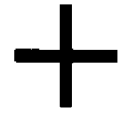

UFO spotted over central Taiwan town

An unidentified flying object (UFO) was spotted over central Taiwan late last night, the Taiwanese news agency CNA reported, quoting "eyewitnesses".

It said that the UFO had attracted a crowd of over 50 people as it "floated" above a private house in Touliu around midnight local time.

According to the eyewitnesses, the object, shaped like a bright circle, occasionally jumped vertically and sometimes moved horizontally. They said that "it did not resemble an aeroplane," the agency reported.

Thank you for your letter to Malcolm Rifkind of 13 April regarding an enquiry you received from **Section 40** of **Section 40**, Bradford, concerning unidentified flying objects. I have been asked to reply.

Section 40 has written to the MOD on a number of occasions recently on this subject and my officials have replied to each of his letters. These responses have explained the specific and limited role and responsibilities my Department has in connection with reports of "unidentified flying objects". We look at such reports solely in the context of our responsibilities for identifying any potential threat to this country's security. We consider reports of unexplained aerial phenomena submitted to us in order to establish whether what was seen may have been of defence significance. If no threat is discerned, and this has been case in all such instances to date, then our interest in the sighting ceases. As such a sighting can remain unexplained, but not result in any further official action. We have no role in "UFO" research of the type alluded to by **Section 40**.

Gerry Sutcliffe, MP

Section 40's letter refers to the alleged incident at Rendlesham Forest/RAF Woodbridge in December 1980. Based on the available substantiated evidence at the time, a collective decision by those within the MOD/RAF sections with responsibility for air defence matters at that time judged that nothing of defence concern occurred in or around Rendlesham Forest/RAF Woodbridge on the nights in question. Nothing has emerged during the last 14 years to make us question that original judgement. My Department has no knowledge of the films which Section 40 claims exist and alleges to be in our possession.

Section 40 makes reference to "UFO" research activity entitled "Operation Aeneid". Neither I nor my officials are aware of any such operation under this or any other name. I have already explained that my Department has no role whatsoever in "UFO" research and as such my officials are not sent to "UFO" Conferences.

Section 40's queries in connection with the United States and South Africa are matters for the Governments of those countries and should be addressed directly to them. It is not for me to comment.

I hope this is helpful.

At 1956 hours on Wednesday 18 January 1995 a call was received at the Wakefield Area Control Room reporting seeing strange lights in the sky above Castleford. A command and control log was created, number 1728, and passed to the Pontefract Help Desk for action.

At 2030 hours the same day I telephoned the caller Mr Section 40, a Section 40 of Section 40, Castleford.

About 1900 hours on 18 January 1995 he and his wife Section 40 were leaving his mother-in-law's house at Section 40, Castleford.

He looked up and saw two groups of lights in diamond shaped formations above the houses opposite. There were four or five lights within each group. He says the lights were bright but not dazzling, like tubes with diffusers over them.

He states they were travelling fairly slowly from east to west, they stopped and the lights seemed to move about within the diamond formation before moving off at speed.

The objects gave off a yellow light, appeared round or oval shaped, and there was no sound associated with them.

At the time of the sighting the night was clear with good visibility and the caller estimates his angle of vision to have been about 60° observed with the naked eye for five to ten seconds.

The witness is unable to estimate the size of the lights as he does not know how far away they were from him.



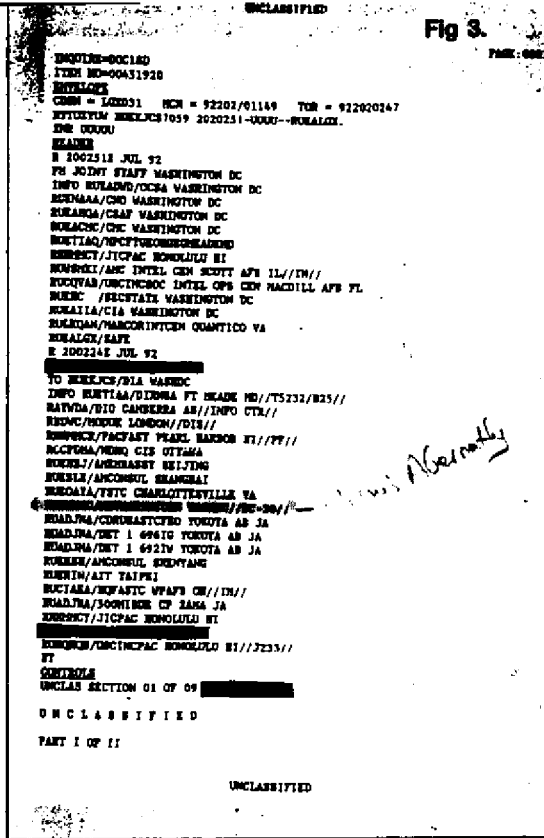
The intelligence community often report on lectures delivered at UFO conferences. What 'contactee' George Adamaski told an audience in New Zealand about his experiences was subsequently routed to defence agencies at the time. [see Fig 4]

Perhaps the most significant features contained within a distribution list are three key letters - S.C.I.

This refers to Sensitive Compartmented Information. This security system is used predominantly by those engaged in U.S. space reconnaissance and related aeronautical activities. S.C.I. functions on the theory that damaging security leaks can be kept to a minimum if those in the system know only what they need to know in order to perform their tasks.

Security people are always talking about the "need to know." Compartmentalizing information is the way they restrict what the watertight doors do on a naval vessel: limit the amount of water entering the ship to a single compartment rather than allowing the entire hull to be flooded.

The fact that many UFO documents contain references to S.C.I. is a matter of great interest to researchers. Those who come under this system, operators, technicians and taskmasters, inhabit a carefully encapsulated netherworld those provinces are identified by acronym, whose secrets are shared only by the relatively few having one or more spe-



cial clearances, and whose existence is publicly either played down or denied outright.

Amongst the agencies who are, or have been named as prime users of the S.C.I. system are:

- The Committee on Imagery Requirements and Exploitation (COMIREX)
- Committee on Overhead Reconnaissance (COMOR)
- Defence Special Missile and Astronautics Centre (DEFSMAC)
- Intelligence Production Council (IPC)
- Joint Reconnaissance Centre (JRC)
- Naval Reconnaissance Centre (NRC)
- National Intelligence Council (NIC)
- National Foreign Intelligence

the system that does all of the watching and listening is so pervasively secret - so black - that no individual, including the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the director of Central Intelligence, knows all of its hidden parts, the products they collect, or the real extent of the widely dispersed and deeply buried budgets that keeps the entire operation functioning.

In 1986, there were more than thirty S.C.I. categories used by the U.S. intelligence community, three of which pertained directly to technical intelligence collection: Special Intelligence (SI), Talent Keyhole (TK), and Byeman. Special Intelligence and Talent Keyhole concern data that are the product of signals intelligence collection and/or overhead reconnaissance, by both aircraft and satellites.

SI and TK clearances are almost always given jointly, however, they allow their holders access to the product of particular overhead reconnaissance systems, but not automatic access to details about the collection systems themselves. Thus interpreters in the national Security Agency, the National Photographic Interpretation Centre, and the CIA, for example, have SI-TK clearances that permit them to hear taped intercepts or to study imagery, but they are not supposed to know how the planes and satellites that do the collecting work, or even their names, because they do not need to know.

Without a shadow of doubt, S.C.I. is of immense importance to the intelligence and defence agencies of the West. One can only guess how many claim that for this reason the classification to be attached to UFO sightings and the resulting reports, and the resulting Intelligence Systems Committee (WSSIC), among others.

Were it not for the use of S.C.I., vital intelligence matters might be exposed to a potential adversary, amounting to a severe, if not fatal, loss for the West. American advocates of S.C.I. claim that without it, U.S. intelligence would be practically deaf, dumb, and blind, and the nation would be commensurately vulnerable. It is for this reason that

Dear Madam,

As an investigator with the above association I now find it necessary to make an approach to the M.O.D. with regard to an unusual event on the 17th of November 1994.

The event took place near Paxton village at about 5pm and again near Preston village at 6pm. These villages are both in Berwickshire. I will now describe the object which at least four people saw that night. The object was disc shaped and black in colour. It had two large spot lights on either side of the disc with red and green lights which were on constantly. There were other lights on the side of the object in particular a small but very bright light which again was on all the time. This object had the capability of hovering fifty feet above the ground in total silence and was at least four times the size of a Tornade fighter jet, at approximately two hundred yards away.

The second event took place on the twenty second of November 1994 at about 7pm. This object was of a different design. It was triangular with sharp edges, being black at one time during the sighting then changed to a dark red. It came slowly in from the North sea at a height of 20 feet and up the estuary of the river Tweed. It then stopped, hovered, turned a dark red and lit the water underneath, a bright red colour. Again, this object was silent. Having hovered for approximately 3 minutes it shot off at an incredible speed passing underneath all three bridges which span the river.

I would now like to ask the M.O.D. if there were any aircraft in these areas which could fit the descriptions given above? I also wish to ask if there were any unexplained blips on the R.A.D.A.R installation at Boulmer on these nights or any other early warning system on the east coast of the U.K? We at B.U.F.O.R.A would be very grateful for any information no matter how small you care to give us. Thank you for taking the time and trouble to read this letter and I would like to wish you all a very merry Xmas and a happy New Year.

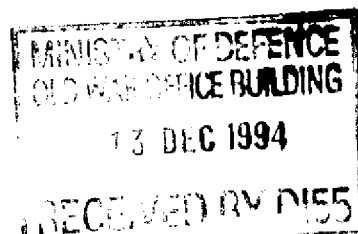

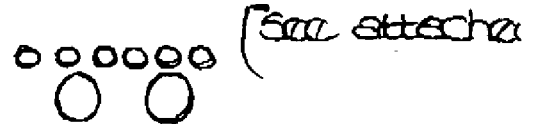

The attached report from Section 40 is submitted in accordance with Standing Order 36/81.

It will be seen from the IRIS incident 736 of 28.11.94, that objects were seen by other observers. Police Officers included. The crew of DR41, Pc's Section 40 felt that they were watching a low flying aircraft. Section 40 saw an object from a moving vehicle on The Avenue of Remembrance at Colchester. There is no way of telling if the officers are describing the same object. Mrs Section 40 Essex, reported seeing an object at Thorpe le Soken, Essex, which apparently ties in with the account from the original informant. I have been unable to recontact Section 40 to question her in detail about direction of flight, angle of viewing etc. as the only reply from her home is an answerphone.

No enquiries have been made from this station with any establishments who may have had aircraft in the area at the time of the sightings, which may offer explanations of what was actually seen.

Dear Sir,

Acting on the advice of Section 40, author, I am writing to tell you of a sighting I had last week which he said would possibly interest you.

My occupation is that of Section 40 and I am currently seconded to the Section 40. I work in the Section 40 in Norwich.

On Tuesday, 15th November, I was in the Section 40 Office which is located in the administration building known as Section 40 occupies a position on Section 40 about a hundred feet above the level of the City. The building faces W.S.W. directly towards the C.E.Cathedral.

At approximately 4.15 p.m. a member of the Support Staff asked me whether I could identify a row of bright lights to the West. Together we looked at a map of the City and concluded that the lights were on the ground in the vicinity of the University. They appeared to be the kind of lights used on a sports ground. My colleague had not noticed them before.

The next day, Wednesday, I was in the office, the time being approximately 7.45 a.m. I looked once again at the map of the City and having done so went to the window to see whether I could identify where it was that we had seen the lights on the previous day.

The morning was exceptionally bright, the sky clear of cloud. The air temperature was mild, there was little, if any, breeze. There was no haze over the City.

While I was searching the sky-line to the right, or W.N.W., my eyes were made conscious of a light to my left, two lights in fact. I enclose a sketch I made a couple of minutes later which will give an idea of the position of the images in relation to the spire of the Cathedral. The sketch is made sight-size.

At first I thought the scene was ordinary enough; the rising sun was already strong and it seemed that I was seeing two hot air balloons, formed from a silvery material. They were identical

in size and perfectly round, about 1/4" to 3/8" diameter. They appeared solid, faced directly to the sun I neither expected to see nor did I see any lessening of reflected light to the edges of the images and so they appeared not to be spherical. Neither of the images showed any movement during the minute or so that I observed them.

I noticed that there were no baskets beneath the balloons and although they appeared to have little altitude I saw no bursts of flame as I should have expected. The brightness of the light coming from the surfaces of the objects made it impossible for me to estimate their distance.

There was neither sight nor sound of aircraft, neither was there, after the images ceased to be visible, any cloud or indication of their presence. The objects appeared to be substantial, to be reflecting light and not emanating it.

Without the objects having moved in relation to the buildings beneath them, after about a minute they both vanished in an instant; they did diminish in intensity of light or size but vanished from view. *not*

The windows to the office had been cleaned two or three days before the sighting. There was no light on in the office and neither was any of the office equipment switched on. What I saw was not a reflection on the window from within the room.

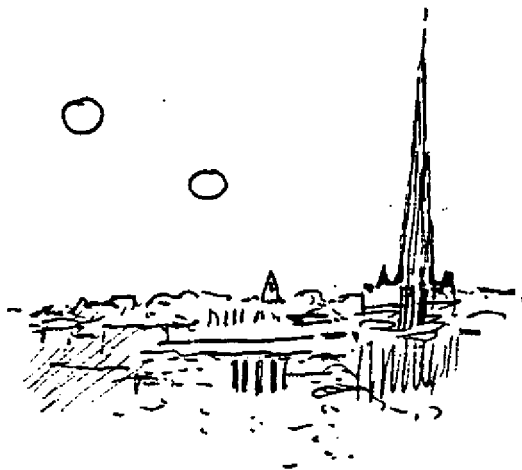
The sketch was made immediately after I saw the images and drawn from the same position in which I had stood. At no time while watching the images or objects did they make any kind of movement.

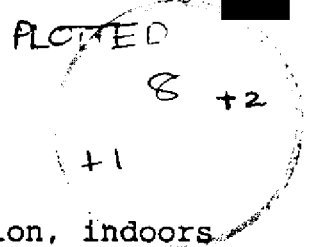
