The Rendlesham Forest case is undoubtedly one of the best documented and most significant military encounters with a UFO. It is also very credible incident. The incident spanned four days in 1980. Rendlesham Forest is a large pine forest, east of Ipswich, in Suffolk, England. Nearby are the twin NATO air bases, RAF Bentwaters and RAF Woodbridge; at the time both bases were being leased to the United States Air Force. Several UFO incidents, including multiple-witness sightings by military personnel, ground traces, and radioactive anomalies were reported from Rendlesham forest. According to USAF security patrolmen on duty, "the object was described as being metallic in appearance and triangular in shape, approx. 2-3 meters across the base... it illuminated the entire forest with a white light, and had a pulsing red light on top and a bank(s) of blue lights underneath." In November, 2002, the British Ministry of Defense released the "Rendlesham File" of documents related to and confirming the Rendlesham Forest incident.

Thank you for your email of 9 November about assessments made by the Ministry of Defence in the last five years regarding: a) the likelihood of, or b) provisions for an alien invasion of the United Kingdom. This has been considered as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

MOD has not made any assessment of the likelihood of, or provisions for, an alien invasion of the United Kingdom in the last five years.

It may be helpful if I explain that the MOD examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MOD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MOD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

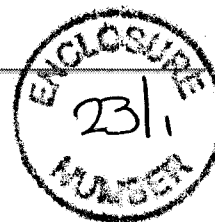

Thank you for your UFO sighting report and your Freedom of Information request of 21 August 2009 asking for details of recent UFO reports. Additionally, you mentioned that you were interested in sightings prior to 1967.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives, solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

I attach details of UFO sightings reported to the MoD for January to August 2009.

Details of UFO sightings reported to the MoD for the period 1997-2008 are available for viewing on the MoD website www.mod.uk by searching under "UFO Reports".

You might also be interested to know that the MOD has already released a great deal of information about UFOs which is available for public viewing. In order to answer your question about airborne activity accurately, we would need to check with every flying station in the UK whether they had any aircraft in the area, the cost of which would exceed the compliance limit, set at £600, under Section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act. This equates to one individual working for three and a half days to locate, retrieve and extract the required information. Under the terms of Section 12 of the FOI Act, we are therefore not obliged to comply with this element of your request.

It may be helpful if I explain that the MOD examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.



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The MOD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MOD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Head of Corporate Information, 6th Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed. Under the terms of Section 12 of the FOI Act, we are therefore not obliged to comply with this element of your request.

Military aircraft have landing and navigation lights. Open source information on aircraft lighting systems is available from a variety of outlets, such as the internet or reference books in public libraries. Basic technical details of aircraft can be found in Jane's 'All the World's Aircraft', which may be available from your local public library.

If your local library lacks the information, you may wish to make use of the internet. I did an internet search which indicated that aircraft navigation lights are placed in a way similar to that of marine vessels, with a red navigation light located on the left wingtip leading edge and a green light on the right wingtip leading edge. Thank you for your emails of 5 October. They have been considered as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOI). You asked for information regarding the amount of serving members of the Armed Forces who have reported UFO's or alien activity over the last 12 months; where the incidents took place; what investigations took place and which were passed onto other government agencies or related civilian agencies.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the MOD examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MOD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MOD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

I can confirm, however, that in the last 12 months (1 October 2008 to 30 September 2009) from the records that MOD holds on UFO sightings reported to the Department, there have been two sightings by people who identified themselves as serving members of the armed forces: one sighting at Shepton Mallet reported by a Royal Navy individual and one at Northolt reported by a Royal Air Force individual. Neither of these sightings prompted further investigation or was passed to other Government or civilian agencies.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information (FOI) request of 28 Jul 2009 asking whether there had been any military activity over Edinburgh at about 00:36 hours on Sunday 20th July 2009 and whether any reports that lights had been seen on that date over Edinburgh had been received.

The MoD has no central record of aircraft flying over Edinburgh on the date and time in question. In order for us to accurately answer your question, we would need to check with every flying station in the UK whether they had any aircraft in the area, the cost of which would exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act. This represents the cost of one person spending three and a half working days in determining whether the Department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information. Under the terms of Section 12 of the FOI Act, this means that we are not obliged to comply with this element of your request at this time.

However, I can confirm that we have received no other reports of UFO sightings over Edinburgh for 19 or 20th July 2009.

It is of course possible that military aircraft may have been transiting the area, and that Edinburgh's civilian Air Traffic Control may have some record.

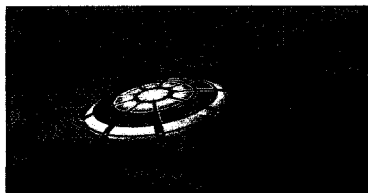

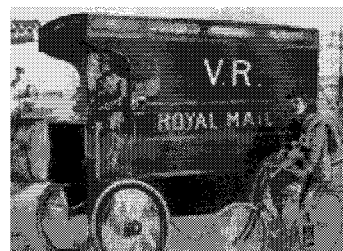

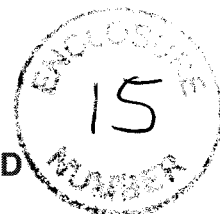

Thank you for your e-mail of 31 August 2009 concerning the strange occurrence you witnessed over the Doncaster area on Saturday, 30 August 2009. I have assumed that you are referring to Sunday 30 August, but for completeness I have checked both dates. I am replying as this is an area that falls within Air Command's remit. This has been considered as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

You asked us to check with RAF Waddington for any military flights operating in the Doncaster area on that date. I have confirmed that there were no military flights over the Doncaster area for either the 29 or 30 August 2009. A radar trace was also conducted for both those dates but nothing was found to match the events you reported. For your information no other UFO reports have been received for the Doncaster area for those dates.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

I am sorry I could not be more helpful.

Sir, I am ex-raf and a retired Police Officer at Doncaster. I fly regularly around the world on the A380 and other aircraft. I have taken helicopter lessons, and used to be a sgt in Doncaster control room, where I regularly controlled SY99 south yorks police helicopter on incidents at Doncaster. Many aircraft and helicopters fly over or near to my house at Robin Hood airport. I can easily recognise differing aircraft. I am a credible witness.

Now, to the point, last night, Saturday 30th August 2009, I was at home with my wife Section 40 were watching television in the front room, the curtains were open, no lights on to cause any reflections. I had not been drinking. My view was out of the window over the rooftops towards Doncaster Royal infirmary and the town centre.

At 856pm, a bright orange light emerged from the distance coming towards our house. At first I thought it was the Police helicopter SY99 which flies around this area quite regularly - it wasn't. There was no noise of the engines or of the chopping sound as it approached. The orange ball had no navigation lights to front or the side/wing tips. It was about the same size as an helicopter, shape not discernable. It veered to its left and accelerated going north towards Barnby Dun. Its height was about normal helicopter height, maybe a little higher - the speed was faster than the police SY99.

This object was out of sight within 5-6 seconds.

Within 3 mins, 2 more separate orange objects appeared, same route, same trajectory - they were spaced about 300 metres apart - they went on same route north. I went outside on my front driveway to have a look - no reflections, the 2 objects accelerated out of view ascending slightly.

My wife came out with me to have a look, she likewise was looking in awe.

In another 2 mins another 2 orange objects appeared, took same route again and vanished, I rushed upstairs to get my Nikon video camera, to get a quick shot of them; by the time I got downstairs they had gone. As I set my camera up, another single orange object (the 6th) appeared the same way and travelled North as the previous 5. The time now was 9.06pm. I was not able to take a photo. I have since left my camera next to me in case it happens again.

I have no idea what the 6 objects were, bright orange shapes, under own propulsion - no navigation lights.

My wife Section 40 a credible witness, she is an HR Manager at a local grammar school.

I immediately texted my local radio station, Traxfm, asking if there had been any other sightings - I haven't had a reply.

I know there is normally a feasible explanation, I cannot give one, nor can my wife.

Would you kindly check with RAF Waddington for any military flights/amber control for Manchester flights/cross country flights/weather balloons (no it wasn't one of them). I suppose West Drayton will be checked out and liaised with.

Please put my mind at rest. I do not want any publicity, I thought the sightings should be reported.

I am writing to report a strange siting of flying objects during the night of Saturday 8th August, early Sunday 9th August 2009.

I heard a faint noise which sounded like the police helicopter flying locally. When I looked out of the window the sound had faded away and all was quiet. However in the sky I noticed some strange very bright orange lights. They were very high and flying in a line. As I looked the first 2 of the 5 lights I could see disappeared or moved over the house. The next three flying equal distance to each other continued to move in the same direction, North to South approximately. The lights did not flash, there was no sound, and they moved steadily in a straight line about the height of a medium height plane. As they became closer they began to fade in turn and then disappear. I ran to the other side of the house assuming they had gone into cloud, but there was not site of them. However the moon and a bright star were clearly visible through the light cloud. I returned back to the original window facing North West and ! another very bright orange light appeared following the same path. This light moved in the same direction then slightly earlier than the others started to fade, even though there was not obvious build up of thick cloud. It then disappear before actually reaching the point of passing over the adjacent flat roof. Again I ran to the other side of the house, but again there was nothing.

Thank you for your email of 14 September about lights on aircraft.

It may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MOD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives, solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

However, open source information on aircraft lighting systems is available from a variety of outlets, such as the internet or from reference books in public libraries. Basic technical details of aircraft can be found in Jane's *All the World's Aircraft*, which may be available from your local public library.

If your local library lacks the information you seek, you may wish to make use of the internet. I did an internet search which indicated that aircraft navigation lights are placed in a way similar to that of marine vessels, with a red navigation light located on the left wingtip leading edge and a green light on the right wingtip leading edge. A white navigation light is as far as possible to the edge of the tail or each wing tip. High-intensity strobe lights are located on the aircraft to aid in collision avoidance.

Navigation lights in civil aviation are required to be operational and to be turned on from sunset to sunrise. High-intensity white strobe lights are part of the anti-collision light system, as well as the aviation red or white rotating beacon. The anti-collision light system (either strobe lights or rotating beacon) is required to be operational and to be turned on for all airplanes built after 11 March 1996 on all aircraft operations.



For further information on lighting specifications you may also wish to contact the Civil Aviation Authority. Their Library and Information Centre, located at Aviation House, Gatwick Airport South, West Sussex RH6 0YR, contains a collection of books, reports, directories, statistics, videos, and periodicals on aviation. The CAA Library is open to members of the public Monday to Friday from 09.30 to 16.30 (10.00 to 16.30 on the first Wednesday of the month) who are welcome to use the Library for reference purposes. A photocopier and microfilm/microfiche reader printers are available for public use. Charges are payable for copies and microform printouts. The Library can be contacted on 01293 573725, Fax 01293 573181, or e-mail infoservices@caa.co.uk

You also asked for what happens to sighting reports received by the MOD. Reports of sightings are recorded and acknowledged whenever contact details are provided. Although the overwhelming majority of the UFO desk's work involves (and has for decades) answering correspondence from the public or recording sightings reported to the MoD, we do on occasion investigate reports. This usually involves liaising with air defence specialists (e.g. radar specialists) on perhaps half a dozen reports per year. These will generally be sightings made by aircrew, members of the armed forces or the police.

When this was realised, it was decided to remove the file from the MoD website. However, the MoD has an overriding requirement to release material under FOI, which does not count as "publication" by the Department.

Finally the dates shown on the website are incorrect due to an administrative error.

You asked whether there were any manoeuvres in the area to explain the craft pictured in the photographs. I am replying as this is an area that falls within Air Command's remit. This has been considered as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

I can confirm that the MOD does have records on military manoeuvres, but there were no Royal Air Force or Army manoeuvres in the Blackpool area in October 2008.

I also asked the Royal Navy (RN) to check their records. To provide the information you requested we would have to examine the log of every UK-based RN ship to determine whether it (or it's aircraft, if appropriate) was in the vicinity during the specified period. The cost of obtaining this information would exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the FOIA. 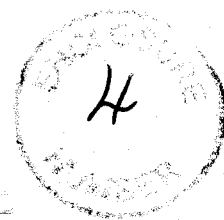

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request regarding UFOs. You asked how far back the Ministry of Defence has known about UFOs and for a list of UFOs reported in the UK and for any true videos or film of UFOs.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena and therefore are not aware of any film or video of "true" UFOs.

Details of UFO sightings reported to the MoD for the period 1997-2008 can be found on our website at www.mod.uk by searching under *UFO Reports*. I appreciate that you do not have the internet, but your local public library should have internet capability and they should be able to assist you. I attach details of UFO sightings reported to the MoD for the period January-August 2009.

You may also wish to know that since 1967, following an increase in public interest in this subject, "UFO" report files are now routinely preserved. Files for 1967 to 1995, and any files prior to 1967 which did survive, are now available for examination at The National Archives,

On the above heading is what I've seen, spotted over the years some I've taken photo's as well as videos of some from 2007 1st June 07 & 2008 plus others in the past few weeks which I've made it public in the local paper.

Some of the UFO'S which you can just make their shape out, but the one I took in 2007 when videoed it took less than 6th of second to enter & disappear when it buzzed this old ww11 tempest plane in the area of Dornock town & Easttriggs, the other outside my back garden when I videoed an RAF jet circling the area several times before I went out with my camera which was a cold cloudy day, when I started to video the jet at the same time this UFO just popped out from behind a cloud going all over the place & back into the clouds then there were others doing the same but only two of them just kept popping in & out of the clouds while the rest just stayed behind thin layers of the clouds I could just make out.

* these space crafts that keep popping in & out of our planet buzzing our aircrafts or just floating over at a slow speed which you can pick out all the details but don't disappear or change shape.

I had two silver orbs on video one taken at the solway coast & above my house the latest I got was the last week of May 2009 while photographing two jets going in different directions when I saw 3 large space ships but managed to get all on my SLR camera but 2 of them when blown up look like battle ships from Star Wars Film its un cunning with the shape they are! To me they are the mother of all space crafts I've ever seen.

* What I hope if possible of a list of these crafts since seen & reported in our country to date plus any true videos/films & photos of these crafts as I would like to remake all my cuttings & information of magazines in order of date & time of year.

Further to my letter of 21 August I am now in a position to confirm that a check of our records for the area adjacent to Alton Barnes around 1400 on 26 June this year, shows that a few aircraft were operating in that area at that time. Unfortunately, these records do not distinguish whether the aircraft were military or civilian. Whilst two aircraft in particular could be observed, it is not possible to identify these aircraft, however it is possible that one was a military Gazelle aircraft operating out of Middle Wallop.

I hope this is helpful and please accept my apologies for the earlier confusion.

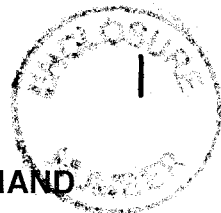

Thank you for your Freedom of Information (FOI) request of 28 Jul 2009 asking whether there had been any military activity over Edinburgh at about 00:36 hours on Sunday 20th July 2009 and whether any reports that lights had been seen on that date over Edinburgh had been received.

The MoD has no central record of aircraft flying over Edinburgh on the date and time in question. In order for us to accurately answer your question, we would need to check with every flying station in the UK whether they had any aircraft in the area, the cost of which would exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act. This represents the cost of one person spending three and a half working days in determining whether the Department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information. Under the terms of Section 12 of the FOI Act, this means that we are not obliged to comply with this element of your request at this time.

However, I can confirm that we have received no other reports of UFO sightings over Edinburgh for 19 or 20th July 2009.

It is of course possible that military aircraft may have been transiting the area, and that Edinburgh's civilian Air Traffic Control may have some record.
