As promised, I have looked into the question of what happened to the paperwork detailing the UFO sighting reported to RAF Leeming by Section 40. Unfortunately, I have been unable to find any record that the report ever reached us.

I was contacted by a number of researchers about a wave of sightings that occurred in the Teeside/Cleveland area on the 23, 24 and 25 March this year. I was also asked about a story that two aircraft from RAF Leeming were diverted from a routine training sortie to an area where a UFO had been sighted, and I assume this was the report made by Section 40. I spoke to authorities at RAF Leeming about this at the time, and they confirmed that nothing was picked up on radar either at RAF Leeming or at Teeside airport. With regard to the aircraft, no diversion took place, although it transpired that the flight paths had taken the aircraft through the area where the UFO had been reported, at the time concerned. The crews were subsequently asked if they had seen anything unusual, but they had not.

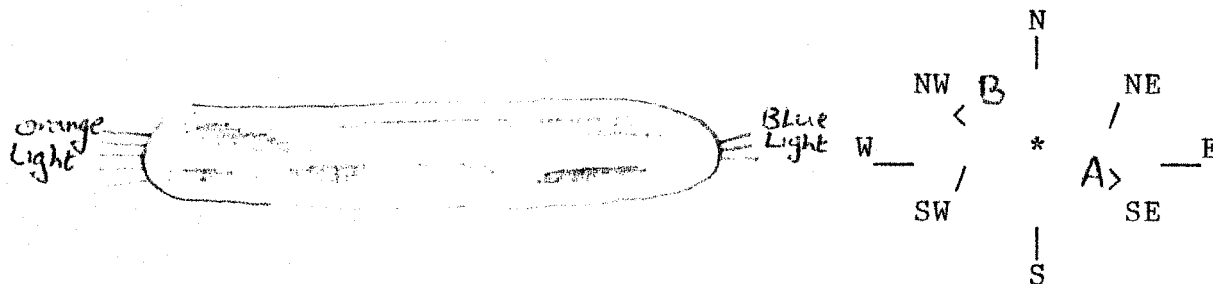

As promised, the following paragraphs set out our policy and views on the UFO phenomenon.

Although the Ministry of Defence does receive reports of UFO sightings, our only concern is to establish whether or not there is any threat to the security of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that there is - and this has not been the case with any sighting to date - we do not attempt to investigate further, or to identify whatever might have been seen.

Given this limited involvement with the subject, the Ministry of Defence has no department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports, nor are there any staff employed on the subject full time. The reports we receive, which are usually limited to very brief details of what was seen, are passed to staff in departments concerned with the air defence of the United Kingdom, who examine them as part of their normal duties.

It is clear from the reports we receive that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky. However, we believe that explanations could be found for most of them. Some of the possible explanations include aircraft lights or aircraft seen from unusual angles, airships, satellites in orbit or satellite debris re-entering the atmosphere, high altitude kites, helium balloons, weather balloons, searchlights or lasers reflecting off clouds, ball lightning, fireballs and meteorites. Additionally, some reports turn out to be hoaxes. Having said this, we accept that there will always be some sightings that appear to defy explanation, and we remain open-minded about these.

The Ministry of Defence does not release material on the subject "en bloc", because, as is the case with all government departments, all Ministry of Defence files are subject to the Public Records Act, and generally remain closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken. Prior to 1967 most UFO files were routinely destroyed after about five years, because at the time there was not perceived to be sufficient public interest in the subject to warrant the permanent retention of this material. A small number of earlier files did survive, and may be viewed at the Public Record Office. The references of these files are as follows: AIR 16/1199, AIR 20/7390, AIR 20/9320, AIR 20/9321, AIR 20/9322, AIR 20/9994 and PREM 11/855. This final file contains a letter on UFOs from the then Prime Minister, Winston Churchill, together with the response.



I have had a recent look at the situation, and have discovered that because files were not destroyed immediately, surviving papers generally date from around 1962. The reason these papers have not yet been released is that they are in files where the last enclosures are more recent, and files can only be released when the most recent enclosure is 30 years old. The good news is that, although it is not our practice to comment in detail on material that has not yet been released, I understand that a further two files (Public Record Office references AIR 2/16918 and AIR 2/17318) are due for release in January 1994. From then onwards there should be a steady trickle of UFO files released each year. If you are interested in seeing these files, I suggest that you contact the Public Record Office early next year.

The files we hold in this office go back to about 1985, so we are able to answer specific queries that people have about particular sightings which have occurred in recent years, and can let them know whether we have a report on the incident, and if so, what it contains. Most of the reports that we have are relatively unexciting, and refer to little more than a vague shape or light in the sky, as opposed to the more exotic "close encounter" reports that are sometimes written about. For whatever reason, people seem to report these cases to UFO groups or researchers as opposed to us. I have attached for your information a copy of the form that we use to record UFO reports.

You may be interested to know the numbers of UFO sightings reported to the Ministry of Defence in the past, so I have attached some figures that you may find useful.

A number of recent reports were almost certainly sightings of an airship, with its main body brightly illuminated. I have seen this myself, and can understand how, when seen from a distance, this generated reports of a bright cigar-shaped UFO. Other recent reports have been caused by the use of lasers or searchlights; such equipment is used increasingly in advertising and entertainment, especially at outdoor music festivals.

The Ministry of Defence is not involved in any research or investigation into the crop circle phenomenon, although we occasionally get questions on this subject, because of the perceived link between crop circles and the UFO phenomenon. Although having no responsibility for this subject, we will refer anybody who asks about them to organisations such as CPR International or the CCCS, in the same way as we will refer people who report or enquire about UFOs to groups such as BUFORA or Quest International. As is the case with UFOs, we hold no fixed views on crop circles, and remain open-minded about this intriguing phenomenon.

Thank you for your letter dated 15 October in which you raised a number of points relating to the UFO sighting at Rendlesham Forest in 1980.

Firstly, you asked about the release of UFO reports, and asked if this would not have breached the "30 Year Rule". I believe that what Section 40 was referring to was the release of specific UFO reports. The release of an entire file would have breached the rules, but releasing some material from a file would not. What we have said is that if people are enquiring about specific sightings that have occurred recently, we will look through our file, to see if we have any reports that might tie-in with what was seen. If we do, we will release a copy, although we delete the names and addresses of the witnesses, together with any personal information, in line with our rules on witness confidentiality. This system works well, and is a good example of how we assist serious UFO groups and researchers.

You asked for copies of material sent to Section 40. I am unsure what, if any, reports we sent her, although any such reports would have been released under the terms of the arrangement described in the previous paragraph. In any case, it would not be proper for me to release details of correspondence between her and us to any third party, without permission, just as I would not pass details of our correspondence to any third party. This approach mirrors our rules on witness confidentiality.

With regard to your point about whether or not the Rendlesham Forest sighting posed a threat to the defence of the UK, the fact is that we have no evidence of any threat. You should bear in mind that although stories persist about structured craft and aliens, Lt Col Halt's report mentions nothing more than lights in the sky, together with some other observations that - as the article in "Focus" suggested - might be very easily explained.

I can make no comment about what was said about UFOs being related to stress; this is clearly one theory, and there may or may not be any truth in it. As I explained in my previous letter, our role is very limited; we do not take sides in the wider debate about the UFO phenomenon, and remain open-minded.

You mentioned the audio recording allegedly made at the time of the UFO sighting. I have heard the tape, and my personal view is that the tape was a hoax (hoaxing is, unfortunately, extremely widespread where UFOs are concerned). Having said this, ufologists are divided on this point. Even if the tape is genuine, it in no way substantiates any of the more exotic stories that are circulating about this sighting. Clearly, however, you will wish to listen to the tape yourselves, and make up your own minds. I believe that Quest International have copies of the tape.



Although I have not seen a copy of the covering letter you mention, it is not unlikely that one was sent, and I imagine that it amounted to little more than a note drawing our attention to Lt Col Halt's report. As for the other papers, drawings and photographs you mention, I know nothing of these. Many strange stories circulate about this UFO case; our problem is that they are not supported by any hard evidence.

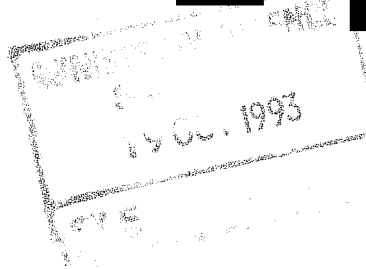

regarding your letter to my friend and I (dated 7th October 1993)
I would like to thank you personally for your reply to my letter, The second paragraph in particular, and the end addresses at the end were extremely interesting; however the "30 Year Rule" was violated by Section 40, the secretary of DS 8 told Jenny Handles (the author of "Skycrash" and "Out Of The Blue" in 1983 (she was the secretary in 1983); and I quote:

"We are currently discussing the mechanics of printing and distributing the reports and once agreement is reached on those aspects it will, of course, take a little while before we can assemble all the material in a form suitable for printing. However, once we are in a position to start releasing these reports you will be informed..."

A position statement was attached to her letter and the ministry added (not in these words exactly):

- 1) They would pass all incoming UFO reports "to appropriate staff who examine them as part of normal duties. There is no unit within the ministry used only for this purpose, and no permanent full time staff solely for UFO research."
- 2) They (MoD) did "not deny that there are strange things to see in the sky." But believed that "there are adequate material explanations" for these (citing satellite debris, ball lightning, unusual clouds and other more familiar things such as aircraft lights). They were adamant that the Ministry of Defence "certainly had no evidence that alien spacecraft had landed on this planet..."
- 3) FINALLY, that "in response to demands for publication of UFO reports "the minister "saw no objection to these reports being made public... We are therefore studying the best means of publishing this material."

So, the "30 year rule" was broken, WHY?, and why did you say that the reports "would not be open to the public yet" even any UFO reports from 1962 would not have been released until last year (1992), and so you could not even release things about this in 1983—so why did you release reports (not you but the MoD), and not only did the MoD release it publicly, she was allowed to make a public announcement—and she did, so why do you still insist that these files are covered by the "30 year rule?"
I would request that you release all the reports that you did to Section 40 to me, plus the letters you sent to her for reference, if you do not it would simply mean a very strange cover-up, and if there is no threat to the defence of the U.K then WHY, THIS SECRETIVE COVER-UP?... and why would you breach the "30 year rule" and then re-establish it, surely that is not allowed...

How can you say there was no threat to the defence of the U.K when something lands on the edge of a N.A.T.O airbase it could just as easily be a new form of spying machine surely this would pose a threat to the USAF and the United Kingdom's Defense; if information was stolen, well then your guess is as good as mine!...

Then when m/s/rs/ss (ms, Mrs, Miss) Section 40 asked for the report about R.A.F Bentwaters / Woodbridge, the secretary of DS 8, said:

"Turning now to your interest in the sightings at RAF Woodbridge in December 1980. I can confirm that USAF personnel did see unusual lights outside the boundary fence early in the morning of 27 December 1980, but no explanation for the occurrence was ever forthcoming. There is, however, no question of the account being a cover-up for crashed aircraft or testing of secret devices. . . nor was there any contact with alien 'beings.' "

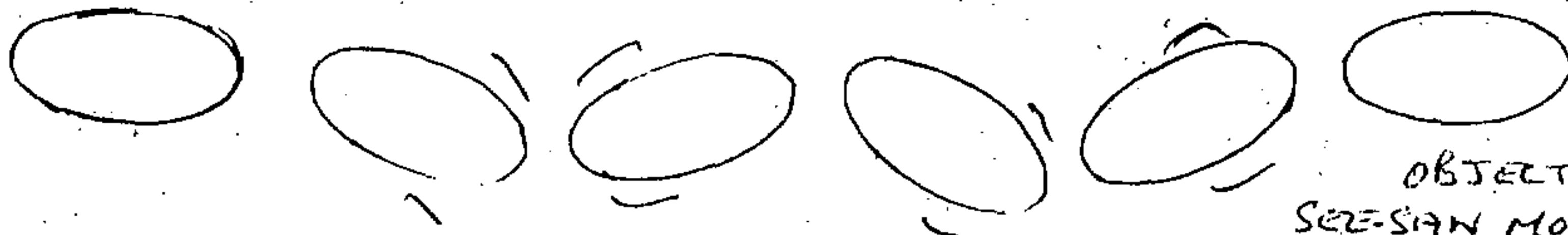

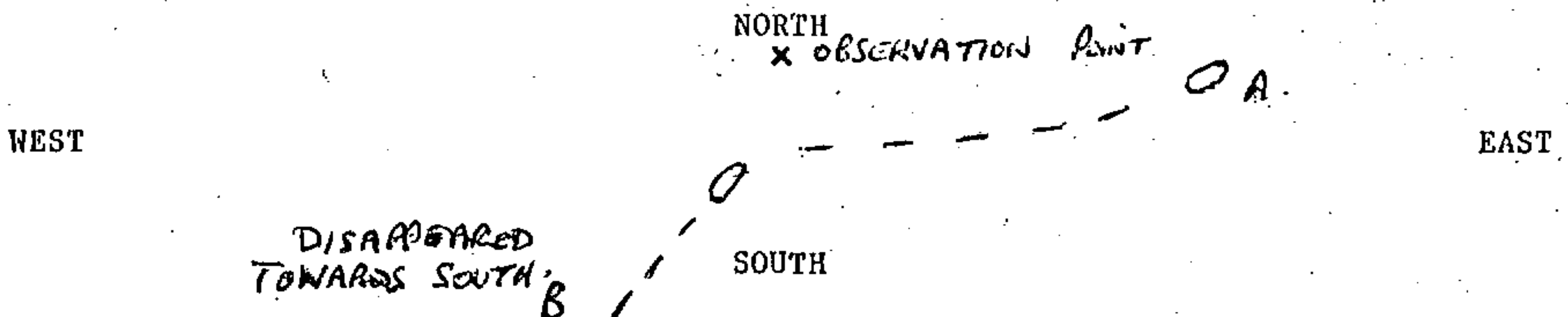

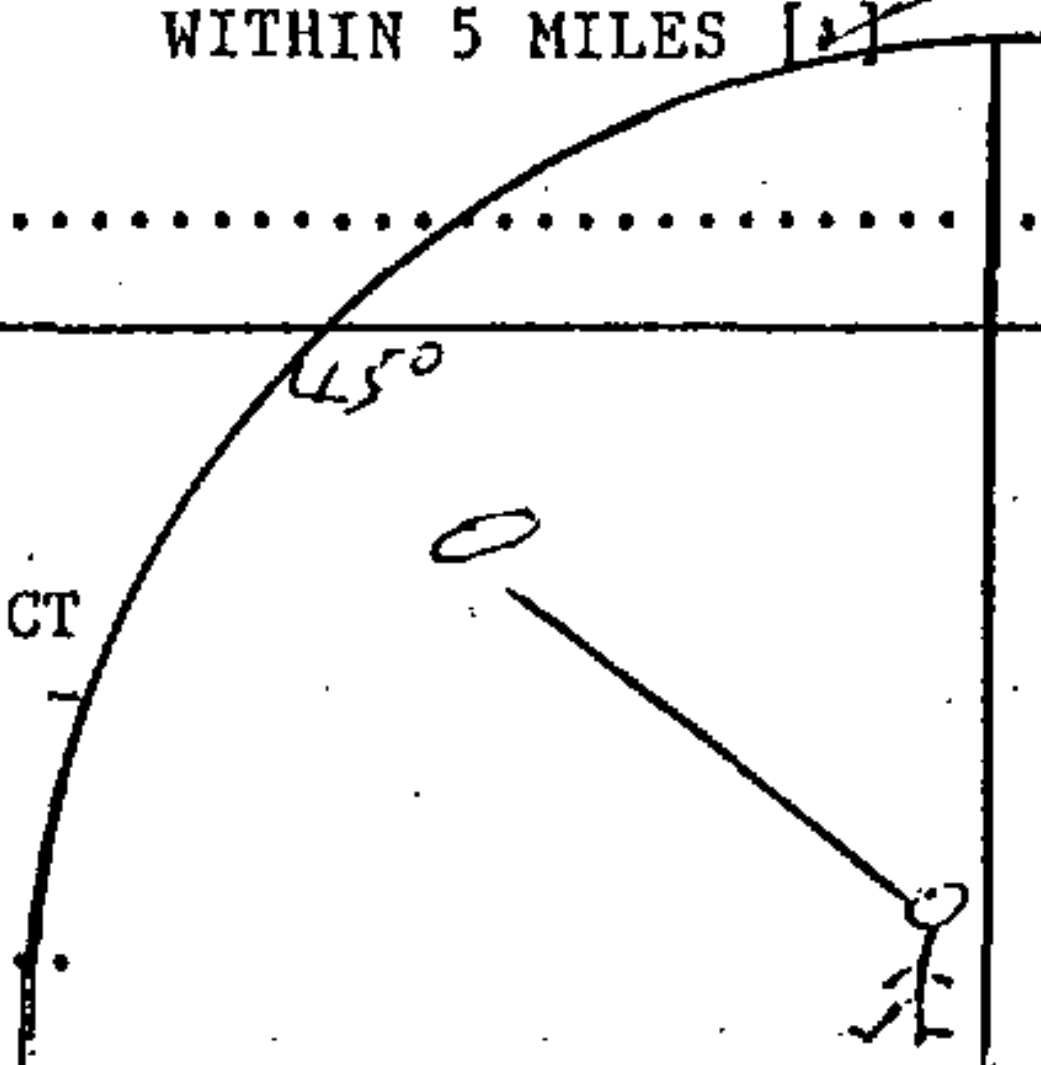

While it is clear from the reports we receive that there are many strange things seen in the sky, we believe that explanations could be found for most of them. If you do believe that what you saw cannot be explained in terms of known objects or phenomena, you might like to contact some of the civilian organisations currently engaged in the study and investigation of UFOs. Pursuit and interception continued for over 1 hour.

2600 witnesses provided statements. 75 of these were Belgian Police officers.

The Belgian Minister of Defence Guy Coeme, admitted the existence of these flying objects; he stated in the Belgian Parliament that ALL hypotheses could be excluded—he did not know what these flying objects were. This was confirmed on the 26th May 1993 by Leo Delcroix the present Belgian Minister of Defence.

At one period of interception, both F-16 aircraft were in pursuit of this unidentified object which was on a Westerly heading towards UK airspace at speeds of +1000 knots per hour.

This incident was regarded by the Belgian authorities as a major alert

Actual time to infringe UK airspace would have been less than six minutes.

I note your observation that because the Belgian detections were outside UK airspace they were beyond your area of remit.

Whilst I acknowledge that this was so, I do not see how it is possible to ensure UK security by such rigid parameters.

When an unknown object of some substance-treated as a threat to national security by the armed forces of a fellow member state-is only six minutes from our national boundary and is being pursued at speeds in excess of 1000 kts per hour by two interceptor aircraft, then it is not practicable or possible, in the interests of security, to impose statutory limits involving national boundaries.

I have discussed your observations with a NATO colleague, and find it difficult to accept that-as you say in your letter-even though we are part of NATO Air Defence Ground Environment and are covered to some extent by AWAC aircraft, that there are occasions when we are not advised by the NATO 80 radar station complex, of possible intrusions into our airspace.

It would seem however, that because this incident was regarded by the Belgian military as a major alert, that we should have been notified by Glons CRC(NADGE) of their radar detection.

There would seem little point of a radar defence system that did not do this.

It would seem incredible that the Ministry of Defence were not aware of this imminent infringement of our national security, particularly when an event of such magnitude was being enacted only six minutes away.

In my letter dated 5 October I explained that the only reason the MOD looks at UFO sightings at all is to see whether there is any threat to the defence of the UK. When we spoke on Friday you asked me who evaluates the sightings, and how judgements are made about whether there is or is not any threat.

Sightings are evaluated here in Sec(AS)2a, and we are assisted by specialist staffs whose responsibilities cover the Air Defence of the UK. It is not our policy to name other departments involved, but I can tell you that the staffs concerned examine UFO reports routinely, as part of their normal duties. There is no department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports, nor are there any staff employed on the subject full-time.

In order to say that there was a threat, we would have to be presented with firm evidence; to date, we have not been presented with any. Most of the reports we receive are quite vague, and relate to little more than a distant light or shape in the sky; furthermore, we often get to hear of a sighting some time after it has occurred. In these circumstances, there is very little that we can do. If we have something more interesting (such as a sighting with more than one witness, or very precise details of a sighting) then we can make some checks, such as finding out whether there was any military aircraft activity that might explain what was seen.

I should tell you that, for whatever reason, people seem to report alleged "close encounters" to UFO groups as opposed to us.

I can assure you that all UFO sightings - together with any other UFO-related data that is sent to us - are carefully looked at, in an open-minded way.

You also asked me to expand on my comments relating to cooperation between the MOD and UFO groups and researchers.

I believe that cooperation is important, and helps everyone involved with investigation of UFOs. The main form that cooperation takes is the exchange of information; ufologists will often send us cases and ask us for any views we may have. In turn, we will suggest that witnesses get in touch with UFO groups, and are therefore responsible for getting a lot of sightings into the public domain. We also release general information, such as the data I passed you on the number and distribution of UFO sightings reported to the MOD.



You also asked if I could give you any further details of sightings in the Bristol area. Recently, we have received the following reports:

"Sometime in August" - Lockleaze area
23 August - Bedminster area
28 August - St Georges area
26 September - area not known
6 October - Frenchay area.

When you called today, you asked me to say something about the term "UFO". In that UFO simply stands for Unidentified Flying Object, we entirely accept that there are such things - clearly people often see something they are unable to identify. The term "UFO" does not imply that what was seen was extraterrestrial, and as I explained, we have no evidence that would support the existence of extraterrestrial life. As I have said before, although we believe that most UFO sightings can be explained in terms of known objects or phenomena, we accept that a small percentage would appear to defy explanation. We remain open-minded about these.

Finally, as promised, please find attached the Civil Aviation Authority report into the airmiss incident that you mentioned.

PART A: SUMMARY OF INFORMATION REPORTED TO JAS

THE B737 PILOT reports that he was inbound to Gatwick and in communication with London control on 128.4 while squawking with Mode C. He was heading 308° and descending through FL 140 at 355 kt with visibility in the region of 40 km. His FO saw a small black lozenge shaped object about 500 m ahead of the ac and at the same level. Within the space of about 1.5 sec it passed very close, less than 100 yd away, down the port side of the ac and, at the most, 30 ft above the level of the wing. He informed London Control, via the RT, who reported seeing a small primary radar contact astern of the ac. No impact or disturbance was felt on the ac and no damage was observed during a post flight inspection. He assessed the risk of collision as high.

ATC AT LATCC reports that during a moderate traffic loading on the BIG/EAS CCF sector the B737 pilot reported an object passing his ac in the opposite direction at a high closing speed. The B737 was inbound to Gatwick via the Eastwood stack and passing the BEXIL way point. He was descending through 15,000 ft and thought the object may have been a balloon, or part of, describing it as black and about 18 inches wide. The SC reports that a primary return was seen about 10 NM behind the B737 heading SE at about 100 kt. A following ac was given traffic information and avoiding turns to the left to avoid the primary return, which had appeared to change heading towards it, but its pilot reported seeing nothing. The DVR CSC was also advised of the facts in order that inbound traffic could be given vectors to avoid the area.

JAS Notes

1. A Meteorological balloon was released from Crawley at 1719 on this particular day, it was light brown in colour and was trailing a silvery mesh triangle. Twenty six minutes after release (1745) it was at 27,000 ft bearing 085.76° and at a range of 30 km from Crawley. It ascended through 15,000 ft 13 min after release (1732) when it was bearing 097.6° and at a range of 17 km. There was a sharp inversion between 4000-5000 ft where the temperature rose from +8° to +12°. The top of convection was at 4500 ft, above this was a very dry area up to about 15,000 ft. Wind velocity at 14,000 ft - 305/25, 10,000 ft - 295/25.
2. AIS(Mil) undertook very thorough tracing action but could reach no positive conclusion. Their radar replay did show a primary return in the general area but it was seen to move about like a light ac or helicopter at low level. No Met or other balloons could be traced which having been released could have reached this area/time nor which could have appeared black. The only possible exception to this was that some hot-air balloon pilots launch small balloons which can be followed with a device called a "Wind Tracker". One balloon pilot contacted had released balloons on the 6th/7th July but then not again until the 19th. On the 21st he tracked one of his black balloons to 7200 ft before he lost sight of it and he assumed they could go much higher than this. The CAA SRG is well aware of this use of balloons; they and others of similar size (less than 2 m) are exempted from most restrictions of the ANO by Article 109(a). The object seen by the B737 pilot must be considered as untraced.

PART B: SUMMARY OF THE WORKING GROUP'S DISCUSSIONS

The only information available to the Working Group was the report from the pilot of the B737, photographs from the radar recordings, and reports from the appropriate ATC and operating authorities.

A member commented that the number of sightings of balloons and other unidentified objects seem to have become more prevalent in the S and SE of the country. Members took note of the AIS(M) comment on the primary return seen in the general area of the airmiss as being more akin to the movement of a light ac or helicopter at low level. They were at a loss to identify the reported object since its shape and behaviour did not seem to fit any recognisable piece of aviation equipment, while the temperature inversion made it unlikely that something like a piece of black polythene could have been carried to that level. It was agreed that this airmiss was best described as a confliction between the B737 and the unidentified object. Whilst members were unsure what damage could have occurred had the object struck the B737 the general opinion was that there had been a possible risk of collision.

AN INFORMATION STATUS UPDATE

In 1972 a programme of "SYSTEMATIC REVIEW FOR DECLASSIFICATION" began. Under this programme classified, permanently valuable [archival] records are reviewed for the purpose of declassification. This programme is applicable to those records which have reached a specific age. Executive Order 12356, authorised National Archives and Records Administration as the sole agency required to conduct a systematic review of its enormous classified holdings. NARA's implementation of this programme is a duplicate of its British counterpart - Public Records Office [PRO], which applies Public records Act. NARA like PRO reviews - with an intention to declassify records - when they are 30 years old. Certain intelligence or cryptologic files series require a longer period of 50 years, before their eligibility for declassification.

While other agencies are not required to conduct a systematic review programme, from now on they are encouraged to do so. They can now, with the approval of the originator, agencies, including NARA, conduct a systematic review of records that are less than 30 years old.

Unfortunately, both the number of pages reviewed and declassified in 1992 decreased significantly. The US agencies reviewed 10.7 million pages, almost 5 million [32%] less than in 1991. Only 9.4 million pages were declassified. Agencies declassified 88% of the pages reviewed. Approximately the same proportion declassified in 1991.

Although the decrease in systematic review is due to the low figures reported by several agencies, NARA's figure critically impacted on the systematic review product. In 1992, NARA's review decreased by 2 million pages to 6 million, a drop of 28% from 1991. NARA's explanation for the deduction in its systematic review were a) the absence of sufficient staff to fulfil the programme; and b) the records reviewed included a smaller percentage of classified documents within the aggregate files.

The Department of Defense [DOD] accounted for the second highest volume of pages reviewed in 1992. Despite this factor, the number of pages reviewed and declassified by DOD decreased significantly. It dropped from 6 million in 1991, to almost 4 million pages in 1992. The reasons provided by DOD were the diminishing resources and the drawdown of special projects. Nevertheless, DOD managed to declassify 84% of the pages it reviewed.

The Air Force, for the third year running accounted for the most of DOD's systematic review activity. The volume of material reviewed and declassified counts for 2/3 of its total product.

The contribution of systematic review by other agencies to the programme was very small. However, it is encouraging to see that after years of minimal declassification, the CIA implemented this programme since 1991. The agency managed to declassify 39,000 pages of information in 1992.

MANDATORY REVIEW

Under the provisions of the Executive Order 12356, the mandatory review process permits the agencies, or the citizens for that matter to require an agency to review specified national security information, seeking its declassification. Mandatory Review is popular with some serious researchers as a less contentious alternative to Freedom of Information Act [FOIA]. It is one of very few vehicles allowing to seek the declassification of presidential papers or records, which are excluded from the FOIA.

In 1992, 3867 cases were processed under the mandatory review. Comprising of 57,000 documents, amounting to 233,693 pages. The total number of pages processed showed an increase of 68% to the previous year - 1991. The rate of pages declassified in whole or in part also increased by the same rate - 68%. US Government maintains that Mandatory Review is a highly successful means for the declassification of information.

Executive Order 12356, also enables the public researchers or organisations to appeal mandatory review denials to designated officials of the denying agencies. In 1992, 229 such appeals were filed by public researchers and various organisations. As result, 4605 documents, totalling 15,608 pages were reviewed by the Appellate authorities. Of these, 98% of the pages were declassified

in whole or in part. Which tends to suggest that researchers can anticipate more returns in declassified information if they pursue an appeal. Equally significant is that as declassification decision reaches to a higher level within an agency, the likelihood of declassification expectedly is greater.

There seem to be a problem in the declassification process. It appears that most declassifiers are reluctant to declassify information in what they term "iffy" situations. They perceive that the possible disclosure, i.e. declassification, might be held against them. Whilst, an initial denial decision, i.e. withholding, poses no such threat, or personal risk. It is understood that only when difficult declassification decision reach higher ranking officials [through Appeal], litigation or otherwise are they likely to be resolved in favour of disclosure. In order to achieve a more coherent and more efficient declassification process, it is the Government's duty, by providing supportive educational programs, enhance the confidence and knowledge in declassification process system. In return, this would produce more confidence in journeyman level declassifiers. Already exploration of the available options are reviewed by the Executive in order to render more positive results in this area.

A significant development in 1992, is the lowest number of Original Classifiers ever reported. The total number of original classifiers throughout the executive branch of the government decreased by 681, to 5793. From that number, 1416 are designated to classify Top Secret documents; 3320 for Secret; and 1057 for Confidential records. Original Classification Authorities, also

known as Original Classifiers, are those individuals designated in writing, either by the President or selected agency heads, to classify information. According to the terms of Executive Order 12356, only Original Classifiers determine what information, if disclosed without authority, could reasonably be expected to cause damage to the national security. This deduction in numbers were right across the board of every level of classification. For example, at Top Secret level, agencies reported a decrease of 9%; at Secret level, a decrease of 13%; and at Confidential level, a decrease of 5%. CIA's 38% decrease in its number of classifiers was the highest. NASA reported 48%, and Department of Commerce 35% decrease respectively. In various DOD components, the Army, Defense Mapping Agency [DMA], and the Joint Chiefs of Staffs [JCS] made progress in decreasing their respective numbers of classifiers.

ORIGINAL CLASSIFICATION

Original Classification is an initial determination made by an authorized classifier that certain types of information require extraordinary protection. Because unauthorized disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause damage to the national security. The process of original classification usually needs, both, the determination of the need to protect the information, as well as the placement of appropriate markings to identify the level of classification. An Original Classification precedes all other aspects of the information security system. Such as Derivative Classification, Safeguarding, and Declassification.

The above figure [480,843] was the number of original classification decisions reportedly made by the agencies in 1992. It was 6% lower than the corresponding figure for 1991. This drop in classification is attributed to the recent impact of the geopolitical changes around the globe, and in the security communities.

However, four agencies; State, Justice, DOD, and CIA continue to account for over 99% of all the original classifications. All except the DOD reported drop in original decisions. The rest of the agencies and components reported a 41% decrease in original classification decisions.

The agencies reported a 12% decrease in the number of original decisions made at the SECRET level. But, there was an increase of 13% [approximately 2500 decisions] in original TOP SECRET level.

and 1% in 'CONFIDENTIAL' level of classification decisions. The increase in the TOP SECRET level is particularly alarming. In the sense that it is contrary and against the general tide of activity, and should be closely monitored by the Executive watch dog in charge.

The classifier must, as part of the original classification process, determine a time frame for the protection of the information. It is commonly known as "duration" of classification. The Executive Order 12356 does provide the classifiers with two clear guidelines in this regard;

1) The information could be marked for declassification upon a specific date or event. Meaning that a classifier may determine that the information's sensitivity would lapse upon the completion of a particular project or programme. This should be clearly noted on the face of the document. Once the project is completed, the information therein would be automatically declassified.

2) If a specific date or event cannot be determined at the time of classification, the classifier should mark the document with the notation "ORIGINATING AGENCY'S DETERMINATION REQUIRED" (OADR). This indicates that the information must be reviewed by the OADR before any declassification decision or action could be taken.

Unfortunately, like 1991, only 5% of all original decisions made in 1992 fell into the first category - the use of date or event. Ideally the Executive requires an average of 10 to 18%. There are changes in the pipe line to the classification system which should, hopefully, help to make the necessary improvements in order for the classification system to behave in a more responsible and credible manner.

DERIVATIVE CLASSIFICATION

Derivative Classification is the act of incorporating, paraphrasing, resting, or generating in new form classified information. Information in this category could be classified in the following two forms;

1) Through the use of a source document - normally correspondence, or publications generated by an original classification authority.

2) Through the use of Classification Guide. A Classification Guide is a set of instructions issued by an original classification authority. It is usually limited to a specific, or particular subject. By describing the elements of information therein, highlighting the information that must be classified.

Only the Executive branch or government contractor employees with the appropriate security clearance, who are required by their work to restate classified source information, can classify derivatively.

There was a marked decrease of 11% in the reported number of derivative classifications in 1992. Partly, this decrease was attributed to the 21% fewer derivative classification decisions reported by the DOD. The two other agencies, that together with DOD, account for 99% of derivative classification actions - CIA and Justice/FBI reported an increase of 4% and 22% respectively. Nevertheless, the total number of decisions made remains astronomically high - 5,868,689 actions. Although, the Executive maintains that this number represents the lowest in this category, I should criticise this figure, especially due to the large shift in volume of special projects into this category. This, to great extent hampers researchers access to information, and is reflective of a policy of deliberate concealment on the government's part.

The remaining agencies reported 64,711 derivative classification actions. A 23% reduction from the previous year [1991]. The following agencies reported a decrease in the same category in 1992:

From 5,868,689 derivative classification actions taken in 1992, 540,833 [9%] were Top Secret decisions; 4,057,558 [69%] were Secret decisions; and the remaining 1,270,298 [22%] were Confidential. In the same figure [5,868,689], DOD counts for 3,328,949 decisions, the CIA for 1,873,326 decisions, Justice for 601,703, and the rest - 64,711 were taken by all other remaining agencies. It is noteworthy to add that the State Department classifies a significant portion [82%] of its information at the Confidential level. Equally important to note is the ration of the Derivative Actions to Original, which is 12:1.

COMBINED CLASSIFICATION

As its name suggests, the Combined Classification is the combination of Original and Derivative decisions. In 1992, Combined Classification activity had a significant drop in its number. It decreased by 757,458 [11%] to a total of 6,349,532 actions. Still a very high number. The high number of the derivative classification decisions had an enormous impact on the total number of Combined Classification. Despite that factor, the figure of 6,349,532 reportedly is the lowest figure ever in this category.

From the total of Combined Classification actions; 562,031 [9%] were in TOP SECRET level; 4,314,593 [68%] were in SECRET level; and 1,472,908 [23%] were in CONFIDENTIAL level.

The agency breakdown in total figure shows a 3,439,085 [54%] for DOD; 1,924,780 [30%] for CIA; 732,674 [12%] for Justice; 181,445 [3%] for the State Department; and 71,548 [1%] for all other remaining agencies. I should add that the remaining agencies run the gamut, however, in the degree of their involvement with classified information. They vary in range from very large departments that possess very little classified information and generate almost none, to very small entities that exist almost exclusively in a classified environment, e.g. NRO.

INFRACTION (INFRINGEMENTS)

The agencies reported a total of 21,071 detected infractions in 1992. Comparing with the 1991 figure, there were a decrease of 139 cases in 1992. There was also a slight increase in discovered infractions per inspection in 1992. It rose from 0.98 in 1991, to 0.99 in 1992. This rate is not indicative of an efficient self inspection programme in place in agencies. In fact, some of the agencies which have the most problems with their classified product lack a comprehensive, self disciplined self-inspection programme in place. Indeed, the Agency Self Inspections have dropped dramatically to their lowest during past two years. Whilst from 1983 [where there were 22,245 self-inspections], there has been regular increase in the number of self inspections carried out by the agencies, up to 1990 when the figure reached to its peak [24,268], the trend seems to have reversed. There were 21,615 reported self-inspections in 1991, and the figure for 1992 is even lower - 21,233. There are no valid reasons or grounds for this neglect. This decline is more evident in particular in the DOD.

Thank you for your letter dated 19 September to the Prime Minister, concerning the 1980 UFO sighting at Rendlesham Forest. I have been asked to reply.

While we are aware of Lt Col Halt's memo, I am afraid that we have no other papers to hand. The files for 1980 are - like all government files - covered by the "30 Year Rule", and will not be open to the public yet. I can tell you that Lt Col Halt's report was examined very carefully at the time, and that we were satisfied that there was no threat to the defence of the UK.

As you may be aware, there is a lot of controversy about this UFO sighting. You may have read about it in "Skycrash", by Jenny Randles, or "Above Top Secret", by Timothy Good. There are many, however, who believe that there may be a simple explanation for what was seen. You might like to buy the latest issue of the magazine "Focus", which (as part of an article about UFOs) looks at the Rendlesham Forest case, and concludes that the lights seen were from Orford Ness lighthouse! Potential explanations are also put forward for the other things that Lt Col Halt found, such as the holes in the ground.

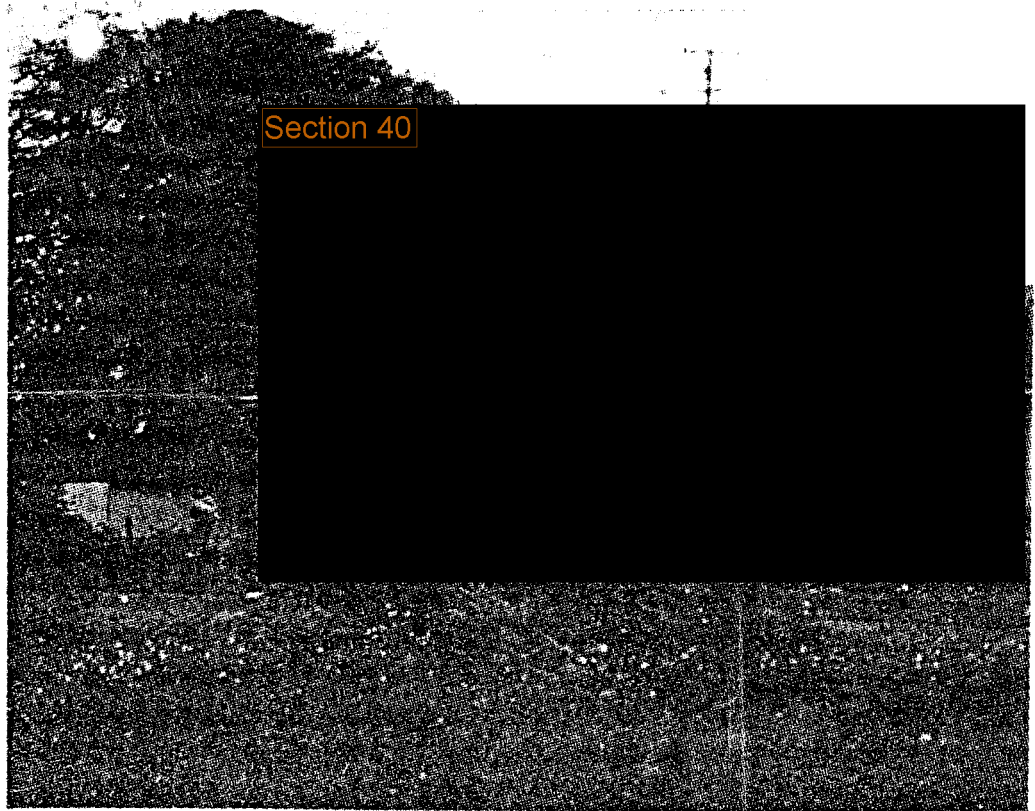

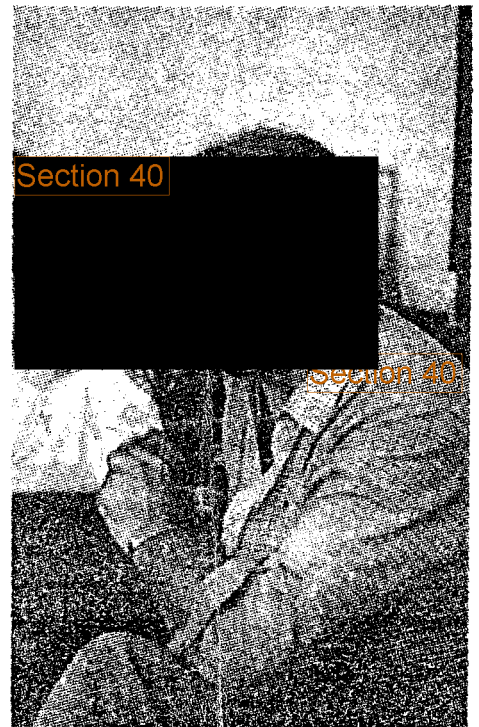
1. Early in the morning of 27 Dec 80 (approximately 0300L), two USAF security police patrolmen saw unusual lights outside the back gate at RAF Woodbridge. Thinking an aircraft might have crashed or been forced down, they called for permission to go outside the gate to investigate. The on-duty flight chief responded and allowed three patrolmen to proceed on foot. The individuals reported seeing a strange glowing object in the forest. The object was described as being metallic in appearance and triangular in shape, approximately two to three meters across the base and approximately two meters high. It illuminated the entire forest with a white light. The object itself had a pulsing red light on top and a bank(s) of blue lights underneath. The object was hovering or on legs. As the patrolmen approached the object, it maneuvered through the trees and disappeared. At this time the animals on a nearby farm went into a frenzy. The object was briefly sighted approximately an hour later near the back gate.
2. The next day, three depressions 1 1/2" deep and 7" in diameter were found where the object had been sighted on the ground. The following night (29 Dec 80) the area was checked for radiation. Beta/gamma readings of 0.1 milliroentgens were recorded with peak readings in the three depressions and near the center of the triangle formed by the depressions. A nearby tree had moderate (.05-.07) readings on the side of the tree toward the depressions.
3. Later in the night a red sun-like light was seen through the trees. It moved about and pulsed. At one point it appeared to throw off glowing particles and then broke into five separate white objects and then disappeared. Immediately thereafter, three star-like objects were noticed in the sky, two objects to the north and one to the south, all of which were about 10° off the horizon. The objects moved rapidly in sharp angular movements and displayed red, green and blue lights. The objects to the north appeared to be elliptical through an 8-12 power lens. They then turned to full circles. The objects to the north remained in the sky for an hour or more. The object to the south was visible for two or three hours and beamed down a stream of light from time to time. Numerous individuals, including the undersigned, witnessed the activities in paragraphs 2 and 3.

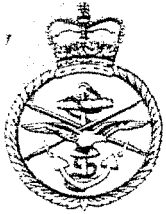

When we spoke earlier today I promised to let you have photocopies of the maps that we produce showing the approximate location of those UFO sightings reported to the Ministry of Defence in recent years. I have attached these maps, together with a table showing the numbers of reports we received.

You asked for any comments I may have about the recent wave of UFO sightings in the Bristol area; I am aware that some of the sightings are thought to have been caused by people having seen Venus, and that others were probably caused by people having seen lasers or searchlights reflecting off clouds; I know that BUFORA and Quest International have received a lot of sightings, and have looked into the situation; you may wish to liaise with them. As I mentioned, Section 40 from DUFORO has also done a lot of research into the recent Bristol sightings.

I am not suggesting that all the recent UFO sightings in the Bristol area were caused by Venus or lasers/searchlights; as I mentioned, one lady reported that "sometime in August" she saw "a pen shaped object" which disappeared and reappeared three times before finally moving out of view. She described it as being black in colour with areas of chrome, and said that it was silent. The sighting occurred in the Lockleaze area.

I thought it might be useful if I set out our policy and views on the UFO phenomenon; the following two paragraphs set out our position.

While the Ministry of Defence does receive some reports of UFO sightings, our only concern is to establish whether or not they pose a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate further, or to identify whatever might have been seen.

It is clear from the reports we receive that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky. However, we believe that explanations could be found for most of them. Possibilities that spring to mind include aircraft lights or aircraft seen from unusual angles, kites, helium balloons, weather balloons, unusual cloud formations, satellites in orbit or satellite debris entering the atmosphere, ball lightning, fireballs and meteorites. We accept, however, that there will always be some sightings that appear to defy explanation, and we remain open-minded about these.



I entirely agree with your comments about cooperation between the Ministry of Defence and ufologists; we always try to be as helpful as we can, and will do our best to answer questions about specific sightings, together with more general questions on our policy and views on UFOs.

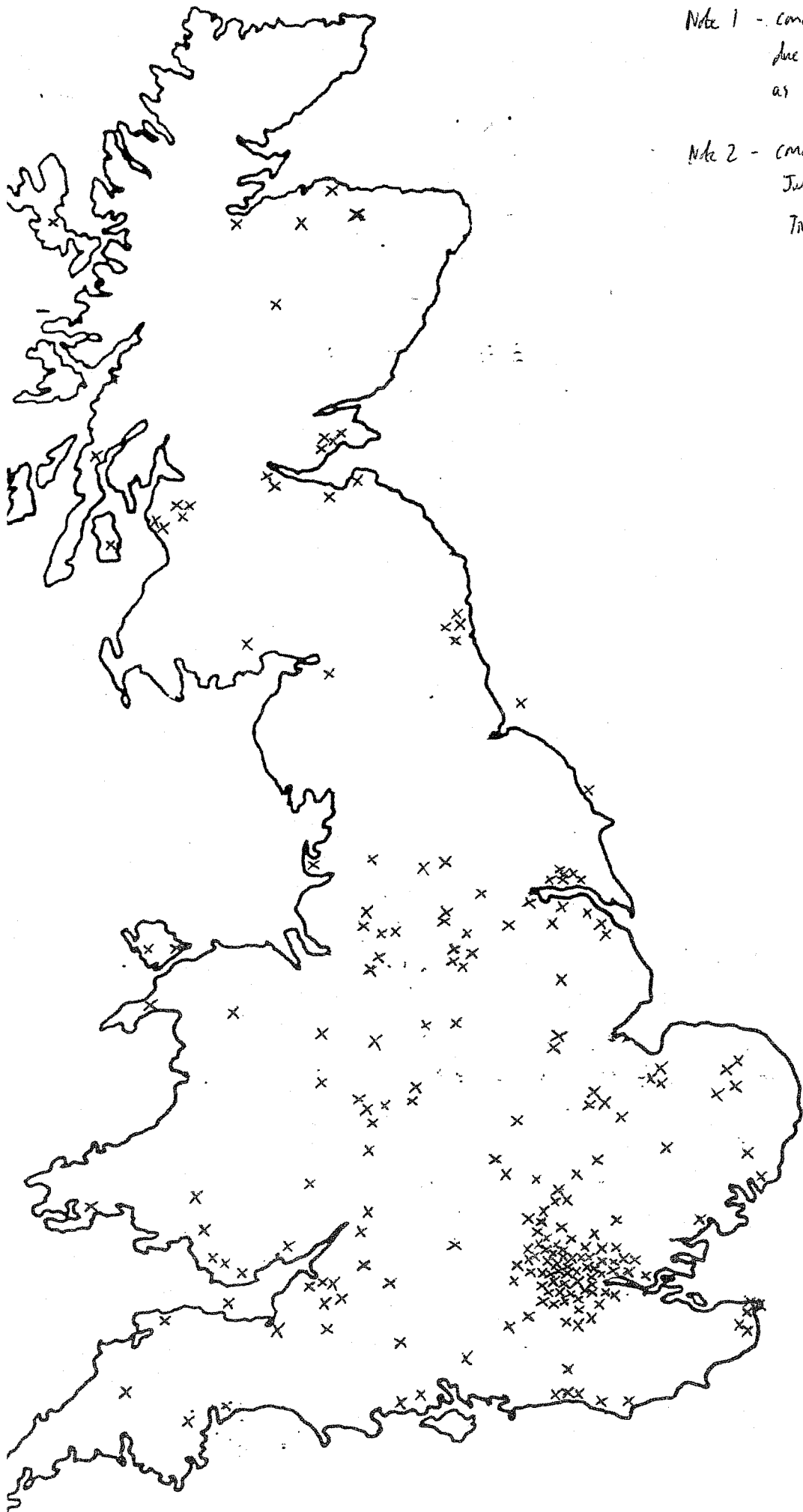

Note 2 : Concentration of Bristol sightings in mid Aug due to searchlights at music festival.

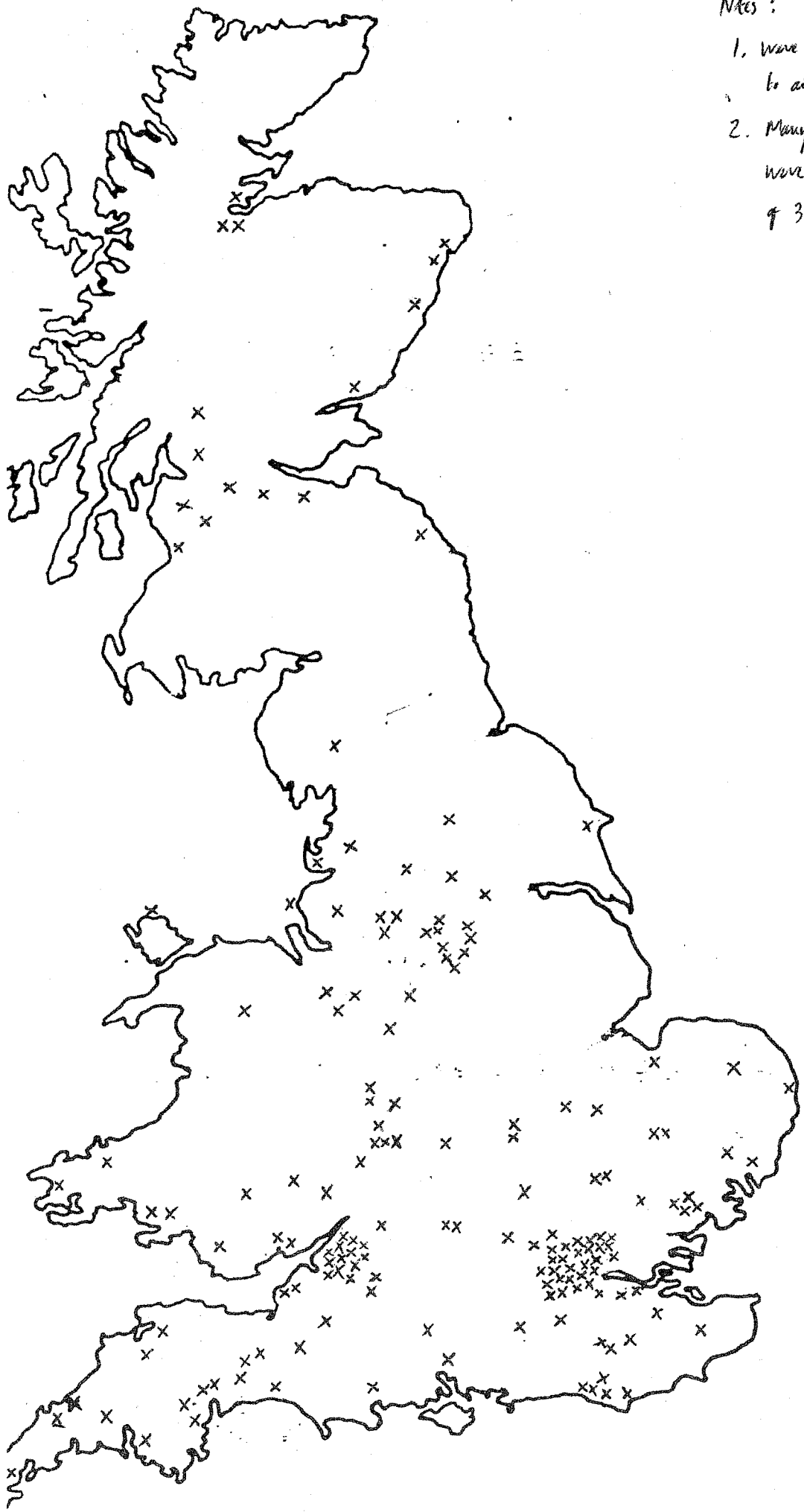

UFO SIGHTINGS INCLUDING THE RAMSEY AREA REPORT

1. Thank you for your letter regarding my Working Paper 12/93 and the matter of reporting in any UFO reports. In the case of the Ramsey sighting the NCO i/c the PBX saw the UFO phone call as an ideal opportunity to check out his automatic recording facility, designed with bomb and terrorist threats in mind rather than UFOs, and consequently the interesting report was taped.
2. Having spoken to various people on the unit there seems only to be a vague awareness of some reporting procedure. Three days on from raising the query no one has come up with copies of those 'standard forms' you referred to. Disseminating the details of correct procedures to all the places you mentioned would be rather expensive. Perhaps alternative reporting methods should be considered, such as a free phone number to an answer phone with a taped set of instructions for reporting in the salient points required ?
3. The business of JARIC being involved was a misunderstanding. It was thought, that with JARIC on stand down at the time the Ramsey report was phoned in, the Research Branch was asked to help instead of referring it to JARIC. In fact the Research Branch was chosen by PBX staff to look into the report and your concept of JARIC only being involved to comment upon specific photos, film, etc. is almost certainly right.
4. I regret now being quite so specific in quoting only Alconbury when the alternative American bases of Mildenhall and Lakenheath might have been the parent base for some training operations. This would allow Alconbury to disclaim responsibility with a clear conscience ! Your premise of another type of helicopter is questionable since very few helicopters I can think of would have that long term hovering capability, operating with high power settings and consequent high fuel consumption.
5. Amusingly enough the area of the sighting, in the Fenland district, is likely to evoke comments to the effect that the local population (the Fen Tigers) wouldn't really notice a few aliens unless the abnormalities were fairly marked, like having two heads. Derogatory local humour.
6. Hope these further comments have been useful.

Thank you for your letter dated 22 September.

You asked about the "close encounter" cases that we released last year. Following a number of enquiries, I wanted to put into the public domain those very few cases that we had which went beyond the sighting of lights or vague shapes in the sky. Following a search of the files held in this office, I identified five such cases, and released them to the national UFO groups, having deleted the names and addresses of witnesses - together with other personal details - because of our rules on witness confidentiality. I sent BUFORA's copies to the Section 40 address, but given that they seem to have gone astray, I have attached copies of these cases.

In line with our rules on witness confidentiality it is not our practice to give details of exchanges of correspondence or meetings with other ufologists. We are happy to meet serious researchers in order to explain our policy and views on UFOs, and have done so on a number of occasions.

I was interested in your views on the Halt tape; clearly you have done a lot of research into this. Given the time that has now passed, and the fact that the personalities involved have moved on, I suspect it will be impossible to resolve the mystery. I have made it clear that my view that the Halt tape is a fake is a personal one. The objections that occurred to me as being ones which cast doubts on the tape's authenticity were points that I thought would be useful to researchers.

I entirely agree with your comments about cooperation between the Ministry of Defence and ufologists; we always try to be as helpful as we can, and will do our best to answer questions about specific sightings, together with more general questions on our policy and views on UFOs.

Although I do not think we have corresponded recently you may have come across my name in association with UFOs. I am, in fact, Section 40 with BUFORA (British UFO Research Association).

I have wanted for some time to thank you for the time and trouble that you have taken in the past two years assisting serious UFO investigators in this country, notably those who are part of the National Investigations Committee at BUFORA. I know they appreciate what you are doing under the limited time and resources on a subject of minor concern to your department. I am equally grateful for the advice you give witnesses to contact BUFORA. We have been able to help several puzzled folk this way.

As I think you know, my approach to UFOs is that there is not (as popularly assumed) a government cover-up to hide knowledge and that you know as well as we do that 95% of all reported sightings have a mundane solution if you apply the effort to find it (eg the recent Bristol sightings which created so much fuss but which were mainly just venus rising). Of the remaining 5% I am satisfied that most, possibly all, but perhaps also not quite all, relate to what I term UAP (unidentified atmospheric phenomena) - these being natural anomalies that science has not yet fully caught up with. There are some intriguing areas left to mull over, notably the alien contact claims, but these appear to be as relevant to psychology and parapsychology as they do to any physical reality they may define.

I was intrigued to read in a Contact UK magazine about 12 months ago (along with bizarre claims about a direct link their team has with the 'aliens' shaped like a dentists drill who are making the crop circles!) that you have supplied them with all of the 'alien contact' cases on file at the MoD. They published them - being, in effect, a series of letters. I recognised most of the cases. A couple were witnesses who had inflicted themselves upon me after reading one of my books. But I was curious that you had distributed these letters to Contact, given their views. They do say that you had also released these to BUFORA, but as director of investigations I cannot trace them in the files. Nor can I find anyone at BUFORA who saw them at the offices. Can you check on this please?

Rumours have circulated around UFOlogy for a time about luncheon appointments you have had with Section 40 (who is not part of BUFORA) and Section 40 (who most certainly is, as a key administrator). For a time there were whispers among UFO buffs, who were mystified as to why such a thing was happening. I assured them that this was probably just a consequence of your personal interest in the subject, taking the chance to talk to Section 40 - but you know how these stories can get out of hand after a time in circulation. UFOlogy is never short of conspiracy theories.

Section 40 has recently confirmed that the meetings happened, but, so far as he knows, you did not pass on MoD 'alien contact' letters. So this still leaves unresolved what happened to them. Your cover letter which Contact publish clearly refers to copies coming to BUFORA in 1992.

The other point that I wanted to raise was regarding your correspondence with Section 40 over the Rendlesham Forest/Bentwaters saga. As you know, I have had more than a passing interest in this, writing two books (the more recent and, I trust, sober of which was published by Berkley in the USA in April and called 'From out of the blue'). That said, I still do not know what went on - although there was clearly a lot of confabulation involved. One of the witnesses who reputedly saw aliens ('Art Wallace' of the original 1983 News of the World articles) is shortly to publish his own book, which may well open up old wounds. I have to say from the interviews that I did that nobody else told me that they recalled aliens.

Anyhow, I was surprised from Section 40 letters that you had not heard the Halt tape before he gave you a copy. Your letter to him of 14 May 1993 (Ref D/Sec (AS) 12/3) argues that the tape may be a hoax, giving various reasons. Having a little free time for the first in what seems like ages I thought I would fill in a few gaps on this matter for you. It might help you to reappraise your views and to have material to hand to answer future queries. You doubtless still get them and when Art Wallace (ie Larry Warren's) book appears you may well be inundated from America, where some may believe the MoD have got spaceships and a few little grey aliens locked away. Of that, I will say no more, since I have already been sued personally, as was a British newspaper, for a not inconsiderable sum, when I countered stories about dead aliens and crashed spaceships, thinking it my responsibility to the serious side of UFO research to do so ...

So best that you be prepared. Although I will confine my comments to the Halt tape I would be pleased to answer any questions that you may have about this case, or, indeed, any other current UFO activity in this country. At a focal point of reporting channels over quite a diverse range, I do find that most cases come through my office - so please feel free to contact me, no strings attached, to ask any questions at any time that might be useful to you, eg in framing replies that you may need to give to a correspondent.

I am absolutely delighted to see the cooperation that has thrived in recent years between your offices and BUFORA. We are both working in the same area and with much the same philosophy I think. The more we can do to help one another, the better.

The Halt tape

The tape is not a hoax. I am as certain of that as I can be. It has been analysed by experts in sound recording in the USA and, aside from the problems of re-recording, it is just what one would expect it to be. Several of the people on the tape have been identified. I have talked to two of them myself. They, and others, all confirm that the tape was made and is accurate.

I do not know how many generations on from the original is the copy that you have, but I have what I believe is at worst a third generation recording. Two were distributed in August 1984 from the USA. They came from Colonel Sam Morgan at an air base in Texas. He was a commander at Bentwaters after the 1980 incidents and decided to release it, he said, as there was no reason for him not to do so. A covering letter was sent - but not with the copy that came to me. At the time I was in hospital having my gall bladder removed, so I never chased it up; although I have seen the letter. It is a private one from Morgan. I suspect this was his personal decision, not a USAF official act. He was under no obligation to withhold data and felt the facts would be illuminated by forwarding the tape.

Morgan was not present when the incidents occurred but does say he accepts the credibility of the men who described it.

Morgan made the recording we all have by playing the original on a portable in his quarters and picking up the sound onto a second tape deck, without any direct interface. Thus extraneous room sounds interrupted that way. They are not part of the original, I understand, which was reputedly destroyed by accident. This was made, by Halt, on a dictaphone style tape deck, keyed on and off - mostly off, as they appear to have had other distractions later on that morning. The main purpose was to record the sample taking and site details as it was dark and difficult to write notes.

As for the 'UFOs' that intrude into the picture, in my view these often match the location of the lighthouse. Whilst none of the witnesses I have talked with buy that solution in any way, many of the lights referred to on the tape are not totally inconsistent with it in a number of aspects.

I do not know why Halt did not mention the tape on his memo (or indeed the photographs that it records being taken and which I know for sure were taken; even though they have never been released). I can guess (and, I stress, it is purely a guess). I got the impression that Halt may have been in the forest at 1 am with a group of men on a private venture, rather than an official mission; although would equipment (eg geiger counters, lightfalls, etc) have to be logged in and out? Of course, there may have been quite proper channels by which the equipment could have been used in an unofficial capacity that night. I do not wish to imply anything underhand took place at all. But it would be odd for an official exercise to take site measurements, geiger counter readings, photographs, samples etc, in the middle of the night. Why not go during the day? Unless you also wanted to watch the sky after work as well, of course - which might have been in the equation.

My feeling is that Halt, like you, was personally interested in the subject and that, after the first night's events, he went out there on his own initiative, perhaps reasonably assuming an investigation would follow and need this data. When the USAF seemed disinterested in what was happening and the MoD also expressed the standard line of 'no defence implications and so no investigation follow up is necessary' he may have simply sent the memo (17 days later note) as a gesture for the files rather than as a definitive account of material that nobody had shown too much interest in analysing.

Just a thought. I may be completely wrong in all of this, of course.

Thank you for your letter dated 27 September.

I agree that radar will only positively detect a radar wavelength or an object of opacity and substance, although it is important to remember that a radar blip does not necessarily correspond to the location of an object; as I explained in my letter dated 18 February, the phenomenon of Anomalous Propagation can give an indication that an object of some sort is in the air, when in fact there is no such object; the radar will be picking up a natural feature such as a coastline.

I am not aware of instances where radar operators have detected an object, judged it to be solid, and not been able to identify it; if there have been such cases then they probably relate to weather balloons. The point I was trying to make in my 18 February letter was that we have never detected a structured craft flying in UK airspace, that has remained unidentified.

Although, as you point out, there is a chain of radar stations stretching across NATO, it is not the case that they all automatically exchange data, so it is not correct to say that the Ministry of Defence must have been aware of radar detections that occurred during the 1989/90 UFO sightings in Belgium. When I said, in my letter dated 24 February, that I remembered only one reference to radar sightings, I made it quite clear that this was a personal recollection of comments made in Timothy Good's book, "Alien Liaison".

I really must stress again that while the sightings that you are researching are doubtless very interesting, they occurred outside UK airspace, and as such lie outside our remit.

I wish you the best of luck with your continuing attempts to get to the bottom of this mystery.

You may remember that earlier in the year we had some correspondence concerning unidentified radar returns.

Your observations refer; 'There are certainly no instances where solid objects have been detected but not identified' (Ref;D/Sec(AS)12/3) and on the subject of Anomalous Propagation of radar 'it is easy for skilled operators to distinguish between these sort of returns, and the track made by a solid object such as an aircraft.' (Ref; D/Sec(AS)12/3)'

I was recently invited by BBC radio, to discuss an application that I have made to the European Parliament for an enquiry into the Belgian incidents of 1989/90.

A direct result of that broadcast were several letters and telephone calls from airline pilots, who had indeed been alerted by radar stations, of objects that had been detected on converging courses, and who had witnessed

together with other crew members, the detected object/objects passing where indicated. A telephone conversation with a radar operator also confirmed similar incidents.

A conversation with a radar technologist also confirmed that 'radar will act in much the same way as a wavelength of light. It will only detect another radar signal or its own reflection from an object of reflectability in the latter case an object of some substance or opacity'

Note* This must be the case-or there would be no point in radar detection.

I have had considerable correspondence with the Belgian Air Force, the Belgian Minister/and Ministry of Defence, and the Belgian Prime Minister. Their comments are, that because the credibility of the Belgian armed forces and Ministry of Defence are involved, that my report be forwarded to:

I have also been informed that detection was made by Belgian-Semmerzeke radar(array type-military), Belgian-Glons radar(multipurpose impulsion type) and German-Vedem-radar. All observations were made by skilled operatives.

These radar stations are part of an 80 station radar complex that extends throughout Europe and are part of the North American Treaty Organisation Air Defence Ground Environment.

All of the detections of these radar stations are coordinated.

We are part of the North American Treaty Organisation Air Defence Ground Environment and of the same radar complex.

The Ministry of Defence must therefore have been aware of the many radar detections by these three radar stations, and of the 13 contacts made by the F-16 interceptor aircraft which were vectored to their targets by the three main radar stations involved.

In view of:- 1) the statement by the radar technologist involved stating that radar will only positively detect a radar wavelength or an object of opacity and substance.

2) The statement concerning - on two occasions - prior warning by radar to a civil airliner, of an object that was witnessed by three aircrew members

3) I would be interested in your observations as to whether you agree with statement 1). Whether you will confirm that the MOD have never had an unidentified radar return as advised in statement 2) And how you would qualify your comments in your letter D/Sec(AS)12/3 of the 24/2/93) that-concerning the Belgian incidents and the detections by three NATO radar stations that -'there was only ONE reference to radar'

Thank you for your letter dated 20 September.

I am not able to shed any light on the jets that were seen in the vicinity of a UFO on 4 September. I am aware that a colleague checked to see whether any military aircraft were in the area at the time, and that no record of any such activity was found. There are no further checks that I can make.

You asked again about our views on the UFO sightings on 30/31 March; I can confirm that these sightings remain unexplained (but not necessarily unexplainable - an important distinction). However, our only reason for looking at UFO sightings at all is to look for evidence of any threat to the UK, and as I explained when you telephoned yesterday, we could not say that there was a threat until we had positive evidence. To date, we have received no such evidence, and given that this is the case, I do not believe there are any grounds for us to carry out further research or investigation. I can assure you, however, that all UFO reports are carefully studied, and that we are open-minded in our approach.

I was interested to hear about the spate of UFO sightings in the Taunton area on 3 August, and, as promised, I have attached a copy of the report we have that might tie-in with these sightings. I have deleted personal details of the witnesses (a husband and wife) in the usual way, but have written to them explaining your interest, and inviting them to contact you if they so wish. I have attached a blank copy of the form we use to take details of UFO sightings, to assist you in interpreting the report I have sent.

Finally, when we spoke, I promised to send you an address for NASA, so that you can ask for some information about SETI. The address is as follows:

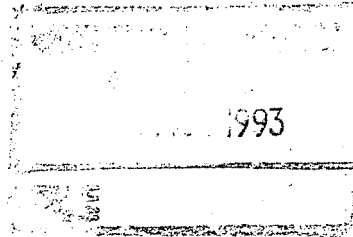

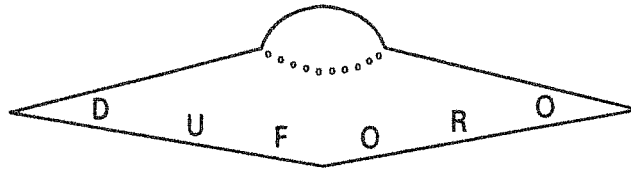

As you may have heard, during your absence on holiday (which I trust was both enjoyable and restful) there has been yet another mini wave of sightings here in the westcountry.

During August there were two sightings of a pair of 'cigar shaped' objects. The first occurred at 0810hrs on the 7th and was reported by a lady from Taunton, Somerset. The two were seen moving slowly towards the northwest, one behind the other. The second sighting was reported from St Agnes, Cornwall, also by a lady, but in company with her sister. In this case the objects were seen at 13.10hrs on the 10th and were again moving very slowly and in formation one behind the other. My case reports on these sightings are enclosed for your perusal. (Case no 932).

On the 4th September, a man from Bristol reported seeing a single 'cigar shaped' object moving fast towards the east. The sighting occurred at approx 05.30hrs and the object was reported as being very large and in a vertical mode rather than horizontal! A few seconds after the sighting the same man and his next door neighbour observed 7 or 8 fighter jet aircraft approach from different directions and converge east of Bristol, they then appeared to follow or chase the 'unknown'. I have already made enquiries at your office regarding the presence of these 'jets', but was informed by a gentleman,

(name unknown) that there is no record of these aircraft over Bristol on the day in question. Could you please double check this for me, as both my witnesses are adamant that these were 'jet fighters' and were definitely pursuing the 'object'.

Whilst writing, I wonder if I could bother you with another problem. This goes back to the extraordinary events over Cornwall, Devon and Somerset on March 30th / 31st this year. (My case No 933 refers)

Reading back through my correspondence on this case, I particularly note that in your letter to me, dated 28th May '93, you say in your last paragraph, and I quote " personally I agree that while the decay of Cosmos 2238 might explain the high level 1.10am sightings, it would not explain the other sightings on the night in question"

Am I to assume then, that the other objects seen and reported upon, which I definitely believe were ufos - and that does not necessarily mean 'alien spacecraft', are by virtue of the fact that they are unexplainable, considered by yourself to be unidentified flying objects or unidentified aircraft? If they are thought to be one of these, what is the MoD or our Government doing about them?

Secondly, whilst in correspondence with **Section 40** **Section 40** of Valencia, Spain, he kindly sent me a photo copy of your letter to him dated 25th August '93. **Section 40** has for reasons best known to himself, taken a great interest in the events of this night, (March 30th/31st) and is, I believe, pursuing these events most vigorously! However, I digress. My question is this and again I refer to your letter and in particular paragraph three, in which you say " we are not able to make a positive identification of what was seen and could draw no firm conclusions, and that this fascinating wave of sightings remains unexplainable". Again this begs a question! If you are unable to make any positive identification of these objects, and I assume that you do believe that my witnesses are telling the truth and that there was something unknown around on this night, what are the authorities doing about them / it?

This does raise some very serious questions. If there are unidentified objects traversing our skies, be they ufo related or otherwise, surely somebody in authority ought to be investigating them - or are they?

Has the Minister of Defence been notified of these events and if so what action is he taking?

I realise the answers to these questions may not be part of your brief, and by saying that I'm not being discourteous, but I really do think that somebody should address them.

If you or your office are unable to answer these questions, could you possibly let me know to whom I should write.

INVESTIGATION REPORT

Case No: 935 & 935A

Case Name or Reference; 'Axminster & Packsaddle Sightings'

Introduction

Although the following reports occurred on different dates they are considered to be sufficiently similar in nature to warrant them as a dual event, possible of the same object.

The first event (Case No 935) occurred on the 14th May 1993 and was reported by Section 40 lives at Section 40

Section 40 Axminster, Devon. This is an older style terraced cottage, virtually in the centre of Axminster. Because of its location; the rear and only garden of the property does not afford its occupants a very good view of the surrounding area. At 10.40pm on the day in question Section 40 had gone out in the garden to smoke a cigarette and upon looking up noticed a bright light approaching from the S.W. He estimated its height to be between 10,000' and 20,000' and at an elevation of about 75 degrees to the horizon. On its approach Section 40 describes its speed as faster than a jet aircraft and on a consistent course. As the object reached a position right above his garden - it suddenly stopped. This action rather startled Section 40 as although he was unable to identify the object he really hadn't considered it to be anything other than perhaps a high flying aircraft or even possibly a satellite.

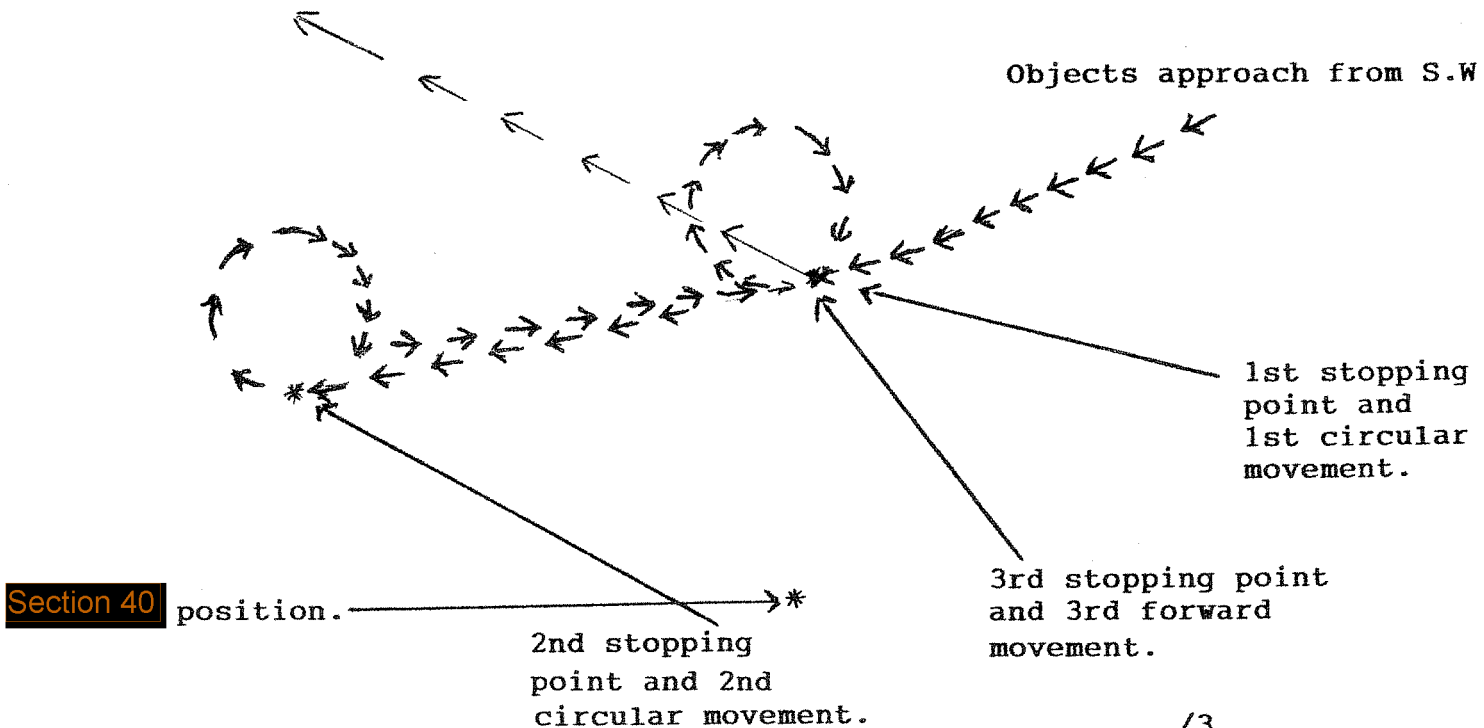
The object remained stationary for for a few seconds, then performed a forward motion going into a anti- clockwise circle and returning to its former position.

After another slight pause, the object then shot forward approx 2 or 3 miles and again stopped abruptly. It then performed another circular motion stopping at its second position and after a short pause returned to its approx first position over the garden. At this point it once again performed another circular motion and again stopped dead. It then moved forward very fast and disappeared towards the S.E.- ascending very fast. During its flight from its first stationary position to its second **Section 40** called to his wife **Section 40** who came out and witnessed the second and final movements of the object and its departure.

Both witnesses described the object as about the size of a new five pence piece at arms length and agreed that the object appeared oval in shape and although described as a bright self luminous object appeared to be tinged with an orange / reddish colour. Neither **Section 40** or **Section 40** could identify the object, but they are certain it was not an aircraft or a helicopter. In all the sighting lasted approx 1½ minutes and needless to say left both witnesses more than a little puzzled.

The second event (Case no 935'A') occurred on the 6th July 1993 and was reported by Section 40 lives at Section 40 Falmouth, Cornwall. Although situated amongst a large number of other properties, Section 40 house is in an elevated position that affords him a good view of the surrounding area. At 11.18pb on the night, Section 40 (just as Section 40 did at Axminster) went out into his garden for a smoke. Suddenly he saw an object appear from over the top of his house and moving at a high speed. It was 'Ice Blue' in colour and again was described as about the size of a new pence piece at arms length. As Section 40 watched the object, it suddenly stopped in mid air and remained stationary for a few seconds. It then moved forward in a zig-zag motion and then shot forward and upwards at a tremendous speed towards the S.E. During its forward movement Section 40 called to his son Section 40 and a friend Section 40 who both witnessed the objects departure. Whilst stationary Section 40 estimated the object to have been 60 degrees to the horizon, but on its departure ascended towards the moon! As in the Axminster sighting, none of the witnesses were able to identify the object and as with the Section 40 are completely mystified by the event.

Investigation

On the evening of Friday 28th May 1993, I travelled to Axminster to meet and interview Section 40 and Section 40. I was accompanied by my wife Section 40 who fortunately takes an interest in my chosen hobby and has, as I call it 'a nose for things'! On our arrival at their home Section 40 and Section 40 made us most welcome and very soon we were engaged in some very serious but relaxed conversation Section 40 had spent some time in the army and had served with the Life Guards, so because of my military background we had something in common.

At the present time **Section 40** is self employed as a **Section 40** **Section 40** whilst **Section 40** is busy at home looking after their baby son.

Once we had gone through the details of their sightings, **Section 40** took me out into the back garden to view his outlook from there. The rear of the property faces south and is virtually unobstructed to the south and south west. His easterly and south easterly view is somewhat restricted by adjacent buildings, but he still has a good view of the sky from approx 20 degrees upwards.

Section 40 explained how he noticed the objects approach and how amazed he was to see it stop in mid air. He described the stopping movement as extraordinary and couldn't see how an aircraft or anything else for that matter could perform this feat. He then described the objects circular aerobatics and its movement between them **Section 40** estimate of the objects height (between 10,000' and 20,000') is I believe fairly conservative and having discussed this with him and assessing the sightings, I believe its height was in excess of 20,000' and probably nearer 30,000', but this is pure speculation on my part! Even if the object was at 20,000', then from the size of the object given by **Section 40** i.e. a new five pence piece, then the object must have been of considerable size **Section 40** who only saw the objects second and third circular movements and its departure, agrees with **Section 40** estimates viz - height. size etc and like him is completely baffled by its presence and flying abilities.

Section 40 and **Section 40** are, I believe, quite truthful in their report and can see no reason why they should report an occurrence of this kind unless it happened! It's my belief that this event did take place, and in the way described, and that their sighting may well have connections with the second report from Packsaddle, Cornwall.

This sighting occurred on the 6th July 1993 and it has many similarities to the Axminster sighting. My investigation into this sighting has been mainly by telephone, but with the added advantage of seeing Section 40 and his family being interviewed on local TV concerning this event.

Section 40

As with Section 40 sighting Section 40 had gone outside into his back garden for a smoke. It was 11.18pm and being a clear night Section 40 was taking in the late evening sky. Suddenly he became aware of a brightly lit object appearing over the top of his house and moving very fast. It was on a S.E. course and at a great height. He estimated the distance of the object from him to be a 'few miles' and at an elevation of 60 degrees to the horizon.

Whilst watching the objects progress, it suddenly came to a stop and remained stationary for a few seconds. It then moved forward in a zig-zag movement, for approx 20 seconds and then descended very fast towards the S.E. almost as if it was heading towards the moon!

During its forward movement Section 40 was able to call out to his son Section 40 and his friend Section 40 who both witnessed the objects departure.

From my conversations with Section 40 and the TV report, I see no reason to disbelieve this sighting and do think the report given is accurate. Section 40 estimates that he had the object in view for some two minutes, sufficient time, I think for him to have fully appreciated and noted most if not all of the details. Both Section 40 son and his friend have verified the sighting and all are equally puzzled by what they saw.

Conclusions

From the descriptions of these sightings, it is fairly obvious that what was seen on these two nights was not a conventional aircraft or helicopter. No aircraft to my knowledge, and this includes the Harrier Jump Jet, can suddenly stop in mid air from this sort of speed. In addition, I don't believe that an aircraft could perform the type of aerobatics described by the witnesses. Because of the sudden stopping of these 'crafts' it is also reasonable to assume they were not Satellites.

Fireballs, Bolides or any other known natural phenomenon.

This being the case - what were they?

They can of course be simply classified as 'Unidentified Flying Objects' - as this they surely were, but into what category do we place them.

Are they 'alien space ships' piloted by 'alien beings' or some advanced form of air/space craft developed here on earth?

Maybe the answer lies somewhere between the two!

During the last couple of years or so, there has been much speculation about the existence of captured 'Flying Saucers'. This obviously relates to the so called Roswell incident of 1948. If, and I only say if, the USAF is in possession of some alien space craft, then it is quite possible that they have been subjected to some very intensive back engineering and as a result are now being flown by them. It's also possible, I suppose, that these craft could be piloted by their original crews - but I think that's best left well alone for the time being.

The reason for this speculation is of course the stories emanating from America and the now infamous Area 51 scenario. I recently obtained a tape recording, made in the USA from a program called 'For the People'. On this tape some well intended and apparently well informed person, is heard disclosing recent events and some film footage taken of these events over Area 51 (Groomlake) which depicts brightly coloured

objects rising from behind some mountains and traversing the sky at great speed. They are then seen to hover and move forward in a zig-zag motion before moving away at great speed. If these reports are genuine, then this must open up a debate as to whether these objects are being flown outside the US and if so, are they being seen in the skies over Britain.

Both the objects mentioned in this report were seen to approach from the N.W., which may indicate that they came from across the Atlantic - travelled north of Ireland before crossing the S.W. of England.

As stated earlier this is only speculation, but without further evidence as to the objects origins, make-up or mode of operation, there is little else to go on.

There is no doubt in my mind that the reports given by **Section 40** **Section 40** and **Section 40** are genuine, and that what they witnessed cannot be explained by any known natural phenomenon.

The ariel performance by these objects is to say the least quite remarkable, and if they do turn out to be some form of advance air/space craft made on this earth, then perhaps the billions of dollars being spent on the so called 'Black Budget' may some day be justified!

INVESTIGATION REPORT - CASE NO: 938

Case Name or Reference ' Taunton / St Agnes Sightings'
(August 1993)

Introduction

Although two days apart both these sightings are so similar in nature and description that there is undoubtedly a connection between them.

Both concern the sighting of 'two cigar shaped objects' traversing the skies above Taunton, Somerset and St Agnes, Cornwall, in what appears to be an identical flight pattern.

The first sighting was personally reported to me by Section 40 who lives in Taunton. Section 40 is an employee in one of the shops, within the shopping centre that Section 40.

Knowing of my interest in ufos, she related her sighting to me, appreciating that if nothing else she would not be ridiculed or thought of as a fool etc. I have known Section 40 for the best part of three years and have always considered her to be an honest and trustworthy person. because of this, I believe her sighting to be quite genuine, and can actually corroborate part of her report myself - which is as follows:-

At approx 8.15am on Saturday 7th August 1993 Section 40 was standing at a bus stop near her home, awaiting her bus to take her to work. She was alone and on looking up at the sky noticed a rather extraordinary number of aircraft vapour trails. Although it is not unusual to see vapour trails, it did seem to her that there was rather a lot of them and more importantly they appeared to be criss-crossing the sky - every which way. Their configuration reminded her of a ball of wool having been undone and

left untidily laying about. Whilst looking at them she noticed an aircraft travelling northwards and heading away from Taunton. As the aircraft disappeared from sight, she then saw two cigar shaped objects, one following the other, moving very slowly across the sky in a northerly direction. Because of their speed she was able to watch them for nearly five minutes. She described them as silver in colour and reflecting the early morning sun. They appeared to be about 30' apart and at a height slightly lower than the aircraft previously seen. She estimated each object to be about 1½" in length - at arms length. They were at an elevation of about 70° to the horizon, but **Section 40** was unable to judge their distance from her. At approx 8.20am **Section 40** bus arrived and she then lost sight of the objects.

On this particular morning, I arrived in Taunton at approx 7.55am and whilst parking my car, I happened to look up at the sky and noticed the rather large number of vapour trails. Being in the west,, the sky above Taunton, particularly on Saturdays, does get very busy and vapour trails are not uncommon. However, on this morning there was an extraordinary number of them and were as I would expect them to be mainly from east to west (west to east), there were a number that criss-crossed the sky and indeed some seemed to have approached from one direction and joined then followed some others. The impression I got, was that a number of aircraft had converged on one another and then headed away northwards!

The second sighting came from a police officer - **Section 40** serves with the Devon & Cornwall Police Force. At 1pm on Tuesday 10th August 1993, **Section 40** (Fiance) and her sister **Section 40** were driving along the B3285 east of Goonhavern, Cornwall, when they noticed to the S.W. two objects flying or moving S.Easterly. They appeared to be about 5 or 6 miles away and in line, one behind the other, moving very slowly and appeared to be on a predetermined course **Section 40** described them as silver / white in colour and at arms length about the

size of a cigarette. She estimated that they were between 45° to 60° to the horizon and that they (Section 40 and her sister) had the objects in sight for for about ten minutes. This obviously indicates a fairly slow speed, and if Section 40 estimate of the objects lengths are correct, then they must have been fairly large!

Investigation and Conclusions

Because of my very heavy work load (Business and UFOs), I have not been able to investigate these sightings in any great depth.

Fortunately, because of my close work association with Section 40 I have been able to interview her firsthand. From her report and from what she has told me of the event, I feel that what she saw on this morning was certainly out of the ordinary. She is, I'm sure, able to identify aircraft when she sees them and other natural aerial objects such as - Hot Air Balloons, Helicopters, Gliders etc. Given the distance of the objects from her, it is conceivable that they may have been some type of aircraft! If they were, they would most probably have been some military type flying in formation and also quite possibly carrying out a re-fueling operation! This is of course merely speculation on my part, but could I believe be one explanation.

What concerns me or rather I should say intrigues me, is the extraordinary number of vapour trails that morning. Only last week, I received a report of the sighting of a single cigar shaped object over Bristol on Saturday 4th September 1993. The object was travelling very fast in an easterly direction and a few seconds after being seen, a number of fighter aircraft (7 or 8) were also seen. The jets arrived from all compass points and converged east of Bristol and appeared to be chasing the Ufo! Inquiries to the MOD (Air) of course produced no results, but this is being followed up by letter. (Case No 9313 to follow, refers).

Both ladies are adamant that there were no 'wings' or other 'appendages' affixed or associated with these objects, which does indicate that they were not any known conventional aircraft. Given the spate of ufo sightings in the west county over the last few months, it is reasonable to assume that these objects may have been ufos of some description or other.

Although all the objects were 'cigar shaped' there is of course the possibility that they were in fact 'disc shaped' and seen from an angle or side view. Again this is speculation, but as the object seen over Bristol on the 4th September was observed in a 'vertical' mode and not 'horizontal', then all things are possible.

In conclusion, although I have to say that there is the possibility that these objects may have been aircraft, and if so, probably military, I do feel that what was seen on these two days and also on the 4th September over Bristol, were definitely unidentifiable by the sighters, and must, for the time being anyway, be classified as 'unknowns'.

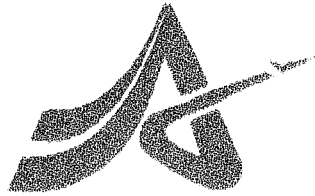

The authorities at RAF St Mawgan have passed me details of the report you made concerning the strange white lights that you saw in the sky recently, as we co-ordinate reports of UFO sightings in this country. Our only concern is to establish whether or not there is a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. Unless we find evidence of such a threat - and this has not been the case so far - we do not attempt to investigate further, or to identify what was seen.

While it is clear from the reports we receive that there are many strange things seen in the sky, we believe that explanations could be found for most of them. If you do believe that what you saw cannot be explained in terms of known objects or phenomena, you might like to contact some of the civilian organisations currently engaged in the study and investigation of UFOs. These organisations may be able to offer some further thoughts on what you saw, or tie in your sighting with other reports they may have received. I suggest the following societies:

Thank you for your letter dated 17 September, in which you asked about official interest in the crop circle phenomenon.

As you suspected, there is no real interest in crop circles. We do co-ordinate reports of UFO sightings in this country (where our role is to check that there is no evidence of any threat to the UK - no such evidence has emerged to date), so because of the perceived link between these two phenomena, we do get enquiries from the public about crop circles from time to time. Having said this, we have no formal remit on the subject, and have never carried out any research or investigation. We will refer members of the public who ask about crop circles to organisations such as the Centre for Crop Circle Studies and Circles Phenomenon Research International. We have also told these organisations, together with UFO groups such as BUFORA, that we are interested in seeing the results of serious research into the crop circle phenomenon. Our reason for doing this is to enable us to deal with public enquiries in an informed way.

Although I have heard the story about alleged discussions between the Ministry of Defence, the Department of the Environment and the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, I am not aware that any meeting ever took place. It may well be that discussions took place between officials who had received letters from the public, in an attempt to decide who should reply! I am aware that two Parliamentary Questions have been tabled by MPs on the subject, and I have attached copies of the relevant extracts from Hansard.

I hope this is helpful, and I wish you the best of luck with the video. Please let me know if you have any further questions.

Helicopters

88. **Sir Michael McNair-Wilson:** To ask the Secretary of State for Defence what low-flying restrictions are imposed on service helicopters.

Mr. Neubert: The general regulations governing the use of the United Kingdom low flying system by fixed-wing aircraft apply also to rotary wing aircraft but with appropriate modifications to take account of their different capabilities.

Railgun

90. **Mr. Wallace:** To ask the Secretary of State for Defence if he will report on the progress of the Railgun project.

Mr. Sainsbury: I refer to the replies that I gave to the hon. Member for Clackmannan (Mr. O'Neil) on 28 June, column 456.

Independent European Programme Group

92. **Mr. Ian Taylor:** To ask the Secretary of State for Defence what progress is being made through the Independent European Programme Group in achieving a more open defence market among North Atlantic Treaty Organisation allies.

Mr. Sainsbury: Significant progress is being made by the Independent European Programme Group towards the creation of an open European defence equipment market, based on measures set out in the action plan approved by Ministers at the Luxembourg meeting in November 1988. At their subsequent meeting in Lisbon on 28 June this year, Ministers reviewed the steps being taken to achieve the key objectives. The central feature of the open market is the dissemination to potential suppliers of information about bidding opportunities. To this end, Governments have now nominated one or more focal points to which companies in other Independent European Programme Group countries can register interest in bidding for defence contracts. Countries have also agreed to publish contracts bulletins by the turn of the year. The bulletins will be similar to those already issued by the United Kingdom and France. This more open market will bring benefits to all participating states. It will also be of considerable value to the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation as a whole by enhancing efficient procurement and thereby strengthening the European contribution to the Alliance. With this in mind the Independent European Programme Group will continue to discourage any protectionist tendencies on either side of the Atlantic. Another important initiative which complements the open market is the creation of a European technology plan—to be known as Euclid—which will foster co-operation in research among Independent European Programme Group nations. During its current chairmanship of the Independent European Programme Group, the United Kingdom's aim will be to ensure that the work of the group is taken forward effectively in the best interests of all the allies.

Toxic Waste

Dr. Thomas: To ask the Secretary of State for Defence if, pursuant to his reply to the hon. Member for Newport,

West (Mr. Flynn), *Official Report*, 19 June, column 60, on toxic waste at Ministry of Defence premises, he will give the reason why it is not the practice to release details of such materials; and if he will consider revising his policy towards publication in line with the practice adopted by United States military facilities.

Mrs. Wise: To ask the Secretary of State for Defence what is the basis for his policy not to disclose details of radioactive and toxic waste stored or disposed of at Ministry of Defence premises.

Mr. Sainsbury: Disclosure of such information could indicate the scale and nature of operations in certain programmes on which detailed revelation would not be in the national interest.

Fuel Containers (Devon)

Mr. Speller: To ask the Secretary of State for Defence if he will make a statement on the circumstances in which two 10ft x 2ft fuel containers were dropped at Stowford Cross in North Devon on Thursday 29 June; and what steps he is taking to prevent this happening in the future.

Mr. Neubert: The fuel containers in question were jettisoned by a Royal Navy Sea Harrier operating from the Royal Naval air station at Yeovilton, while the aircraft was on an air combat training exercise. The aircraft unintentionally went into a spin and the pilot, following the correct procedures, released the fuel tanks as part of his spin recovery action. The fuel tanks were empty at the time. A local investigation has established that the pilot was not in breach of any regulations.

To minimise the risk to the public, air combat training is carried out over the least populated areas available and always well away from towns and cities. It is also very rare for a Sea Harrier to enter into a spin in this way. The risk therefore of a repetition of this incident or of any consequent injury to persons on the ground is considered to be remote.

Cereal Fields

Mr. Teddy Taylor: To ask the Secretary of State for Defence what progress has been made in the inquiries initiated by Army helicopters based in the south-west in investigating the origin of flattened circular areas of wheat; and if he will make a statement.

Mr. Neubert: The Ministry of Defence is not conducting any inquiries into the origins of flattened circular areas of crops. However, we are satisfied that they are not caused by service helicopter activity.

Service Children Education Authority

Mr. Key: To ask the Secretary of State for Defence how many children currently attend schools run by the service children education authority in (a) north-west Europe, (b) Gibraltar, (c) Hong Kong, (d) Cyprus and (e) elsewhere.

Kurt Waldheim

Mr. Andrew Mitchell: To ask the Secretary of State for Defence when he will publish the results of the review of the 1986 investigation into the fate of captive British servicemen and the possible involvement of the then Lieutenant Waldheim.

Mr. Archie Hamilton: My right hon. Friend the Prime Minister announced on 16 February 1988 that a review would be undertaken of the results of the investigation carried out in 1986 by the Ministry of Defence into the fate of British servicemen and the possible involvement of the then Lieutenant Waldheim. This was in the light, of both the report of the Commission set up by the Austrian Government, which had access to a wider range of sources than those available for the 1986 investigation, and of the continued questioning of Lieutenant Waldheim's role. Her Majesty's Government have now conducted most thorough inquiries into the allegations concerning his role in areas of specific British interest. The results of this review have been recorded in a report, which I have placed to-day in the Library of the House, and which is being published by HMSO.

The review has been solely concerned with areas of British interest and has centred on the cases of British servicemen, mostly members of the special forces, captured between October 1943 and October 1944 in Greece and the Greek islands under the control of the German Army Group E, in whose headquarters Lieutenant Waldheim was then serving as a junior staff officer. These cases, covering over 80 British servicemen, include both those brought to the attention of the Ministry of Defence and others identified during the research for this review. The review has not looked at other allegations concerning Lieutenant Waldheim's involvement in areas not related to British interests.

The review has involved long and painstaking research. The historical evidence and the documents gathered have been examined and analysed by the director of Army legal services who is well versed in the laws of war and who retains a residual responsibility for the prosecution of war crimes. His duty is to examine the evidence that has been put before him and advise whether, on that evidence, there is a case for a potential accused to answer. After very careful consideration his conclusion concerning the then Lieutenant Waldheim is that there is no evidence from which guilt of a war crime might be inferred.

The report indicates that Lieutenant Waldheim knew of the capture of the British service men and the possible fate of "Commandos", but no evidence has come to light to indicate that as a junior staff officer he had the power either to order or to prevent that fate or indeed to affect the outcome in any way. Knowledge in such circumstances is not itself a crime. Her Majesty's Government have accepted the findings of the report.

The report also deals with British knowledge of Lieutenant Waldheim's wartime role and the post-war handling of relevant records. Allegations that records were altered, destroyed or withheld to protect President Waldheim are shown to be unfounded. He was not wanted by the United Kingdom either as a "top Nazi" or as a war criminal. In order to clarify these issues virtually all the most relevant papers have been included as annexes to the report. A very few documents have either not been published or not in full, on the ground of security or personal sensitivity. All these documents have been examined by Professor Sir Harry Hinsley, lately the Master of St. John's college, Cambridge, who agreed to scrutinise the results of the review in order to ensure its objectivity and thoroughness. I draw the House's attention to his statement in the report, in which he vouches for the validity of the conclusions drawn from these documents. On the question of President Waldheim's alleged post-war involvement with foreign intelligence services and his election to the United Nations, I do not intend to break the practice of successive Governments by commenting on such matters but I commend detailed consideration of the report.

Research has concentrated on the main archives in this country, in Germany and America, but other archives were consulted, as well as individuals whose wartime service was of relevance or who had some other expertise to offer. Although it can never be said that any historic report is definitively the last word, I am satisfied that the investigation has produced, from the thousands of documents examined, what we believe to be the main relevant records. These have established a pattern showing the events, and the responsibilities of the German headquarters' officers involved in those events. We therefore feel justified in bringing this long exercise to a conclusion now, and publishing the results.

A factor in this decision has been the need to consider the feelings of the relatives of the missing service men. I very much regret that it has not been possible to resolve all the outstanding questions about what finally happened to the missing service men, although I should like to assure the House that any further information that may come to light will be passed on to the families.

Cornfield Circles

Mr. Colvin: To ask the Secretary of State for Defence whether any official assistance has been given by service personnel to civilians investigating the origin of cornfield circles in Hampshire and Wiltshire; and if he will make a statement.

Mr. Archie Hamilton: I am not aware of any official assistance having been given by service personnel to civilians investigating the origin of crop circles.

Defence Technology Enterprises Limited

Mr. Sillars: To ask the Secretary of State for Defence how many licences have been arranged by Defence Technology Enterprises Ltd.; and how many recipients are companies registered in Scotland.

Mr. Neubert: Defence Technology Enterprises Ltd. has arranged 38 licences. Two are with companies registered in Scotland.

Thank you for sending me a copy of Working Paper 12/93 which concerns UFO sightings in the Ramsey area.

I received the basic details of Section 40 sighting shortly after the first report was made, and have already written to him, setting out the MOD's policy and views on UFOs. I received one further report from the Ramsey area; although the details were vague, the sighting occurred in the early hours of 4 August.

I agree with your conclusion that helicopter activity seems to be the most likely explanation. We asked RAF Alconbury whether or not they were operating helicopters in the Benwick area at the times concerned, but they have advised that they were not. Of course, it may well be that some other helicopter (such as a police helicopter) was involved.

I thought it might be useful if I explained our role in relation to UFO sightings; essentially, our only reason for being involved at all is to ensure that there is no threat to the defence of the UK. We, together with other specialist staffs, look at all UFO reports carefully, to look for evidence of any such threat. To date we have found no such evidence. Most of the reports we receive are fairly vague, and refer to little more than a vague light or shape in the sky. Clearly there is little we can do with such reports. Where a report is more interesting (either because of the description of the object and its behaviour, or in cases where many witnesses are involved) we will make further enquiries. You stated that you would normally expect JARIC to action such a case; while I know that they could be asked to examine any interesting UFO photographs that we may be sent, I was not aware that they had a day-to-day role in investigating sightings. Perhaps you would let me know what the position is.

Although I do not believe we can take any further action with regard to these specific sightings, your report has highlighted some confusion about how UFO reports should be handled. RAF bases, police stations and civil airports should all have standard forms for the reporting of sightings, but the system does not work as well as it might. This is clearly illustrated by the fact that RAF Wyton assumed the report to be a crank call, and cut Section 40 off. We intend to review the existing system, and promulgate advice on the handling of UFO reports.

UFO OVER BENWICK, CAMBS ON 26 JUL 93
REPORTED SIGHTING, ACTIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

Introduction

1. This note records the reporting of UFO activity in the Ramsey area of Cambridge in Jul and Aug 93. The report was actioned through official channels and formal acknowledgement of the sighting has been made to the principal individual involved. Some possible explanations based on the descriptions of the sighting are made.

Initial Report

2. On the morning of the 26 Jul 93 an attempt was made to report, over the telephone to RAF Wyton, a UFO sighting. The operator took it to be a crank/hoax call and terminated the contact. The caller then phoned RAF Brampton where the operator accepted the call and used the copy facility so that a tape of the conversation was available for analysis.

3. The telephone report was being made, at 08:15 on the morning of 26 Jul 93, by a [Section 40] of Ramsey, Cambridgeshire, on behalf of his father who was not available to make the call himself. The report can be summarised as follows:

[Section 40] senior [Section 40] so that he often wakes in the night. In the early hours of the morning of 26 Jul 93 he was awake and his attention was drawn to a bright object in the night sky seemingly a few miles to the NNE of his home in Ramsey, in the vicinity of the fen village of Benwick. He then found his 'high powered German' binoculars and focused them on the light. For the next hour or so, accompanied by his wife, he observed the mainship hovering. Initially 2 smaller ships came down. Little lights around the spaceship were seen.'

A full transcript of the telephone report made by [Section 40] is at Annex A.

4. After hearing the tape of this initial call I rang [Section 40] junior back to ask if he had anything else to add and volunteered to process the inquiry. (Note that action would probably have been requested of JARIC staff but in their absence, on stand down, the inquiry was picked up by Research Branch, HQRAFSC.) I contacted the radar unit at RAF Wyton to see if they had any record of anything unusual some 12-15 miles N-NNE of their location. Unfortunately the radar was not manned at the time (03:15 to 04:45 on 26 Jul 93) so I was given a West Drayton contact. Eastern Radar of London ATC took details from me and said they would action it through official MOD channels.

5. On the morning of the 27 Jul 93 I spoke by telephone with [Section 40] senior and explained the action taken. He confirmed the original details except that his version was that "2 things shot out of the side of it" when first seen and described it as "a saucer with lattice work". He then went on to claim that whilst in the local doctors' waiting room on the evening of the 26th he discussed the sighting with an elderly farm worker who was also waiting. Apparently this individual was not surprised since he said that an object had come down to within some 50' of him whilst he was working in Pidley village, back in 1983.

6. The map at Figure 1 shows Ramsey, where the sighting was made, and the village of Benwick, the nearest habitation other than individual farms, in the area that the UFO was thought to be hovering over.

Subsequent Report

7. One week later, 2 Aug 93, [Section 40] junior phoned me to say that the sighting had been repeated in the early hours of that morning and this time witnesses had confirmed the observation. A possible explanation was discussed but rejected by [Section 40] junior. [Section 40] senior had received official acknowledgement of his sighting on the 26th, the letter apparently clearing him to take whatever follow up action he desired.

Possible Explanation

8. The initial description of an illuminated object hovering for an hour plus did seem difficult to match with any man-made flying object especially with the claimed saucer shape as seen through binoculars. However, there is a possible answer, as follows:-

The American Air Force operate out of RAF Alconbury some 15 to 20 miles south west of the area of the sighting (see Figure 1). A current type operated is the Sikorsky HH-53 helicopter. The range of this large rescue helicopter can be extended by external fuel tanks. Because of its rescue role there are lights carried and hovering over an accident/incident site is a basic requirement.

9. Consider the situation of flight training in the rescue role. The requirement is for long duration in the hover. Given the extra tanks that can be fitted the idea of hovering for an hour plus is probably feasible. Any combination of struts by which external tanks are attached, the nose flight refuelling probe and the main and tail rotors could explain the 'lattice work' comment. At night the combination of navigation and cabin lighting would make it show up. Given the clear but windy weather in the early hours of the 26th the hover would not be stable and rotation, either about the single main rotor axis or tight circling to stay over the planned ground position means that the fuselage would sweep out a shape other than the actual helicopter fuselage shape (see Figure 2). Use of searchlights could have been seen, at some distance, as 'projections' from the craft. The sighting was over an area of low population density possibly to minimise noise complaints and with the windy conditions the noise may well have been attenuated anyway.

10. The implication that the first sighting disappeared and the second involved a rapid vertical ascent to go out of sight are difficult to explain, but not impossible. If, in the first case, the helicopter departed the area heading directly away from the observers the visible lights would be minimal. In the second case the helicopter could have used its not inconsiderable climb rate, 1000 feet per minute plus and if it went up into the cloud base the sudden disappearance might make it seem faster than it was.

11. The helicopter solution to this sighting can be resolved if the forces at Alconbury are prepared to admit to such training. Alternatively, the evidence of people on the ground at some of those isolated fenland farms could probably confirm the noise from a very large hovering helicopter which would be quite noticeable even if it was at a considerable height above the ground.

Conclusions

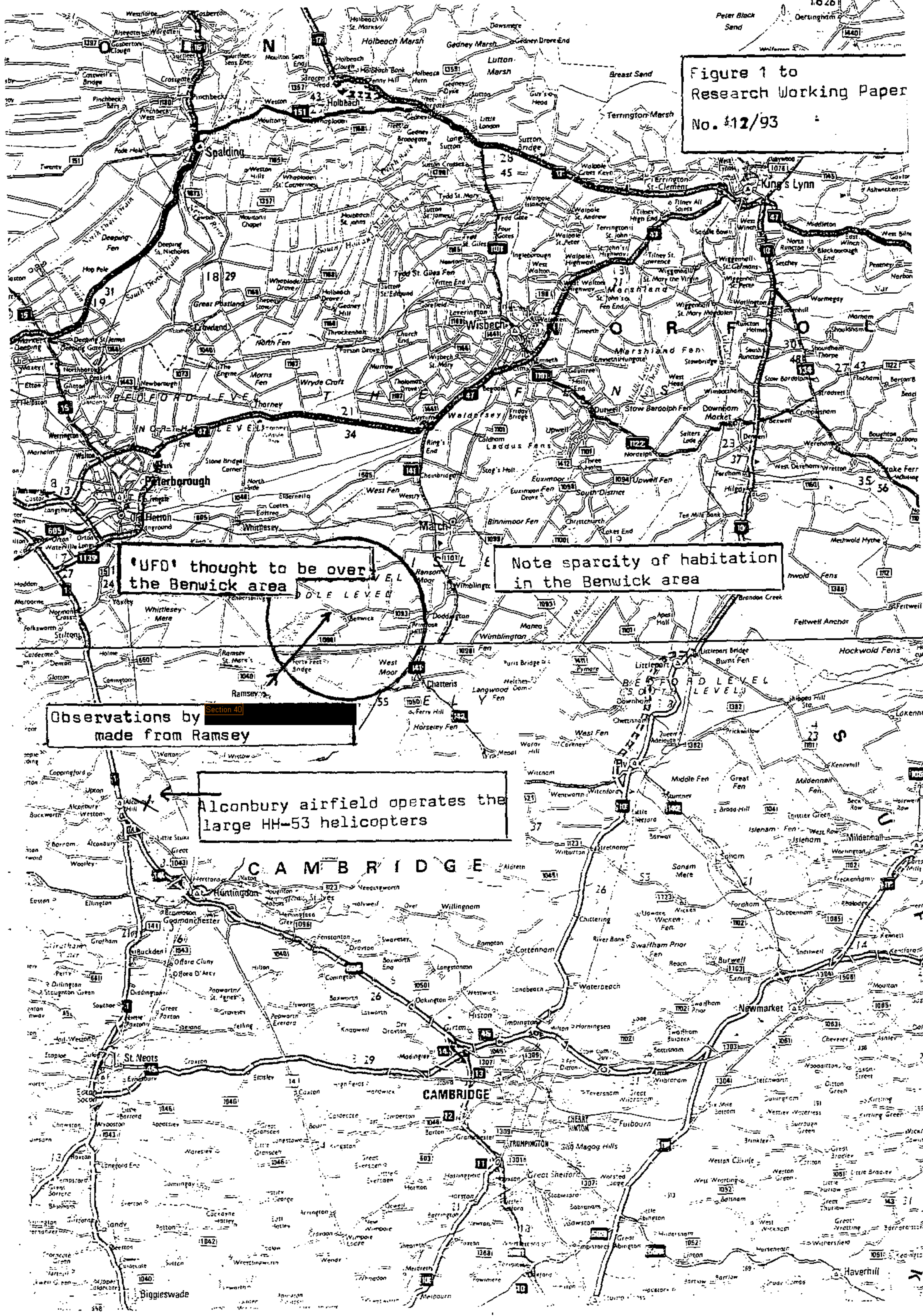
12. The coincidence of this UFO sighting happening close to a base operating the large helicopters that could produce this impression in the sky really means its interpretation as a UFO is unlikely. Only if the American forces deny any such operation and no one can be found to confirm the noise from such a deployment, should this incident be taken as a truly 'Unidentified' flying object.

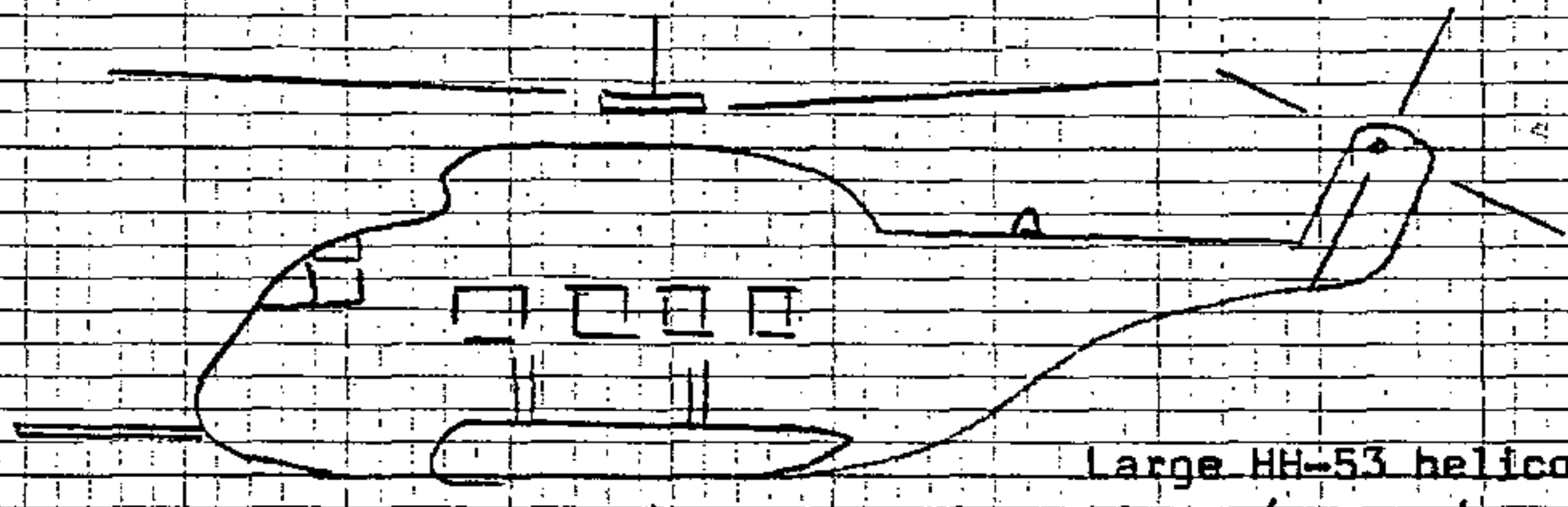

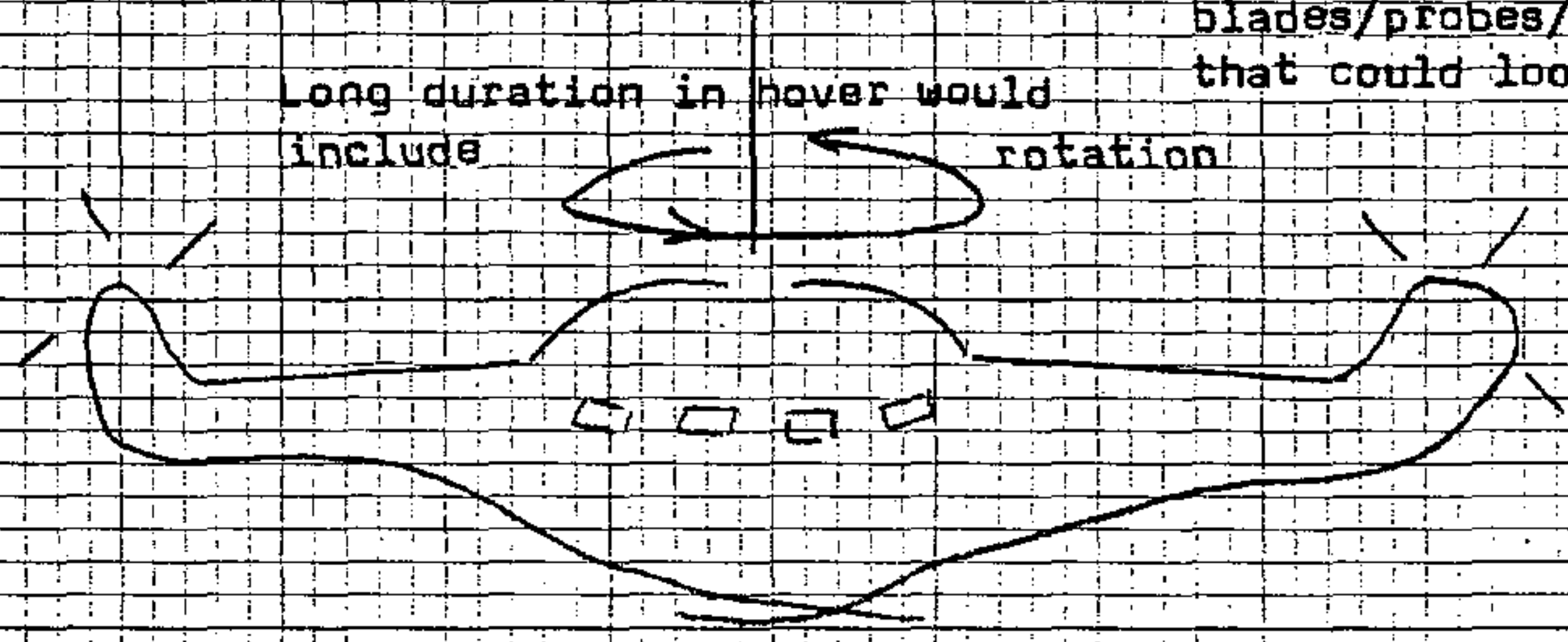

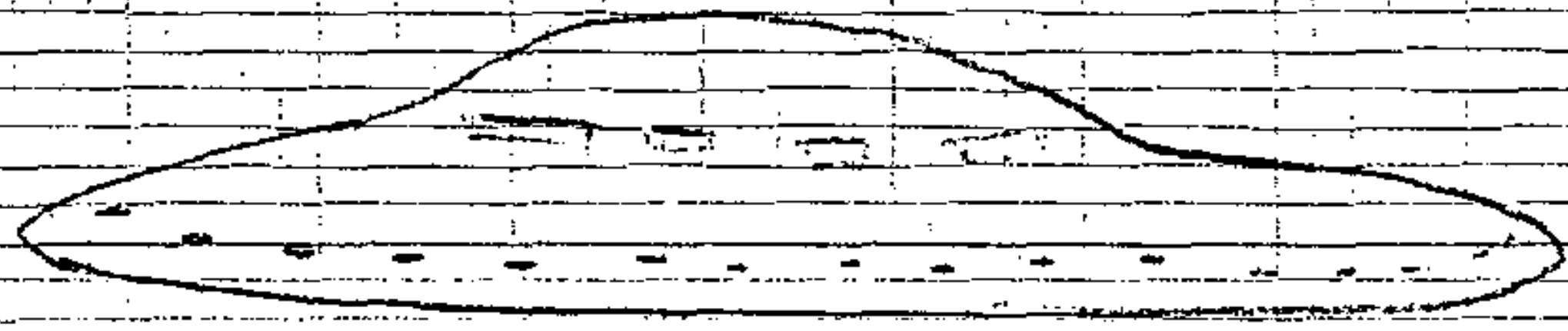

CALLER - The main ship hovered for an hour in the same position, okay, from 3.00 am to about 3.50 am yesterday, but to see the ship properly you had to have a pair of binoculars, okay. It just looked like a light in the sky at the start, okay. When you look through binoculars you can see all the little lights around the outside and windows all round the outside as well. And he said that 2 or 3 other little small ships came off the main one and down, downwards. He didn't see where they went, he just said downwards. So you know, I wondered if you saw anything. I rang Wyton and they just cut me off. I thought you guys might want to know about this stuff.

SWITCHBOARD - Yes, well it is interesting.

CALLER - He is the sanest man you will ever know, honestly. You are not talking to cranks here. We are business people, sane people.

SWITCHBOARD - So, the main ship hovered for an hour?

CALLER - An hour.

SWITCHBOARD - And then 2 smaller ships?

CALLER - Through the naked eye it just looked like a saucer shape of light in the sky but when you looked through binoculars at it you could see all the detail of the ship. He's got a very powerful pair of binoculars. He lives in Ireland, you see, and he looks out to sea through his big binoculars. He looks through them and can see everything.

CALLER - He watched it from 3.15 am to 4.45 am he said.

CALLER - It wasn't actually. We are at Section 40 in the middle of Ramsey. He was looking North through his back window, sort of North East, North East direction. Thank you for your letters dated 9 and 14 September.

Section 40 sighting of a structured craft near the Fosse Way is very interesting, and I must admit that no explanation springs to mind. I agree that the sighting Section 40 describes is less interesting, and I wonder whether what was seen was simply a combination of aircraft landing and navigation lights. We have no reports that tie-in with this sighting. I was interested to see the letter from Section 40. I presume that about the only paper you could send him in relation to his search for "assessment of the situation" reports would be the Air Ministry's 9 August 1952 reply to Winston Churchill's enquiry.

I do not intend to write to any of the above mentioned gentlemen, and with any cases you forward me I will only contact the witness if you give me permission, and advise that the witness is expecting me to get in touch.

I had not appreciated that the Section 40 pilot's sighting took place in the Sixties! Several people mentioned to me that they had heard about a pilot reporting a UFO in very recent media reports, and I assumed that they were talking about a sighting that had just occurred. I do not see why an old report should have been resurrected, unless it was being compared to a recent sighting. I would be happy to meet Section 40 at some stage.

You asked whether any papers detailing liaison between RAF and USAF personnel might have survived. The problem is that, as I explained in my letter dated 4 August, most of our old UFO files were destroyed because it was felt that the subject was not important enough to justify their retention. Having said this, a few files did survive (whether this was an accident, or whether a deliberate decision was made by a PRO archivist I do not know) and it may be that other files survived. If they do, I am not aware of them. The only suggestion I have is that any such papers might be on a "non-UFO file". I suspect you have already thought of this, but I can only suggest a bit of lateral thinking, perhaps starting with files (if there are any) covering RAF/USAF liaison.

Finally Section 40 and I were grateful for your kind invitation, and would be delighted to join you and your girlfriend one evening. Most of October is free, so perhaps you would give me a call so we can decide on a date.

I have just finished reading Alien Update, which I found to be quite impressive, and should like to contribute an article for your next book in this series. It was a result of reading Above Top Secret that led me to realize that as an eye witness to one of the few really compelling UFO events, I should write a description of what really happened. I am referring to the well-known UFO flap over Washington, D. C. in July 1952. As a native of the capital I was there during this entire period, and can assure you that both the behaviour of the UFOs, probably their numbers, and certainly the response of the U. S. armed forces, have been totally misrepresented.

It is really amazing that Ufologists, who are very adept skeptics, have repeated the Governments propaganda with no thought as to how improbable it sounds. The report that the government sent one airplane from an air base in Delaware 100 miles away as its only response is a lie. The assertion that a plane had to be sent from such a distance because "the" runway at Andrews air force base was being repaired is obviously absurd. 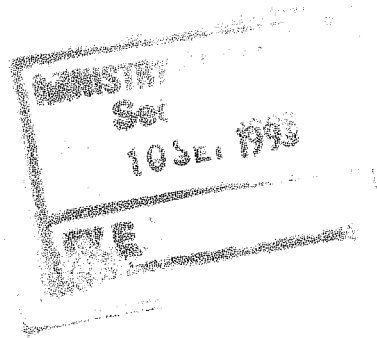

Dear Sir,

Some years ago now whilst I lived in Dewizes, Wiltshire I wrote to you detailing a number of UFO sightings I have personally experienced and I was delighted you took the trouble to reply (considering you must doubtless be very busy). Since that time my sightings have been very few and far between but I would like to now give you details of a particularly exciting UFO which I saw this morning as I drove to work in Leamington Spa, some seven miles away.

It was along the Fosse Way I drove and was about 5.45 AM. There was good clear visibility and it was getting quite light. As I drove along, a bright object out of the corner of my eye caught my attention and I looked toward it, to my left, and was amazed at the object's clear definition, i.e. there was absolutely no mistaking what it was I was looking at.

Of all the UFOs I have previously seen, none have been so clear as this. It was, I suppose, a typical shape or design and I could clearly see its details. On its top was a small round thing, and there seemed to be a strong light pulsating at its left side and beneath it - this light

was a bright white colour. The object gave off the impression to me that it was of some considerable size and its distance from me is extremely hard to estimate, although I would hazard two miles or so - even so, it really was very clear and stood out against the darker blue horizon.

I had to pull over into a lay-by for a better view. After a few moments above a little further to a rise where I had an excellent view. The object was moving very gently from one side to another and I recall my feelings at that very moment were that it was surveying or somehow gathering information, such was its seemingly meticulous searching or hovering. It moved up, then back down again, left to right then visa versa, and then began tilting from side to side.

The object appeared to be constructed of a very, very highly polished silvery metal. I really have no idea of size, as mentioned previously. All I kept thinking was that it was searching for something, or waiting for something - its movement was very gentle and constant. I continued watching and noticed it started moving rapidly away, then stopped again, performing the same movements.

At this time it was nearly 6pm - I was due to start work at that time - so very reluctantly I got back into the car (I had been standing by a field for the best possible view) and hurriedly sketched this object's image on the only thing available - a box of tissues - it is a very accurate likeness. Following this I continued to work and noticed that in a moment the object had suddenly vanished from sight.

Whilst I had been regarding the strange object I was also analysing whether or not it could actually be something else and not a 'UFO' at all. I concluded after a while that it was not the sun, a cloud or aeroplane or balloon because none of these would move as this thing was moving and also because my view of it was so vivid. There is no ounce of doubt in my mind that what I saw today was a bona fide UFO although I accept its origin may indeed be earth bound if one considers how advanced the Military are these days. Mind you, having said that, I believe it is more probably a craft from somewhere else - although its movement was slow and deliberate whilst stationary, when it moved away from me (until it was about a quarter of its size) it did so with alarming speed and I don't believe we can manufacture any flying craft yet which can move so fast from a stationary position.

Whatever it was I saw this morning I hope you are as interested as I about it all. It was the most satisfying sighting I've ever seen and hope that maybe it can be of some use to you, either as a statistic or other way. I also hope you don't mind me writing to you as I've no idea if you still require this kind of information. I am enclosing my original sketch cut from the tissue box.

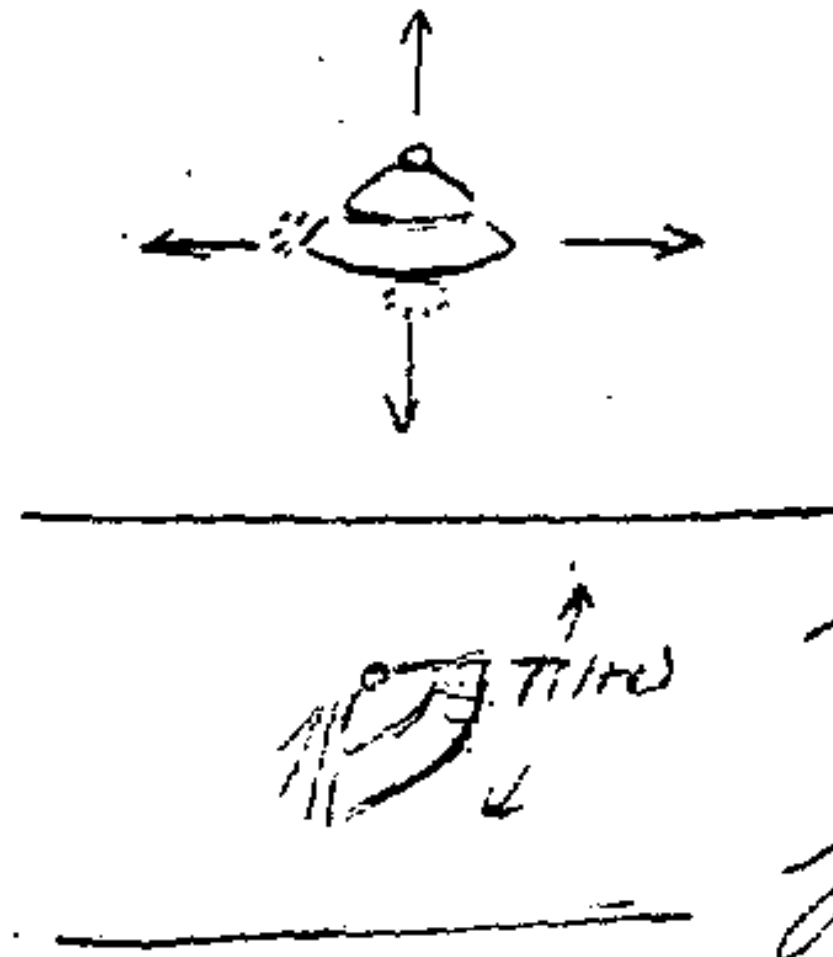

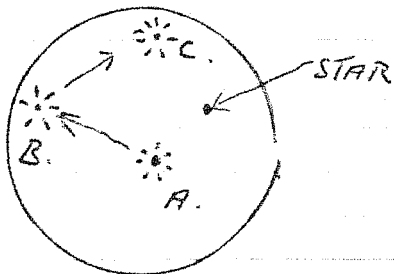

I saw the Superchannel programme 'On TV Air' last Wednesday, and it stated that they would pass on any letters to you. I am writing to tell you of a sighting that my Mother and Father had last Tuesday, in the early hours of the morning. My parents said that it was a fairly clear night, and that they had a good view of the object. My Dad estimates that it was at least 10-15 miles away, at a 45° angle above the horizon. They said that it was a brilliant Silvery-White light, much brighter than the lights of a plane, helicopter etc. Here is their description of the object -

It was a Silvery White light, when first seen, it was moving to the left, blinking, then it stopped for a few seconds, and the blinking ended. Then the object started blinking again, and moved rapidly over to the right, then it moved rapidly back over to the left. It then began to move about slowly, with the bright light still blinking, getting a bit fainter eventually, after about 12 minutes, they stopped watching it, they could not make out any shape, only that it was an extremely bright, flashing light, which performed incredible movements in the sky.

They think that it was directly North, in the direction of the Campsie Fells. They watched the object through binoculars, the power of the binoculars was 7X50, and when my Father looked at the object through them he said that it made small 'jumps' about, which were instant jumps, it would suddenly appear a small distance from where it had been. The flashes were also irregular - Some blinks were once ever 2 seconds, others were multiple blinks in one second.

Thank you for your letter dated 16 September, and for sending details of a UFO report made by Section 40 (your reference Section 40 099).

I have checked our files, and can confirm that we received no other reports that might tie-in with this this sighting.

Given the proximity to Gatwick, and the fact that red and green flashing lights were seen, I have to say that I think an aircraft is the most likely explanation. The "hovering" would occur when the aircraft was heading directly for the car, and other effects might be caused by a combination of the relative motion of the car and aircraft, together with the fact that some distortion might result from the object being viewed through glass. I do not find the lack of sound surprising, and believe the other effects could be explained. The other point that occurs to me is that Section 40 would have been concentrating on driving, so would not have been able to devote his full attention to the object.

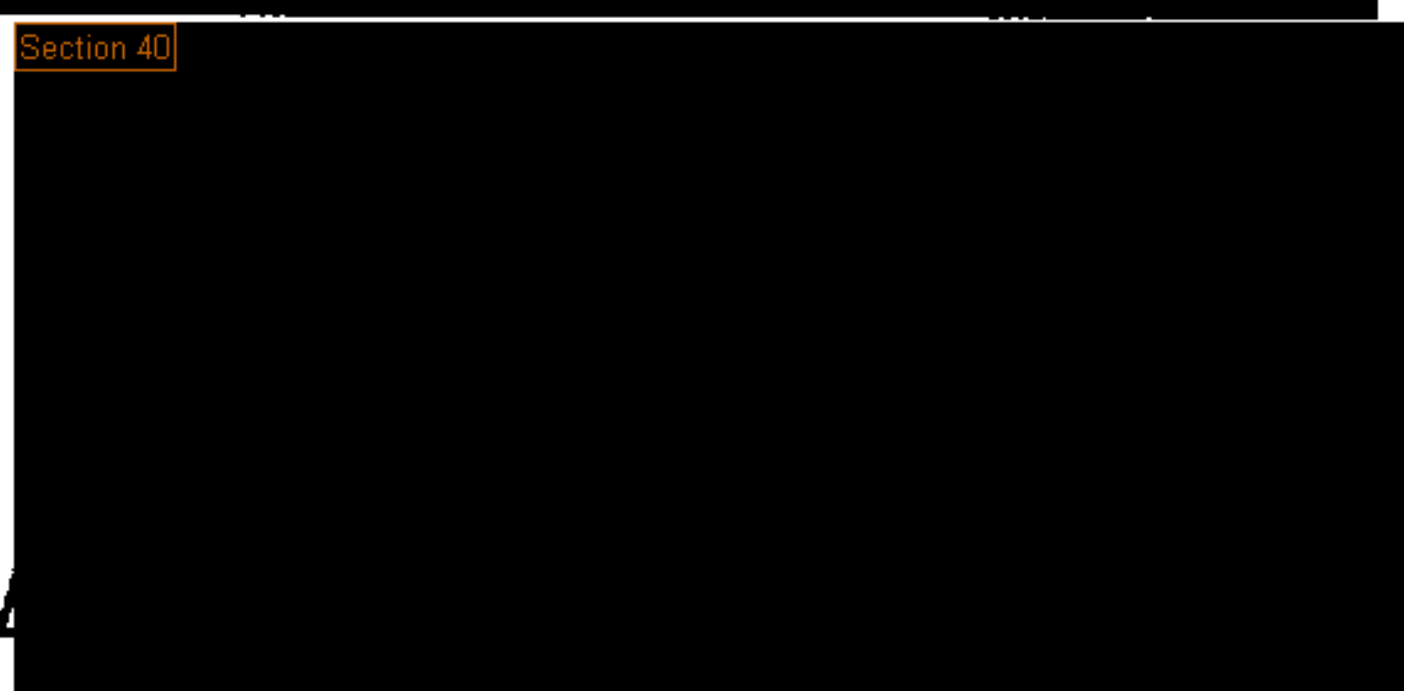

You also asked about the collision between two Russian Mig-29 aircraft at the International Air Tattoo at RAF Fairford. A Board of Inquiry has been called to investigate this accident, and see whether there any lessons to learn for the future, with a view to preventing similar accidents and further minimising the risk to the public at air displays. This is a standard procedure with any such accident.

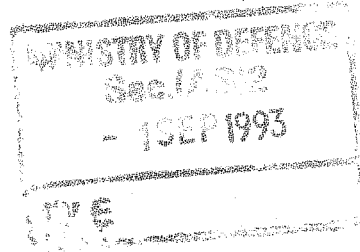

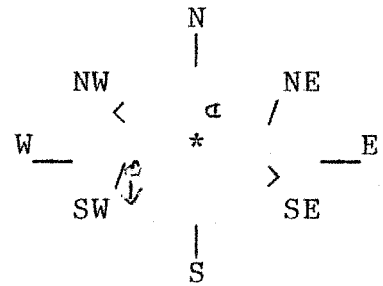
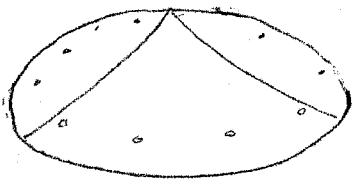

Thank you for your recent letter concerning Section 40 UFO video.

You asked for some information about our policy and views on UFOs; the following paragraphs set out our position:

While the Ministry of Defence does receive some reports of UFO sightings, our only concern is to establish whether or not they pose a threat to the security of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that they do, and this has not been the case so far, we do not attempt to investigate further, or to identify whatever might have been seen.

Given this limited involvement with the subject, the Ministry of Defence has no department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports, nor are there any staff employed on the subject full time. The reports we receive, which are usually limited to very brief details of what was seen, are passed to staff in departments concerned with the air defence of the United Kingdom, who examine them as part of their normal duties.

It is clear from the reports we receive that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky. However, we believe that explanations could be found for most of them. Possibilities that spring to mind include aircraft lights or aircraft seen from unusual angles, kites, helium balloons, weather balloons, unusual cloud formations, satellites in orbit or satellite debris entering the atmosphere, ball lightning, fireballs and meteorites. We accept, however, that there will always be some sightings that defy explanation.

We will always try to be as helpful as we can in dealing with reports of UFOs, and with more general policy questions.

I look forward to seeing Section 40 films in due course, and will let both him and you know if I have any ideas on what they show.

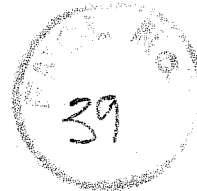

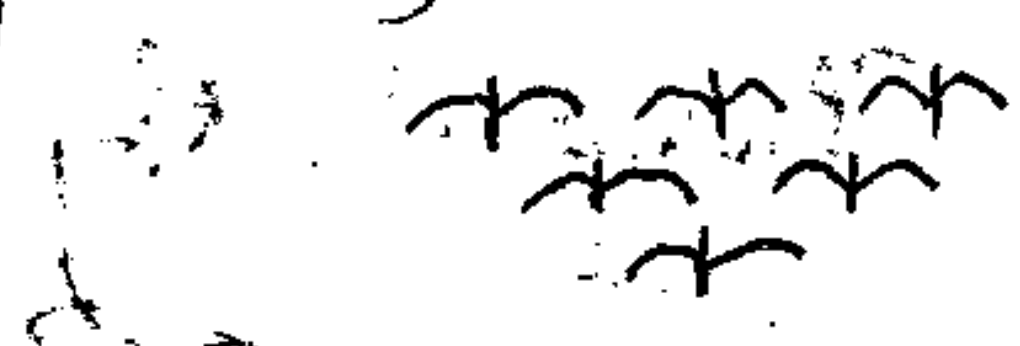

SIGHTINGS OF UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS

I write to inform you of the following:-

On Monday last, 16th August, I was taking my dog for a walk in countryside near CREWE. At about 11.05 pm I witnessed a meteor trail of quite unusual brightness, so much so that the path of it remained illuminated for several seconds. Others, I am sure, also saw this.

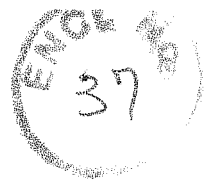

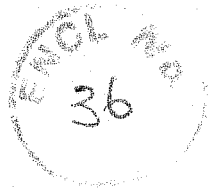

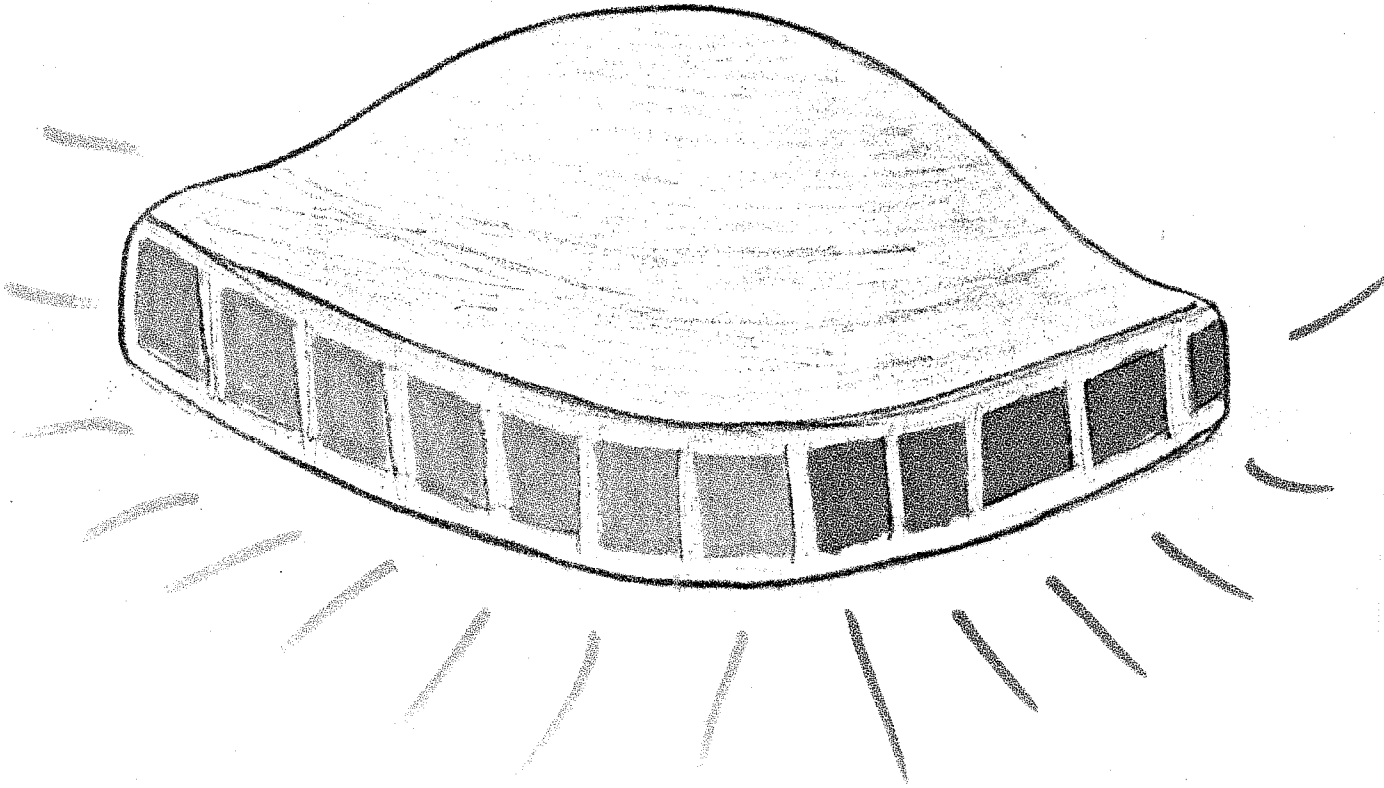

Thank you for your letter dated 20 August, concerning the wave of UFO sightings reported in the early hours of March 31 this year.

The sightings in this country occurred mainly over the South-West, with most of the reports being from Devon, Cornwall and South Wales. The most common feature of these reports was that people reported having seen two bright white lights. It was not clear whether these were two separate objects flying in close formation, or whether they were lights from one object. There were conflicting reports about the speed, height and heading. I have attached a map that I drew up at the time, plotting the locations of sightings we know about. Where I had the information, I added the time of the sighting (I have used British Summer Time, ie GMT + 1 hour), and the heading of the object. As you can see, it is all pretty confusing!

While we believe that most UFO sightings could be explained in terms of known objects or phenomena, there will always be some that appear to defy explanation, and we retain an open mind on these. The sightings on March 31 fall into this category; we were not able to make a positive identification of what was seen, and could draw no firm conclusions. This fascinating wave of sightings remains unexplained.

I do not know whether you liaise with UFO groups in this country, but it may be worth your while getting in touch with them to see if they have any further data. I suggest the following groups:

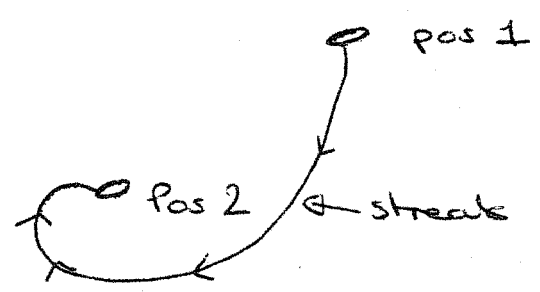
I have been asked to contact you
by my friend (and yours), Section 40 after
I relayed an incident, which I witnessed, to him.
On Thursday 5th August at approximately 10.30pm
myself and girlfriend were parked at Lytham St A-
mes boating lake's carpark when we observed
an extremely bright light in the sky. The
light was stationary and inclined at
approximately 20° to the horizon. The light
appeared white, ~~and~~ flickered, and was approx-
imately 3-5 times the diameter ~~and~~ of the
brightest star in the sky. As it was a
perfectly clear night (and full moon), I had
a pair of hi powered binoculars with me
(x50 magnification) which I was going to
look at the moon. I was attracted to
the object by its sheer brightness and
the fact that it appeared out of no-where.
It was stationary for several minutes
which lead me to conclude that it was
NOT an aircraft and unlikely to be a helicopter.
At this point I did not rule out the
possibility however! Looking through
bi-noculars the object was ^{or appeared} SPHERICAL

and changed colours many times a second. Colours from red, blue, green, & white could be seen. Suddenly the object became very dim and was barely observable with the naked eye but appeared as an inclined cigar shape as shown:-



The object began to move to the left and descend very slowly. After approximately five to ~~ten~~ ten minutes it appeared to land or hover in the vicinity of the WINTER HILL radio transmitter. At this point we lost sight of the object but numerous lights could be seen moving around on the hillside for the next 10 minutes or so. I concluded that these were probably cars driving around the hillside track. We saw nothing (as we weren't looking also) until about 11:30 pm approx. when the brilliant light appeared again it was in a slightly higher position than it ^{originally} was. It changed colour (or pulsated as previously) and remained stationary for several minutes. At this point 2 other sets of lights could be seen which I concluded to be aircraft ~~which~~ (because of their behaviour and light configuration). These aircraft circled the object and the winter hill area for about several minutes when one departed in our direction.

The object then became dim as before and began to rise vertically and stop at about $30 \rightarrow 40^\circ$ to the horizon. The object jumped from one point in the sky to another INSTANTANEOUSLY ^{MANY TIMES} and behaved unlike any aircraft, helicopter, weather balloon or satellite. This jumping was NOT caused by movement ~~and~~ of the ~~the~~ clouds and was witnessed by both myself and my girl friend. I would estimate the jumps (which ~~were~~ ^{were} totally random) to have been between $200 \rightarrow 800$ metres. On occasion the object would leave a spiral-type streak :-



{ It behaved like this until it disappeared. }

The object continued to rise ^{but} after several minutes ~~we~~ we lost track of it. The time was now about 11:50 or so. We departed and left for home. The next morning at 8:30 am I received a phone from a friend who along with with his girl friend and sister (who I believe was also present) observed the same object (but this time from their apartment ~~at~~ on the top floor ^{of the building} on Preston dock) at 12:05 approx. He was very excited as he too had observed the object through

bi noubars and took photo's with a very expensive zoom lens camera. Unfortunately he later discovered it was de-void of film! The object was very close and was joined by upto five aircraft. The type of which I have not asked about yet. He said the object appeared as a mass of pulsation lights with a powerful red light on top and blue light on the bottom (or vice-versa I can't remember).

{ My friend's name is Section 40 and can be contacted through me. }

He said the object moved left to right and back again a number of times. At one point it was as low as tree top level and JUMPED from one point to another instantly.

Sorry if the details are a bit sketchy but at the time of writing I have only a phone call to go by.

I have never been 100% sure of the UFO subject but now I can say with conviction that this object was neither plane, helicopter, weather-balloon, satellite, atmospheric phenomenon or otherwise. I cannot say that it was an extra-terrestrial vehicle for certain but whatever it was it displayed an incredible ability to manoeuvre.

The day after the incident I telephoned WARTON aerodrome (Section 40) and asked them (air traffic control) about any anomalous objects that could have been tracked on radar. They were very unhelpful and said that this information is confidential and all flights in and out of Warton are also. He added that the radar was 'switched OFF' at 9.30 pm that night also. I also telephoned Blackpool airport who told me to ring Manchester airport (which I haven't done yet).

There is no doubt in my mind that this object was witnessed by at least 100 other people due to its sheer brilliance.



Approximately 3 weeks ago articles in the national news papers (and on the radio) appeared which relayed the sighting of a 'silver disk' UFO by a (Section 40) pilot over Lancaster.

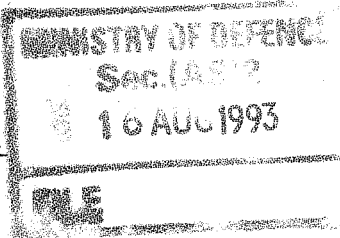

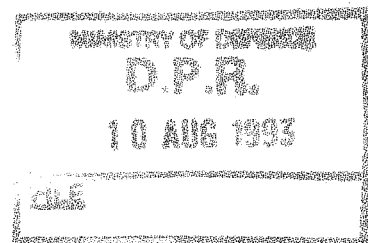

I know from previous correspondence and from your books that you are familiar with the MOD's position on UFOs, but I thought it would be useful if I set out, in full, our policy and views on the UFO phenomenon.

Although the Ministry of Defence does receive reports of UFO sightings, our only concern is to establish whether or not there is any threat to the security of the United Kingdom. Unless we judge that there is - and this has not been the case with any sighting to date - we do not attempt to investigate further, or to identify whatever might have been seen.

Given this limited involvement with the subject, the Ministry of Defence has no department which is appointed solely for the purpose of studying UFO reports, nor are there any staff employed on the subject full time. The reports we receive, which are usually limited to very brief details of what was seen, are passed to staff in departments concerned with the air defence of the United Kingdom, who examine them as part of their normal duties.

It is clear from the reports we receive that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky. However, we believe that explanations could be found for most of them. Some of the possible explanations include aircraft lights or aircraft seen from unusual angles, satellites in orbit or satellite debris re-entering the atmosphere, high altitude kites, helium balloons, weather balloons, searchlights or lasers reflecting off clouds, ball lightning, fireballs and meteorites. As you are also aware, some reports turn out to be hoaxes. Having said this, we accept that there will always be some sightings that appear to defy explanation, and we remain open-minded about these.

The Ministry of Defence does not release material on the subject "en bloc", because, as is the case with all government departments, all Ministry of Defence files are subject to the Public Records Act, and generally remain closed from public viewing for 30 years after the last action has been taken. Prior to 1967 most UFO files were routinely destroyed after about five years, because at the time there was not perceived to be sufficient public interest in the subject to warrant the permanent retention of this material. As you know, however, a small number of earlier files did survive, and may be viewed at the Public Record Office. I have had a recent look at the situation and have discovered that because files were not destroyed immediately, surviving papers generally date from around 1962. The reason these papers have not yet been released is that



they are in files where the last enclosures are more recent, as you know, files can only be released when the most recent enclosure is 30 years old. The good news is that, although it is not our practice to comment in detail on material that has not yet been released, I understand that two files (Public Record Office references AIR 2/16918 and AIR 2/17318) are due for release in January 1994. From then onwards there should be a steady trickle of UFO files released each year. I suggest that you contact the Public Record Office early next year. I have already written to the national UFO groups about this.

The files we hold in this office go back to about 1985, so we are able to answer specific queries that people have about particular sightings which have occurred in recent years, and can let them know whether we have a report on the incident, and if so, what it contains. Most of the reports that we have are relatively unexciting, and refer to little more than a vague shape or light in the sky, as opposed to the more exotic "close encounter" reports that are sometimes written about. I have attached for your information a copy of the form that we use to record UFO reports.

You may be interested to know the numbers of UFO sightings reported to the Ministry of Defence in the past, so I have attached some figures that you may find useful, together with some maps which give the approximate location of recent year's sightings.

A number of recent reports were almost certainly sightings of an airship - illuminated from the inside. I have seen this myself, and can understand how, when seen from a distance, this generated reports of a bright cigar-shaped UFO. Other recent reports have been caused by the use of lasers or searchlights; such equipment is used increasingly in advertising and entertainment, especially at outdoor music festivals.

The Ministry of Defence is not involved in any research or investigation into the crop circle phenomenon, although we occasionally get questions on this subject, because of the perceived link between crop circles and the UFO phenomenon. Although having no responsibility for this subject, we will refer anybody who asks about them to organisations such as CPR International or the CCCS, in the same way as we will refer people who report or enquire about UFOs to groups such as BUFORA or Quest International. As is the case with UFOs, we hold no fixed views on crop circles, and remain open-minded about this intriguing phenomenon.

I hope this is useful, and has helped explain our position.

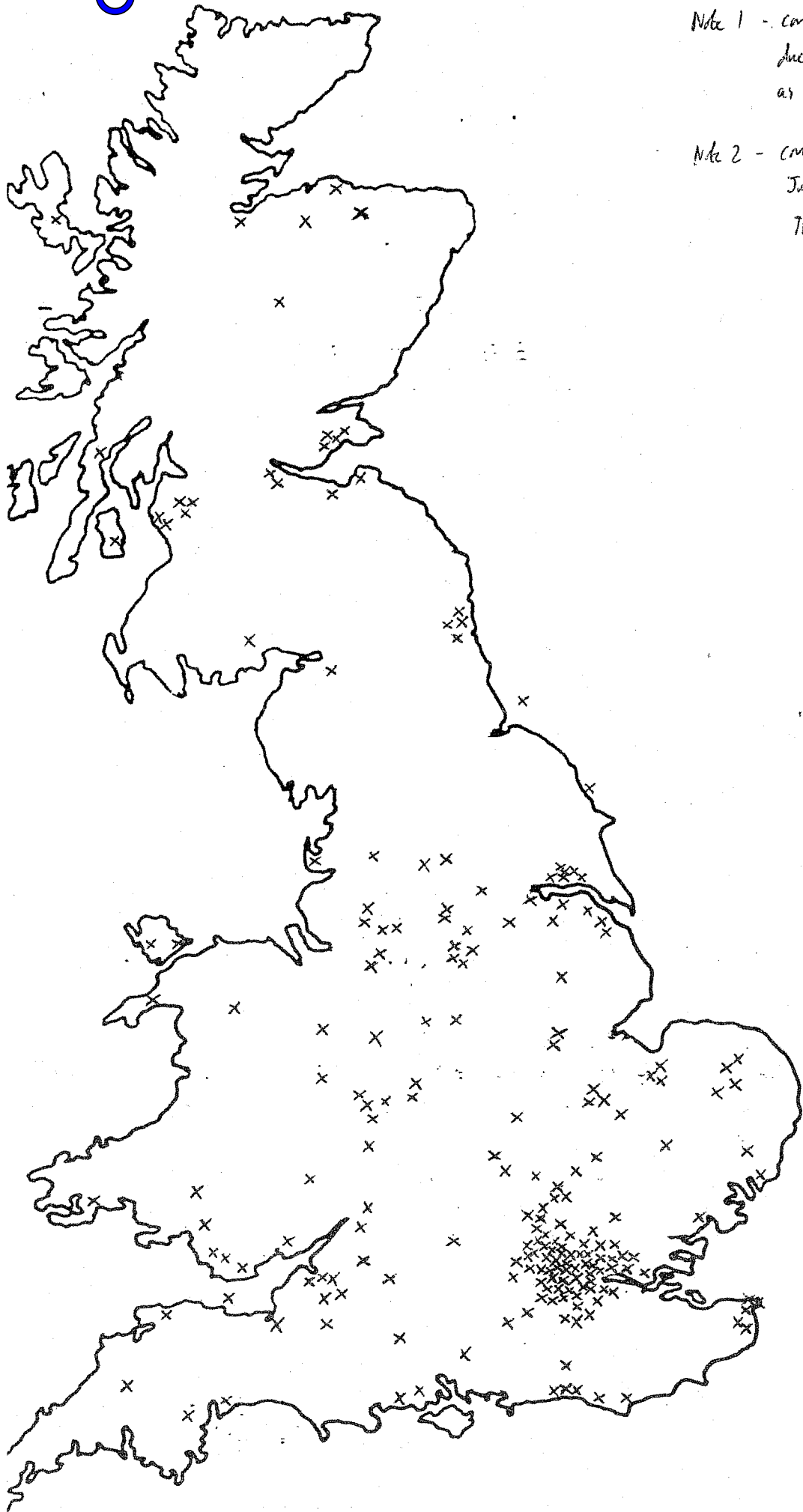

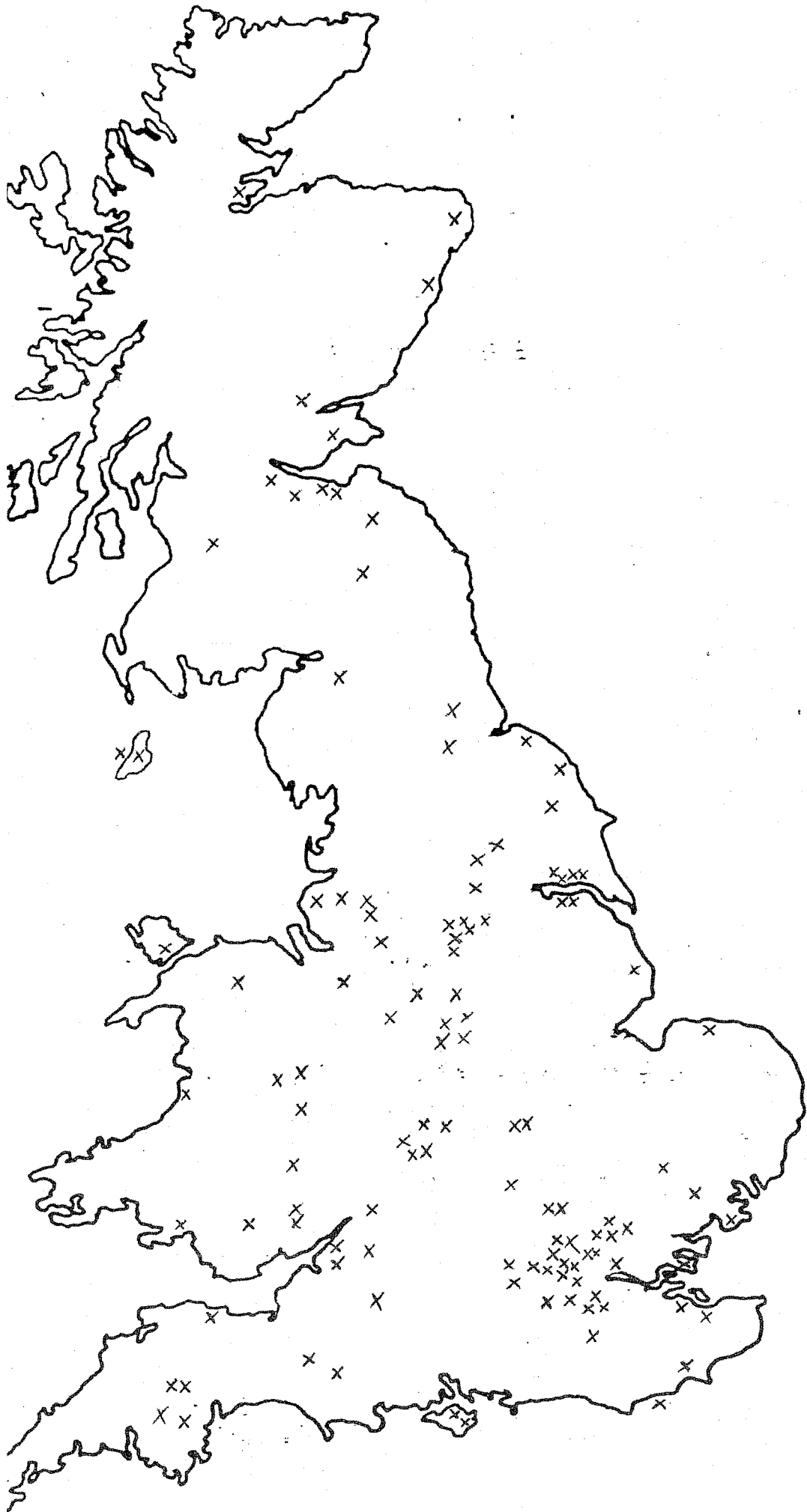

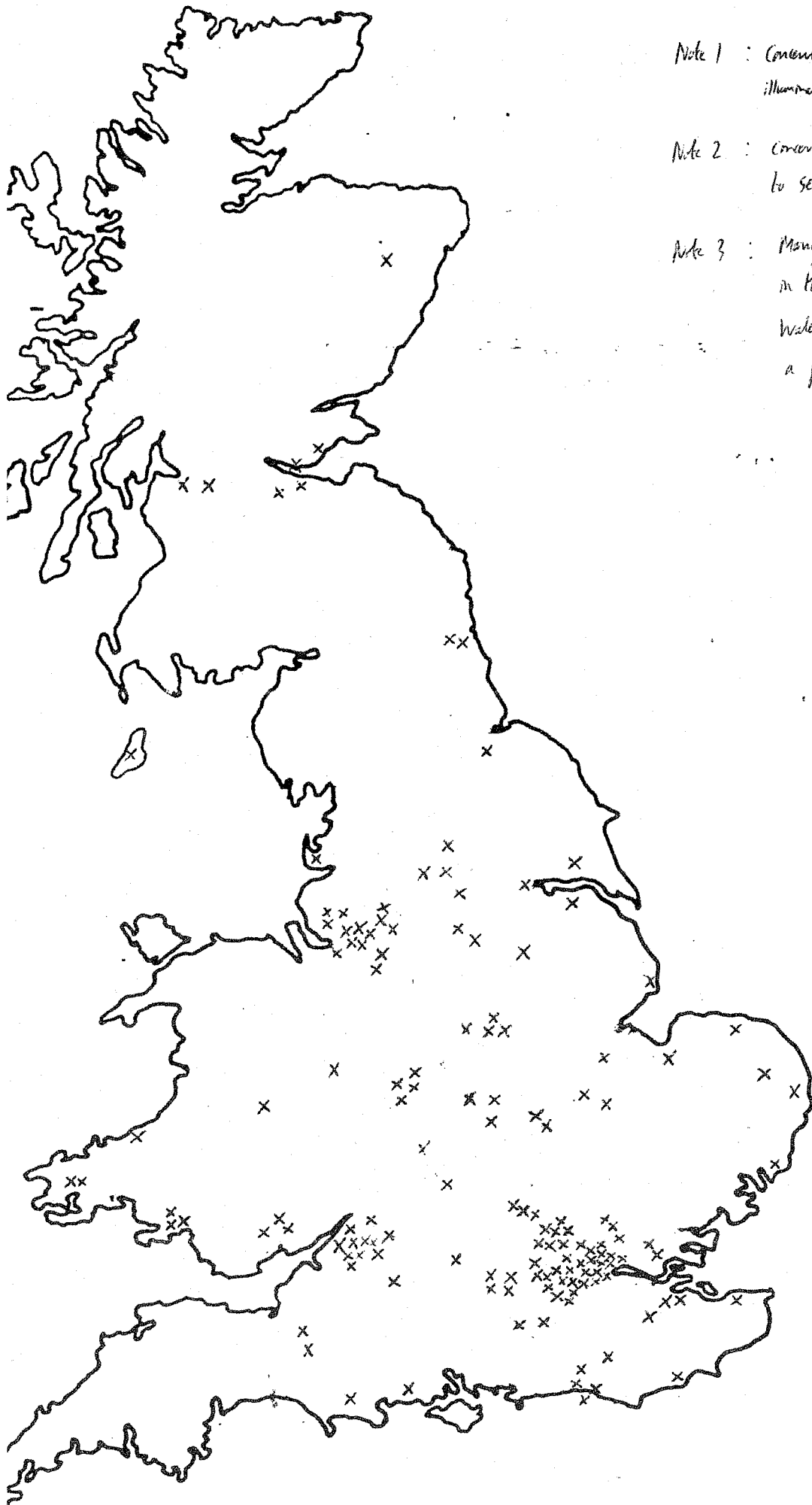
