

It dissapeared behind the horizon at great speed at almost exactly due East of SS6. The object was a dull brown colour around magnitude 3.5 to 5 and was the size of a small garden pea held at arms length. It resembled a slightly luminous brown paper bag.

The object must have hit the ground from 1 to maybe 10 miles from the viewing point, although slightly resembling a luminous brown paper bag it did not bounce up again as would be expected from an inflatable object.



Dear Sir/Madam,

Can you help me to find someone who can explain some UFO sightings I have made over the last year?

I have never believed the alien explanation for people's confusion with aerial phenomenon; I've always thought that it was delusional... I have always been a 'flying saucer' sceptic but, however, I am stumped...

I cannot understand what I have been witnessing. I have gone through an elimination list i.e., satellites (too near and/or moving too fast), planet or star (moving too fast), conventional aircraft (no nav or strobe lights even through binoculars), Chinese lantern (too fast), balloon or airship (too fast), low flying conventional aircraft (no nav or strobe lights, no audible sound and it would be obvious through binoculars).

I have seen these things on two occasions. The first occasion was on a clear night about a year ago at approximately 2300 hrs. I stepped outside my front door and while I wasn't actually looking skywards my attention was drawn to a single bright yellow/white light appeared in the west about 30 degrees above the horizon. What drew my attention was its motion. I would describe it as fast and deliberate and apparently silent. It crossed the sky and disappeared over the eastern horizon in about two to three minutes. As it passed overhead it wasn't displaying any characteristics of a conventional aircraft except the fact that it was crossing the sky. Before it disappeared I quickly stepped back inside for my binoculars from the hall stand and I watched through them as it disappeared into the east.

After about five minutes of standing there trying to apply reason to the identity of the 'object' another light, seemingly identical to the first, appeared in the same place, at the same speed and on the same trajectory as the first light. It followed the same pattern as the first light but this time I watched the whole thing through binoculars. The strange thing to me was at looked exactly the same through binoculars - just bigger and brighter. I was expecting a fuselage or wing, nav lights, beacon or strobes, but nothing, just the round yellow/white light travelling at high speed. The light looked no different when it was in the east than in the west. If it were from a conventional light with a reflector I would expect some variation in the intensity of the light depending on the direction from which it was viewed.

The second occasion was about a month ago and exactly the same as the first except this time it was during daylight (approx 0400 hrs), there was broken cumulus cloud and I only saw one light this time. I contacted the Met Office and they told me the cloud in question was between 5000 and 7000 feet so I could establish that it was at least 5000 above the ground as the light disappeared as it passed either through or above the cloud layer.

I am asking you because I don't know where to go. I would like someone to give me an explanation, you know something like: "they were conventional aircraft that are allowed to fly through UK airspace with one bright light and no nav lights and are so small they cannot be seen behind their one big light.

There is more to this but I'll stop at that to save you from becoming bored.

If you or you know someone else who can be of any help I would be really grateful.

I saw 3 orange objects, the first 40 minutes after this sighting, from my house in Hoddesdon. I was looking North and saw an orange glowing object that was travelling slowly from the SW towards the NE. There was no sound, no flashing lights and no variation in the lights intensity. It was at an angle to the ground of about 30-40degrees which was just over roof top height and the size was equivelant to holding a pea at arms length. I am 55, lived in this house for 30 years and have never seen anything like this before



Hi,

Over the past two weeks the same event has been witnessed by myself and my girlfriend twice, and a third person on a comepletely independant occasion.

Last night (15/07/09) at around about 23.30, I myself any my girlfriend noticed what seemed to be a very bright white light, almost like a large Star, appearing to move slowly in the sky, north-West of Trimley St Mary, Suffolk, above the river Orwell.

The Light to moved south, doubled back on itself in a smooth motion to its original position in sky, at which point a similar light suddenly appeared with it.

The two lights almost "danced" around each other, each making out one equal half of a circle, before splitting of in completely opposite directions. The original light quickly veered towards our position, whilst the newer light moved off at speed towards the north west, away from us.

At this point it became apparent that the lights were either moving at speed or were much lower in the air that first apparent.

The Light cruised above us, and I noticed that unlike most aircraft there was only this single bright white light, no repeating flashes, or different coloured lights usually seen.

(There were at least 3 other conventional aircraft in the sky at the time with which to compare the object) A vauge black outline could be made out surrounding the light against the night sky, however this may have just been wishful thinking from my eyes, trying to imagine the shape.

As I commented, there were other aircraft in the sky, and a vauge drone could be heard from the one closest to us, however the "Light" made absolutely no noise what so ever. Also in comparisons with the other aircraft, this Light was clearly closer to us that expected.

As the Light reached almost imediately overhead, it dissapeared instantaneously. At that point in time, there was very little cloud cover and the Stars could be seen clearly, so I ruled out the disruption if cloud cover. The previously bright white light, simply dissapeared before us.

Ususally I would have put something such as this down to perhaps just a normal aircraft, a chinese lantern or just an odd experience.

However, as I mentioned, this is the second time in two weeks both myself and my girlfriend have witnessed the exact same sequence of events, over the same time scale. Last time I had just brushed the sighting off as "odd".

We arrived at my girlfriends house, and began to tell her mum of what we've just seen. At which point she interupted, stating that she had seen the exact same thing, with incredibly similar movements the previous week. Describing the "dance" as if she had seen through my own eyes. She was unaware of what we had seen, and visa versa.

The only objects that I can think resembles the light most simply, by way of an explanation, are chinese

lanterns. But this wouldn't explain the "dance", or the fact the two moved off in opposite directions. (Particularly the one above us, moving against the wind). The lights were just far too bright to be lanterrest my opinion, and acted and looked so unlike conventional aircraft that I cannot think of an explaination.

Hi there,

I can't believe I'm actually doing this, but I'd like to report a UFO sighting over Newport, South Wales.

Time of the sighting was 1.22am, July 19th 2009.

The object was moving west to east over the centre of Newport. The weather was patchy cloud with light rain.

The object was a bright, reddish light travelling west to east, below cloud level. It did NOT have the usual aircraft lights or flashing lights and did NOT make a sound. I am guessing that cloud level was perhaps 3000ft (mountains in the area are around 1,300ft).

I have had a keen interest in aviation since a child and know what conventional aeroplanes and helicopters look and sound like, so I know it was neither of these in any form that I am aware of. I also know what the International Space Station, meteorites etc look like. It was below cloud level, so was not an object in near Earth orbit. It was moving too slow to be a meteorite.

The object travelled in a straight line. It's brightness did not alter during its approach, or as it was receeding. When it eventually reached a patch of cloudless sky, it faded. The fade lasted perhaps 10 seconds until it disappeared.

In all respects, this object travelled in the same way that a normal aircraft would, but it lacked all the give-away signs of night-time lights (coloured wing/tail lights, flashing lights of a helicopter). The fact that it was reasonably low yet emitted absolutely no noise was what fascinated me and alerted me.

Again I would like to stress that I have an above average knowledge of aircraft and have always been a keen sky watcher with an interest in astronomy. This object was not a normal aircraft, orbiting satellite or inbound such as a meteorite. I can make no guess as too what it is.

I don't subscribe to ideas of aliens visiting the planet because I don't believe that it is possible to cross the vast distances of space.

I was able to get some footage on my mobile phone (Sony Ericsson Cybershot) of the last 42 seconds of its flight, which I will be uploading to YouTube.

About me. I am a 46 year old Public Relations consultant. I was walking my dog when I saw the object.

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

Hello,

I write to inform you of a second sighting remarkably similar to my first (which was 29th May 2009). This has really quite unnerved me. I never expected to see this thing again ('lightning never strikes twice' I thought), let alone see a UFO in first place! I am a mixture of spooked and curious to get to bottom of whatever this thing is.

Anyway, here's my report/sighting below:

ANOTHER LARGE SILVER WHITE BALL. Worthing, West Sussex, UK 23.01 Monday 13th July 2009

Am feeling very spooked, as have just seen an object almost identical to the one I witnessed (and reported) on 29th May in nearby location.

Was outside before turning in for night, and as usual glanced up to see if any stars visible.

Almost clear night and plenty of stars, when I noticed from corner of eye, a large and incredibly bright silver/white ball/sphere, constantly lit, slowly moving directly from West to East direction, heading away from my location.

This object was higher than the two planes which were also visible - one of which was flying from London towards South/South East coast at the time, and one returning to UK which was just above the coast flying Northwards.

This object was much larger than the aircraft and the brightness of the light was many times more intense and bright compared to aeroplane lights. Am sure at least one of the Pilots/Crew of those planes MUST have seen this thing?).

It was very similar to my earlier sighting in May, except this object was slightly smaller than the last (though still much larger than any star!), it did not suddenly increase in size this time, and wasn't changing direction like the previous time.

However, it was remarkably similar in several ways: intensely bright silvery white, clearly ball shaped, and much larger than any visible stars or planets.

Also, it didn't change direction (as previous sighting had), but instead it did appear to "stop" still several times as it went into the distance and, what was most remarkable, was that it appeared to dim in brightness and shrink in size slightly whenever it stopped still, even though its brightness did not diminish the further away it flew when it was moving.

It did not seem to dip towards horizon as flying objects would (heading into distance away from you) but instead seemed to keep at constant altitude in spite of increasing distance. Then after approx 9 minutes, this thing just vanished. Disappeared with no fading or decrease in size/brightness.

Possibly sounds crazy, but this is now the second time I have seen these things. In similar area and behaving in similar manner.

Am not at all frightened by the idea of life beyond Earth, yet am also a rational, down to earth person, however I actually felt quite scared when I saw this tonight, the hair on back of my neck went up.

What is frustrating is that all the countless times my partner looks at the night sky with me, these two sightings have both happened when I've been outside alone at night, which is quite annoying and rather unnerving. And again, it happened when I didn't have my camera to hand (am kicking myself about that.. but to be honest, was once again transfixed by this thing and couldn't take my eyes off it, so probably wouldn't have thought to get a picture anyway.).

As before, I have checked all the relevant authoritative sites to ensure this could not have been a passing satellite or ISS or Comet (using HEAVENS ABOVE and SPACEWEATHER websites) and come up with nothing to identify it. There was nothing passing this area at that time/date, in that direction.

And it certainly wasn't any plane or helicopter, nor a balloon or anything like that. This was a large solid looking object, with incredible brightness.

I really just hope others have seen this thing too and are brave enough to report it. I'm certain some Pilots/Aviation people must have seen this thing!

Between the dates of 29th June 2009 and 2nd July 2009, I witnessed several orb-like lights in the sky during broad daylight in Harlow, Essex.

The first and most blatant sighting was a bright orb that travelled in a straight line as a green-coloured helicopter approached it at high speed. Altitude was approx 600-1000 ft and approx the same distance away as it hovered over St James' School on Parringdon Road. As the chopper got closer and passed the orb, it slowed down and suddenly vanished and dissapeared. The helicopter then made some erratic movements as if it were shocked by the orbs dissapearance and started circling the field I was in. I do not have an exact time/date for this sighting but it was between the dates outlined above and at approx 4pm. On this day I also witnessed several other orb-like objects faintly flying through the skies, dissapearing then suddenly reappearing later on it's apparent course. Thought I should report what I saw on 27th June of this year. I live in West Swindon, only a few miles from RAF Lyneham, Wiltshire. I was travelling at about 22:45 on that evening on a regular route of ours and noticed an orange light in the sky coming over Greendown school...my initial reaction was that it's going the wrong way-we are in a flight path of the air-craft flying into Lyneham, so it's nothing new to see something in the sky..but as I say it was going in the opposite direction to normal, so it caught my attention.

As I was sat at the junction waiting to turn right into Grange Park Way I noticed two more(altough they were quite close together), again nothing really unusal in that, as there are often 3 aircraft in a flight path going into Lyneham flying at a safe distance from each other. But as I drove(trying to keep on eye on the lights as well!), turned left into Hay Lane, lost sight of them momentarily and when I saw them again(near to the rear entrance of Lydiard Park) there was now approximately 12/13... I proceeded to pull over, as did a car about 200 yards behind me, the lights travelled right infront of me from my left to right. The lights formation was kind of a mis-shapened diamond at the front and the others looked like a tail following behind.

I did try to photograph them, but I only had my phone and when I reviewed itthe photo was just black. There are trees lining the road and when I pulled forward to get a better view (as they were disappearing behind them) they had completely gone, all of them.

I do wear glasses for distance, although I did not have them on, so I cannot describe any sort of shape to the individual orange lights. but there is no mistaking what I saw.

I hope you find this information useful, and I have not reported this easily (ridicule and all that), but as i have said previously, we do live near a military air base, so I thought I should.





Subject: Report of sighting on 05/07/09

Hey there MOD, I was unsure whether I could fill out an application online about a UFO sighting in the midlands, so instead I compiled a report, it's a bit lengthy, but hopefully interesting none the less: P, the sighting certainly was to me and my mates when we saw it.

Where: Stratford upon Avon, Warwickshire, England. Near the Welcombe Hills, around the golf course area and opposite the end of Blackthorn Road.

When: Approximately 01:35am. I started voice recording at 1:52am and finished recording at around 02:24am.

Date: 05/07/09

Who were the witnesses: There were 4 of us (all 17 years of age), when the object was first noticed, but then 1 had to go home before I started voice recording, so there were 3 of us which fully witnessed the object.

Weather Conditions: A relatively warm/mild night, with a few high clouds in the sky, but mostly clear.

Details of object before voice recording: A dormant blue light was first spotted by me, and I initially assumed it to be a plane, it then proceeded to travel in a rightwards direction, (the colour of the object changed to green, with a red light at the opposite end of its moving direction, possibly representing a thruster) and I pointed it out to my friends. We were still not too suspicious and still interpreted the object to be a steadily moving plane, that was until it suddenly stopped, hung for a couple of seconds, changing to a blue colour again, then started moving in a leftwards direction, and changing to a green colour with a red light at the right hand side of the object. Now to my knowledge we do not possess the technology to make an aircraft move in such a radical manner, the only rational explanation to what we witnessed at this moment was it to be a helicopter, but the issue with this was the fact that the object seemed to be producing no noise whatsoever. The object then continued to move from left to right with some considerable speed, until resting over the top of a cluster of trees and changing to a blue colour again. After a few seconds the object started to move towards us and stopped above some close trees, and

began to move downwards, changing completely red with a flashing red light on the top of it, and this is where it got increasingly strange, we could see the object's light reflecting off the top of the thick tree leaves, so clearly the object was right above the tree, showing that it was not of considerable size. It then turned white and went behind the tree, we could still see its light shining through the leaves, and it stopped moving. After being inactive for about 10 seconds the object went up above the tree again, changing to a green colour, with a red light at the bottom, before moving over towards the golf course. Disturbinaly, the object then stopped in the air, and shone a bright white light down over the golf course and erratically scanned the surrounding area, we could easily see the whole light beam, and the light appeared to emit from the body of the craft, which darkened to a dark blue colour when the light came on, the object also had two red lights on its left and right side. After scanning the area, the object went red and flew up into the air, changed to a green colour, with the according red lights to whichever way it was moving, and started darting around the sky above the golf course. At this point I withdrew my phone, an LG GD900, and attempted to record the object, but unfortunately it wasn't at all picked up on the camera, even though it was a rather bright object. The object then went dormant in the same point it had been resting in previously, just next to a tall obstruction of trees. Soon after, the object came out of this position and proceeded to travel over (it was green in light with a red light to the right of it) to the main congregation of trees at the Welcombe Hills, and scanned its primary light over them before then turning round and retreating back to its seemingly favourite dormant position. This is when I decide to use my phones voice recorder instead, so we could document what we were seeing and also, if the object came over to us, or made a loud noise, we could pick the sound up.

Details of object whilst and after voice recording: The object was still lying dormant in the air, and me and my friend start discussing what the object could look like, shortly after this the object moves to the left then begins hovering. Whilst it is hovering I spot a plane in the distance heading towards the direction of the object, it looked like a standard commercial airliner and was moving at the speed you would expect one to move at. The object, probably currently unaware of the plane then suddenly turns entirely red, with a flashing light on top, and starts going down behind the trees, possibly to land? After a minute or so we spot more red flashes behind the trees it settled behind, and we document that we have been watching the object for 20 minutes now, which would mean we spotted the object at around 1:35am. During this time, the airliner had been getting closer to the objects location, and upon notice of it, the object flew out from behind the trees, being red in colour, and darted off behind the distant clouds in the sky, a light is then seen coming down from the clouds towards the plane, this light goes off and the object disappears. It then remains here until plane has gone and moves to a visible location and goes dormant (blue in colour) again. An idea of how high the object must have gone could be taken upon the fact that the airliner was flying underneath the clouds, and still looked relatively high up, several thousand feet, whereas the object had in a few seconds managed to move from ground level to above the highest clouds in the sky, which the plane had passed under. A while later, the object emerged from behind the main congregation of trees, and was green in colour, it then stopped at a location it had been hovering over a lot, and went dormant (blue in colour), a faint, white light beam could then be seen shining downwards from the object, and two lights could be seen orbiting the object, one was green in colour, and the other one was red, as well as this, the object also looked to have a hazy dark blue force field or aura around it. A while later the object then turned white in colour and began to move downwards, but then suddenly started moving very quickly in a leftwards direction, it changed red when moving in this way, whilst it is doing so we attempt to decipher what

ch of the lights mean on the object: Green = Movement, Red = Throttle, Blue = Dormant and White = Scanning light. The object then changed to a white colour and shined its main light over the ground beneath it, after doing so; it then turned around and headed the other way, back behind some thick trees. In an erratic and jittering movement pattern, the object appeared from behind the tree then proceeded in a downwards movement, back behind the trees again, possibly to land. Shortly after this we hear a scratching noise behind us in the long grass along with a high pitched squealing noise, we are initially worried about the noise but then dismiss it as a badger, then abruptly, all three of us started to feel really cold, like it was the middle of winter, even though it was a fairly warm night. Could it have been something sinister behind us in the grass, seen as though at this point the object was possibly grounded behind some nearby trees? The clouds which were above the tree which the object landed at then started to move upwards, and the most southern cloud had a rather prominent glow to the bottom of it, suddenly we then spotted the object very high up in the sky, so it must have either moved very quickly or teleported, because we were watching the area almost constantly the entire time. That is of course, if there wasn't a second one in the sky, and the previous one was still grounded. From here the object moved left and we heard a loud rustling in the bushes behind us, and spotted something white in the field, it could have just been our imaginations running away with us, but we decided to move anyway. After proceeding halfway towards the entrance of the field, we spotted the object move incredibly fast to behind the clouds, and the atmosphere as well as the air in the field got increasingly cold for all three of us, and the breeze felt almost icy, which was odd as neither of us were shivering. I then got a little worried and we left the field and wandered out into a residential area, the object is still hanging in the sky at this time. We then decided to walk home and after having a conversation, we looked between some houses and spotted the object lying dormant and blue in the sky, this is then when I stop recording as the object seemed to be doing nothing else. Shortly after the recording the object disappeared off behind the clouds and we went home. What a night! :).

P.S. I do still possess the voice recording.



We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

With regard to your particular observation, I can confirm that we have received no other reports of UFO sightings so far from Chelmsford for 7 July 2009.

I am writing with reference to your e-mailed report of an 'unidentified flying object', seen on 2 July 2009 over Blackwood. This office is the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to UFOs.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.


