In response to his questions we described Agency responsibilities in general and provided a reprint of a US News & World Report article on an interview with Admiral Hahn on the occasion of his retirement. Although the article was dated the information was still current. [redacted] referred to Agency involvement with the National Students Association and said that many in the academic community were critical of this. We happened to have with us a copy of a New York Times article on this subject by James Reston, which we gave him. The article was quite authoritative and sympathetic toward the Agency. [redacted] friendly and not as insistent about [redacted] as we thought, but he asked to be advised if the Agency policy changed regarding provision of [redacted] to let him know.
