assassinate Negro leaders in the civil rights movement. The JRPC is a subsidiary of the Revolutionary Action Movement, a black militant group dedicated to the overthrow of the capitalist system in the U.S. and replace it with the socialism of the Chinese communist.

In 1968, Shabazz expressed an interest in traveling to Peking, China, but is not known to have made such a trip.

She was named a Second Vice President of the Republic of New Africa (RNA). The RNA is a group of militant blacks calling for guerrilla warfare against the U.S. and demanding several southern states for its own Negro nation.

In September, 1968, she attended the Third National Conference on Black Power at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

In 1968, confidential sources, who have furnished reliable information in the past, knew Shabazz was considering marrying [redacted] who had been fired from CORE (Congress of Racial Equality) for his anti-Semitic remarks and hatred of all white people. The sources discounted her marriage to Brown as she would do nothing to change her status of "the widow of Malcolm X."

Betty Shabazz

Since 1969, she has spoken at various memorial services for her late husband and at black nationalist activities. While her activity is declining, she did attend the Congress of African Peoples held in Atlanta, Georgia, during September, 1970, which was attended by many known black extremists.

Shabazz continued to reside at 234 East Fifth Street, Mount Vernon, New York, and take in boarders as a source of income until she was employed by the Mount Vernon School System in 1970. (105-71196-1; 27, 31, 41)
