COPY OF SPECIAL RESOLUTION XIII--C/REC

WEST IRIAN

FACTS:

1. In 1949 the Netherlands promised before the United Nations full sovereignty to those islands formerly known as the Dutch East Indies. In that same year the Round Table Conference at The Hague postponed the decision on the status of West Irian, one of these islands, for a year. Further negotiations failed, and at present West Irian is still a Dutch colonial possession. Due to the colonial policy of the Netherlands, there are no institutions of higher learning or opportunities to obtain a secondary education.
2. In 1959 a representative of the Research Investigation Committee of the International Student Congress was refused entrance into West Irian to study the situation.

PRINCIPLE:

In accordance with the usual basic policy declaration concerning colonialism as it affects students, UNSU notes that the Dutch Government by not setting up educational institutions is depriving the West Irian people from pursuing their own educational interests.

RECOMMENDATION:


The 13th National Student Congress reaffirms the Special Resolution on West Irian passed by the 12th National Student Congress.

MANIFEST:

1. The 13th National Student Congress mandates the International Affairs Vice President to circulate to all member schools the report on West Irian of the Research and Information Committee of UNSU.
2. The 13th National Student Congress mandates the International Affairs Vice President to send this resolution to the Dutch National Union of Students, the Indonesian National Union of Students, and the representatives to the United Nations of both countries.
